ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (51-54) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (43-62) July 27, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #106/Home #56 RHP Zac Gallen (7-11, 5.58 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (5-8, 1.91 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first eight games of this nine-game homestand (were swept by Chicago-AL in three games from July 18-20 and swept Detroit in three games from July 21-23 before splitting the first two games of this three-game series vs. Arizona)...Have gone 30-25 at home this season...Are one of four teams in all of Major League Baseball that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings this season (36-0)...Are 31-36 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8.

THE CALL TO THE HALL: This afternoon, Dave Parker will become the 45th former player, manager or executive who spent part of their professional career with the Pirates (including 2013 Pre-Integration Era inductee Deacon White, who played for the Pittsburgh Alleghenys in 1889), to be enshrined into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York... Parker hit .290 in 19 Major League seasons (1973-91), including 11 with Pittsburgh (1973-83)...In his career, he had 339 home runs and 1493 RBI (was also a two-time NL batting champion).

ONE OF A KIND: Paul Skenes gets the start this afternoon for

the Pirates in the finale of this three-game series and ninegame homestand...He has a 1.94 ERA (260.0ip/56er) and 307 strikeouts over the first 44 starts of his Major League career... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Skenes is the only Major League pitcher since at least 1893 to have at least 300 strikeouts and a sub-2.00 ERA through his first 44 big-league appearances.

A GIANT STRETCH: Tomorrow night, Pittsburgh will begin a six-game, seven-day road trip with the first of three games in San Francisco against the Giants... The trip will conclude with three games next weekend in Denver against the Rockies...When the Pirates return home to PNC Park, their first three games (August 4-6) will also be against the Giants...Pittsburgh is in the third game of a 12-game stretch against the National League West (July 25-August 6), which was preceded by 12 straight games against the American League Central (July 7-23)... After this current stretch, the Pirates will play 10 straight against the National League Central from August 7-17 (four vs. Cincinnati, three at Milwaukee and three at Chicago).

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz blasted a two-run home run off Arizona's Merrill Kelly in the second inning of Saturday's 2-0 win...Cruz' 17 homers as a center fielder this season are the fourth-most in all of MLB, trailing only Chicago (NL)'s Pete Crow-Armstrong (27), Minnesota's Byron Buxton (22) and Seattle's Julio Rodríguez (18)...He became one of only five Pirates (seven instances) since at least 1901 with at least 17 homers and 34 steals in a season, along with Al Martin (1996), Barry Bonds (three, 1990-92), Andy Van Slyke (1987) and Kiki Cuyler (1925).

RELIABLE RENEGADE: David Bednar secured his 100th Major League save (all with Pittsburgh) on Saturday vs. Arizona (the 10th-most in Major League Baseball since the start of 2021)...His 1.50 ERA (36.0ip/6er) since April 19 is the fourth-lowest among Major League relievers (minimum 35.0 innings pitched).

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh recorded its 12th shutout of the season with Saturday's 2-0 win over the Diamondbacks, tied with Chicago (NL) for the second-most in all of Major League Baseball (San Diego, 14, ranks first)...The Pirates' last season with more than 12 shutouts was 2018, when they had 16.

TODAY'S STARTER RHP PAUL SKENES #30

AGE: 23 **SIGNED:** Thru 2025 **HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: Skenes will make his 22nd start of the season today...He took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors in 2024 after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...He was the first-overall pick by Pittsburgh in the 2023 Draft (out of LSU).

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed three hits and one walk while striking out six batters over 6.0 scoreless innings on July 21 vs. Detroit, winning a 3-0 decision against Jack Flaherty...In four starts this month, he has posted a 0.86 ERA (21.0ip/2er) and 27 strikeouts (just two walks)... That's the third-lowest ERA among all Major League pitchers with at least 21.0 innings pitched this month, behind only Texas' Nathan Eovaldi (0.38) and Chicago-NL's Matthew Boyd (0.67).

AGAINST THE DIAMONDBACKS: Skenes will make his third career start against Arizona (second this season)...He struck out seven batter over 6.2 scoreless innings on May 28 at Chase Field, winning a 10-1 decision against Zac Gallen...Skenes also faced the Diamondbacks last season on August 4 here at PNC Park, allowing two runs in 5.1 innings (no-decision in Pittsburgh's 6-5 loss).

AN OPENING ACT: Skenes has not allowed a run in the first inning of any of his 21 starts this season, the longest-such streak by any Major League pitcher in 2025 (Detroit's Reese Olson did it in each of his 22 starts during the 2024 campaign)...Skenes' streak began last season on September 3 at Chicago (NL), giving him 26 straight starts without allowing a run in the first inning...That's the longest-such active streak in all of Major League Baseball (Tampa Bay's Shane Baz, 16, ranks second on the list) and the longest-such streak by any Pittsburgh pitcher since Rick Rhoden (32 straight starts) from June 20, 1982 to June 2, 1983...The last Major League pitcher to do it in at least 27 straight starts was Olson (29) from August 22, 2023 to September 26, 2024.

PAUL-STAR: Skenes started for the National League in the All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park (he was named the starter by manager Dave Roberts on July 12)...He struck out Detroit's Gleyber Torres and Riley Greene on 100-mile-per-hour fastballs before getting New York's Aaron Judge to ground out, completing a perfect inning on 14 pitches...He was opposed by Detroit's Tarik Skubal, who allowed two runs in his 1.0 inning of work...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Skenes became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two big-league seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57).

ALL-STAR ACCOLADES: During his start on July 6 at Seattle, Skenes was named to the National League All-Star team for the second straight season...Last season, he became the first Pirates rookie pitcher to ever be selected to an All-Star Game (was the fifth Major League rookie pitcher to start the All-Star Game)...In 2024, he also became one of four Pittsburgh rookies to ever be named an All-Star, joining Tony Womack (1997), Jason Kendall (1996) and Frankie Zak (1944).

300 PUNCHOUTS: With his fourth-inning strikeout of Matt Wallner on July 11 at Minnesota, Skenes reached 300 career strikeouts in his 43rd career start (he also struck out Willi Castro in the the fifth inning, finishing the night with 301 career strikeouts)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Pirates pitcher and one of 17 Major League pitchers all-time to record at least 300 strikeouts in his first 43 starts...Skenes is also one of five active pitchers to have done that, along with Spencer Strider (376, 2022-23 with Atlanta), Yu Darvish (348, 2012-13 with Texas), Corbin Burnes (340, 2019-22 with Milwaukee) and Shane Bieber (308, 2018-19 with Cleveland).

10-0-0: Skenes struck out 10 batters in 5.0 scoreless innings (no walks allowed) in his start on July 6 at Seattle...He became the first Pirates pitcher to strike out at least 10 batters in an outing of 5.0 innings or fewer since Roansy Contreras had 10 strikeouts in 4.2 innings on September 21, 2022 at New York (AL)...Skenes also became just one of five Pirates pitchers since at least 1901 to strike out 10 or more batters while allowing zero walks and zero runs in an appearance, along with Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado), Mitch Keller (May 14, 2023 at Baltimore), Larry McWilliams (September 20, 1983 at New York-NL) and Bob Veale (Sept. 23, 1966 at Atlanta).
