METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cubs, 11-2, on Monday night...The victory snapped a six-game losing streak...The Mets continue a 10-day, 10-game homestand (1-0) against the Cubs (1-0), Braves (four games) and Pirates (three games).

HIGH FIVE: Pete Alonso crushed his 32nd and 33rd home runs of the season last night...He now has 179 career home runs, which is the fourth-most through a player's first five seasons in the majors...He is behind only Ralph Kiner (215), Albert Pujols (201) and Eddie Matthews (190)...Courtesy of ESPN Stats & Info.

PICK SIX: Alonso tied a career-high with six RBI (also: August 15, 2019 at Atlanta)...He has three games with five or more RBI, tied for the most such games this season with Josh Naylor and Isaac Paredes...His eight career games with five or more RBI since 2019 are tied with José Ramírez for the second-most during that span...He is tied with Todd Hundley for the second-most such games in franchise history trailing only David Wright's 10...Yesterday marked the third time in the last 14 days that Alonso had two homers and five RBI in a game...Is the first player in major league history to accomplish the feat three times in a span of two weeks or less...Courtesy of StatsPerform.

MULTIPLICTY: Alonso recorded his fourth multi-homer game of the year and the 18th of his career...His 18 career multi-homer games are now the third-most in franchise history...He was previously tied with Mike Piazza and Carlos Beltrán, who each had 17...Only Darryl Strawberry (22) and David Wright (21) have more...His 18 multi-homer games are the second-most in the majors since Alonso entered the league in 2019... Only Aaron Judge has more with 24.

POLAR BEAR VS. WINDY CITY CUBS: Pete Alonso has 13 home runs and 30 RBI in 25 career games against the Cubs...His 13 career home runs against the Cubs are tied with Paul DeJong for the fourth-most by an opposing player against Chicago since 2019...Alonso is averaging one home run per 6.77 AB against Chicago-NL, the second-highest rate all-time (min. 100 PA) behind only Mark McGwire (5.43 AB/HR against the Northsiders)...He has 30 RBI in 88 career at-bats against the Cubs... His 2.93 AB/RBI ratio vs. Chicago-NL is the best since RBI became an official stat in 1920...His 30 career RBI are the fifth-most by an opposing player against Chicago since 2019...Alonso has homered in five of his last six games against the Cubbies, including twice during a three-game set at Wrigley Field this May...He has hit safely in eight consecutive games vs. the Cubs, going 11-27 (.407) with six homers, 13 RBI, seven runs scored and a 1.589 OPS.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 33 home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the NL with 83 RBI...He is hitting .333 (22-66) with 12 extra-base hits, 21 RBI, 11 runs and a 1.126 OPS in his last 17 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in a stretch where 19 of 25 games are at home...New York is 1-0 in that span...The Mets are 27-23 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.76 ERA in Citi Field...That is the fourthlowest mark in the National League...This compares to a 4.93 mark on the road...The team's 50 games at home are the fewest in the majors.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

JEFF McHITS: In 16 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .295 (18-61) with 10 runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, nine RBI, four walks with a .377 OBP and a .410 SLG...In 22 games (83 at-bats) following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out six times.

HANG 10: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in nine of his last 10 games, batting .432 (16-37) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, five walks, with a .512 OBP, a .757 SLG and a 1.268 OPS....Francisco Lindor ranks 11th in the majors with a 4.2 fWAR...That is seventh-best in the National League.

LINSANITY: Over the last 42 games, Lindor is batting .305 (47-154) with 33 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 24 walks, 12 steals with a .401 OBP, a .578 SLG and a .979 OPS...Lindor has stolen 18 bases in 111 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season... He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is tied with Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 34-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 80 steals in 89 attempts... The team's 89.9 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 57 stolen base attempts.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2014, Bartolo Colón tossed  $8.0\,\text{innings}$  and allowed one run on six hits with six strikeouts as the Mets defeated the Phillies, 5-4, at Citizens Bank Park...The victory marked the 200th career win for the Dominican born native...The Mets collected 12 hits in the victory including doubles from Curtis Granderson and Juan Lagares...Colón, a member of the 2015 National League championship team, will officially retire as a member of the Mets on Sunday, September 17 in a press conference prior to the 1:40 p.m. game vs. Cincinnati...The first 15,000 fans attending the September 17 game will receive a Bartolo Colón "Big Sexy" long sleeve shirt.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Playing for the FCL Mets yesterday, going 1-4 with a doubles, one run and one RBI...In 62 games between Binghamton (58), FCL Mets (4), Rudick has batted .285/.427/.472 with 47 runs, 13 doubles, nine home runs, 33 RBI and 12 steals...He was selected in the 13th round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of San Diego State University.

#### **CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES**

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss after throwing 6.0 innings against the Kansas City Royals on August 3 at Kauffman Stadium...Allowed six earned runs on eight hits and one walk in a 9-2 Mets loss.

ACE ON ADDISON ST: Carrasco will face Chicago-NL for the second time this season and for the fifth time in his career...In his last start against the Cubbies on May 25 at the Friendly Confines, he earned the win after tossing 6.2 innings, allowing one earned run on five hits and two walks while fanning four batters... Throughout his career against the North Siders, Carrasco has pitched to a 2.74 ERA (7 ER/23.0 IP) and holds a 2-1 record...Carrasco holds a 2-0 record with a 1.93 ERA (4 ER/18.2 IP) when in the Windy City compared to an 0-1 record and a 6.23 ERA (3 ER/4.1 IP) at home.

MILESTONES & MEMORIES: Carrasco will make his 300th career appearance today...Made his 250th career start at Fenway on July 23, becoming the 21st active pitcher and seventh Venezuelan pitcher to reach that milestone...Will become the 16th active pitcher to make 300 career appearances and 250 career starts...With 4.0 innings on June 30. Carrasco became the 21st active pitcher to reach the 1500.0 inning milestone...Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

COOKIE CRISP: In his start against the Giants on June 30, Carrasco tallied a season-high 18 whiffs and six whiffs on four-seam fastballs...According to Baseball Savant, Carrasco also currently stands in the 78th percentile in curve spin.

COOKIE'S COMEBACK: In his starts on May 25 and May 31 against Chicago-NL and Philadelphia, respectively, Carrasco allowed just two runs over 12.2 innings compared to 18 runs allowed across the 18.2 innings he threw in his first four starts of the season...In those 12.2 innings, Carrasco fanned eight batters, which equals the total strikeouts he tallied in his first three starts of the year.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 last season at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of eight Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,500.0 career innings pitched on July 6 vs. Arizona...Carrasco is currently ranked seventh among Venezuelan-born pitchers with 1513.2 career innings pitched.
