METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Nationals, 11-5...New York has won four of its last five games...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day, road trip (1-0) against Washington (1-0) and Minnesota (three games).

DINGERS! The Mets have hit 15 home runs over their last five games, including a season-high five last night...The Mets hit five home runs in a game for the first time since they smashed seven on July 19, 2021 at Cincinnati...Overall, the team has socked 185 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 185 home runs are tied with the 2004 team for the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 1987 team which hit 192 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: In 40 career games at Nationals Park, Pete Alonso has hit .327 (49-150) with nine doubles, one triple, 13 home runs, 31 RBI, 19 walks with a .408 OBP and a .660 SLG...Brandon Nimmo has hit .317 (52-164) with 28 runs, eight doubles, one triple, four home runs, 12 RBI and 30 walks with a .424 OBP and a .451 SLG in 48 games at the yard...Jeff McNeil has slashed .313/.365/.465 with four homers and 22 RBI in 38 games in D.C.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo recorded his fifth career multi-homer game and his second of the season last night...He is batting .286 (50-175) with 11 doubles, one triple, three home runs, 14 RBI, 12 walks with a .349 OBP against left-handed pitchers this year.

DOING THE SPLITS: Nimmo is batting .293 with 40 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, nine home runs, 32 RBI, 35 walks with a .379 OBP and a .463 SLG in 67 games on the road this season...This compares to a .237/.340/.446 slashline in 65 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .282/.354/.535 slashline with 52 runs, 20 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 70 games on the road in 2023...He has posted .214/.306/.387 slash in 66 games at Citi Field.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio is batting .400 (6-15) with one run, one double, one RBI and two steals in his first four career games...The last player to open his career with a four-game hitting streak is Pete Alonso who did so in 2019...The franchise record is seven straight games with a hit, accomplished by Daniel Murphy in 2009 and Keith Miller in 1987.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 29 doubles and 26 home runs this season...He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 25 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.4 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.2 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.8) and Mookie Betts (18.2) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.2 fWAR since 2021 is fifth in the majors.

LINSANITY: Over his last 67 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .291 (73-251) with 53 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 38 RBI, 30 walks, 19 steals with a .375 OBP, a .522 SLG and an .897 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high-tying 25 bases in 134 games this season.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the National League with 42 home runs...Alonso's 188 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

100: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 482 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 102 RBI.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who had a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 19-19 against the NL East this season...The team has posted a 4.70 ERA and are slashing .241/.325/.396.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are on their penultimate road trip of the season...New York has 10 road games remaining in the 2023 campaign...New York has posted a 29-41 record on the road with a 4.83 ERA.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 16 games, DJ Stewart is batting .333 (19-57) with 10 runs, three doubles, nine home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.247 OPS...In 39 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (26-98) with 13 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI, 10 walks, a .348 OBP and a .622 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 176 strikeouts...He moved into third all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie pitcher passing Noah Syndergaard (166), Jon Matlack (169) and Tom Seaver (170)...He is now three strikeouts shy of passing Jerry Koosman for second all-time for most strikeouts by a Mets rookie...Last night marked the first time a Mets rookie pitcher recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games since Noah Syndergaard did the trick from September 25 - October 3, 2015...Is the first Japanese-born rookie to accomplish the feat since Masahiro Tanaka did so from June 11 - 17, 2014...Courtesy of Elias.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1983, former Met and current SNY analyst Jerry Blevins was born...Blevins spent 13 years in the major leagues, including four years with the Mets...He 14-4 with a 3.38 ERA (52 ER/138.2 IP) with 61 walks and 166 strikeouts in New York...We wish him well.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Over the last four games, JT Schwartz has batted .429 (6-14) with two runs, one home runs, three RBI and walk walks...In 31 games since he was promoted to Double-A, Schwartz is batting .357 (40-112) with 13 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 25 RBI, 16 walks with a .446 OBP, a .518 SLG and a .964 OPS...The left-handed hitter was selected in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of UCLA.

BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT IN THE MAJORS: Suffered the loss after tossing 2.2 innings on August 15 against the Pirates at Citi Field...Allowed three earned runs on two hits and three walks...Fanned five Pittsburgh batters in a 7-4 Mets loss.

BUTTO VS. THE NATS: Butto will face the Nationals for the second time this season...In his last start against Washington on April 25 at Citi Field, Butto suffered the loss after allowing 2 earned runs on four hits and six walks in 4.2 innings while fanning one Nats batter...Butto has pitched to a 3.86 ERA (2 ER/4.2 IP) against Washington after that one appearance...Will be facing the Nats on the road at Nationals Park for the first time in his career.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Butto has made 19 starts in Syracuse this season, pitching to a 3-7 record with a 5.93 ERA (60 ER/91.0 IP)...In his last start on August 27 against the Buffalo Bisons, Butto suffered the loss after throwing 5.0 innings, during which he allowed four earned runs on seven hits and four walks while striking out three batters...Butto's last win came on August 10 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre against the Railriders, during which he tossed 5.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and one walk while fanning four batters...Butto leads the Syracuse Mets in strikeouts this season with 82.

DEBUTTO: RHP José Butto made his season debut on April 16 at Oakland in his last start...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...He did not factor into the decision as the Mets won in 10 innings, 4-3.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

2022: He made his major league debut on August 21 last season in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-innings home runs by Mark Canha.

FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (10-7, 3.08)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.0 innings on September 1 against the Mariners at Citi Field, allowing one earned run on five hits and two walks...Struck out a career-high-tying 12 batters in a 2-1 Mets victory, joining Dwight Gooden (six) as the only Mets rookie pitcher with three or more starts of 12 or more strikeouts.

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 96 of his 176 strikeouts through 25 starts...The pitch has a 60.2 percent whiff rate and a 29.0 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 141 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .113 batting average.

- Has 11 home runs and 25 RBI in his last 27 games...Had his fifth multi-homer game of the season on September 3 vs. Seattle.
- Has 25 career home runs vs. Washington, tied for third-most among active players...His 1.049 OPS against the Nats is the 10th-best all-time.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 188 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
