THE PIRATES: began their penultimate homestand of the 2026 campaign vs. San Francisco (1-0, Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (Friday-Sunday) with a 13-12, walkoff win in Tuesday's series opener vs. the Giants at PNC Park...Went 4-5 on their recent season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, August 21-23), San Diego (2-1, August 24-26) and St. Louis (2-1, August 28-30)...Have hit 163 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have the most hits (1216) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the fourth-most runs (682) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Chicago-NL (746), Washington (735) and Milwaukee (695), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs all of last season (they are looking to become only the fourth team in Major League Baseball history to finish top three in the league in runs scored the year after finishing last in the league in runs scored and the first since Chicago [AL] did it in 1915).

A WILD NIGHT: Brandon Lowe scored the game-winning run in the ninth inning of Pittsburgh's 13-12, walkoff win on Tuesday vs. San Francisco...It was the Pirates' first walkoff win without an RBI since Adam Frazier scored on a game-ending wild pitch in the 10th inning of a 6-5 win on May 23, 2025 vs. Milwaukee...Pittsburgh's 13 runs were its most in a walkoff win since April 21, 1991, when Don Slaught had a game-ending, two-run double in the 11th inning of a 13-12 win vs. Chicago at Three Rivers Stadium...The Pirates have won back-to-back home games via walkoff (also August 19 vs. Detroit) for the first time since April 6-7, 2024 vs. Baltimore...Tuesday marked their longest nine-inning home game (3:38) since August 3, 2022 vs. Milwaukee (3:49).

ONE-RUN FUN: The Pirates have won back-to-back games by one run after picking up a 5-4 win on Sunday afternoon at St. Louis and a 13-12 win on Tuesday night vs. San Francisco...They last won three consecutive contests by one run each from June 6-8, 2025, when they won each game of a three-game sweep vs. Philadelphia by one run apiece...Pittsburgh's 13 runs in Tuesday night's walkoff win vs. San Francisco were its most in any one-run win since its 13-12 win on September 23, 2023 at Cincinnati.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: Pittsburgh can win its third straight series (also August 24-26 at San Diego and August 27-29 at St. Louis) with a win tonight vs. San Francisco...The Pirates last did that last year from September 19-21 vs. the A's, September 23-25 at Cincinnati and September 26-28 at Atlanta.

FOUR BY FOUR: Oneil Cruz had four hits and four RBI on Tuesday vs. San Francisco...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the third Pirate in the Expansion Era (since 1961) with four hits and four RBI through the first five innings, along with Al Oliver (four hits/six RBI) on May 3, 1973 at San Francisco & Kevin Newman (four hits/four RBI) on Aug. 29, 2019 at Colorado.

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe posted his fourth career four-hit game (first since July 25, 2024 at Toronto) on Tuesday vs. San Francisco...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Gene Alley (May 17-18, 1971) and Bryan Reynolds (August 3-4, 2022) as the only Pirates in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to score the winning run in a walkoff win in back-to-back home games.

PRIME NINE: The Pirates scored nine runs in the third inning on Tuesday vs. San Francisco...They also posted 10-run innings on April 13 vs. Washington (sixth) and July 12 vs. Milwaukee (fourth)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the fourth time in team history (since 1887) that Pittsburgh has had three innings of at least nine runs in any season, along with 1893, 1894 and 1944.

MORE WITH LESS: Pittsburgh did not have an extra-base hit in its nine-run third inning on Tuesday vs. San Francisco...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it was the Pirates' second inning with at least nine runs and zero extra-base hits in the Expansion Era (since 1961)...They also scored nine runs without an extra-base hit in the eighth inning of a 10-0 win on May 26, 2003 at Chicago (NL).

Starter Charlie Morton improved to 7-3 after allowing just two runs (one earned) and striking out six Brewers over his 7.0 innings of work. Jose Tabata went 3-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored out of the leadoff spot in the Pirates' victory that afternoon.
