TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the homestand with the first of 3 games against the Cincinnati Reds...the Mariners are coming off a series win against the San Francisco Giants (2-1) to open the first homestand of the second half...following Wednesday's series finale against the Reds and an off day Thursday, Seattle will embark on a 7-game road trip at the Texas Rangers (4 G, 7/24-27) and Los Angeles Dodgers (3 G, 7/28-30)...tonight's game will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's series finale against the Giants by a 6-3 score...Seattle is 42-24 (.636) when they homer, 35-14 (.714) when they score 4+ runs and 20-6 (.769) with 10+ hits.

- **Seeing Red** - Seattle is 21-6 (.778) all-time against the Reds, their best all-time record against any opponent they have faced...the Mariners have won 8 of 9 series played against the Reds since 2002.
- **Home Sweet T-Mobile Park** - The Mariners are 8-2 over their last 10 home games since June 21.
- **Milestones** - **J.P. Crawford** yesterday recorded his 900th career hit and 860th with Seattle...his 860 career hits with Seattle rank 13th in franchise history, just below the next closest Bret Boone (863 H).
- **Homestand Highlights** - Remaining highlights on the Mariners current homestand against the Reds include Mariners Crossbody Bag Night tonight and Mariners Value Games tonight and Tuesday.
- **Rehab Update** - INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** has made 3 rehab appearances between Triple-A Tacoma (2 G) and the ACL Mariners (1 G) as he works his way back from the Injured List...Donovan has been on the IL since May 16 with left groin muscle strain.

J-ROD RETURNS...on Saturday, the Mariners reinstated center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** from the 7-day Injured List (concussion)...during his career, Julio has been an excellent second-half hitter...in 222 career games after the All-Star Break (2022-c), he is batting .295 (270x914) with 157 runs, 48 doubles, 3 triples, 59 homers, 156 RBI and 38 stolen bases, reaching base at a .349 clip and slugging .548 for an .878 OPS...his OPS is nearly 140 points higher in the second half than the first half (career .739 in first half), while his slugging percentage is 130 points higher than the first half (career .419 in first half)...in a corresponding move for his reinstatement, infielder/outfielder **Miles Mastrobuoni** was designated for assignment.

EL FUEGO DE LOS MOCHIS...closer **Andrés Muñoz** yesterday picked up his 95th career save and 17th of the season...he has been flawless over his last 12 appearances (6/16-c), not allowing a run with 18 strikeouts and 4 walks, limiting opponents to a .125 batting average (5x40) with a 0.75 WHIP...during that span, Muñoz's 40.9% strikeout rate ranks 6th among MLB relievers and 3rd in the American League (min. 10.0 IP) behind only Josh Hader-HOU (44.7%) and Ryan Zeferjahn-LAA (42.9%).

GEORGE KIRBY BUMP DAY...tonight's starter **George Kirby** was stellar in his last start at T-Mobile Park against the Angels on June 29, tossing 8.0 innings and allowing only 2 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...Kirby is one of only 6 American League pitchers this season to throw multiple 8.0+ inning games, joining Tanner Bibee-CLE, Max Fried-NYY, J.T. Ginn-ATH, Cam Schlichtler-NYY and Ranger Suárez-BOS...overall this season, Kirby owns a 3.76 ERA (46 ER, 110.0 IP) with 98 strikeouts and 24 walks...among qualified AL starters, he ranks 6th in BB/9 (1.96), 6th in HR/9 (0.90) and 8th in SO/BB (4.08).

OPS, THERE IT IS...second baseman **Cole Young** yesterday went 2-for-4 with a single and a 2-run home run...on Saturday, Young hit a game-tying, 3-run homer...it marked the first time in his career that he has hit a home run in back-to-back games...over his last 30 games (6/11-c), Young has posted an impressive .860 OPS and is batting .274 (31x113) with 4 doubles, 9 home runs, 17 RBI and 5 walks, reaching base at a .311 clip and slugging .549...Young leads AL second basemen and ranks 3rd among MLB second basemen (min. 50% G as 2B) with 3.4 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season...he is on pace to join Ken Griffey Jr. (4x), Alex Rodriguez (3x), **Julio Rodríguez** (2x) and Ruppert Jones as Mariners to post a 3.0+ bWAR season at age-22 or younger.

OUTSTANDING ARMS...the Mariners pitching staff has excelled in 2026, ranking 1st in MLB in SO/BB (3.46), 1st in fewest BB/9 (2.53), 1st in fewest HR/9 (0.97), 4th in FanGraphs Wins Above Replacement (13.8), T-3rd in WHIP (1.18), 6th in ERA (3.61) and 11 in strikeouts (846)...Seattle pitchers have allowed only 24.9 walks this season, ranking 1st in the Majors, 15 fewer than the next closest Rays (264 BB).

NAYL'ING IT ON THE BASES...first baseman **Josh Naylor** went 2-for-4 with a run, RBI and stolen base yesterday...he has reached base safely in the last 11-consecutive games (7/4-c), recording a hit in 10 of those games...Naylor is 19-for-23 in stolen base attempts this season and 38-for-42 with the Mariners...since making his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, his 38 stolen bases rank 3rd in the Majors, trailing only Jazz Chisholm Jr.-NYY (47 SB) and Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (41).

RANDY THE ALL-STAR...in 92 games this season, left fielder **Randy Arozarena** is batting .281 (94x335) with 61 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, 37 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .376 clip, slugging .448 with an .824 OPS this season...Randy is coming off his third All-Star selection (2023, '25-'26) and second with Seattle after being named an All-Star in back-to-back seasons...he became the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club...Randy went 1-for-2 for the American League as Seattle's sole representative in the 2026 MLB All-Star Game.

IN THE 'ZONE...over his last 36 games (5/30-c), **Dominic Canzone** is batting .291 (34x117) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 19 RBI and 11 walks, reaching base at a .357 clip and slugging .598 for a .955 OPS that ranks 7th in the AL during that span (min. 100 PA).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Logan Gilbert** put together another quality outing last night, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 4 hits (1 HR) with only 1 walk and a season-high tying 10 strikeouts (also: 6/16 vs. BAL), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since the start of last season, Mariners starters have recorded 10 games with 10+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks allowed, the T-2nd most such games in the American League during that span?...of those 10 games, Gilbert has accounted for 6 of them, ranking T-3rd in the league behind only Garrett Crochet-BOS (7 G) and Tarik Skubal-DET (11 G).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 20

- **1988** - The Mariners set a new team record with eight doubles.
- **2013** - The Mariners recorded only one hit, and were no-hit through the first 6.0 innings, but scratched out a 4-2 win over the Astros. Seattle tied the game 2-2 with a 2-run 6th inning without a hit (2 walks, 2 passed balls, sacrifice fly) and scored the winning runs in the 7th on a 2-out, 2-run double by Michael Saunders. It was only the 4th time since 1900 where a team scored 4+ runs without the benefit of more than one hit.
- **2013** - Mariners failed to homer for the first time in 23 games, snapping their franchise record streak (23 G, 6/20-7/19).
- **2016** - Leonys Martin hit his 2nd walk-off home run of the season, marking the Mariners 6th walk-off home run of 2016, tying the single-season Mariners record for walk-off home runs in a season.
- **2021** - **Cal Raleigh** records first two MLB hits, including an RBI double.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 19th start of the season and 1st against the Reds...will be the 131st start of his career and his 2nd career start against Cincinnati.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...L#8 on July 8 at Miami, tossed 6.0 innings with 2 runs (2 ER), 8 hits, no walks, and 7 strikeouts...threw 86 pitches and 59 strikes...is his 8th quality start with 5+ strikeouts this season, tied for 9th most such games in the AL.

GOOD TO BE HOME...owns a 1.46 BB/9 at home which ranks 2nd in MLB since 2022 (min. 200 IP) while his 6.31 SO/BB ranks 3rd-best...since 2025, he has thrown 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 14-of-22 home games, including 5 times this season with 3 outings being 7.0+ IP (last: 6/29 vs. LAA)...the Mariners are 10-4 in such games since 2025 and 4-1 this season...his 36 career home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed are tied for 4th-most in Mariners history and are T-2nd most in MLB since 2022.

QUALITY STRETCH...has recorded a quality start with 5+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer walks in each of his last 5 outings...his 5 consecutive quality starts is tied for the 3rd longest such streak of his career (also: 6/13/23-7/6/23) and is his longest since 6/9/24-7/26/24...is tied for the 6th longest such streak in MLB this season...he is 1-of-6 pitchers this season to recorded a 6-game streak of quality starts with 5+ strikeouts...marks the 2nd longest such streak of his career, trailing his 8-game streak logged in 2024 (6/15-7/26).

THE LAST FEW...over his last 5 starts Kirby owns a 3.09 ERA (11 ER, 32.0 IP) with 34 strikeouts to 6 walks for a 5.67 K/BB and a 9.56 K/9...his 5.57 K/BB since the start of June ranks 9th best in MLB over that span (min. 35.0 IP)...his 34 strikeouts are the most he has recorded over a 5 game span this season and the 10th most in his career.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...has logged 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks in 12 games this season (last: 7/8 at MIA), tied for 6th most in the AL...his 74 career games are 11th-most in MLB since 2022...among MLB pitchers with 90+ strikeouts in 2026, his 24 walks are tied for the 7th fewest...ranks 8th among qualified AL pitchers with a 4.08 K/BB.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 11 quality starts this season (last: 7/8 at MIA), tied for 11th most in MLB...has thrown 74 quality starts across his career, T-5th most in MLB since 2022, tied with **Luis Castillo**...has 39 career quality starts without any walks (4x this season, last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Zack Wheeler-PHI (28 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 21 career home games (last: 6/17 vs. BAL), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of **Logan Gilbert** (17 G) and Zack Wheeler (17 G)...his 21 such games are also 3rd most in Mariners history, just 1 game behind Jamie Moyer (22 G) and Félix Hernández (22 G).

KEEPING THEM ON THEIR TOES...owns a 38.2% chase rate this season, tied for the lead in MLB among qualified pitchers while posting a 35.8% career chase rate, ranking 8th among qualified pitchers since 2022...his 684 swing and misses on pitches outside the zone rank 9th among AL pitchers since 2022, while his 347 strikeouts are 7th-most...of pitchers in MLB with over 250 strikeouts on pitches out of the zone since 2022, his 109 walks are the 4th-fewest, trailing Jacob DeGrom-TEX/NYM (66), Garrett Crochet-BOS/CWS (96), and Max Scherzer-3Tms (103).

FURIOUS GEORGE...has thrown 7.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 4 starts this season (last: 6/29 vs. LAA) and in 26 career starts, tied for 15th most in MLB since 2022, matching **Logan Gilbert**...Kirby and **Bryan Woo** (5 G) are 2-of-8 pitchers in the AL this season to have 4+ games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs and 1-or-fewer walks...Kirby's 23 such starts since 2023 are 4th most in MLB across that span.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he **leads the Majors** in fewest walks allowed (117), walks-per-nine innings (1.4), and walk rate (3.8%) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.15).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.15)...ranks T-6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.61), 2nd in WHIP (1.142) and 9th in total strikeouts (719 SO).

PLENTY OF PUNCHOUTS...has tossed 12+ strikeouts in 3 career games, including a career-high 14 strikeouts twice last season...is 1 of 12 pitchers with 3-or-more games of 12+ strikeouts since 2024...recorded his 4th 10+ strikeout game since 2025 on June 10 at BAL...his 4 such starts are tied for 8th-most in the AL over that span.

PLAYING THE LONG GAME...has pitched into the 6th inning in 16 of his 18 starts this year, T-4th most in MLB, and has cleared the 7th inning in 4 of those starts...his 110.0 IP through his first 18 starts are the most he has pitched over an 18 game span to start the year since his 2023 season where he pitched 112.2 innings...is also the most innings pitched over any 18 game span in a single season since he threw 110.2 IP over 18 starts from April 27 to July 31 of 2024.

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 4/27/23 at PHI)...is 1 of 10 pitchers with a complete game this season...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since **Logan Gilbert** did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...recorded his 2nd 8.0+ inning outing in his last start (6/29 vs. LAA) for the 3rd such outing by a Mariners pitcher this season (also: **Bryce Miller**, 6/12 at WSH), T-6th most in MLB this season...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX)...is 1 of 10 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, along with teammate **Logan Gilbert** (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

MILESTONES GALORE...earned his 50th career win on May 11 at HOU, becoming the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...his 121 games are tied for the 4th-fewest games to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, alongside Hisashi Iwakuma and Erik Hanson, and trailing Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy García (100 G), and Marco Gonzales (118 G)...recorded his 700th strikeout on June 17 vs. BAL, becoming the 10th pitcher to record 700+ SO in a Mariners uniform...of those 10 pitchers, Kirby's 127 games were the 5th-fewest to reach the milestone...is the first pitcher that debuted in 2022 to record their 700th strikeout.
