RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (0-2, one to play), Milwaukee (three to play), and Minnesota (three to play) this afternoon at Busch Stadium...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...have started 0-2 for the sixth time, joining 2016, 2015, 2011, 2006, and 2005...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...are scheduled for five games in March, most in franchise history, more than their four in 2025, 2024, and 2019...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR).

- * The Rays erased a 4-0, 9th-inning deficit to force extras and took a 5-4 lead on the first pitch of the 10th, but were ultimately walked off by the Cardinals, 6-5, on Saturday...per Stats Perform, it matched the largest 9th-inning comeback in franchise history, joining April 19, 2025 vs. NYY (trailed 8-4, won 10-8 in 10 inn.), April 5, 2024 at COL (trailed 6-2, lost 10-7), Aug. 10, 2011 vs. KC (trailed 7-3, won 8-7), and July 23, 2002 at BOS (trailed 4-0, won 5-4).
- * They are the second team since 1901 to blow a lead of six runs or more on Opening Day before erasing a deficit of four runs or more in their second game, regardless of final outcome, joining the 1960 White Sox, who blew a 9-2 lead in a 10-9, walk-off win in their opener and came back to win, 6-5 (11 inn.), after yielding four 1st-inning runs in their second game, both vs. the Kansas City Athletics...this was the Rays second time blowing a lead of six runs or more and coming back from a deficit of four runs or more in consecutive games, joining July 27-28, 2019 at TOR (Stats Perform). Tampa Bay was held hitless until Junior Caminero singled on the first pitch of the 7th inning...it was the longest no-hit bid against the Rays since Cam Schlittler (6.0) on Aug. 20, 2025 vs. NYY.
- * Today, the Rays look to avoid going winless in their first three games for the second time, which would join their 0-6 start in 2011...it would mark their eighth time losing their first three road games, first since 2020 (0-5).
- * A loss would also result in the Rays being swept in their opening series for the second time, joining April 1-3, 2011 vs. BAL...it would mark their second time being swept by the Cardinals along with June 17-19, 2005 at Tropicana Field and first on the road.
- * Steven Matz will toe the rubber this afternoon for his Rays debut in his first appearance at Busch Stadium since the Cardinals traded him to the Red Sox at last year's July 31 trade deadline...Matz is set to join Charlie Morton (March 29, 2019 vs. HOU) as the only pitchers to debut for the Rays as a starting pitcher against a club he appeared for in the previous season (Stats Perform).

POWER OUTAGE—The Rays are tied for third in the majors with 24 hits but rank 30th in extra-base hits, tallying only a Jonathan Aranda homer...their 23 singles pace MLB and are the most in club history through two games, surpassing 1998 (22), and the most by an AL club through its first two games since the 2007 Yankees (23)...it marks the most singles by any team with 1 XBH or fewer through its first two games in the modern era (since 1900), surpassing Cleveland in 1966 (20)...the Rays are the first club with 23 singles (or more) and 1 or 0 XBH over any two-game span within a single season since the Braves (25 1B, 1HR) from July 25-26, 2011.

- * The Rays are the sixth team in AL history to start 0-2 while collecting 24 hits or more, joining Cleveland in 2011 (24H) and 2004 (29H), the White Sox in 2000 (24H), the Red Sox in 1986 (25H), and the St. Louis Browns in 1925 (25H)...their 21 runners left on base are tied for seventh most in MLB and their third most through two games behind 2003 (26) and 2002 (22).
- * Despite the lack of slugging, the Rays 12 runs are their second most through two games over the last 13 seasons (2014-26), trailing only the 2023 club (16) that tied a modern era-record with a 13-game winning streak to open the campaign...they have scored five runs or more in each of their first two games for the first time since 2012 (2G)...their last longer streak was four games to kick off the 2008 season.
- * Of the Rays 24 hard-hit balls (95 mph EV or higher), 95.8 pct. (23) have resulted in singles or outs, the highest clip in the majors...the 24 hard-hit balls are tied for fourth most in the AL.

STARTING FROM THE TOP—Between Drew Rasmussen (5.0IP, 1ER) and Joe Boyle (6.0IP, 2ER), the Rays rotation has pitched to a 2.45 ERA (11.0IP, 2ER)...the two have combined for a 0.64 WHIP, second among MLB starters to the Blue Jays (0.53) and second lowest by the Rays rotation in its first two starts behind 2021 (0.43)...Rays starters have not issued a walk in their first two outings for the second time, joining another two-start streak to open the 2021 season.

- * The Rays bullpen has yielded 12 runs, tied with the White Sox for the most in MLB and tied with the 2006 Devil Rays for the 'pen's most through the first two games of a season...this marks the first time the club's bullpen has taken back-to-back losses to open a campaign...eight of the 12 RBI allowed by Rays relievers have come with two strikes.
- * Overall, the Rays staff has permitted six runs or more in each of its first two games for the seventh time, first since 2015 (2G)...their longest such streak is three games to open 2013.

HERE'S JONNY!—Jonathan Aranda saw his streak of seven consecutive games with an RBI halted Saturday, but reached safely three times (1B, 2BB) to extend his on-base streak to a career-high-tying 16 games (July 19, 2025-pres., also: June 11-28, 2025)...it marks the longest active streak in the AL and ties the third longest in MLB (see table to the right)...he is 18-for-57 (.316) with 6 XBH, 12 RBI, 11 BB and a .414 on-base pct. during the streak.

- * Aranda has also hit safely in eight straight games (July 28, 2025-pres.), the second-longest streak of his career behind June 15-28, 2025 (13G).

LA MÁXIMA—Junior Caminero has reached base safely in seven of his first 10 PA (2 1B, 5BB), tying Matt Joyce in 2014 for most in franchise history through the Rays first two games of a season...the 7 TOB are tied with TOR Andrés Giménez for second most by any player through his team's first two games this season, trailing LAA Mike Trout (8)...at 22 years, 266 days through yesterday's games, he is the youngest AL hitter to reach safely seven times or more in his team's first two contests since SEA Rod Craig (7, 22.090) in 1980...Caminero has drawn a walk in a career-high five consecutive games dating back to Sept. 26, 2025, the longest active streak in the majors and longest by a Ray since Yandy Díaz went eight straight games from Sept. 14-21, 2025.

CASH CONSIDERATIONS—Entering his 12th season, Rays manager Kevin Cash is the longest-tenured skipper in the majors with his current club...in 2024, he surpassed his predecessor, Joe Maddon (2006-14), as the longest-tenured manager in Rays history...Cash is 896-786 (.533) with the Rays, the most wins and highest winning pct. of any Rays skipper...the 896 career victories are fourth most among active managers, trailing CIN Terry Francona (2,034), DET A.J. Hinch (966), and LAD Dave Roberts (947).

- * Upon earning his 900th win, he will become the ninth manager in major league history to reach that mark while managing a single club in his career...the current list: LAD Walter Alston, LAA Mike Scioscia, LAD Tommy Lasorda, BAL Earl Weaver, MIN Tom Kelly, DET Hughie Jennings, PIT Danny Murtaugh, and STL Red Schoendienst.
- * Cash, who joined the Rays on Dec. 5, 2014, is the fifth-longest-tenured manager/head coach in the big four North American professional sports leagues (MLB, NBA, NFL, NHL) by hiring date...he trails only Erik Spoelstra (NBA's Miami Heat, April 2008), Andy Reid (NFL's Kansas City Chiefs, Jan. 2013), Jon Cooper (NHL's Tampa Bay Lightning, March 2013), and Steve Kerr (NBA's Golden State Warriors, May 2014).

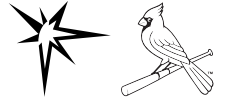
ON DECK—The Rays will travel to Milwaukee following this afternoon's series finale for a three-game set with the Brewers at American Family Field...it will mark their fourth series at the ballpark since its gates were opened in 2001, joining April 29-May 1, 2024 (L, 2-1), Aug. 9-10, 2022 (L, 2-0), and June 20-22, 2011 (W, 2-1)...they are 12-13 against the Brew Crew all time, but the clubs have met in each of the last four seasons (2022-25), with the Rays going 5-8 in that span...11 of those 13 games have been decided by two runs or fewer.

- * The series is set to feature Nick Martinez's Rays debut and Shane McClanahan's first major league start in 973 days (Aug. 2, 2023 at NYY).

TODAY'S START—Steven Matz takes the ball for his Rays debut this afternoon at Busch Stadium...marks his 173rd career start and fifth opposite the Cardinals...marks his first start since April 30, 2025 at CIN (G2) as a member of the Cardinals...enters his 12th major league season and first with the Rays...at 34 years, 303 days, is the oldest pitcher to start for Tampa Bay in his club debut since **Corey Kluber** (36.000) on April 10, 2022 vs. BAL...is one of 13 active left-handed pitchers to cross the 1,000-inning mark for his career (1,004.1) and one of four in the AL along with NYY **Max Fried** (1,086.0), NYY **Carlos Rodón** (1,282.0), and DET **Framber Valdez** (1,086.2)...signed a two-year deal with the Rays on Dec. 16, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT—In his final Grapefruit League tune-up on March 23 at PHI, he spun 5.0 scoreless frames, tossing a spring-high 71 pitches, 47 for strikes (5.0IP, 4H, OR, BB, 4SO)...did not yield a run in 11.0 IP spanning three starts...was one of four pitchers in MLB to toss 10.0 IP or more during spring training without yielding a run, joining WSH **Cade Cavalli** (14.0), SF **Tyler Mahle** (10.0), and TOR **Max Scherzer** (13.2).

★ Min. 10.0 IP, he finished third among Grapefruit League left-handers in both WHIP (0.82), trailing teammate **Cam Booser** (0.73) and **STL Matthew Liberatore** (0.80), and opp. average (.167), behind Booser (.118) and **PIT Hunter Barco** (.150).

BACK IN THE LOU—Matz will be making his first appearance at Busch Stadium since pitching for the Cardinals from 2022-25...he was dealt to the Red Sox at the July 31, 2025 trade deadline for **INF Blaze Jordan** before signing with the Rays last December...he is seeking his first career victory over the Cardinals and first at Busch Stadium since June 24, 2025 vs. CHC...it would also mark his first win as a starter in this ballpark since April 16, 2025 vs. HOU...this is Matz's third start at Busch as a visitor, joining April 25, 2018 and July 9, 2017, both as a member of the Mets.

★ In 17 career starts at Busch Stadium, he is 5-8 with a 4.93 ERA (84.0IP, 46ER)...however, this includes a 4-2 mark and 3.10 ERA (40.2IP, 14ER) across his last eight starts dating back to May 7, 2023.

★ According to Stats Perform, he will become the second Rays pitcher to start in his debut with the franchise against a club that he appeared for in the previous season, joining **Charlie Morton** on March 29, 2019 vs. HOU...he will become the first to do so as a visitor.

★ Matz is 15-11 with a 4.15 ERA (184.1IP, 85ER) in 46 career appearances opposite NL Central foes.

ON THE ROAD—Matz went 3-1 with a 2.41 ERA (33.1IP, 9ER) over 22 appearances (1 start) away from home last season, the ninth-best road ERA among all left-handers in the majors (min. 30.0IP)...this includes a 0.90 ERA (11.0IP, 1ER) with one save and two holds in nine road appearances following the All-Star break, all in relief...the only run he allowed in that span was a solo homer to TB **Brandon Lowe** on Sept. 21 at Steinbrenner Field...the long ball was Lowe's 30th of the campaign, making him the third Ray with multiple career 30-homer seasons along with **Evan Longoria** (4) and **Carlos Peña** (3)...it was one of only three homers Matz yielded to left-handed batters on the season, all of which came with the Red Sox (also: Sept. 1 vs. CLE - **Kyle Manzardo**; Aug. 17 vs. MIA - **Jacob Marsee**).

★ He is seeking his first win in a road start since Aug. 12, 2023 at KC.

A TALE OF TWO ROLES—Matz returns to a major league starting rotation for the first time since opening the 2024 season as the Cardinals No. 4 starter, a role he filled until a lower back strain cost him four months (May 1-Sept. 1)...for his career, he is 55-59 with a 4.31 ERA (871.1IP, 430ER) in 172 starts vs. 5-3 with a 3.20 ERA (107.0IP, 38ER) over 74 outings in relief.

★ Last season, he made a career-high 51 relief appearances against only two starts, his first time working primarily out of the bullpen...in his first 10 MLB seasons (2015-24), he made 170 starts and 23 relief appearances.

★ Matz is one of two active pitchers with 150 starts or more and 50 relief appearances or more in his career, joining **ATL Chris Sale** (313 starts, 81 relief appearances).

IN CONTROL—Matz produced a career-best 3.6 pct. walk rate last season, lowest among major league left-handers and third lowest overall (min. 75.0IP) to SF/NYM **Tyler Rogers** (2.3%) and DET **Janson Junk** (2.9%)...he did not issue a walk in 44 of his 52 appearances...he ended the year with 19.2 consecutive frames without a walk from Aug. 9 on...the 19-appearance, season-ending run tied **CLE Cade Smith** for the longest in the majors and was the longest by a left-hander since **PIT Tony Watson** (26G) in 2013...after walking **Jonathan India** on Aug. 4 vs. KC, Matz did not record a free pass against any of his final 75 BF in 2025.

THE ARSENAL—He relied on a four-pitch mix last season, using his sinker 58.4 pct. of the time...his most-thrown secondary offering was his curveball (21.8%)—Matz held opponents to a .197 clip (13-for-66) against the offering, ninth lowest on any MLB left-hander's curve...they batted a combined .264 (60-for-227) in at-bats ending with his sinker, changeup, or slider.

BEEN AROUND THE BLOCK—Matz enters the 2026 season with 10 years, 99 days of service time, most among Rays...he reached the 10-year mark last June and was one of 16 left-handed pitchers to appear in the majors last season to conclude the year with a decade of service time...joined **Tyler Anderson**, **Andrew Chafin**, **Aroldis Chapman**, **Patrick Corbin**, **Andrew Heaney**, **Rich Hill**, **Wade Miley**, **Martín Pérez**, **Drew Pomeranz**, **José Quintana**, **Robbie Ray**, **Carlos Rodón**, **Eduardo Rodríguez**, **Chris Sale**, and **Justin Wilson**.

2025 RUNDOWN—Matz set career bests in ERA (3.05, min. 40.0IP), WHIP (1.10), walk rate (3.6%), opp. on-base pct. (.280), home runs per 9.0 IP (0.94), and chase rate (29.8%) across a career-high 53 appearances (2 starts) between the Cardinals (32G/2GS) and Red Sox (21G)...was acquired by Boston on July 31 for **INF Blaze Jordan**...posted a 2.08 ERA (21.2IP, 5ER) with a 0.88 WHIP with the Sox compared to a 3.44 ERA (55.0IP, 21ER) and 1.18 WHIP as a Cardinal...pitched to a 0.73 ERA (12.1IP, 1ER) over 11 appearances in August, tied for ninth in the AL (10.0IP), during his first month in Boston...saw his first playoff action since his 2015 rookie season with the Mets, throwing a pair of scoreless frames across Games 2 and 3 of the Red Sox ALWC Series loss to the Yankees.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER @ BREWERS: RHP NICK MARTINEZ (0-0, -.-)

LAST TIME OUT—Was tagged for 11 ER on 12 hits over 3.2 IP in his final spring start on March 22 at TOR (L, 3.2IP, 12H, 11ER), 2BB, 3HR)...went 0-4 across his four Grapefruit League outings.

vs. BREWERS—The former Red is 0-1 with a 4.65 ERA (40.2IP, 21ER) with 31 SO in 11 career appearances (2 starts) opposite the Brewers...this includes a 4.99 ERA (30.2IP, 17ER) in the six starts.
