ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

2B Jonathan India is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cie's **Joe Jackson**, .468, 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426, 1926)...he entered today's game ranked third in the National League and fourth in the majors in on-base percentage (.404)...leads all Major League rookies in on-base percentge and walks (47)...ranks second among NL rookies in hitting (.276, Tyler Stephenson .278), RBI (38), OPS (.824), runs (48) and stolen bases (7)...in the first inning, leads the Major Leagues in hitting (.429) and on-base percentage (.523)...since he became the Reds' leadoff hitter on 6/5, ranks second in the Major Leagues in on-base percentage (.441, Freddie Freeman .450).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Brian Bartow's Cardinals** and **Game 8** (2-5) of a 10-day, 9-game homestand that included a **3-0 series sweep loss** to the **Brewers** and a **2-1 series loss** to the **Mets**... on Wed the Reds completed a stretch of **10 consecutive games vs first-place teams** (4-6), including **7 games vs the Brewers** (3-1 at Mil, 0-3 vs Mil, 1-2 vs NYM)...following this series, the Reds' first road trip of the second half takes them to Chi's **Wrigley Field** (4g) for the second time this season and, for the first time since **2019**, to NYM's **Citi Field** (3g).

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today placed on the 10-day injured list **RHP R.J. Alaniz** (left calf strain), recalled from Louisville **IF Max Schrock** (#32), traded to the Mets for cash **OF Mark Payton** and sent to Louisville on a rehabilitation assignment **RHP Michael Feliz** (right elbow sprain)...**Payton** made 24 apps for the Reds this season, all as a pinch hitter or defensive replacement...**Feliz** has been on the Reds' 10-day injured list since **6/8**.

SERIES NOTES: In their most recent meeting, in June, the Reds earned their first **4-game sweep in St. Louis** since **5/4-5/7, 1990**...are **7-4 vs StL** this season, including an active **5-game winning streak**...is their longest winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 5-game streak from **4/30-6/8, 2017**... haven't won more than 5 consecutive games vs StL since a 6-game winning streak from **5/5-5/14, 2003**...the Reds are **6-6-3** in their last **15 completed series** vs StL, including **1-1 this season**...**Joey Votto** has **202 apps** and **217 career hits** vs StL, both the most among active players (217-708, .306)...in the live ball era, his **career .423 OBP vs StL** ranks third among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** .477, **Ralph Kiner** .424)...the Cards' **.500 winning percentage at Great American Ball Park** (77-77) is the highest among **NL Central** opponents and the only winning percentage among division teams **at or above .500**.

CUBS UP NEXT: In their most recent meeting, over the **Fourth of July weekend at Great American Ball Park**, the Reds recorded their first **series sweep** of the Cubs (3g) since a **4-game sweep** from **6/21-6/24, 2018**, also at **GABP**...**Joey Votto** ranks third among all active players with **39 HR** and **128 RBI** against the Cubs, trailing in both categories only **Albert Pujols** (57-146) and **Ryan Braun** (40-141)...over 4 seasons from **2015-2018**, the Cubs' **.671 winning percentage** vs the Reds (51-25) was the best by any team against any division opponent...over the **last 5 seasons** the Cubs are **25-26** (.490) at **Great American Ball Park**.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds have lost **30** of their **last 44 games** at **Wrigley Field**, including **4** of the last **6 games** over the last 2 seasons... since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **28** of the **last 32 night games vs Cin** at **The Friendly Confines**.

COOPERSTOWN: The annual **Hall of Fame Awards Presentation**, featuring the 2020 and 2021 winners, will be held at noon tomorrow...**Al Michaels**, the 2021 winner of the **Ford C. Frick Award** for broadcasters, and **Dick Kaegel**, the 2021 winner of the **BBWAA's Career Excellence Award**, will be honored along with the 2020 award winners **Ken Harrelson** (Frick Award), **Nick Cafardo** (BBWAA Career Excellence Award) and **David Montgomery** (Buck O'Neil Lifetime Achievement Award)...**Michaels** will become the fifth **former Reds broadcaster** recognized in Cooperstown, joining **Red Barber** (1978), **Russ Hodges** (1980), **Marty Brennaman** (2000) and **Al Helfer** (2019)...the **2021 Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony**, scheduled for **Wed, 9/8** at Clark Sports Center, will celebrate the inductions of Class of 2020 members **Derek Jeter**, **Marvin Miller**, **Ted Simmons** and **Larry Walker**.

- **RHP Tejay Antone** (right forearm strain) next week will start throwing bullpens prior to a tentative rehabilitation assignment.
- **IF Alex Blandino** (broken metacarpal, right hand) next week is expected to begin a rehabilitation assignment with Louisville.
- **RHP Michael Feliz** (right elbow sprain) today was sent to Louisville for a rehabilitation assignment.
- **RHP Michael Lorenzen** (right hamstring strain) is rehabbing with the team.
- **3B Mike Moustakas** (right heel contusion) is rehabbing with the team.
- **IF/OF Nick Senzel** (5/28 left knee arthroscopic surgery) is expected to play CF and SS on a rehab assignment that could begin next week.
- **RHP Lucas Sims** (right elbow sprain) on Tuesday is expected to begin a rehab assignment with Louisville.
- **RHP Art Warren** (left oblique strain) is expected to continue his rehabilitation assignment at the Reds Player Development Complex in Goodyear.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Reds rank third in the Major Leagues and lead the National League with **27 come-from-behind wins** (Bos 31, TB 30)...**after the sixth inning**, Reds batters rank among the National League leaders with **171 runs** (2nd), **282 hits** (1st ML), **58 doubles** (2nd), **41 HR** (3rd), **.260 BA** (1st ML), **.431 slugging percentage** (1st ML) and **.344 on-base percentage** (1st ML)...from **7/1-7/5** the Reds trailed in 5 consecutive games but won all 5...was their longest such streak since **1918**.

Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

- Was the Reds' 2019 and 2021 Opening Day starting pitcher.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (35), starts (110), IP (628.1) and strikeouts (682).
- Went 1-8, 7.22 in 11 starts through May (.321oba) and 2-2, 1.76 in 9 starts since then (.178oba).
- In June posted a 1.71 ERA, the fifth-best ERA in the National League (Jacob deGrom 0.67, Max Scherzer 1.42, Zach Wheeler 1.44, Anthony DeSclafani 1.69).
- So far in July has posted a 1.82 ERA, second-best in the National League behind teammate Wade Miley (1.29).
- Has been the victim of a blown save 5 times this season, tied with Tayler Mahle and including each of his last 3 starts.
- In the 7-6 walkoff loss on 7/6 at KC, allowed only a fifth-inning, solo HR to Michael A. Taylor that snapped Castillo's 37-inning homerless streak.
- His 6-4 win on 6/4 at StL snapped his 7-game and 7-start losing streaks, both the longest of his career...was his first win since his second start of the season...in 9 starts between winning decisions went 0-7, 7.29 (.330oba), including 0-7, 7.91 over 7 consecutive starts (.324obp).
- Suffered an 11-6 loss vs StL in the second Opening Day start of his career...was the coldest Opening Day in Reds history (37 degrees).
- On 5/18 vs SF produced 8 strikeouts through the first 3 innings...became the first Reds pitcher with 10 strikeouts through a game's first 4 innings since Jim Maloney did it on 5/21/1963 at Mil.
- In 2019 averaged 10.67 strikeouts per 9 innings, the highest ratio in Reds history for pitchers with a minimum of 125 innings...in the shortened 2020 season averaged 11.44 strikeouts per 9 innings over 70 innings pitched...in 2021 is averaging 8.61 strikeouts per 9 innings.

- During 2021 spring training, after 8 apps was moved from third base to shortstop...Mike Moustakas moved from second base back to his native third base...Jonathan India became the starting second baseman.
- In Wade Miley's no-hitter on 5/7 at Cle made his first start of the season at 3B.
- Made most of his starts batting sixth in the order (34gs, team high)...also made 3 starts batting seventh (last, 7/11 at Mil), his first apps in a spot that far down in the lineup since 2016.
- From 5/25-6/4 made 9 consecutive starts batting leadoff, his only career apps in the top spot in the lineup...hit safely in 7 of his 9 games batting first and reached base safely in 8 of those 9 apps (8-38, .211, 3 solo HR, 3bb, 7r)...the Reds went 6-3 in the 9 games in which he led off.
- In the 2-1 win on 5/25 at Wsh made his first career start batting leadoff and in the sixth inning hit a solo HR off Max Scherzer that extended the Reds' lead to 2-0.
- In the 3-0 win on 5/27 at Wsh hit his first career leadoff HR (off Stephen Strasburg).
- Became only the sixth shortstop in Reds history to homer on Opening Day (solo off Jack Flaherty)...was the first Reds shortstop to do it since Barry Larkin in 1995.
- In 2019 established records for home runs in a season by a player from Venezuela and by a National League third baseman (49).
- Is approaching 200 HR (180) and 500 runs scored (479)...on 5/23 vs Mil made his 900th Major League appearance...on 6/13 vs Col reached his 500th career RBI on a 2-run HR off Antonio Senzatela.

- 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1bHomestand: 9-26 (.346), 2 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .469obp
- His 2-run double in the first inning last night produced his 1,009th and 1,010th career RBI, tying and then moving past Hall of Famer Frank Robinson into fourth place alone on the Reds' all-time list...Pete Rose is third with 1,036 RBI.
 - In his last 36 apps beginning 6/11 is hitting .310 (40-129, 6 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 25rbi, 20r, .407obp).
 - Beginning 7/2 has reached base safely in each of his last 17 apps, fourth-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (19-58, .328, 4 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 10rbi, .466obp, .534slg, 1.000ops).
 - From 5/7-6/6 missed 28 games while on the 10-day injured list with a broken left thumb...the Reds went 14-14 in his absence.
 - In his second appearance after he came off the 10-day IL, on 6/9 vs Mil, began a 6-game RBI streak that tied his career high (August 2010, April 2018)...the 12 RBI during that streak was the highest total over any 6-game span in his career.
 - In the 10-inning, 1-0 win on 5/5 vs WSox made his 1,800th Major League appearance...in the bottom of the fourth inning was hit by a Dallas Keuchel changeup and left the game after the fifth with the broken left thumb.
 - Did not play in the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min while serving a 1-game suspension for his actions on Sat at SD that led to his 13th career ejection.
 - In the third inning of the 8-6 win on 4/30 vs Cubs became the third Reds player and ninth active player with 300 career home runs...his 2-run HR off Jake Arrieta gave the Reds a 3-2 lead they would not relinquish...on the Reds' all-time home run list, with 307 HR trails only Hall of Famers Johnny Bench (389) and Frank Robinson (324).
 - In the eighth inning of the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 4/17 vs Cle recorded the first 2 outs of the Reds' 31st triple play, their first since 7/25/2017 at NYY...Josh Naylor lined into the 3-3-5 triple play...Votto also participated in the July 2017 triple play.
 - In the first inning of the 7-5 loss on 6/19 at SD was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 13th ejection of his career, his first this season...singled on the first pitch of his first plate appearance the next day.
 - In the eight inning of the 4-3 win on 7/10 at Mil was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 14th ejection of his career, his second of the season.
 - On 6/30 vs SD homered off Joe Musgrove for his 1,000th Major League RBI...was his 1,821st career appearance.
 - Made his 14th Opening Day roster...appeared in his 13th Opening Day game, fifth-most in Reds history, 1 game behind Johnny Bench and 4 games behind all-time franchise leaders Barry Larkin and Pete Rose (17).
 - Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
 - Holds franchise records for career games played at first base (1,790) and intentional walks (142)...shares with Joe Morgan the club career record for number of seasons with at least 100 walks (6).

- 33 JESSE WINKER, ifHomestand: 6-31 (.194), 3 2b, 2rbi
- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career...in the American League's 5-2 win at Coors Field, started in RF batting sixth behind teammate Nick Castellanos...in the second inning walked (Lance Lynn) and in the fifth grounded out (Nathan Eovaldi).
 - Through his third plate appearance on Sunday was hitting .290 (96-331), his lowest batting average of the season...since then is 6-for-19 (.316, 3 2b, 2rbi).
 - Hit .325 through June and .164 so far in July.
 - Hit safely in 65 of his 89 apps...reached base safely in 76 of his 89 apps...is on pace to reach base safely in 126 games...will fall short of the club record for number of games reaching base safely via hit, walk or HBP (150, Joey Votto, 2017).
 - On 6/6 at StL, in his 50th appearance hit his 15th, 16th and 17 home runs to establish a new single-season career high (2019, 16hr in 113g).
 - In the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min, in his 65th appearance, established a new career high with 45 RBI (2018, 43rbi in 89g).
 - Is the only player in Reds history to produce in a single season a pair of 3-homer games (5/21 vs Mil, 6/6 at StL)...most recently among Major Leaguers, Atl's Adam Duvall had two 3-homer games last season.
 - On 5/21 vs Mil became the 31st player in Reds history to produce 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 39th time (off Adrian Houser 2, Josh Lindblom)...had his second 3-homer game and a career-high 6 RBI in the 8-7 win on 6/6 vs the Cardinals that led the Reds to their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 1990.
 - Received votes for National League Player of the Month for May but finished behind SD's Fernando Tatis Jr....teammate Nick Castellanos also received votes.
 - Has 3 leadoff HR this season and 7 in his career.
 - From 5/21-5/23 vs Mil became the first Reds batter with 5 HR in a 3-game series since Willie Greene did it from 9/24-9/26, 1996 vs Cubs (5hr) and the first ML player since José Abreu did it from 8/21-8/23, 2020, also vs Cubs (6hr).
 - On 5/23 vs Mil hit a 456-foot HR off Freddy Peralta, the longest homer of his career and the second-longest by a Reds batter this season (Tyler Naquin, 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser, 459 feet).
 - In the third inning of the 7-2 loss on 5/11 at Pit became the 41st player to hit a homer that reached on the fly or bounced into the Allegheny River (61st time).
 - Started at designated hitter in 5 of the Reds' 7 interleague road games (3-19, .158, 2 2b, 2rbi, 3bb, 6k).
