TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 1 of a best-of-3-game Wild Card series vs the **NL West Division Champion Dodgers**...is the Reds' first appearance in the Postseason since the 2020 Wild Card Series vs **Atl** (0-2), and their first Postseason berth in a full season since the 2013 Wild Card Game at **Pit**, a 6-2 loss.
- The Reds entered the 2025 Postseason as the National League's #6 seed, while the **Dodgers** are #3...the winner will face the **Phillies** (#2) in the Division Series with Games 1, 2, and 5 taking place in **Philadelphia**.

ROSTER: The Reds finalized their Wild Card Series roster by deactivating **RHP Brady Singer** and **RHP Zach Maxwell**...the full WC roster is on page 4.

TAKE A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE: For the first time in franchise history, the Reds clinched a playoff berth on the final day of the regular season (*Elias*).

- The Reds and **Mets** entered Sun's regular season finale vying for the National League's final Wild Card spot...both teams finished the year with identical 83-79 records but Cin earned the trip to the **Postseason** by virtue of winning 4 of 6 vs **NYM** during the regular season.
- Following the 5-4 loss to the **Mets** on 9/5, the Reds trailed **NYM** and **SD** by 6.0 games for the final WC position with 21 games remaining.
- Since then, the Reds went 13-8 while the **Mets** finished 7-14.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a half-game of that last spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 to fall 6.0 games off the pace...they entered the 9/23 game vs **Pit** tied with **NYM**, marking the first time after the All-Star break that they held a Postseason position.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both **SF** and **AZ** during a 3-11 run.
- The Reds and **Mets** finished the 1999 season with matching 96-66 records and tied for that year's final WC spot...the **Mets** defeated the Reds, 5-0 at **Cinergy Field** in a 1-game playoff on 10/4 (game 163) to eliminate Cin from contention...had today's tiebreaker rules applied that year, the Reds would've earned the Postseason berth.

TERRY'S TEAM: Terry Francona is managing in his 12th Postseason.

- Is 44-34 (.564) in the Postseason with **Bos** (2004, 2007-09) and **Cle** (2013, 2016-18, 2020, 2022).
- Won the World Series twice with **Bos** (2004 & 2007) and managed in the Fall Classic again with **Cle** in 2016.
- His 44 Postseason wins match Hall of Famer **Jim Leyland** for seventh-most in Major League history.
- Is now the 12th different manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason.
- Is the fifth manager in club history to manage the Reds to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), and **Patrick Moran** (1919)...also reached the Postseason in his first year as manager with **Bos** (2004) and **Cle** (2013)...is only the third skipper in Major League history to accomplish this feat with 3 different franchises, joining **Joe Torre** (1982 w/ **Atl**, 1996 w/ **NYN**, 2008 w/ **LAD**) and **Dusty Baker** (2003 w/ **Chc**, 2016 w/ **Wsh**, 2020 w/ **Hou**)...courtesy *Elias*.
- Earlier this season, became the 13th manager in Major League history to reach 2,000 career wins.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and **Dodgers** are meeting in the Postseason for the second time...the Redlegs swept **LAD** in 3 games the **1995 National League Division Series**.

- LAD** won 2 of 3 at **Great American Ball Park** this year from 7/28-7/30.
- The **Dodgers'** 3-game sweep of Cin from 8/25-8/27, 2025 ended the Reds' streak of not having been swept in 43 straight series dating back to September 2024.
- The Reds swept **LAD** in 2024 at **GABP** (3g, 5/24-5/26) was the first series sweep vs **LAD** since 5/10-5/13, 2018 (4g) at **Chavez Ravine**.
- The **Dodgers** are 457-417 vs Cin since they moved to **LA** in 1958.
- Cin and **LAD** combined for 14 National League West titles during the 25 seasons in which both clubs competed in the division (1969-1993).

POSTSEASON: Tonight is making his Postseason debut.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-inning, 4-3 loss vs Pit on 9/24 (6.0ip, 5h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 7k, 0hr, 96TP)

- Opposed Paul Skenes, who threw 6.0 shutout innings.
- Was his second straight quality start and his sixth over his last 8 appearances.
- Was his second consecutive homerless outing, his ninth of the season.

SEPTEMBER 18 vs CHC: Pitched his first career 9-inning complete-game shutout in the 1-0 vs Chc on 9/18 (9.0ip, 1h, 1bb, 9k).

- Became the third Reds starter this year to throw a 9-inning shutout (Abbott 6/10 at Cle & Lodolo 7/23 at Wsh).
- Became the first Reds pitcher to throw a 9-inning shutout at Great American Ball Park since RHP Scott Feldman on 5/7/17 vs SF.
- Was his eighth career start of 7.0 innings or more and 2 hits or fewer.
- Carried a no-hitter into the 7th inning before allowing a 2-out double to Seiya Suzuki...marked the second-longest no-hit bid of his career (7.1ip on 5/15/22 at Pit).
- Was perfect before Moisés Ballesteros reached on a fielding error by SS Elly De La Cruz to open the 5th inning...was the second-longest perfect bid of his career (4.2ip on 7/28/24 at TB).

SEPTEMBER 13 at ATH: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-5 loss at Ath on 9/13 (2.1ip, 4h, 5r/5er, 4bb, 3k, 2hr, 84TP).

- Was the shortest start of his career.
- His 4 walks were a season high.
- Left game in the 3rd inning...the last batter he faced, Jacob Wilson, hit a double off his left ankle...was not injured.
- Threw 17 pitches in the 1st inning, 36 pitches in the 2nd inning, and 31 pitches in the 3rd.
- Recorded his 600th career strikeout (1st inning, Nick Kurtz)...became the fastest Reds pitcher by appearances (89) to reach 600 K since 1900, surpassing Luis Castillo (96g, 2017-21)...became the sixth-fastest Major League starter by innings (479.1ip) to reach 600 K.

SEPTEMBER 7 vs NYM: Earned the 6-4 win vs NYM on 9/7 (7.0ip, 1h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 12k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Was his longest outing since 4/13 vs Pit (also 7ip).
- Struck out each of the first 5 batters he faced in the game for the second time in his career (6 straight Ks to open the 7/11/24 game vs Col).
- Was his 12th career double-digit strikeout game.
- Was his seventh career outing of 7.0 or more innings and 2 hits or fewer allowed.
- Was his ninth quality start of the season, the fourth over his last 5 appearances.

SEPTEMBER 1 vs TOR: Did not factor in the decision in the 5-4 win vs Tor on 9/1 (6.1ip, 5h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 7k, 101TP).

- Was his eighth quality start of the season, the 37th of his career.
- Retired 16 of 17 batters from innings 2-7...allowed each of his last 3 batters to reach in the 7th (double, walk, RBI-single) before turning it over to Scott Barlow, who retired the final 2 batters in the inning.
- Eclipsed the 100-pitch mark (101) for third time this season, the first time since 5/2 vs Wsh (114TP).
- Was his seventh homeinless start of the season.
- His 6th-inning strikeout of Andrés Giménez was his 100th of the season.

AUGUST 25 at LAD: Suffered the 7-0 loss on 8/25 at LAD (5.0ip, 6h, 5r/3er, 2bb, 3k, 2hr, 99TP).

- Was his first loss since 5/28 at KC.
- Was the first time since 4/26 at Col that he gave up multiple home runs.
- Allowed 6 hard-hit pitches (*batted balls with an exit velo at 95mph or higher*), the most he's given up in an outing since 4/19 at Bal (also 6).

AUGUST 19 at LAA: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-4 win at LAA on 8/19 (6.1ip, 6h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 12k, 1hr, 98TP).

- Became the 10th different Reds pitcher over the last 125 years with as many as 12 strikeouts and no walks in a single game; the first since Tyler Mahle on 6/13/22 at AZ.

SINCE HE RETURNED FROM IL: Went 3-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 8 starts since he returned from the injured list on 8/13 (right groin strain)...were his first 8 starts since 6/3.

- Made 4 rehabilitation appearances with R-ACL Reds (1g, 2ip) and AAA-Louisville (3g, 11ip) where he pitched to a 6.23 ERA over 13.0 innings (10h, 11r/9er, 5bb, 24k, 4hr).

STRIKE-THROWER DELUXE Pt. 1: His 617 strikeouts are the second-most by a Reds pitcher through his first 4 seasons, trailing LHP Noodles Hahn (658, 1899-1902).

- Is the third Cin pitcher since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 to record 100+ strikeouts in each of his first 4 career seasons, joining Johnny Cueto (2008-2011) and LHP Noodles Hahn (1899-1902).
- Reached 600 strikeouts in 89 apps, faster than any other Reds pitcher since 1900, surpassing Luis Castillo (96g, 2017-21).

STRIKE-THROWER DELUXE Pt. 2:

- Threw first-pitch strikes to 68.6% of the batters he's faced (288 of 420)...*league average in 2025 was 62.0%*
- Was ahead in the count to 55.2% of his batters (232 of 420)...*league average in 2025 was 48.2%*
- Among plate apps with at least 3 pitches, 2 of his first 3 offerings were strikes to 63.1% of the batters he's faced in 2025.
- Had 30 three-pitch strikeouts this season.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Has produced 12 career double-digit strikeout games (most recently 9/7 vs NYM, 12k)...ranks sixth among all Reds pitchers since 1893 with 12 double-digit strikeout games (*courtesy Elias*).

KEEPIN' IT 100: Has thrown 768 pitches at least 100mph, the most by a starting pitcher in the pitch track era (Jacob deGrom, 2nd, 323).

VS TOP OF THE ORDER: Held top of the order batters (1,2,3) in 2025 to a .168/.239/.268 slash (25-for-149).

VS LEFTIES: Held left-handed batters to a .195/.258/.407 slash (43-for-221, 12hr, 17bb, 62 times on base).

PRONUNCIATION: Last name is pronounced "lih-TELL".

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-1 win on 9/26 at Mil (4.2ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 3k, 0hr, 85TP).
• Allowed 5 of his 20 batters to reach.
• Issued 2 walks in a game for the first time since 8/22 (3bb).
• Finished the regular season with 496 career strikeouts.

SEPTEMBER 20 vs CHC: Earned the 6-3 win on 9/20 vs Chc (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 73TP).
• Extended his single-season career high with his 10th win.
• Retired 13 of his final 15 batters...the 2 that reached came via HR (Michael Busch in the 3rd inning & Reese McGuire in the 5th inning).
• Allowed 4 of his 19 total batters to reach.
• Reds were leading 3-2 when he exited after the 5th.

SEPTEMBER 15 at STL: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-7 win on 9/15 at StL (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 0bb, 3k, 0hr, 86TP).
• Was his seventh consecutive outing without a decision.
• Was the fifth time over his last 7 apps that he allowed 3 or more runs.
• Was his 13th start without issuing a walk.
• Retired 12 straight from the 2nd inning to the 6th...set down the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th but allowed each of his next 4 to reach (3r), which proved his ouster.

SEPTEMBER 9 at SD: Did not factor in the decision in the 4-2 loss on 9/9 at SD (6.0ip, 2h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 0hr, 94TP).
• Marked the third time in his career that he pitched as many as 6.0 innings in a game while allowing 2 hits or fewer (9/19/04 vs Bos & 9/13/24 at Cle).
• Allowed just 4 of his 22 batters to reach.
• Retired 11 in-a-row from the 1st inning through the 4th...retired each of his last 5 batters.
• Hit a batter for the first time since 6/22.
• Was his 17th quality start of the season, his fourth in 7 starts for the Reds.
• Threw first-pitch strikes to 15 of his 22 batters.

SEPTEMBER 3 vs TOR: Did not factor in the decision in the 13-9 loss on 9/3 vs Tor (4.1, 7h, 5r/5er, 1bb, 6k, 4hr, 88TP).
• Didn't hold a 5-run lead...all 5 of his runs came via HR.
• His 4 HR allowed matched a season high for the third time (6/11 at Bos & 4/10 vs LAA).

AUGUST 29 vs STL: Did not factor in the decision in the 7-5, 10-inning loss on 8/29 vs StL (7.0ip, 6h, 4r/3er, 0bb, 4k, 2hr, 97TP).
• Was his 12th start in which he didn't issue a walk and his ninth in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings without a BB.
• Was his 30th career quality start (16th this season, 3rd for the Reds).
• Allowed 4 runs (3er) on 6 hits and 2 home runs over the first 3 innings...retired each of the the final 14 batters he faced.

AUGUST 22 at AZ: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-5, 11-inning loss on 8/22 at AZ (3.0ip, 4h, 4r/3er, 3bb, 3k, 1hr, 77TP).
• Was his shortest start since a 2.0-inning effort for TB at Atl on 6/14/24.
