ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (16-13) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (16-14) April 29, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #31/Home #16 RHP Andre Pallante (2-2, 4.26 ERA) vs. RHP Bubba Chandler (1-2, 4.88 ERA)

THE PIRATES: lost, 11-7, on Tuesday vs. St. Louis and have dropped the first two games of this seven-game homestand (lost, 4-2, on Monday vs. the Cardinals)...Will host St. Louis for two more games (Wednesday-Thursday) before welcoming Cincinnati for a three-game series (Friday-Sunday)...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game road trip to Texas (1-2, April 21-23) and Milwaukee (2-1, April 24-26)...Are in the sixth game of a stretch of 10 straight games vs. the National League Central (are 6-5 vs. the division)...Have lost three straight games for the first time since last year from Sept. 14-19 (five).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz connected for his ninth home run of the season with his solo shot off starter Kyle Leahy in the sixth inning on Tuesday vs. St. Louis...His nine home runs are tied with three others for the third-most in the National League and are tied with five others for the seventh-most in all of Major League Baseball...Cruz' nine home runs are also tied with Jeff King (1996) for the second-most by a Pirate during March/April in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901), behind Willie Stargell in 1971 (11).

PICK SIX: Pirates pitchers have at least six strikeouts in 67 straight games (since last year on August 18 vs. Toronto)...That is the fourth-longest streak by any Major League team during the Modern Era (since 1901), behind New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019), Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023) and Cincinnati (71 games, August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021)...Pittsburgh's 278 strikeouts are the most in the National League and the third-most in all of Major League Baseball (Cleveland, 285/Toronto, 282).

O'YEAH: Ryan O'Hearn went 2-for-4 with a two-run home run (sixth inning) and an RBI single (eighth inning) on Tuesday night vs. St. Louis...His .323 average (32-for-99) ranks ninth in all of Major League Baseball...O'Hearn's .925 OPS through his first 28 games with Pittsburgh is the seventh-highest mark by any Pirate through his first 28 games with the team (minimum 115 plate appearances) during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only Reb Russell (1.128, 1922), Brian Giles (1.077, 1999), Garrett Jones (1.059, 2009), Dino Restelli (1.057, 1949), Gus Suhr (.966, 1930) & Bob Elliott (.941, 1939).

GOOD GONZO: Nick Gonzales went 2-for-4 with two RBI on Tuesday vs. St. Louis, extending his hitting streak to a career-high-tying nine straight games (since April 19 vs. Tampa Bay)...He also hit safely in nine consecutive games twice last season (August 16-25 and August 28-September 6)...Gonzales is batting .486 (17-for-35) with two doubles, five RBI and five runs during the streak...His .330 average (32-for-97) ranks fourth in Major League Baseball, behind Houston's Yordan Alvarez (.355), Toronto's Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (.340) and Miami's Xavier Edwards (.339)...Gonzales was the first Pirate to collect at least 17 hits in a nine-game span since Ke'Bryan Hayes went 18-for-37 (.486) from June 2-11, 2023.

KONNOR KONNECTS: Konnor Griffin hit his second Major League home run and first at PNC Park with his solo shot off Matt Swanson leading off the bottom of the ninth inning on Tuesday vs. St. Louis...He has gone 7-for-18 (.389) with two home runs, five RBI and two stolen bases over his last five games, dating back to April 24 at Milwaukee (multiple hits in three of the games).

WALK THIS WAY: Bryan Reynolds went 2-for-3 with a walk and two runs on Tuesday vs. St. Louis...His 23 walks are tied with St. Louis' Iván Herrera, Detroit's Gleyber Torres and Chicago (AL)'s Miguel Vargas for the fourth-most in Major League Baseball...The only players with more are Los Angeles (AL)'s Mike Trout (32), the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (31) and Washington's James Wood (29).

PIRATING: Pittsburgh has at least one stolen base in 15 of its last 18 games, a stretch that began on April 10 at Chicago (NL)...The Pirates' 25 steals in that time are the most in Major League Baseball (Tampa Bay, 20, is second)...Pittsburgh's 87.5 stolen-base rate (28-for-32) in 2026 ranks second in MLB, behind Philadelphia (89.5 percent, 17-for-19)...Eight different Pirates have stolen a base...Oneil Cruz has a team-best 10 steals, while Konnor Griffin (six) and Jake Mangum (five) rank second and third, respectively.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 29, 2018: Nick Kingham retired each of the first 20 batters he faced and earned the win in his Major League debut during Pittsburgh's 5-0 win over St. Louis at PNC Park. He tied Bert Blyleven (1980) and Nellie Briles (1972) for the third-longest bid for a perfect game by any Pirates pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961), trailing only Ken Brett in 1974 (8.0ip) and Jeff Karstens in 2008 (7.2ip).

LAST TIME OUT: Chandler lost a 6-1 decision after allowing six runs on seven hits, three walks and a hit batter in 4.0 innings of work on April 23 at Texas' Globe Life Field.

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Chandler earned his first Major League win in his second career appearance after allowing one hit, one walk and one hit by pitch over 4.0 scoreless innings of relief during his only career appearance against St. Louis last year on August 27 at Busch Stadium (tonight will mark his first start against the Cardinals).

SAVE (AND WIN) THE DAY: Chandler earned his first Major League win with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief last year on August 27 at St. Louis (second game)...He also earned his first Major League save with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief on August 22 vs. Colorado, making him one of five Major Leaguers (saves became official in 1969) to earn a win and a save in his first two games, joining Rick Waits (1973/1975), Bob Stanley (1977), Mardie Cornejo (1978) & Mickey Weston (1989)...He was one of four MLB relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to begin a career with two outings of 4.0-plus scoreless innings (Hugh Bedient in 1912, Von McDaniel in 1957, Eric King in 1986).

RIGHT AT HOME: Chandler has a 3.48 ERA (10.1ip/4er) in two starts at PNC Park this year...He allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his last start here (April 17 vs. Tampa Bay).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona's Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh's 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodríguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

DYNAMITE DEBUT: Chandler secured a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut on August 22 vs. Colorado...He was the first Pirates pitcher to earn a save in his MLB debut (stat became official in 1969), and he was one of four Major Leaguers to earn a 4.0-inning save in his MLB debut, joining Boston's Bob Stanley (April 16, 1977 at Cleveland), St. Louis' Zack Thompson (June 3, 2022 at Chicago-NL) and San Francisco's Keaton Winn (June 13, 2023 at St. Louis)...He was the only one to not surrender a run.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Chandler became one of two Pirates relievers since at least 1900 to pitch at least 4.0 innings in each of his first three outings (last year on August 22 vs. Colorado, August 27 at St. Louis and Sept. 2 vs. Los Angeles-NL), along with Carmen Hill in 1915 (the last Major League pitcher to do that prior to Chandler was Kansas City's Atlee Hammaker in 1981)...He also became one of three Major League pitchers since 1969 (when saves became official) to earn two wins and a save in his first three games (Minnesota's Tom Johnson in 1974/Cincinnati's Hector Carrasco in 1994).
