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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (50-47) vs. CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (51-46)

July 18, 2026 - Progressive Field - Cleveland, OH - 1:10 & 7:10 EDT - Game #98 & #99/Road #47 & #48

THE PIRATES: will start the second half with a six-game road trip to Cleveland (Saturday-Sunday) and New York-AL (Monday-Wednesday), starting with today's doubleheader...Went 4-2 on their six-game homestand leading into the break vs. Atlanta (1-2, July 7-9) and Milwaukee (3-0, July 11-12)...Have hit 125 home runs this season (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (886) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the second-most runs (516) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (539), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (883) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (957), Milwaukee (937) and New York-NL (894)...Entered the All-Star break with 50-plus wins for the 10th time in team history (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933) & first since 2015 (53-35).

TWICE AS NICE: The Bucs are scheduled to play their second doubleheader in a four-day span (excluding the All-Star break) today at Cleveland (swept a doubleheader on July 11 vs. Milwaukee)...This will be their 11th all-time interleague doubleheader (also June 4, 2003 vs. Boston, June 10, 2004 at Texas, May 1, 2014 at Baltimore, May 18, 2014 at New York, April 1, 2018 at Detroit, April 25, 2018 vs. Detroit, April 21, 2021 at Detroit, May 4, 2022 at Detroit, May 29, 2024 at Detroit and June 19, 2025 at Detroit).

TURNPIKE SERIES: Pittsburgh and Cleveland are meeting at Progressive Field for the first time since August 30-September 1, 2024...The Pirates' last series win here came from July 23-25, 2018, when they won the first two games of a three-game series, which extended their winning streak to 11 straight games (since July 11), their longest such streak since another 11-game streak from September 12-22, 1996...This weekend's series marks Pittsburgh's second series against the American League Central this season...The Pirates swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota at PNC Park...Pittsburgh will also play three-game series vs. Detroit (August 17-19), at Chicago (September 8-10), vs. Kansas City (September 18-20) & at Detroit (September 25-27).

WE WERE ON A BREAK! The Pirates entered the All-Star break at 50-47, marking the first time they entered the break with a winning record since 2016 (46-43)...They swept a three-game series from July 11-12 vs. Milwaukee and are looking to win at least four straight games for the third time this season (also March 31-April 5 [five games] and May 29-June 2 [four games])...The Pirates have not been four games over .500 this late in a year since they were 80-76 after a win on September 25, 2018 at Chicago-NL (they were last five games over .500 this late when they were 67-62 after a loss on August 29, 2016 at Chicago-NL).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh has won four straight interleague series...The Pirates swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston, won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics and won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle...Pittsburgh has only ever won four straight series (within a single season) against American League opponents two other times, coming in 2015 and 2018...The Pirates swept a two-game series from June 15-16, 2015 vs. Chicago, swept a two-game series from June 17-18, 2015 at Chicago, swept a three-game series from June 30-July 2, 2015 at Detroit and won two of three games from July 3-5, 2015 vs. Cleveland...Pittsburgh also won two of three games from April 25-26, 2018 vs. Detroit, swept a two-game series from May 8-9, 2018 at Chicago, swept a two-game series from May 15-16, 2018 vs. Chicago and won two of three games from July 23-25, 2018 at Cleveland...The Pirates' .667 winning percentage (16-8) during interleague play this year is tied with Los Angeles-NL (22-11) for the best mark across all of Major League Baseball.

ON THE ROAD: The Pirates, who are 23-23 on the road, have won or split each of their last two road series...Pittsburgh split a four-game series from June 29-July 2 at Philadelphia and won two of three games from July 3-5 at Washington...The Bucs are looking to win or split a third straight road series for the first time since 2024, when they swept a four-game series from March 28-31 at Miami, won two of three games from April 1-4 at Washington & split a four-game series from April 11-14 at Philadelphia.

A PERFECT 10: Pittsburgh plated 10 runs in the fourth inning of a 14-5 win on July 12 vs. Milwaukee...It marked the Pirates' second 10-run inning this season (also April 13 vs. Washington, sixth inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the first time in franchise history (since 1887) that Pittsburgh has posted multiple 10-run innings in a season...The only other Major League teams to do that in the last 15 seasons (since 2012) were Minnesota (2012), Atlanta (2020), Toronto (2021), Los Angeles-AL (2023) and New York-AL (2025)...The Pirates, who played their 460th game vs. the Brewers (since 1997), scored at least 14 runs vs. the Crew for the sixth time and first since August 14 (G1), 2021 (also 14 runs)...Pittsburgh's first nine batters of the fourth inning reached base safely...Per Elias, it was the first time the Bucs had nine straight batters reach base safely at any point in an inning since June 12, 2001 at Detroit (fourth inning) and the first time doing that to begin an inning since June 27, 1986 vs. Montréal (sixth inning).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 18, 1951: Ralph Kiner became the first player in franchise history to hit three homers and collect seven RBI in a game during the Pirates' 13-12 win over the Dodgers at Ebbets Field. Kiner hit a grand slam in the first inning, a two-run shot in the fourth inning and a solo blast in the eighth inning. Pittsburgh recorded 17 hits in the win, including four from Gus Bell, who finished a double shy of the cycle.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings and only the fifth to do that in an outing of at least 5.0 innings, joining Babe Adams (5.0 innings of relief) on August 18 (G1), 1909 vs. St. Louis, Elmer Ponder (5.2 innings of relief) on July 23 (G1), 1919 at Philadelphia, Vin Mazzaro (5.0 innings of relief) on June 30, 2013 vs. Milwaukee and Max Kranick (5.0 innings in his start) on June 27, 2021 at St. Louis.

ONE AND DONE: Jones has allowed just one run and struck out 14 batters over 10.0 total innings in his last two starts (July 2 at Philadelphia and July 8 vs. Atlanta)...He has pitched 7.0 consecutive scoreless innings since allowing the third-inning run on July 2.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Jones won a 5-1 decision after allowing four hits and two walks (he had four strikeouts) in 5.0 scoreless innings on June 4 at Houston...It was his first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2024 vs. Washington (it was a total of 634 days).

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

ON THE MEND: Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakleand), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

2024 IN REVIEW: Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).

STRIKE ‘EM OUT: Jones’ 98 strikeouts prior to the 2024 All-Star break were the most by any Pirates rookie prior to the break, surpassing Cy Blanton (79) in 1935...He led the South Atlantic League in strikeouts (142) while he was w/High-A Greensboro (2022).

HISTORIC OUTING: Jones allowed just one baserunner (it was a fifth-inning double to Elias Díaz) while striking out 10 batters over 7.0 scoreless innings on May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado...He became the first and only Pittsburgh pitcher to have an outing of at least 7.0 scoreless innings, one/zero hits allowed, zero walks surrendered and 10 strikeouts.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Jones struck out at least seven batters in each of his first five Major League starts (March 30-April 22, 2024)...He joined Pittsburgh’s Jose DeLeon (July 23-August 10, 1983), Washington’s Stephen Strasburg (June 8-28, 2010) and New York (AL)’s Masahiro Tanaka (April 4-27, 2014) as the only pitchers to accomplish that.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Jones struck out 10 batters over 5.2 innings of work in his Major League debut on March 30, 2024 at Miami...He became the first Pirate with at least 10 strikeouts in his Major League debut since Tim Wakefield on July 31, 1992 vs. St. Louis (he was the first National League pitcher to do that since Milwaukee’s Freddy Peralta on May 13, 2018 at Colorado)...Jones’ 10 strikeouts in his debut were one shy of the franchise record in a debut, set by Nick Maddox (1907) & matched by Dick Hall (1955).

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Game Two of today's doubleheader against Cleveland at Progressive Field.
