RAY MATTER-The Rays have won five straight games, the longest active winning streak in the majors and tied for their 3rd-longest of the season behind May 13-24 (11) and July 4-10 (6)...they are a season-high 21 games over .500 for the first time since ending the 2019 season at 96-66...the Rays have moved into a first-place tie with the Red Sox, the first time they have been tied or alone in first since the end of play on June 26 (+0.5)...at 60-39, the Rays are tied with the Astros and Red Sox for the best record in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Giants (61-37).

- The Rays are 6-1 in their last 7 G and 7-2 since the All-Star break.
- The Rays are 13-3 since July 4, 41-20 since May 13 and 47-24 since May 2, all of which are the best in the majors over those stretches... the 41-20 mark is tied with April 9-June 14, 2021 and April 30-July 6, 2008 for the best single-season 61-game stretch in club history.
- The Rays and Red Sox currently occupy the AL East lead and/or the AL's first Wild Card, holding a 4½-game lead over the A's...they hold a 7-game cushion over the Mariners for a postseason berth.
- The Rays have won five consecutive series beginning July 5-7.
- The Rays have held a lead in 78.8 pct. (78 of 99) of their games—they have led in 46.2 pct. (18 of 39) of losses and trailed in 30 of 60 wins. the 30 come-from-behind wins rank 2nd in the majors (Red Sox, 31).
- With 63 games remaining, the Rays are on pace to go 98-64, which would set a franchise record for wins in a season (97-65 in 2008).
- Last night's victory gave the Rays 100 wins since the beginning of the 60-game shortened season, going 100-59 (.629) over that span.
- The Rays are a majors-best 28-12 (.700) in day games this season.
- + The Rays have 13 players on the IL including 12 pitchers.

SEEKING SWEEP—Today the Rays are attempting to complete an eighth sweep of 3 games (or more) this season, which could break a tie with the Brewers (seeking 8th), Dodgers, Tigers and White Sox for most in the majors...a win today would give the Rays a third sweep of 4 games (or more), which would break a tie with four others for 2nd in the majors behind the Astros (4)...their most recent sweep was July 5-7 vs. CLE (3-0) and their most recent on the road was May 21-24 at TOR (4-0, in Dunedin).

- The Rays have played 237 4-game series in club history and swept 18 of them, and eight of 126 on the road...their last three 4-game sweeps have come on the road: May 21-24 at TOR, May 3-6 at LAA and  $\bar{\text{Aug}}$  10-13, 2020 at BOS...their two 4-game sweeps this season tie a single-season club record (1998, 2010. 2012. 2013). and it is the first time they have swept two on the road in the same season.
- The Rays are attempting to sweep a series of 4+ games from the Indians for the first time in franchise history...they have swept them in a series of 3 games (or more) four times in club history: three at home (2021, 2019, 2004) and once on the road (Aug 12-14, 2005).
- Today the Rays are attempting to sweep the season series from the Indians...only once in franchise history have they swept a season series from an AL opponent, going 7-0 against the Royals in 2018... the only other times they swept a season series with multiple series against a club were 2019 vs. MIA (4-0) and 2013 vs. MIA (4-0).

ROAD BLOCK—The Rays are 30-21 (.588) on the road, 3rd in the majors behind the Brewers (29-18) and Red Sox (30-19)...spanning multiple trips, they have won four straight road games and are 6-1 in their last seven on the heels of a 10-game road losing streak from June 15-July 3...the Rays are 6-11 on the road since June 15 and 10-14 since June 1 after a 20-7 start.

- + The Rays lead the majors with 277 runs scored on the road, ahead of the Dodgers (265), and they rank 2nd in the majors with 72 HR.
- The Rays have lost in walk-off fashion eight times, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Marlins (9)...this is tied with 2002 for the most through 99 games in franchise history, and the club record for walk-off losses in a single season is 13 in 2015.
- Since Aug 10, 2020, the Rays are a majors-best 50-27 on the road.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE-Last night the Rays hit 4 HR, their most since May 21 at TOR (4) and tied for their 2nd-most of the season behind May 18 at BAL (5)...Austin Meadows homered in both the 3rd and 9th innings for the third multi-HR game of his career and second this season (May 4 at LAA)...the Rays have scored 8 runs (or more) in back-to-back games for the fourth time this season, following July 5-7 (G1) vs. CLE, May 18-21 at BAL/TOR (4) and April 20-21 at KC...since DH Nelson Cruz made his Rays debut on July 23 at CLE, the club leads the majors with 18 runs scored.

- + During this 13-3 stretch the Rays are averaging 5.69 runs per game, totaling 89 runs in the 13 wins and 2 runs in the 3 losses...they have scored 5 runs (or more) in 12 of the 13 wins and 7 runs (or more) in eight of the 13 wins...the Rays are batting .260 (138-for-531) during this stretch overall including a .283 avg. (34-for-120) with RISP.
- This season the Rays are batting .233, 22nd in the majors and 11th in the AL...the .233 avg.-which would be the lowest mark in franchise history-includes .237 with RISP and .225 with RISP/2 outs.
- The Rays have scored 196 runs this season with 2 outs, 4th-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (218), Dodgers (212) and Giants (199).
- The Rays have struck out a majors-most 991 times and are on pace for 1,621 SO, which would be a ML record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...however, they have double-digit strikeouts in eight of their last 25 games (32.0 pct.) after 51 of their first 74 games (68.9 pct.).
- This season the Rays are batting .277 (151-for-546) with RISP in the 60 wins, compared to .165 (49-for-297) with RISP in the 39 losses.

FASHIONABLY LATE—This season the Rays have scored 192 runs in the 7th inning or later, most in the majors ahead of the Astros (174)...they have outscored opponents, 192-116, in these frames, and the +76 differential ranks 1st in the majors...the Rays have scored 57 runs in the 7th inning (8th in the majors), 58 runs in the 8th (tied for 4th), 57 runs in the 9th (1st) and 20 runs in extras (tied for 3rd)...the 116 runs allowed in the 7th inning or later are the 5th-fewest in the majors and 2nd among AL clubs (Indians, 111).

# + Opposing starting pitchers have a 4.02 ERA (513-IP, 229-ER) and .222 opp avg. (428-for-1,931) when pitching against

the Rays this season, but opposing relievers have a 5.25 ERA (368.1-IP, 215-ER) and .249 opp avg. (356-for-1,428) against the Rays

The Rays have scored 11 9th-inning runs this series and 13 in their last 4 games...during these 4 games, the Rays are 2-for-27 with RISP through the 8th inning and 7-for-13 in the 9th inning and later.

PITCHING PROPERLY-The Rays have a 3.58 ERA this season, which leads the AL over the Astros (3.62) and ranks 7th in the majors...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth consecutive season...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 53 times this season—most in the AL (Astros, 52)—and are 43-10 (.811) when doing so.

+ The Rays bullpen has a 1.19 ERA (60.2-IP, 8-ER) in the last 14 games and a 3.09 ERA (422.2-IP, 145-ER) this season, which ranks 1st in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (2.93)...the Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA through games of April 21, but since April 22 their 2.61 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.

RAYS vs. INDIANS-Since May 25, 2019, the Rays have won 11 consecutive games over the Indians, tied for the 2nd-longest streak against a single opponent in club history behind a 12-0 stretch over the Orioles (April 30-Sep 24, 2008)...the Rays are 6-0 this season (3-0 at home, 3-0 on the road), including two 7-inning wins, 2 wins when trailing after 8 innings and 1 win when tied after 8...since 2018, the Rays are 16-3 (.842) against the Indians, their best mark against any opponent (2nd: 7-2 vs. the Mets).

- + The Rays have outscored the Indians, 44-20 (+24), in the season series, including 17-2 in the 7th inning or later...the Rays are averaging 7.33 runs per game in the season series and have totaled 29 hits. 19 runs (18 ER) and 6 HR in 19 innings against the Indians bullpen.
- + The Rays are 21-13 (.618) at Progressive Field since snapping an 18game losing streak from Sep 29, 2005-July 23, 2010...it remains the longest losing streak at a visiting ballpark in franchise history.
- + Nelson Cruz ranks 2nd among actives with 28 HR vs. Cleveland

MEDICAL MATTERS-OF Manuel Margot (left hamstring strain) continued a rehab assignment last night with Durham, going 0-for-5 in his second game with the Bulls...he is scheduled to play 9 innings in right field today vs. Charlotte...RH Chris Archer (right lateral forearm tightness) is scheduled for 4 IP or 60 pitches on Tues at Norfolk...RH Nick Anderson (right elbow sprain) is scheduled for 1 IP tomorrow with the FCL Rays.

**LAST START**—On Mon vs. BAL, took his first loss since April 30 vs. HOU after allowing a season-high-tying 6 ER in 5.2 IP, snapping a streak of 12 apps (9 starts) without a loss...allowed hits to his first 3 BF, and 2 runs came around to score on a **Ryan Mountcastle** RBI double and sac fly in a 32-pitch 1st inning...following the double, retired 14 of his next 15 BF, including a 6-pitch 4th, before allowing two 2-out baserunners in the 5th... yielded three singles to 6 BF in the 6th, including two 2-out run-scoring hits with exit velocities of 80.3 mph and 74.7 mph. then was removed from the game...his line: L, 5.2 IP, 8 H, 6 R, 2 BB, 5 SO, 108 pitches, 75 str.

+ Threw first-pitch strikes to 20 of 27 BF (74.1 pct.).

**FINALLY DEFEATED**—Yarbrough went unbeaten from May 5-July 10, a streak spanning 12 apps (9 starts) in which he was 5-0 with a 4.00 ERA (63-IP, 28-ER)...it was the 2nd-longest unbeaten streak of his career, trailing a 15-game run from June 18-Sep 10, 2019—and his 5-game winning streak was his longest since a 6-game streak from June 23-Aug 11, 2019... this run started in the midst of a 24-game streak without a win as a starter, which was the longest drought by a traditional starter in club history.

- + Since May 5 at LAA, is 4-1 with a 4.25 ERA (59.1-IP, 28-ER) in 10 starts, and has allowed 3 ER (or fewer) in eight of those starts.
- + In his career, is 25-5 with a 3.58 ERA (203.2-IP, 81-ER) in 53 apps in relief and 9-15 with a 4.52 ERA (243-IP, 122-ER) in 43 starts...since the start of the 2018 season, leads the majors with 25 relief wins.

vs. INDIANS—Is 2-0 with a 2.19 ERA (12.1-IP, 3-ER) in two career apps (1 start) against the Indians, with both coming at Progressive Field...last faced them on May 23, 2019 when he started and earned the win after allowing 2 runs in 7.1 IP...retired 15 of his first 16 BF, and his only baserunner allowed over that stretch was a 1-out single in the 2nd...a 2-out, bases-loaded double by Jordan Luplow plated 2 runs in the 6th, but he got a groundout in the next at-bat en route to retiring his final 5 BF.

**KING OF WEAK CONTACT**—Since 2018, has allowed an avg. exit velocity of 84.3 mph, according to StatCast, lowest in the AL and 2nd-lowest in the majors (min. 500 batted balls) behind MIL **Brent Suter** (84.0 mph)...his career hard-hit rate (95+ mph) of 26.6 pct. is the best mark in the majors over that stretch...has ranked 6th or better in both of those categories in

each of the last three seasons...ranks 1st in the majors this season in both categories, with an 84.2 mph avg. exit velocity and 27.6 pct. hard-hit rate.

+ Holds a career 1.17 WHIP, tied for 4th in the AL since entering the league in 2018 (min. 400 IP)...that mark is the 2nd-lowest in club history (min. 300 IP), behind **David Price** (1.141)...ranks 1st in Rays history (min. 300 IP) with a 3.69 SO/BB ratio (373-SO, 101-BB).

**CUT IT UP**—Over the last three seasons (2019-21), has thrown his cutter for 38.4 pct. of his pitches, according to StatCast, the 2nd-highest rate in the majors (min. 2,500 pitches) behind HOU/CIN **Wade Miley** (47.0 pct.)... batters have an avg. exit velocity of 82.8 mph against his cutter since then, the lowest mark in the majors (min. 100 AB)...has recorded 98 SO with the cutter over that stretch, which ranks 5th-most in the majors.

- + Has recorded 58 swings-and-misses with the cutter this season, 8th-most in the AL...had 40 swings-and-misses with the cutter last season, which was tied for 8th in the majors and 6th in the AL.
- + Opponents are batting .310 (75-for-242) against the cutter since the start of 2020, the 5th-highest mark in the majors (min. 75 PA).

**CANT GET AHEAD**—Has thrown first-pitch strikes to 63.6 pct. (273 of 429) of batters faced this season, his lowest rate since his rookie season in 2018 (59.9)...in comparison, threw first-pitch strikes to 66.1 pct. of batters faced from 2019-20, including 67.2 pct. (158 of 235) last season which ranked 4th in the majors among pitchers with 50 IP...however, his 3.80 pitches/BF ranks 11th in the AL and he ranks 3rd in BB/9 IP ratio (1.68).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN—Is 4-1 with a 3.81 ERA (52-IP, 22-ER) in nine road apps (7 starts) this season, compared to 2-3 with a 5.40 ERA (50-IP, 30-ER) in 10 apps (7 starts) at Tropicana Field...is 20-8 with a 3.53 ERA (227-IP, 89-ER) and .229 opp avg. (196-for-857) in 48 career road apps (23 starts), ranking among AL leaders in wins (tied for 5th) and ERA (4th, min. 200 IP) since 2018...three of his 5 quality starts this year have come on the road.

- + His 20 road wins are tied with **Jeremy Hellickson** for 7th-most in Rays history, trailing **Jeff Niemann** (22) for 6th place...min. 100 IP, ranks 8th in club history in road ERA and 5th in opp avg.
- + Threw his first career complete game on June 3 at NYY.

(18-for-98), compared to a .270 opp avg. (41-for-152) in his first 9 starts.

<u>vs. YANKEES</u>—Faced them on June 2 at NYY (L, 3.1-IP, 4-ER) and twice out of the bullpen in last season's Division Series.
