BRINGING OUR WORK HOME: Owners of the best record in the majors, the Detroit Tigers tonight kick off a three-game series against the Athletics, continuing a stretch in which they play 15 of 21 games at home to conclude the month of June ... this six-game homestand ends with three games vs. the Minnesota Twins starting Friday \dots the Tigers hold the best home record in the A.L. and, at 26-12, are off to their best home start since a 27-11 mark through 38 games in 2010.

- In welcoming the Athletics, the Tigers will have now played all 14 other teams in the A.L. this season in addition to all five teams in the N.L. Central and four of the five teams in the N.L. West ... the Tigers next week will finally play their first N.L. East team of the season when they play at Washington on July 1 and still need to play Arizona from the N.L. West ... overall, the Tigers will have played 23 of the 29 teams in the majors in their first 80 games of the season.
- At 49-30, the Tigers have the best record in the majors, 1.0 game ahead of the Dodgers and 3.5 $\,$ games ahead of the Astros and Yankees for tops in the A.L. ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 79 games in 19 years when they began 54-25 in 2006 ... the Tigers are 31-18 in their last 49 games starting April 30.
- The Tigers are 9-3 through their first 12 series at Comerica Park this season ... Detroit has won at least nine of its first 12 series for only the ninth time in the 125-year history of the club, the first time since winning nine of their first 12 in 2016 ... thanks to Elias.

IT'S GOOD TO BE KING: Tarik Skubal is 8-0 with a 1.58 ERA (15 ER/85.1 IP) in his last 13 starts dating to April 8, featuring a 13.38 K/BB ratio during this span ... his eight-game winning streak is the longest winning streak, active or otherwise, by any pitcher in the majors this season.

- Skubal's eight-game winning streak is the longest same-season run by a Tigers pitcher since Max Scherzer had a 13-game winning streak 12 years ago from April 6-July 3, 2013.
- Skubal's eight-game winning streak is the longest same-season run by a Tigers southpaw in 30 vears since David Wells had a nine-game winning streak from May 23-July 26, 1995.
- Skubal tonight takes aim at his 50th career win, as he would become the 54th pitcher in franchise history to reach the mark, the seventh to reach 50 wins here in the last 30 years.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Tarik Skubal enters tonight's start with a 3.9 WAR this season, according to Fangraphs, by far the best mark of any pitcher in all of baseball and behind only two position players -- Aaron Judge (6.1) and Cal Raleigh (5.3) -- for the best WAR by any player in the American League ... Skubal has a 0.8 lead on the next closest A.L. pitcher -- Garrett Crochet (3.1) -- and is more than a point ahead of every other pitcher in the American League.

THIS IS ON THE RECORD: The Tigers have posted a 49-27 record, a .645 winning percentage, in their last 76 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 49-27 record, which is a 104-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 5.5-games up on the Astros, the next closest A.L. team.

GETTING ON WITH IT: Riley Greene on Sunday reached base safely for the 13th-straight game, tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the American League and three games shy of his season-high 16-game streak of reaching base safely from April 28-May 16 ... Greene is batting .380 (19-for-50) with six doubles, four homers and 17 RBI during this 13-game stretch ... he has a .439 on-base percentage and .740 slugging percentage, good for a 1.179 OPS during this run.

JUNE BOON: Riley Greene is now up to 19 RBI in June, trailing only Seattle's Cal Raleigh (24 RBI) for most in the A.L. this month ... Greene set a single-month best with 24 RBI last month in May and, with 43 RBI starting May 1, is second to only Raleigh (50 RBI) for most RBI in the A.L. starting May 1.

- Greene is looking to become the first Tiger to record 20 RBI in back-to-back calendar months in 12 years when Miguel Cabrera did so in May (33 RBI) and June (21 RBI) of 2013.
- Greene has 17 homers, 59 RBI and 37 extra-base hits this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals.

PRODUCE SECTION: Riley Greene (17 homers, 59 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 49 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the A.L., as they are the only set of teammates in the A.L. (and one of three in the majors) to have each reached 16 homers and 49 RBI.

GLEYBER PARTY: Gleyber Torres, who leads all A.L. second basemen in All-Star voting, has posted an .804 OPS this year, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. ... Torres also leads all major league second basemen with a .386 on-base percentage, leads A.L. second basemen with a .278 batting average and is second in the A.L. with 38 RBI ... www.tigers.com/vote.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the majors on the strength of a +82 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+105) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +105 edge on the second-place Guardians (-23), are +103 on the third-place Royals (-21) and are +101 on the fourth-place Twins (-19).

AND FINALLY: Tarik Skubal enters tonight with a nine-game winning streak at Comerica Park dating to last August 13, the longest active home winning streak by any starting pitcher in all of baseball.

- Threw the first complete-game shutout of his professional career on May 25 against Cleveland, tossing a "Maddux". He needed just 94 pitches (72 strikes/22 balls) to record 27 outs, with 13 of those coming by way of strikeout, tying his career high. His 13 strikeouts were the most strikeouts by any pitcher in major league history in a "Maddux".
- In that outing, he became the first pitcher in Tigers history to throw a complete game issuing zero walks and allowing no more than two hits with at least 13 strikeouts ... he is the first pitcher in the majors to record such a start since Jacob deGrom did so on April 23, 2021.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters on May 9 against Texas, marking the third 12-strikeout game of his career and his most in a game since his career-high 13 on July 7, 2024, at Cincinnati. With the outing, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to have 40+ strikeouts (50), no more than one walk (1) and an ERA under 1.00 (0.97: 4ER/37.0IP) over a six-start span since ERA became in official stat in both leagues in 1913.
- Went 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (5 ER/29.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and only four walks in five starts in April, a tick better than his April of 2024 when he went 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (7 ER/30.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and six walks in five starts en route to winning the A.L. Cy Young Award in unanimous fashion.
- Was the unanimous AL Cy Young winner in 2024, becoming the fifth Tiger to win the award, the first since Max Scherzer in 2013, and the second LHP in franchise history to ever do so (other, Willie Hernandez in 1984).
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher
 in franchise history and the 22nd pitcher in Major League history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal
 Newhouser (1945).
- Started three games during the postseason, compiling a 1-1 record with a 2.37 ERA (5ER/19.0IP) and 20 strikeouts...started his playoff career by not allowing a run in 17.0 consecutive innings, tied for the fifth-longest streak in MLB history and longest since Ian Anderson started his postseason career with 17.2 straight scoreless innings in 2020.

- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster after a standout spring camp, during which he didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief...went 1-0, surrendering seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.
