TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Robert Livingston's Rockies** and the third game of Cin's longest road trip of the 2026 season, a 10-day/9-game journey that includes upcoming series at **Sea** (Mon-Wed) and **StL** (Fri-Sun).

- The Reds return home to **Great American Ball Park** on 7/27 to begin an 11-day/10-game homestand against the **Guardians** (7/27-7/29), **Pirates** (7/30-8/2), and **Athletics** (8/4-8/6).

FEEL THE BURN(S): Cincinnati Reds President of Baseball Operations **Nick Krall** on Sat announced that the club has agreed to terms with **RHP Chase Burns** on a new 7-year, \$105-million contract extension through the 2033 season.

- Burns**, 23, earned his first career All-Star nod after posting an 11-1 record with a 2.54 ERA and 118 strikeouts in his first 18 starts this season.
- Selected by Cin with the 2nd-overall pick of the 2024 MLB Draft, **Burns** became the second Red to ever earn an All-Star nod within 2 years of being drafted (also: **Scott Williamson**, drafted in 1997 and AS in '99).
- The Reds own a 14-4 record in his 18 starts this season, including wins in each of his last 6 appearances and in 10 of his last 11.

SMART STEERING: In Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**, **INF/OF Spencer Steer** capped off his fifth career multi-homer game (last: 6/2 vs **KC**) with an inside-the-park homer off **Jeff Criswell** in the 8th inning.

- Marked his first career inside-the-park home run and the first by a **Reds** batter since **Noelvi Marte** on 9/24/25 vs **Pit**.
- Steer** on Fri became the fifth **Red** in the expansion era (since 1961) to hit an inside-the-park homer as part of a multi-HR game (see chart below).
- The first of **Steer's** 2 homers, a 2-run shot in the 6th inning, marked his 200th career extra-base hit...also reached 300 career RBI on the HR.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE: **INF Elly De La Cruz** and **INF/OF Spencer Steer** both recorded their 200th career extra-base hit in Fri's 7-2 win at **Col**...became the first pair of Major League teammates since 1900 to each collect the 200th extra-base hit of their respective careers in the same game.

- At 24 years, 187 days old, **De La Cruz** became the fourth-youngest **Red** to reach 200 career extra-base hits since 1900, behind **Vada Pinson** (23y/13d), **Johnny Bench** (23y/126d), & **Frank Robinson** (23y/234d).
- De La Cruz**, who had a career-high-tying 4 hits on Fri at **Col**, also became the second Major Leaguer since 1900 with 200+ XBH and 150+ SB within his first 4 career seasons (also: **Juan Samuel**, 1983-86 w/**Phi**).

POWER SURGE: The Reds rank ninth in the majors with 125 homers...have scored 48.6% of their 405 runs via the HR (197), the second-highest rate in MLB.

- Lead MLB this season with 9 sets of back-to-back home runs.
- On Fri at **Col** hit at least 4 homers in a game for the seventh time this season (last: 7/8 vs **Phi**), tied for the most-such instances in MLB.
- Hit *back-to-back-to-back* HRs in the 4th inning on 7/8 vs **Phi** (**Elly De La Cruz**, **Sal Stewart**, **JJ Bleday**)...marked their 15th set of 3 straight home runs in the expansion era (since 1961).
- Are on pace to hit 206 homers this season, which would mark the 10th time in club history reaching 200 HR.
- Have hit a Major League-leading 27 homers to the opposite field this year, 6 more than the next closest team (**Phi**).
- Are 1 of 6 teams in the majors to boast 6 players with 10 or more HR (also: **NY Yankees**, **Sea**, **Pit**, **Atl**, and **LAD**).

TOUGH SLEDDING: The Reds have dropped 11 of their last 16 games and 14 of their last 21 games.

- Went 20-11 (.645) to begin the year...entered May a season-high 9 games over .500 and in first place in the NL Central (+1.0)...ended the month 2 games over .500 and in fifth place (-6.0).
- Beginning 5/1, have gone 24-42 (.364)...since 6/1, have gone 14-25 (.359).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 126-118 all-time vs the **Rockies** (52-71 in **Colorado**)...Cin took 2 of 3 at **Great American Ball Park** from 4/28-4/30.

- From 4/25-4/27, 2025 the Redlegs swept the **Rockies** at **Coors Field** for the second consecutive season...have won 7 of their last 8 games and 8 of their last 10 in the **Mile High City**.
- Since 6/19/23 Cin has won 17 of 21 overall vs **Col**, including 10 of 13 at **Great American Ball Park**.
- The 7/12/25 game was the first in the Reds/**Rockies** all-time series to feature a walkoff win since Cin's 3-2 victory on 9/2/22...the Reds are 15-6 all-time in walkoff games vs **Col**.
- Cin's 4-2 win at **GABP** on 7/13/25 marked **Terry Francona's** 2,000th career victory as a Major League manager.

GENO MACHINO: **DH Eugenio Suárez** homered in a season-high 3 straight games from 7/11-7/17, marking the 10th time he hit a homer in at least 3 consecutive games in his career (last: 7/19-7/21, 2025 w/**Diamondbacks**).

- Hit his 201st career homer as a member of the **Reds** on Fri at **Col**...is 2 HR shy of tying **Eric Davis** for 10th place on the club's all-time list.
- Had his season-long on-base streak snapped at 17 games on Sat at **Col**.

STAR-STUDDER: **RHP Chase Burns** and **INF Sal Stewart** represented the Reds as National League All-Stars at the 2026 MLB All-Star Game in Philadelphia.

- It was the first career All-Star selection for both players...2026 marks the third straight year in which Cin had multiple All-Stars.
- Burns** did not pitch in the Midsummer Classic...**Stewart** entered as a defensive replacement at third base and went 0-for-1 with a walk.
- Burns** and **Stewart** are the third set of teammates in Reds history to each earn an All-Star selection at age 23 or younger in the same season (**Johnny Bench** and **Wayne Simpson** in 1970, **Frank Robinson** and **Vada Pinson** in 1959).

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOKS: **SS Elly De La Cruz** (498 career games) on 7/12 vs **Chc** became the second player in MLB history to produce at least 75 HR and 150 SB within his first 500 career games, joining Reds Hall of Famer **Eric Davis**, who had 107 HR and 190 SB through his first 500 career games.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 4-0 win on Fri, 7/12 vs Chc (7.0ip, 3h, 0r, 1bb, 12k, 93TP).

- Marked his 41st career quality start.
- Was his ninth career outing of 7.0 or more scoreless innings, his first since 9/18/25 vs Chc (9.0ip, 0r).
- Became the ninth Reds pitcher since 1900 to strike out 12 or more batters over 7.0 or more scoreless innings (last: Tyler Mahle, 6/14/22 at AZ).
- Was his 13th double-digit strikeout game (last: 9/7/25 vs NYM).
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 19 of his 25 batters.
- Allowed 4 baserunners.
- Held batters to 2-for-17 when ahead in the count, and 1-for-16 with 2 strikes.
- Held the Cubs to 0-for-5 with runners in scoring position.
- 68 of his 93 pitches were strikes (73.1%), his highest such rate since 8/18/25 at LAA (74 of 98, 75.5%).

JULY 4 vs BAL (SEASON DEBUT): Was activated from the 60-day injured list on Sat, 7/4 and made his season debut in that afternoon's 8-5 loss vs Bal (3.1ip, 7h, 8r/8er, 4bb, 7k, 1hr, 1wp, 89TP).

- Was just the third time in his career that he allowed 8 or more runs in a game, the first time since 8/20/23 vs Tor (9).
- Matched his career high with 8 earned runs allowed.
- Produced 15 swings-and-misses (46 swings).
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 10 of 20 batters.
- Allowed as many as 11 baserunners for the first time since 10/1/23 at StL (12).
- Threw 24 pitches in the 1st inning, 18 in the 2nd, 18 in the 3rd, and 29 in the 4th.
- 5 of the 7 hits he allowed came vs left-handed hitters.

ON THE INJURED LIST: Missed Cin's first 87 games of the season while recovering from 3/11 surgery to remove bone chips from his right elbow.

- Made 3 rehabilitation appearances, including his first one on 6/18 for R-ACL Reds (vs R-ACL Cubs), and 2 more with AAA-Louisville (6/23 & 6/28 vs St. Paul)...did not allow a run in any of his 3 rehab apps (14.1ip, 5h, 13k, .106/.143/.170).
