METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Marlins, 2-1, last night... New York has lost three of its last four...The Mets are 12-8 over their last 20 games...The team is in a stretch of 17 straight games (7-4)... New York is in the midst of a seven-game road trip against the Nationals (2-2) and Marlins (0-1)...New York has now won four of its last six series.

THREE AMIGOS: Carson Benge (right), A.J. Ewing (center) and Nick Morabito (left) started in the outfield last night...It was the earliest the Mets ever started an all-rookie outfield...The previous earliest was July 24, 1977...Lee Mazzilli, Steve Henderson and Joel Youngblood...Last night was the first time the three have played together in the same outfield in the same game (at any level).

ONE IS A LONELY NUMBER: New York has scored one run or less in 13 games this year tied for the second-most with Boston and Colorado...San Francisco has the most such games (14).

MAY FLOWERS: The Mets are 12-8 in May...The team has posted a 3.29 ERA (66 ER/180.2 IP) with 183 strikeouts...Their 183 strikeouts are the seventh-most in the majors this month...Their 3.29 May ERA is eighth in the majors...They are hitting .234/.303/.377 in the month of May...Their .234 average is 18th in the majors.

BENGE WATCH: Carson Benge had his six-game hitting streak snapped last night...He has hit in six of his last seven games (12-32, .375) and 10 of 12 (20-54, .370) and 15 of his last 18 with a .361/.418/.472 slashline with one home run, five doubles, 11 RBI and 16 runs during that span...He has recorded multiple hits in six of his last 10 games, including three hits in three of his last seven contests...He had a career-high three RBI and scored a career-high three runs Monday night.

CARSON CONNECTS: Benge has a .337 batting average since April 23, ranking seventh in the majors (min. 84 PA)...He also is tied for fifth in the majors with 19 runs during that stretch...Over 25 games during that span, Benge is batting .337 (34-101) with 19 runs, six doubles, two homers, 14 RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and an .835 OPS.

REALLY RARE: Juan Soto stole his 100th career base Thursday in his 1,131st career game...That is the fewst games to 100+ SB, 200+ HR & 900+ walks...The previous fewest: 1,257 games by Mickey Mantle...Research courtesy of Sarah Langs.

250: Juan Solo hit his 250th career homer on May 14...He is the fifth-youngest player to reach 250 home runs, only Alex Rodriguez, Jimmie Foxx, Eddie Matthews and Albert Pujols reached the milestone at a younger age...He reached the milestone in his 1125th career game making him the seventh-quickest active player to accomplish the feat, only trailing Aaron Judge, Shohei Ohtani, Pete Alonso, Kyle Schwarber, Matt Olson and Mike Trout...Overall, he is the 16th player to reach 250 homers before turning 28...Per *Elías*.

BO KNOWS: Bo Bichette has four extra base hits in his last five games...Bichette has hit in five of six games, .296 (8-27)...His two home run game Tuesday was his 10th career multi-homer game...His last game with two long balls was August 4, 2025 against the Rockies...Bichette has three homers, nine RBI, one double, five runs scored while slashing .318/.348/.773 over his last five games...

BATY BALL: Brett Baty has at least one hit in 10 of his last 13 games with an at-bat...During that span, Baty is batting .318 (14-44) with two home runs, two doubles, four runs scored and nine RBI during that stretch...In his last 29 games dating back to April 19, has a .270/.375/.416 slashline.

FREDDY PERALTA: This season, opposing batters are 3-43 (.070) with runners in scoring position against Freddy Peralta...Peralta ranks third in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 30 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .197 (100-507) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

DREAM WEAVER: Over his last 13 games, Luke Weaver is 1-1 with a 1.23 ERA (2 ER/14.2 IP) allowing 10 hits, five walks and striking out 18...He has stranded all seven inherited runners in that span.

WONDERFUL WILLIAMS: Devin Williams has not allowed a run in his last 10 games (9.2 innings)...He has yielded just two hits and two walks with 12 strikeouts during that span...Williams is 2-0 with five saves during this stretch dating to April 26.

THIS DAY IN 1986: Tony Gwynn hit a three-run walk-off homer in the bottom of the ninth off Jesse Orosco to lift the Padres to a 7-4 win over the Mets in San Diego...Mookie Wilson went 5-5 with two RBI...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at mets.com/1986.

METS HALL OF FAME CEREMONY: Outfielder Lee Mazzilli and manager Bobby Valentine will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in a pre-game ceremony on Saturday, May 30 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Mazzilli had two stints with the Mets (1976-1981 and 1986-1989) and combined to slash .264/.357/.396 during his 10 years in Queens...The Brooklyn native was named to the 1979 All-Star team and hit the first home run by a Met during the Midsummer Classic...Mazzilli ranks sixth in franchise history with 152 stolen bases and is tied for fifth in team history with 38 pinch-hits...Valentine ranks third in team history with 536 wins guiding the Mets from 1996-2002. In 1999, he led the Mets to the Postseason for the first time since 1988...The following year, Valentine took the team to the World Series, becoming the first manager in Mets history to lead the team to consecutive playoff appearances...Valentine was a key contributor to the club's immediate volunteer response to the 9/11 attacks.

PREVIOUSLY ON: Peralta allowed three runs over 5.0+ innings in the Mets' 7-6 victory over the Yankees on May 17 at Citi Field...The right-hander allowed a season-low two hits, issued a career-high-tying six walks (also 5/19/18 and 5/5/24) and struck out four batters...Peralta has completed five or more innings in nine of his 10 starts this season and has allowed three or fewer runs in each of his last nine starts.

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 3-43 (.070) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta ranks third in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 30 batters faced w/RISP)...Additionally, Peralta ranks third in the majors in opponents' SLG and sixth in opponents' OBP with runners in scoring position (min. 30 batters faced (w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .197 (100-507) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his eighth day game start of the season...Peralta has only made three night starts this season, all of which have come in his last five starts...In 131 career night games (96 starts), Peralta is 45-26 with a 3.60 ERA (227 ER/567.2 IP)...In 90 career day games (76 starts), Peralta is 28-19 with a 3.53 ERA (164 ER/417.2 IP)...Peralta will become the first pitcher to reach eight daytime starts this season.

GOIN' FISHIN': Tonight, Peralta will make his 12th career appearance and ninth career start against the Miami Marlins...In his career against Miami, Peralta is 3-4 with a 4.03 ERA (20 ER/44.2 IP) and 58 strikeouts...In his last outing against Miami, July 25, 2025 at American Family Field while with Milwaukee, Peralta allowed one run over 5.0 innings, issued two walks and struck out nine batters...In five career games (3 starts) at loanDepot Park, Peralta is 1-2 with a 5.51 ERA (10 ER/16.1 IP) and 20 strikeouts...Peralta's last start at loanDepot Park came on May 22, 2024...He allowed one run over 7.0 innings and struck out seven in a 1-0 Brewers loss.

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .201 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%...This season, Peralta has thrown his fastball 56.2% of the time and his changeup 20.7% of the time...Peralta has held opposing batters to a .186 (19-102) average with his fastball and has struck out 24 batters with the pitch.
