HAPPY ANNIVERSARY, GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK!

On this date in 2003, the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular season game in **Great American Ball Park** history...the **Bucs** spoiled the occasion with a 10-1 victory.

- Reds Hall of Famer **Reggie Sanders** started in RF for **Pit** and belted the first home run in stadium history, a 2-run shot off Reds starter **Jimmy Haynes** in the 2nd inning...**CF Kenny Lofton** and **C Jason Kendall** also homered in the **Pirates'** 6-run 2nd inning.
- RHP Kris Benson** started for **Pit** and held the Reds to 1 run over 6.1 innings to earn the victory.
- Reds Hall of Famer **Ken Griffey Jr.** collected the ballpark's first official hit with a 1st-inning double off **Benson**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Luke Henne's Pirates** and the fifth game (3-1) of a 6-game season-opening homestand...the Reds took 2 of 3 games from the visiting **Red Sox** to open the 2026 campaign.

- Following tomorrow's game vs **Pit** and the off day on Thu, the Reds will begin their 2026 road schedule with a 3-game series at **Tex** (Fri-Sun) and a 4-game set at **Mia** (4/6-4/9).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **1b Sal Stewart** yesterday was named National League Player of the Week for 3/25-3/29...He's the 10th Reds rookie to win NL Player of the Week honors since the award's inception in 1973 (last: **Rece Hinds**, 7/8-7/14, 2024).

- Stewart** is the fifth Red to win the award in the season's first week (others: **Kal Daniels** 1988, **Eddie Milner** 1984, **Johnny Bench** 1983, **Dave Collins** 1980).
- In the 3 games vs **Bos**, he went 7-for-10 with a home run, 3 doubles, 3 walks, and 5 hard-hit balls (exit velo of +95mph).

OUR PAL SAL: In last night's 2-0 win vs **Pit**, **1b Sal Stewart** went 1-for-2 with 2 walks...it was the fourth time in 4 games to open the season that he reached base at least 3 times.

- Stewart** is the fourth Reds player since 1900 to reach safely at least 3+ times in each of the team's first 4 games of a campaign, joining **Kal Daniels** (1988), **Joe Morgan** (1975), and **Ival Goodman** (1937).
- Sal** is just the second Major League rookie since 1958 to accomplish the feat (**Cle's Steven Kwan**, 2022).
- Stewart** (4g) is 1 of 4 players to have reached base 13 times so far in 2026, the others are **Hou's Jose Altuve** (13x, 5g), **LAA's Mike Trout** (13x, 5g), **Sea's Brendan Donovan** (13x, 5g).

THERE'S A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: In last night's 2-0 win vs **Pit**, **RHP Chase Burns** earned his first career win (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP) and **RHP Connor Phillips** picked up his first career save (1.0ip, 0h, 2bb, 1k).

- Burns** and **Phillips** became the eighth pair of Reds teammates since saves became an official stat in 1969 to earn their first win and save, respectively, in the same game...the last duo to do it was **RHP Julian Aguiar** and **RHP Casey Kelly** on 8/24/24 at **Pit**.

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Terry Francona** returns for his second season after guiding the 2025 Reds to their first Postseason berth since 2020 and their first during a full season since 2013...his 83-79 Reds were the 12th Postseason club he has managed in the majors.

- Francona** finished as the runner-up to **Mil's Pat Murphy** for the **2025 National League Manager of the Year Award**.
- He became the fifth skipper in Reds history to lead the team to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), & **Patrick Moran** (1919).
- Francona** became the 12th manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason (Cin, **Cle**, **Bos**).
- His 2,035 career wins as a Major League manager lead all active skippers and rank 12th in Major League history.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds finished 7-6 vs the **Pirates** in 2025, Cin's first winning season series vs the **Bucs** since 2021 (13-6).

- The Reds swept the **Pirates** in 3 games at **Great American Ball Park** last April (4/11-4/13)...it was Cin's first sweep of **Pit** since 8/5-8/8, 2021 at **GABP** (4g).
- Cin has played the **Pirates** 509 times since both teams became charter members of the **National League Central** in 1994 (265-244, .521), more than any other **Pit** opponent.
- Cin owns a 107-87 (.552) record all-time vs **Pit** at **Great American Ball Park**...the Reds and **Pirates** played the first regular-season game at **GABP** on 3/31/03 (10-1 **Pirates** triumph).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: With last night's 2-0 win vs **Pit**, the Reds have avoided being swept in 33 consecutive home series (min. 1g, including this one) dating back to 2024...it's the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept in **Cincinnati** in a franchise-record 52 consecutive home series.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the Cin teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

SPRING RECAP: The **Reds** finished 2026 Spring Training action with a 14-17 record, going 9-6 at Goodyear Ballpark (including when **Cin** was the "away" team vs **Cle**) and 5-11 on the road...the overall record reflects the 2 exhibition games the Reds lost vs the **Brewers** in Milwaukee on Mon and Tue.

- Reds** batters concluded their spring schedule ranked among Major League leaders in extra-base hits (129, 1st), average exit velocity (91.6 mph), home runs (55, T1st), total bases (535, 2nd), slugging pct (.499, 2nd), hard-hit balls (237, 2nd), and runs scored (182, 6th).
- The **Reds'** 55 home runs were their most in a single Spring Training season since 2006 (as far back as ST data is available), surpassing the previous best of 44 set by the 2024 club.
- Temperatures in the Phoenix area ran 20-30 degrees above normal this March and reached over 100 degrees for 5 consecutive days leading up to the Reds' departure on 3/22.
- Cin** earned its 200th win all-time in Cactus League action with a 3-2 victory on 2/25 at **CWS**.
- The Reds were successful in 37 of their 62 ABS challenges this spring.

WELCOME BACK, WILLIE: Will make his first Major League appearance since 9/17/24 vs Atl, a span of 560 days.

- Missed all of last season as he recovered from left elbow reconstruction surgery (10/9/24).

SPRING RECAP: Went 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA in 5 appearances (3 starts) during Spring Training (16.1ip, 12h, 3r/3er, 3bb, 15k, 2hr, 246 TP).

ACQUIRED FROM THE MARINERS: Was acquired from the Mariners with RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley, and a player to be named (RHP Connor Phillips, 3/29/22), for 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker on 3/14/22.

- When obtained by the Reds in March 2022, his curveball was rated by *Baseball America* as the best in the Mariners' organization.
- Was originally selected by the Mariners in the second round (59th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-0 loss vs Bos on Opening Day (3/26)...threw 6.0 shutout innings (7h, 1bb, 4k, 83 TP).

- Was his first Opening Day start, becoming the 19th different left-handed pitcher to start for the Reds in a season opener since the club joined the National League in 1890 (last: Mike Remlinger, 1998).
- Became the ninth Reds starter since 1890 to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings in a season opener (last: Frankie Montas, 2024)...is the second Cin lefthander to ever accomplish the feat (also: Johnny Vander Meer, 1943).
- Snapped the Reds' streak of 27 consecutive season openers started by a right-handed pitcher...was the longest such run in franchise history.
- At 26 years, 298 days old, became the youngest left-handed pitcher to start a Reds' season opener since Don Gullett (24-091) in 1975.
- Reds manager Terry Francona on 3/8 announced Abbott as the Opening Day starter.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-3 with a 11.72 ERA in 6 Cactus League starts (17.2ip, 28h, 25r/23er, 8bb, 22k, 6hr, 362 TP).

- His final Cactus League tuneup came on 3/21 in the 11-7 win over the White Sox in Goodyear (4.2ip, 4h, 5r/3er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 84 TP).

AWARD TOUR: Following the 2025 season, received from the local chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America the 2025 Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the Reds' Most Outstanding Pitcher.

- Became the sixth Reds pitcher since the Vander Meer Award was established in 1969 to receive both awards in the same season.
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher (eighth occurrence) to be named team MVP.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.37 ERA through his first 76 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.19, 1977-82).

PERSONAL: Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "Hangman" Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
