TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Nationals finish a four-game set today with the 16th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The teams are scheduled to conclude their season series next week in Washington, September 13-15.

A After dropping the first three games against Washington this season, the Braves have won nine of the last 12 despite outscoring the Nationals by only six runs over this stretch (67-61).

A The Braves are looking to finish off their first-ever four-game sweep of Washington/Montreal today...The only time they won four games in a series against the Nationals/Expos franchise was in 1996, when they went 4-1 in a rare five-game set.

A RHP Mike Soroka is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (5 ER/15.0 IP) in three games, all starts, against the Nationals...All of the righty's appearances against the Nationals have come this season...In his last start against Washington, Soroka went 7.0 innings and allowed one run, earned, in a 5-4, 10-inning win.

A RHP Max Scherzer is set to face the Braves for the 23rd time in his career and for the 21st time as a starter...The righty has yet to face the Braves this season, and went 2-2 with a 3.19 ERA (11 ER/31.0 IP) in five starts against them last season.

SURGING: The Braves set a new season high last night with their ninth consecutive victory, beating Washington, 5-4...Atlanta has won 20 of their last 24 games and 17 of 19 to move to 89-54 and a season-best 35 games over .500...The Braves have not been this many games over .500 since the end of the 2003 season, when that club finished 40 over at 101-61.

A Atlanta has the fourth-best record in baseball, and the second-best mark in the National League, 2.5 games behind Los Angeles for home field...They are 4.0 games behind Houston and New York for the best record in all of MLB.

A Last night's win over Washington pushed the Braves lead in the NL East to a season-most 10.0 games...The magic number for Atlanta to clinch its second consecutive division title is 11.

A Atlanta last had as good a stretch over 19 games in 2013, when that club also went 17-2 from July 27 to August 16.

A With last night's win, the Braves took this series...Atlanta has not lost a multi-game series since July 23-24, when Kansas City swept both games here at SunTrust Park...They have gone 10-0-3 in multi-game series play over this stretch.

A The Braves are on pace to win 101 games this season...Eight different teams in franchise history have won triple digits in a season (last, 2003; 101)...They need to finish 11-8 or better to get there.

A The Braves are looking to win 10 in a row for the first time since 2013, when they took 14 straight from July 26-August 9.

WINNING AT HOME: The Braves have set a franchise modern-era record with 13 consecutive home wins after they beat Washington, 5-4, last night...The 2000 Braves set the previous record, winning 12 straight from April 8-May 5.

A The Braves' run started on August 17 vs. Los Angeles and continued with wins over Miami, Chicago (AL), Toronto and Washington.

A The last major league team with a longer winning run at home was Arizona in 2011; the Diamondbacks won 15 straight, August 9-September 10.

A The Braves have held the opposition to 38 total runs in these 13 games (35 earned runs/2.69 ERA).

A The longest home single-season winning streak by any Braves team in franchise history is 18, set in 1897 by the Boston Beaneaters...Led by 31-game winner Kid Nichols and four other future Hall of Famers (manager Frank Selee, 3B Jimmy Collins, OF Billy Hamilton, OF Hugh Duffy), the Beaneaters won 18 straight at South End Grounds from May 31-June 25.

GOING FOR 90 WINS: The Braves are looking to collect their 90th win of the season today, and with a victory, it would mark the quickest by games the franchise has reached the mark since 2003...Today is game No. 144.

A That 2003 team reached win No. 90 in game No. 143...The 1998 team was the quickest in franchise history to 90 wins, earning it in game No. 136 that season.

STARTERS DOMINATING: RHP Julio Teheran allowed one run and three hits over 6.0 innings last night, and over the last 12 games, the rotation owns a 1.91 ERA...They have allowed just three home runs over this stretch.

A For the season, the Braves rotation has allowed 96 home runs, the fewest by any National League team's starting pitchers...The rotation's HR/9 rate of 1.1 is third lowest in the majors, trailing just Tampa Bay and Washington.

HOME RUNS: The Braves hit four home runs last night, getting a two-run home run from C Brian McCann and solo shots from 2B Ozzie Albies, 3B Josh Donaldson and OF Matt Joyce...The Braves now have 225 home runs this season, the fifth most in baseball and second most in the National League.

A With the four home runs last night, this club passed the 2006 team for the second most single-season home runs in franchise history...That team had 222.

A McCann and Joyce had consecutive home runs in the sixth inning, the 15th time the Braves have gone back-to-back this season, which extended the franchise record.

A The Braves are now 10 home runs away from tying the single-season mark, set by the 2003 team.

Today's Game

- A Set for his 26th start of the season and 31st of his career.
- A Ranks third in the majors with a 2.53 ERA (43 ER/152.2 IP)...Today's opposing starting pitcher, Max Scherzer, ranks fourth (2.60)
- A Only the Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu (2.45 ERA) and Houston's Justin Verlander (2.52 ERA) have been better.
- A Soroka's current ERA is the second best by a Braves rookie in the live-ball era (since 1920)...Right-hander Jim Turner went 20-11 with a 2.38 ERA for the 1937 Boston Bees.
- A Soroka's ERA is the lowest by any rookie in the majors since 2013, when Miami's José Fernandez compiled a 2.19 mark over 28 starts.
- A Makes his fourth career start against Washington, all of which have come this season...Is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (5 ER/15.0 IP) in his first three games.
- A Atlanta has gone 2-1 in his starts against the Nationals this season.
- A Set for his 12th intradivision start of the year, and his 2.47 ERA (18 ER/65.2 IP) against the East is lowest in the majors among pitchers to make at least 10 starts against the division.
- A Allowed two home runs in his last start, September 2 vs. Toronto, the first time in his career he has allowed more than one home run in a single start.
- A Regardless of the outing, Soroka's 10 home runs allowed on the season are easily the fewest among qualified starters in the majors.
- A No Atlanta pitcher has made at least 25 starts and allowed no more than 10 home runs since 2007, when Tim Hudson surrendered 10 homers over 34 turns.
- A Started at Toronto, August 27, and allowed his only two runs of the game in the first inning, before pitching 5.0 scoreless frames to close his outing.
- A Has a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) in the first inning this season.
- A In all other frames, has pitched to a 2.33 ERA (33 ER/127.2 IP).

2019 Recap

- A A native of Calgary, Alberta, he beat the Blue Jays for the first time in his last start, 9/2 at SunTrust Park...Allowed three runs over 5.0 innings.
- A Became the first Canadian-born Braves pitcher to ever beat Toronto, and the second to ever beat a Canadian franchise...Claude Raymond, a native of Saint-Jean-sur-Richelieu, Quebec, pitched 2.0 innings of relief to beat the Expos on 5/16/69.
- A Lost at Toronto, 8/27, for his first career loss on the road...Allowed eight hits and two runs over 6.0 innings.
- A Despite the loss, Soroka's 1.44 ERA on the road is best in the majors among qualified starters, and nearly a full point lower than the closest pitcher (Jacob deGrom, 2.30).
- A The loss also marked the first time he lost consecutive decisions in his career, a streak that span eight total starts...Also lost on 7/20 vs. WSH...Went winless during the stretch despite a 2.81 ERA (16 ER/51.1 IP).
- A Turned 22 years old, August 4...Went 12-3 with a 2.58 ERA (40 ER/139.2 IP) in 24 starts aged 21 or younger.
- A Soroka's 24 starts before turning 22 are fourth-most in franchise history since 1908, and the most since Steve Avery made 56 such starts.
- A He is one of 145 pitchers in the live-ball era (since 1920) to make at least 24 starts aged 21 or younger...Of those 145 pitchers, Soroka's 2.58 ERA was fifth lowest, trailing just José Fernandez (2.25 in 36 starts), Dwight Gooden (2.28 in 99 starts), Mark Fidrych (2.34 in 29 starts) and Vida Blue (2.36 in 49 starts).
- A Lost to Washington, 7/20 at SunTrust Park, to snap a 10-game winning streak that spanned 15 starts...Allowed nine hits and four runs over 6.0 innings.
- A Became just the sixth Braves pitcher in the live-ball era (since 1920) with a double-digit win streak and the first since Greg Maddux also won 10 straight in 2001.
- A Went 9-1 with a 2.42 ERA (24 ER/89.1 IP) over 15 starts to open the season, and became the youngest pitcher in franchise history to be named an All-Star.
- A Made his All-Star Game debut with a scoreless sixth inning, July 9 at Progressive Field...Retired Whit Merrifield, Carlos Santana and Dan Vogelbach.
- A Allowed a then season-high four runs, including three earned, 6/1 vs. DET...The outing snapped a streak of eight straight starts allowing one earned run or less to start the season.
- A Was the third major league starter in the live-ball era to open his season with eight consecutive starts of one earned run or less, and the first Braves pitcher to do so...Edinson Vólquez (2008) and Mike Norris (1980) also did so.

Career Recap

- A Selected by Atlanta with the 28th overall pick in the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.
- A Is 23-20 with a 2.84 ERA (117 ER/370.2 IP) over 69 career minor league games, including 67 total starts.

Saves/Opp: 1/1 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 37/29 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 20/6

- Is 1-0 with 3.90 ERA (12 ER/27.2 IP) in 37 games with Atlanta...Thirty of his 37 appearances have been scoreless, including 17 of his last 21.
- Converted his first save chance of the season, 8/14 vs. NYM...Was the seventh save of his career.
- Celebrated 10 years of major league service time on July 27.
- Has a 27.00 ERA (6 ER/2.0 IP) against LAD this season...Has a 2.10 ERA (6 ER/25.2 IP) against all other teams.
- Twenty of his 37 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .160 (8-for-50) average with 17 strikeouts...Righties are 13-for-53 (.245).
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignment by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

Saves/Opp: 1/3 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 20/14 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/4

- Is 0-1 with a 4.42 ERA (9 ER/18.1 IP) in 20 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.24 ERA (14 ER/56.1 IP) in 58 games on the season...He has converted 23 of 28 save opportunities.
- Snapped a streak of 13 consecutive scoreless appearances on 9/7 vs. Washington...Held opponents to just four hits while striking out 14 through 13.0 innings during the streak...Logged his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 vs. WSH.
- Allowed runs in four of his first six appearances with the Braves, and allowed all four inherited runners to score.
- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...At the time ranked fourth in the AL with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

Luke Jackson • RHP • 6-2 • 210 • 27 yrs • #77

Saves/Opp: 18/25 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 63/41 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 23/11

- Is 8-2 with a 3.97 ERA (29 ER/65.2 IP) in 63 games this season...Has converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for third most in the majors.
- Has eight wins in relief this season, the most by a Braves reliever since Oscar Villarreal also had eight in 2006.
- Per Statcast, has an expected batting average of just .209 and an average exit velocity of 87.9 mph...Opponents are officially batting .270 (70-for-259).
- Left-handers have just 16 hits in 97 at-bats (.165) against him...Righties are hitting .333 (54-for-162).
- Has fanned 90 batters in 65.1 innings for a career-best 12.40 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
- Earned his 18th save, 8/11 at Miami...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002
