TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 28, 2006: Former Yankees pitcher Steve Howe dies in a car accident at the age of 48. Howe spent six seasons (1991-96) with the Yankees, going 18-10 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 229 relief appearances (227.0IP, 90ER, 116K).

April 28, 1989: Rickey Henderson hits the 36th leadoff home run of his career in a 3-1 win vs. the White Sox at Yankee Stadium, snapping a tie with Bobby Bonds (35) and giving Henderson sole possession of the all-time record.

April 28, 1985: Billy Martin is named manager for the fourth time, replacing Yogi Berra after the Yankees get off to a 6-10 start.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 29, 2006: The Yankees score at least one run in every inning of a 17-6 win vs. Toronto at Yankee Stadium, marking the second such time in franchise history and the sixth in American League history.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set at Milwaukee (1-1 thus far)...will also play a four-game series at Baltimore from Mon.-Thurs....went 4-3 on their recent homestand after winning two-of-three games vs. Tampa Bay and splitting a four-game set vs. Oakland.

- Their 18-10 record (.643) is tied with Philadelphia for the fifth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (18-7, .720), Cleveland (19-8, .704), Baltimore (17-9, .654) and Milwaukee (17-9, .654)...their 18 wins are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (19).
- Marks the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 18-10 or better to start a season (also went 20-8 in 2010 and '22, 19-9 in 2017 and 18-10 in 2018)...with a win today, would also mark the fifth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 19-10 or better to start a season (went 21-8 in 2010 and '22, 20-9 in 2017 and 19-10 in 2018).
- The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 5-4 so far.
- **Are 3-0 in rubber games this year.**
- Have won or split seven of their eight completed series (6-1-1) this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Brewers, 15-3, on Saturday at American Family Field...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.0IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 1BB, 8K, 1HR) started and earned his second win of the season...**LF Alex Verdugo** (3-for-5, 2R, 1HR, 4RBI, 1SF) recorded a season-high-tying 3H and recorded a career-high-tying 4RBI, hitting a three-run HR in the first inning and a sac fly in the ninth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (3-for-6, 1 double, 3RBI) recorded a season-high 3H and hit a bases-clearing double in the third inning...**3B/1B Oswaldo Cabrera** (1-for-5, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the fifth inning...**CF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit a two-run HR in the sixth inning...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (3-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI) recorded a season-high 3H and hit a two-run HR in the sixth inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5, 2R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit a three-run HR in the ninth inning...**RF Juan Soto** (1-for-3, 2R, 2BB) and **C Austin Wells** (2-for-5, 1 double, 1BB) each reached base three times...**RHP Luke Weaver** (2.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief...**Jose Trevino** (1.0IP, 2H, 2R/ER, 1BB) made his first career pitching appearance.

- Improved to 7-3 following a loss this year.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.19 ERA (152.1IP, 54ER) in 28 starts this year, the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.11), Philadelphia (2.13) and Kansas City (2.86)...**have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of their 28 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 17 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 12 starts.**

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.01 ERA (254.0IP, 85ER) this year, the second-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.63).

- Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 18 of 28 games this year (are 13-5 in those games)...are 16-5 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.
- Rank fifth in the Majors in opponents' BA (.217) and opponents' SLG (.349) and sixth in opponents' OPS (.647).

VERDAWGO: OF Alex Verdugo recorded a season-high-tying 3H and a career-high-tying 4RBI on Saturday at Milwaukee... homered in his second straight game, hitting a three-run HR in the first inning...has homered in consecutive games for the eighth time in his career and first since his only three-game HR streak from 8/24-26/23 with Boston.

- Batted cleanup in the starting lineup on Saturday for the first time this season and first since 9/28/23 at Baltimore with Boston...batted cleanup in the starting lineup eight times in 2023, 34 times in 2022 and three times in 2021.
- **Has hit .350/.446/.600 (21-for-60) with 13R, 6 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 11BB, 1HP, 15B and 25F in his last 18 games** (since 4/8)...has reached base multiple times in six of his last seven games (since 4/21) and 11 of his last 18 games.
- His 12.67 plate appearance per strikeout ratio (114PA/9K) is the best in the Majors this season...**has struck out just once in his last 38PA** (since ninth inning on 4/17).

GLEYSBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres recorded a season-high 3H and hit a bases-clearing double in the third inning on Saturday at Milwaukee...is 6-for-19 (.316) with 1 double and 3RBI over his last four games (since 4/24).

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton reached base three times and hit a three-run HR in the ninth inning on Saturday at Milwaukee...is hitting .286/.348/.587 (18-for-63) with 12R, 4 doubles, 5HR, 15RBI and 6BB over his last 18 games (since 4/6).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters set season highs on Saturday in runs (15), hits (19) and home runs (4)...their 15R were their most in a game since their 16R on 7/6/22 at Pittsburgh...their 19H and 26TOB were their most since 8/25/22 at Oakland (20H and 26TOB).

- **Have hit 12HR over their last five games** (since 4/23) after hitting 3HR in their previous seven games (4/15-22).
- Have scored at least 4R in 19 of 28 games this season, at least 5R in 16 games and at least 6R in 11 games...**their 16 games with at least 5R are the most in the AL and third-most in the Majors**, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (17) and Atlanta (17).
- Lead the Majors in walks (122), pitches per plate appearance (4.10) and plate appearances per walk (8.83), are tied for third in home runs (34) and rank fourth in on-base percentage (.335).
- **The Yankees are 18-3 (.857) this season when scoring at least 3R**, the second-best such record in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (19-3, .864).
- Yankees batters are hitting .365/.410/.712 (19-for-52) with 3 doubles, 5HR, 28RBI, 5BB, 1HP and 3SF with RISP in their last seven games (since 4/21).

RODOMINANT: LHP Carlos Rodón earned the win on Saturday at Milwaukee after allowing just 1R/ER in 6.0IP...his 8K on Saturday were also a season high...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his six starts this season and 2R-or-fewer in five of those starts, going 2-1 with a 2.48 ERA (32.2IP, 9ER) this year.**

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo hit his fourth HR of the year and the 299th of his career on Saturday at Milwaukee...with his next HR, would become the 12th active player to reach 300 career home runs...would join Giancarlo Stanton (408), Mike Trout (378), Joey Votto (356), Paul Goldschmidt (342), Nolan Arenado (326), Freddie Freeman (322), Manny Machado (317), J.D. Martinez (315), Bryce Harper (312), Carlos Santana (304) and Andrew McCutchen (302).

- Has hit 30 career home runs against the Brewers, the third-most among active players, trailing only Joey Votto (43) and Andrew McCutchen (39)...his 18HR at American Family Field are his second-most at any ballpark as a visitor, trailing only his 24HR at Great American Ball Park.

STRO SHOW: RHP Marcus Stroman will make his sixth start of the year today at Milwaukee...is 2-1 with a 2.93 ERA (27.2IP, 9ER) and 28K in five starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in four of his five starts and 2ER-or-fewer in three of those starts.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times and hit his fifth HR of the year with a two-run HR in the sixth inning on Saturday at Milwaukee...over his last five games (since 4/23), has reached base in 10-of-24 PA (.417 OBP)...has hit 2HR in his last four games (since 4/24).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: INF Anthony Volpe turns 23 years old today (DOB: 4/28/01).

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto reached base three times for the second straight game on Saturday at Milwaukee...has reached base safely in 25 of his 28 games this season, hitting .324/.443/.581 (34-for-105) with 20R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 23RBI, 24BB, 15B and 25F...has reached base multiple times in each of his last four games and in 18 of his 28 games this year.

- Leads the Majors in walks (24), ranks second in times on base (58, first in AL) and OBP (.443, first in AL), third in WAR among position players (1.9 - FanGraphs, tied for second in AL), fifth in OPS (1.024, first in AL), tied for fifth in RBI (23, tied for third in AL), and ninth in SLG (.581, third in AL)...is also tied for fourth in the AL in BA (.324), ranks fifth in runs scored (20) and tied for fifth in hits (34).

- Is the third Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2007) to reach base at least 58 times in the club's first 28 games of a season, joining Aaron Judge (58TOB in 2018) and Derek Jeter (58TOB in 2012)...is also just the third Yankee in that span to record at least 24BB in the club's first 28 games of a season (also Aaron Judge-25BB in 2018 and Nick Johnson-24BB in 2010).

NEWYORK GIANTS: OF Aaron Judge and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton both homered on Saturday at Milwaukee...marked the 33rd time the pair has both homered in the same game with the Yankees during the regular season (since 2018), tied for the sixth-most such games by a pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history, trailing only Lou Gehrig and Babe Ruth (73), Yogi Berra and Mickey Mantle (55), Bob Meusel and Babe Ruth (47), Mickey Mantle and Roger Maris (42), and Jorge Posada and Alex Rodriguez (37)...Derek Jeter and Jorge Posada (33), and Bill Dickey and Lou Gehrig (33) also homered in the same game 33 times - credit Elias...the Yankees are 29-4 in those games (the duo has also homered in four Yankees postseason games, with the team winning each of those games).

#17 AARON BOONE—Manager**Career Managerial Record: 527-371 (8th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Billy Martin, 556)**

- The 2024 season marks his seventh year at the helm for the Yankees (also 2018-23)...guided the Yankees to an 82-80 record in 2023, finishing fourth in the AL East...marked the Yankees 31st consecutive winning season and sixth such season under Boone...has led the Yankees to two division titles (2019 and 2022).
- According to *Elias*, was the first Manager in Baseball history to reach the postseason in each of his first five managerial seasons...was the third Manager to make the playoffs in his first five seasons with the Yankees (2018-22), joining Casey Stengel (first five from 1949-53) and Joe Torre (first 12 from 1996-2007).
- Was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21 to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...was named the 33rd Manager in club history on 12/4/17...is the 18th person to both play for, and manage, the Yankees... is one of eight active managers to have played for the franchise he currently manages, joining Kevin Cash (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (Boston), A.J. Hinch (Detroit), Mark Kotsay (Oakland), Dave Martinez (Washington/Montreal), Bob Melvin (San Francisco) and Dave Roberts (Los Angeles-NL).
- Has 35 career managerial ejections (two in 2024: 4/22 vs. OAK, 4/10 vs. MIA; seven in 2023; nine in 2022; six in 2021; two in 2020; five in 2019; four in 2018).

- Eleven of his 23H have driven in a run this season.
- Is batting .345/.333/.483 (10-for-29) with 1 double, 1HR, 12RBI and 1SF with RISP this season.
- Hit an RBI single in the fifth inning on Saturday at Milwaukee (1-for-5, 1RBI)... went 1-for-4 with 1R, 1BB and 1SB on Friday at Milwaukee.
- Is 8-for-27 (.296) with 4R, 3 doubles, 1HR, 4RBI and 5BB in seven career games vs. the Brewers.
- Batted .211 (63-for-298) with 35R, 11 doubles, 5HR, 29RBI, 25BB and 8SB in 115 games over four stints with the Yankees in 2023 (3/30-5/31, 6/3-18, 6/22-7/22 and 8/3-10/1)...appeared defensively at all three outfield positions (LF - 51G/34GS, RF - 49G/25GS, CF - 1G), 3B (15G/13GS), 2B (6G/3GS), SS (5G/5GS) and 1B (1G)... according to *Elias*, was just the third player in franchise history to play all three outfield positions and all four infield positions in a single season, joining Clay Bellinger (2000) and Wid Conroy (1905).

- Entered the game as a DR in the seventh inning (CF) on Saturday at Milwaukee (0-for-2).
- Hit his first home run of the season with a go-ahead three-run shot in the fourth inning on Friday at Milwaukee (1-for-2, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB)...marked his first home run since 9/8/23 at Houston with San Diego...was replaced by a PH (Stanton) in the 10th inning.
- Was originally drafted by Milwaukee in the first round (15th overall) in the 2015 First-Year Player Draft...in one season with the Brewers (2019), batted .231 (36-for-156) with 24R, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 6HR, 24RBI and 1SB in 51 games...was acquired by the San Diego from the Milwaukee along with RHP Zach Davies in exchange for LHP Eric Lauer, INF Luis Urias and a player to be named later or cash considerations on 11/27/19.
- In 153 games with the Padres in 2023, hit .198 (93-for-469) with 67R, 31 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR, 50RBI, 75BB and 15SB...set career highs in games played, runs scored, doubles, walks and stolen bases.
- Is a two-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020, '22)...was just the fourth player in Padres history to win multiple Gold Gloves, joining Tony Gwynn (five), Steve Finley (two) and Dave Winfield (two).

- Appeared in seven games with Milwaukee in 2023 over two stints (7/3-9 and 7/16-28), hitting .200 (2-for-10) with 2R, 1 double, 3RBI, 1BB and 1SB.
- Spent the majority of the 2023 season in Triple-A, hitting .268/.413/.466 (95-for-354) with 71R, 28 doubles, 3 triples, 12HR, 48RBI, 83BB and 12SB in 103 combined games with Oklahoma City (Los Angeles-NL) and Nashville (Milwaukee)... appeared defensively at second base (47G/46GS) and third base (1G/1GS) with Oklahoma City, and second base (10G/9GS), left field (18G/18GS) and right field (13G/12GS) with Nashville.

- Has reached base in 21 of his 28 games this season...has reached base multiple times in 15 of those games.
- Hit his fifth home run of the year with a two-run shot in the sixth inning on Saturday at Milwaukee (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB)... went 0-for-4 with 1BB on Friday at Milwaukee.
- Hit his fourth HR of the year with a two-run shot in the first inning on Wednesday vs. Oakland (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI)...marked the 261st home run of his career, surpassing Derek Jeter (260HR) for ninth place on the Yankees' all-time home run list.
- In 11 career games vs. Milwaukee, has hit .341/.491/.683 (14-for-41) with 9R, 2 doubles, 4HR, 7RBI, 11BB and 1HP.
- Hit .327/.441/.708 (37-for-113) with 24R, 4 doubles, 13HR, 27RBI, 23BB and 15B in 31 Interleague games in 2023...has batted .305/.407/.641 (147-for-482) with 97R, 23 doubles, 2 triples, 45HR, 90RBI and 80BB in 132 career Interleague games...since 2017, leads the Majors in SLG (.639) and OPS (1.047), and second in OBP (.408) and HR (44) in Interleague play.
- Batted .267/.406/.613 (98-for-367) with 79R, 16 doubles, 37HR, 75RBI, 88BB and 35B in 106 games with the Yankees in 2023...appeared defensively in RF (54G/50GS) and CF (18G/16GS)...was named the 2023 Roberto Clemente Award winner...was named a finalist for the Silver Slugger and Hank Aaron Award...was named to the All-MLB Second Team.
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list, his 37HR last season were the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the 10th-most in the Majors...was also tied for fourth in the AL in game-winning RBI (13) and ranked sixth in walks (88).
- Was just the second player in Major League history to hit at least 37HR in a season while playing in 106 games-or-fewer, joining Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland).
- The Yankees have gone 172-54 in his career when he homers...since 2020, the Yankees are 100-25 in those games.
- Has hit 262HR in 863 career Major League games, the most HR through a player's first 863 career games in Major League history (previous: Ryan Howard-252HR).
- Since 2017, leads the Majors in HR (258) and AB/HR (11.73), ranks second in SLG (.586) and OPS (.983), third in PA/BB (6.38), tied for third in game-winning RBI (83), fourth in OBP (.397) and walks (572), and 10th in runs scored (615).

- His 11.87 AB/HR ratio (3,110AB/262HR) is the third-best ratio in Major League history (min. 2,000AB), trailing only Mark McGwire (10.61) and Babe Ruth (11.76)...his .580 career slugging percentage is the 10th-highest in Major League history and his .973 OPS is the 15th-highest (min. 2,000AB).
- His 262 career home runs are the ninth-most in Yankees history...trails only Babe Ruth (659), Mickey Mantle (536), Lou Gehrig (493), Joe DiMaggio (361), Yogi Berra (358), Alex Rodriguez (351), Bernie Williams (287) and Jorge Posada (275)...are also the second-most HR as a member of the Yankees among players drafted and signed by the organization, trailing only Posada (275HR, 1990).
