**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed the day off on Thursday...On Wednesday the Mets defeated the Marlins, 6-5, in 11-innings...The Mets finished their opening road trip, a six-game trip to Houston (1-2) and Miami (2-1)...Today, the Mets open the 2025 Citi Field schedule with a three-game set against the Toronto Blue Jays.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the team will wear a tribute uniform patch all season long to honor Mets Hall of Famer Ed Kranepool...Kranepool passed away on September 8, 2024, at age 79...Kranepool played for the Mets from 1962-1979, spending his entire 18-year career with the Mets...He was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a 1965 All-Star and the club's all-time leader in games played...Kranepool remains in the Mets all-time top 10 in many statistical categories including plate appearances, hits, at-bats, total bases, doubles, RBI, walks and runs scored...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1990.

**TAKE ME HOME, CITI ROADS:** The Mets are 41-22 (.651) in Home Openers, including 11-5 at Citi Field...The Mets have won the home opener in four of the last five seasons.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** Today, the Mets will play their first game at Citi Field this year when they take on the Blue Jays at 3:10 p.m...Ahead of the game, the Empire State Building will be lit blue and orange beginning at sunset on April 3 and continue through April 4 for the home opener...Fans can purchase tickets to all 2025 Mets home games at the Citi Field box office or by visiting mets.com/tickets or calling 718-507-TIXX.

**IN THE CITI:** New York finished the 2024 season going 46-35 at home, including a 46-34 record at Citi Field (one home game in London)...The Mets went 33-12 at Citi Field from June 12 until the end of the season...The team lost consecutive games at home only three times in that period...New York posted a 3.57 ERA at home, which was sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL...The Mets went 43-38 at Citi Field in 2023, posting a 3.89 ERA.

**THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE:** This year marks the first time in franchise history that the Mets open their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 1-2 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague play last year...Overall, New York owns a 279-278 record in Interleague play.

**MEGILL, MY BELLE:** RHP Tylor Megill is set to take the bump today...He is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA (1 ER/5.0 IP), one walk and six strikeouts through one start this season...In 39 career games (36 starts) at Citi Field, Megill is 13-9 with a 3.80 ERA (81 ER/192.0 IP), 74 walks and 197 strikeouts...He has made three career starts against the Jays and is 1-0 with a 0.52 ERA (1 ER/17.1 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** The Mets sport a 2.38 ERA (14 ER/53.0 IP) this season...That places them fourth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit...Only the Padres (1.57 ERA) and Dodgers (1.97 ERA) have a lower mark in the NL...This includes a 2.90 ERA (10 ER/31.0 IP) from the starting staff and a 1.64 ERA (4 ER/22.0 IP) from the relief staff...The Mets bullpen is second in the majors with a 1.64 ERA...Only the Padres (0.68 ERA) have a lower mark.

**JAYS-METS NOTES:** The Mets will host the Blue Jays at Citi Field for the first time since 2023...The Mets won 12 straight games against the Blue Jays in New York from September 1, 1997 - May 15, 2018...Since then, the team is 2-5 against the Jays in NYC.

**WALK IT OFF:** The Mets have had three walk-off wins during their home opener...Joe Torre delivered an RBI single off Steve Carlton to beat the Phillies on April 8, 1975...Gary Carter slugged a 10th-inning walk-off home run in his first game with the Mets to beat the Cardinals, 6-5, on April 9, 1985 and Alberto Castillo had a 14th-inning RBI single to lift the Mets over the Phillies, 1-0, on March 31, 1998.

**MENDOZA LINES:** Carlos Mendoza returns for his second season at the helm of the Mets...He was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 45-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including his last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén...He became the second manager in Mets history to earn a Postseason berth in his first season, joining Buck Showalter in 2022.

**TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME:** The Mets are expecting near capacity crowds all weekend long...To avoid delays, fans are encourage to arrive early to Citi Field...The fastest and easiest way to the game is to use mass transportation via the Subway or the LIRR.

**HOMECOMING:** Megill will get the nod in the team's home opener today...He is one of 11 pitchers to start the home opener since Citi Field's inaugural season in 2009 and joins Johan Santana (2010 and '12), Jacob deGrom (2015-16, '20) and Noah Syndergaard (2017-19) as the only pitchers to take the mound on the home opener multiple times (also: 2023).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Megill made his first start of the season on March 28 at Houston, earning the win after allowing one earned run over 5.0 innings pitched (3 H, BB, 6 K, WP)...Retired each of his first nine batters faced...Allowed his only run on a sac fly to Yordan Alvarez in the fourth inning.

**TYLOR MADE:** The Mets recorded the win in each of Megill's last seven starts, dating back to August 30, 2024...Tylor has gone 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (9 ER/36.0 IP), 11 walks and 42 strikeouts during that stretch, recording back-to-back quality starts on September 9 and 17...He also has held opposing batters to a .212/.272/.288 slash line in those games.

**STARTING OFF STRONG:** Megill has made 12 career starts in the months of March and April, going 8-2 with a 2.76 ERA (19 ER/62.0 IP), 22 walks and 56 strikeouts in those games...Since making his first Opening Day roster in 2022, Megill's eight wins in March/April are tied for the third-most in the majors (tied for first in NL)...His 2.76 ERA in March/April is the sixth-lowest among National League pitchers since 2022 (min. 50.0 IP).

**AGAINST TORONTO:** Megill has made three career starts against the Blue Jays, going 1-0 with a 0.52 ERA (1 ER/17.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He has held Toronto batters to a .138/.242/.172 slash line...Two of his three outings were quality starts, the last coming in his only appearance against Toronto in 2024 where he allowed just one hit over six scoreless innings on September 9 at Rogers Centre (2 BB, 9 K).

**ACROSS LEAGUE LINES:** In 18 career games (16 starts) in Interleague games, Megill has went 6-2 with a 3.43 ERA (32 ER/84.0 IP), 31 walks and 88 strikeouts...Has made one start against Interleague opponents this season, earning the win after allowing just one earned run over 5.0 innings on March 28 at Houston...In six Interleague games last season (five starts), he held opposing batters to a .225 (23-102) average...The right-hander allowed just one home run to a total of 116 batters faced, posting a 0.33 HR/9.0IP ratio...He also recorded a 10.73 K/9.0IP ratio (33K/27.2 IP) in those games...Among National League pitchers who faced at least 100 American League batters in 2024, his K/9.0 and HR/9.0IP both ranked eighth.

**HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL:** In four Spring Training starts, Megill went 0-2 with a 4.24 ERA (8 ER/17.0 IP)...He allowed just one home run to 66 total batters faced...The right-hander last pitched on March 22 against Washington, tossing a spring-high 88 pitches over 5.1 innings.

**2024 RECAP:** Over 16 games (15 starts) in 2024, Megill went 4-5 with a 4.04 ERA (35 ER/78.0 IP), adding 32 walks against 91 strikeouts...The right-hander allowed three runs or less in 11 of his 15 starts, including each of his last six starts of the season (August 30 - September 30)...He recorded at least six strikeouts in nine starts, tied for his most such starts in a single season (also: 2021)...Among National League pitchers, his 10.50 K/9.0IP ratio was tied for the ninth-best (min. 75.0 IP)...Megill pitched in the Postseason for the first time in his career, making appearances in Game 2 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia (1 ER/1.1 IP) and in Game 3 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL (4 ER/3.0 IP)...Was on the 15-day Injured List from April 1 - May 20 with a right shoulder strain...In seven starts with Triple-A Syracuse in July and August, Megill went 2-0 with a 4.67 ERA (18 ER/34.2 IP) with 41 strikeouts...Also made four combined rehab appearances (April 27 - May 12) with Brooklyn (A+), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA), posting a 0.64 ERA (1 ER/14.0 IP) with one walk and 23 strikeouts.

**CAREER HIGHS:** Megill established career bests in ERA (4.04), K/9.0IP (10.50), HR/9.0IP (0.92) and FIP (3.62) in 2024, surpassing his previous season records of a 4.52 ERA (2021), 9.94 K/9.0IP ratio (2021), 1.28 HR/9.0IP ratio (2023) and 3.82 FIP (2022).

**FAMILY MATTERS:** His brother, Trevor, plays for the Milwaukee Brewers...Tylor and Trevor both debuted in the majors in 2021...*Elias* notes that there have been three other pairs of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000: Scott and Tyler Heineman (2019), Joe and A.J. Jimenez (2017) and Donovan and Jhonatan Solano (2012)...The Megill brothers join teammates Luisangel Acuña (Ronald Acuña Jr.) and Edwin Díaz (Alexis Díaz) as three of 13 pairs of siblings to both make 40-man rosters this season...Courtesy of *Elias*.

**CAREER NOTES:** Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2022, '24)...Over parts of four Major League seasons with the Mets, Megill has combined to go 22-21 with a 4.52 ERA (174 ER/346.1 IP), 131 walks and 352 strikeouts over 75 games (68 starts)...Was originally drafted by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arizona.

- Got the final two outs and picked up the save in the Mets 6-5 win on April 2 at Miami...It was his first career save after not recording one in his first 118 career appearances.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on Opening Day (March 27) against Houston...Was the ninth time in his career he's pitched at least 2.1 innings and the first time since July 3, 2024, at Boston when he threw 3.0 scoreless innings.
- Made his second career Opening Day roster and his first with the Mets.
- Appeared in nine Grapefruit League games and finished with a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts.
- Was on the Mets NL Wild Card roster but did not appear in the series.
- Began last season with Miami before he was acquired by the Mets on July 30 in exchange for INF Wilfredo Lara.
