TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 9-game, 10-day homestand with the second of 3 games against the Tampa Bay Rays (0-1)...Seattle has hosted the Minnesota Twins (2-1) and the Detroit Tigers (1-2) on the homestand...following an off-day Monday, the Mariners will embark on a 3-city road trip at the Yankees (3 G, 8/11-13), at the Astros (3 G, 8/14-16) and at the Brewers (3 G, 8/18-20)...tonight's game will be streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Rays in last night's series opener by a 2-1 final...the Mariners are 41-15 (.732) when they score at least 4 runs in a game and 35-8 (.814) when they score at least 5 runs.

- **2-Out Rally** - Seattle has hit 116 home runs with 2-outs since 2025, ranking 5th in MLB during that span behind the Yankees (129 HR), Phillies (127), Astros (118) and Mets (117).
- **Quality Check** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has recorded 54 quality starts this season, the most in the American League and 2nd-most in MLB behind only the Dodgers (62 G).
- **Making a Ruckus** - **Michael Rucker** has been stellar out of the Mariners bullpen as of late, holding a 2.20 ERA (4 ER, 16.1 IP) with 4 walks and 16 strikeouts over his last 15 games (6/30-c).
- **Yesterday's Moves** - The Mariners yesterday recalled RHP **Nick Davila** from Triple-A Tacoma...in a corresponding move, RHP **Cole Wilcox** was placed on the 15-day Injured List (left oblique strain).

50 SEASONS CELEBRATION WEEKEND CONTINUES...the Mariners continue their **50 Seasons Celebration Weekend** tonight, where they will reveal and honor the 50 greatest players in franchise history during a pre-game ceremony beginning at **5:30 p.m.**...last night, the Mariners kicked off the weekend with the first ever Alumni Home Run Derby following the game...the weekend will conclude tomorrow with 50 Seasons Pin Day giveaway.

STEFEN ROMERO WINS FIRST EVER ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY...last night, the Mariners hosted the first ever Alumni Home Run Derby...former Mariners outfielder **Stefen Romero** (2014-16) edged out current Mariners Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola** in the final round by a 12-11 score to earn the title of Derby champion...in addition to Romero and Nola, the 7 total Derby participants included Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, along with **Mike Cameron**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith**, **Ryon Healy** and **Bucky Jacobsen**...the Derby was DJ'd by **Julio Rodríguez** aka "**DJ Pleno**" and hosted by MLB Network studio host **Greg Amsinger**...in addition, Hall of Famer **Ken Griffey Jr.** served as the event's Commissioner, while the two teams were captained by Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** and **Nelson Cruz**.

MLB NETWORK VISITS T-MOBILE PARK...yesterday's 50 Seasons festivities were covered live by **MLB Network's Greg Amsinger** and former Mariners legend **Harold Reynolds**...special Mariners guests who joined the Network **pre-game** included **Rick Rizzs**, **Jerry Dipoto**, **Dan Wilson**, **Alvin Davis**, **Raúl Ibáñez**, **Bret Boone**, **Jay Buhner**, **Ruppert Jones** and **Ken Griffey Jr.**

J-ROD PUTTING ON A SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** went 2-for-4 with a solo home run and a stolen base in last night's series opener...he has hit safely in his last 7-consecutive games (7/31-c), batting .400 (10x25) with 3 runs, 2 homers, 5 RBI and 2 stolen bases during the span...Julio is also approaching his 5th-consecutive 20+ homer season and with 2 more home runs would become the 8th player since 2022 to record 5 seasons with 20+ home runs, joining Pete Alonso-NYM/BAL, Rafael Devers-BOS/SF, Manny Machado-SD, Matt Olson-ATL, Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD, Kyle Schwarber-PHI and Juan Soto-3Tms...he would also join Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodriguez as the only Mariners players to accomplish the feat at age 25-or-younger.

KIRBY BUMP DAY...today's starter **George Kirby** is coming off an impressive last outing, tossing 7.0 shutout innings with only 5 hits and 1 walk allowed with 3 strikeouts on Aug. 2 vs. Minnesota...over his last 4 home starts since June 17, Kirby has posted a 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP) with 3 walks and 21 strikeouts...his 1.67 home ERA ranks 5th in the Majors during that span (min. 25.0 IP), trailing only Troy Melton-DET (1.23 ERA), **Bryan Woo** (1.37), Robbie Ray-SF/SD (1.41) and Sean Burke-CWS (1.42).

COLE "COLE YOUNG" YOUNG...in 20 games since the All-Star Break, **Cole Young** is batting .308 (24x78) with 9 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 6 walks, reaching base at a .365 clip and slugging .487 for an .852 OPS over 85 plate appearances...Young ranks as the **best second baseman** in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (3.6).

RANDYLAND...**Randy Arozarena** faces off against his former team this weekend...Randy played for the Rays from 2020-24, where he was an All-Star (2023), Rookie of the Year (2001) and ALCS MVP (2020)...Randy was acquired by the Mariners on July 26, 2024...in 109 games this season, Randy is batting .282 (113x401) with 73 runs, 24 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 49 RBI, 20 stolen bases, a .376 OBP and slugging .451 for an .827 OPS and 138 OPS+...Randy ranks 2nd among MLB left fielders with 3.7 Wins Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) and ranks T-12th among all qualified hitters in OPS+.

FUEGO FROM THE 'PEN...closer **Andrés Muñoz** locked down his 20th save of the season in Wednesday's 4-2 win...the right-hander tossed a perfect inning with a pair of strikeouts...for Muñoz, it marks his third consecutive 20+ save campaign, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) as the only Mariners with three consecutive 20+ save seasons...Muñoz also has 98 saves in his career, inching closer in becoming the 40th pitcher in MLB history to record 100 saves by age 27-or-younger...97 of his 98 saves have come with the Mariners (1 with San Diego), 3 saves shy of becoming the fourth pitcher in Seattle history with 100+ saves, joining Sasaki (129 SV), Edwin Díaz (109) and J.J. Putz (101).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** last night hit his 18th home run of the season and the 4th of the second half, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...**Rodríguez's** 63 career home runs in the second half of the season rank 9th-most in MLB and 3rd-most in the American League since 2022, when he made his Major League debut?...Julio trails only Aaron Judge-NYY (89 HR) and teammate **Cal Raleigh** (72 HR) as the only AL players to hit more second half homers during that span...Rodríguez has hit 130 career home runs, ranking 5th in the AL since 2022.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 8

- **1988** - Harold Reynolds was named the American League "Player of the Week" for the week of August 1-7.
- **1997** - Randy Johnson strikes out 19 for the second time in the season in a 5-0 win vs. Chicago.
- **2001** - Edgar Martinez blasts a 2-run HR vs. Toronto, giving him 1,000 career RBI.
- **2016** - Hisashi Iwakuma won his eighth consecutive home start, surpassing Félix Hernández for most wins in consecutive home starts in Mariners club history.
- **2025** - **Cal Raleigh** hit a go-ahead 3-run home run in the 8th inning to give the Mariners the 3-2 win over Tampa Bay...it marked his 43rd home run of the season, and his 35th as a catcher which ties him for the most home runs by an American League catcher with Iván Rodríguez-TEX (1999).

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 22nd start of the season and 1st against the Rays...will be the 134th start of his career and his 6th career start against the Rays.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on Aug. 2 vs. Minnesota, threw 7.0 scoreless innings (0 ER) and allowed 5 hits and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...he threw 94 pitches (62 strikes) in his 21st start of the year...he has tossed 7.0+ innings in 5 starts this season and has cleared the 6th inning in 13 of his 21 starts.

THE HOME STRETCH...over his last 4 home games since June 17, Kirby owns a 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts to 3 walks (7.00 K/BB) and a 0.963 WHIP...his 1.67 ERA is his best mark across a 4-game span at home since he recorded a 1.07 ERA (3 ER, 25.1 IP) from May 13-July 2, 2024...his 27.0 innings pitched are tied for the most he has tossed across a 4-game span at home in his career (done 2x prior, last: 6/17-8/2/26)...he has also recorded a quality start in each of his last 4 home starts, tied for the 2nd-longest streak of QS at home in his career, trailing a 9-game streak he held from April 15-July 20, 2024.

GOOD TO BE HOME...owns a career 1.46 BB/9 at home which ranks 2nd-best in MLB since 2022 (min. 200 IP) while his 6.31 SO/BB ranks 4th-best...since 2025, he has thrown 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 16-of-24 home games, including 7 times this season, with 4 of the 7 such outings being 7.0+ IP (last: 8/2 vs. MIN)...the Mariners the Mariners are 12-4 in such games since 2025 and 6-1 this season...his 38 career home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed are tied for 5th-most in Mariners history, matching Freddy Garcia and just trailing Mike Moore (38)...his 38 games are also T-3rd most in MLB since 2022.

KEEPING THEM CLOSE...has thrown 6.0+ innings without an extra-base hit allowed in each of his last 2 home starts and in 3 total starts this season...his 21 career games of 6.0+ IP and 0 XBH allowed are T-4th most since 2022, alongside Corbin Burnes-3Tms...the Mariners pitching staff has combined for 13 games of 6.0+ IP and 0 XBH this season, 3rd-most such games this year...they are also 13-0 in those games.

AGAINST THE RAYS...is making his 6th career start against the Rays and is facing them at T-Mobile Park for the 3rd time in his career...in his last home start against the Rays on July 1, 2023, he tossed 7.0 innings and allowed 2 runs (2 ER) on 2 hits and 2 walks with 7 strikeouts...has thrown a quality start in 3 of his 5 prior starts against the Rays.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he **leads the Majors** in fewest walks allowed (119), walks-per-nine innings (1.4), and walk rate (3.8%) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.14), just trailing Tarik Skubal-DET/LAD (6.23).

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 13 quality starts this season (last: 8/2 vs. MIN), tied for 5th-most in the AL and tied for 9th-most in MLB...his 76 career quality starts are 3rd-most in the AL since 2022 and are 5th-most in MLB across that span...has thrown 39 career quality starts without any walks allowed (4x this season, last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022, ranking ahead of Zack Wheeler-PHI (29 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 21 career home games (last: 6/17 vs. BAL), most in MLB since 2022...his 21 such games at home are also 3rd-most in Mariners history, trailing Jamie Moyer (22 G) and Félix Hernández (22 G).

KEEPING THEM ON THEIR TOES...owns a 37.8% chase rate this season, for 8th-best in MLB among qualified pitchers while posting a 35.8% career chase rate, ranking T-12th among qualified pitchers since 2022 (*Fangraphs*)...According to *Baseball Savant*, his 698 swing and misses on pitches outside the zone rank 9th-most in the AL since 2022, while his 351 strikeouts are also 9th-most...has struck out 59 batters on pitches outside the zone this season...of pitchers in MLB with over 250 strikeouts on pitches out of the zone since 2022, his 111 walks are the 7th fewest.

PLAYING THE LONG GAME...has pitched into the 6th inning in 18 of his 21 starts this year, T-7th most in MLB, and has cleared the 7th inning in 5 of those starts...his 127.0 IP through his first 21 starts are the 2nd most he has pitched over a 21 game span to start the year, trailing his 128.2 IP through his first 21 starts in 2023.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 15.0 pitches per inning this season tied for the 8th lowest mark in MLB among qualified pitchers...has tossed 6 quality starts with 90-or-fewer pitches thrown in the outing this season, T-7th most such starts in MLB...records a first pitch strike 65.6% of the time in 2026, 8th highest in MLB with a first pitch swing 37.5% of the time, T-5th highest in MLB this season...owns 87 strikeouts to 10 walks (8.7 K/BB) with a 1.005 WHIP after a 0-1 count.

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the **Mariners franchise** (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.14)...ranks 6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.61), 2nd in WHIP (1.139), trailing **Logan Gilbert** (1.050) and 9th in total strikeouts (731 SO), only 9 strikeouts away from tying Erik Hanson (740) for 8th most in Franchise history.
