RAY REPORT—The Rays conclude a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (2-1) and Blue Jays (2-0, one to play) tonight at Rogers Centre...have won three straight, 10 of 11, 16 of 18, and 26 of their last 34 games...have won 12 of their last 16 road games since a 2-5 start...have won six straight and eight of their last 10 series...are a season-high 15 games over .500, their third-earliest date reaching the mark behind the 2023 (18-3 on April 22) and 2010 (22-7 on May 7) Rays...since April 4, have the majors' best record (26-8) and ERA (3.02)...own MLB's second-best record overall behind the Braves (29-13)...are tied for the third-best start in club history (see table on the right)...have the second-easiest remaining schedule in MLB by opponent winning pct. (.473) behind the Rangers (468)...have led the AL East for four straight days...have spent 10 days atop the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ The Rays allowed a five-run rally in the 7th inning, their most in a frame since April 8 vs. CHC (5R in 5th), but plated two runs in the 10th of last night's 7-6 win...they earned their MLB-leading eighth last at-bat win and their fifth consecutive extra-inning victory, tying the Cardinals (5-1) for MLB's most wins in extra frames...they also remained undefeated (6-0) when tied entering the 9th inning.
- ★ **Shane McClanahan** extended his career-best scoreless inning streak to 21.2 consecutive frames, the longest active streak by an MLB starting pitcher, with his fourth straight start of 5.0 scoreless innings or more, matching **Drew Rasmussen's** club record set from May 17-June 3, 2025.
- ★ The Rays tied a season high with 5 XBH, tallying 4 2B and 1 HR (5x, last: April 24 vs. MIN)...it snapped a streak of 14 consecutive games with 3 XBH or fewer, tied for the seventh longest in team history.
- ★ With the win, the Rays have claimed six consecutive series, tied for the third-longest single-season streak in franchise history (5x, last: Aug. 11-30, 2023)...it trails only two 10-series streaks from June 24-July 29, 2013 and July 28-Aug. 31, 2008.
- ★ The club has won seven straight games decided in the final at-bat, tied for the fifth-longest streak in team history (Stats Perform)...the seven last at-bat wins are two shy of the Rays most before the end of May (9 in 2008)...they have also won a single-season team-record nine consecutive one-run games, the majors' longest streak since the 2025 Astros won 11 straight...the Rays won 11 straight one-run affairs between Sept. 12, 2013-May 1, 2014.
- ★ The Rays current 16-2 run ties their best 18-game stretch in franchise history, done nine times, most recently from May 13-June 1, 2021...entering the year, only the 2021 (2x), 2013 (5x), and 2004 Rays (1x) had recorded such spans...the surge has boosted their postseason odds from 28.5 pct. (April 21) to 85.5 pct. entering play today, a 57.0 pct. increase (FanGraphs)...the Cubs (+19.3%) have the second-largest increase in odds over that timeframe.
- ★ The Rays have scored first 13 times in 18 games during their 16-2 stretch...their 19-3 (.864) record when plating the opening run leads MLB...they have won each of the last 17 games in which they scored first, the second-longest streak in club history, per Elias (longest: 22G from March 30-May 5, 2023).
- ★ The Rays have won 11 straight and 21 of the last 22 games in which they scored four runs or more...their AL-best 22-4 (.846) record when plating four or more ranks fourth in MLB...among AL clubs, only the Yankees (29G) have reached the mark more often than the Rays (26G).

- ★ **WHAT'S AT STAKE**—With a win tonight, the Rays would:
 - ★ Record their MLB-leading sixth sweep—no other club has more than four (CHC, NYY).
 - ★ Match a franchise record with six sweeps before the end of May, joining 2023, 2021, and 2010.
 - ★ Sweep the Blue Jays for the 20th time and fifth at Rogers Centre...sweep a series in Toronto for the first time since May 16-18, 2016.
 - ★ Sweep the Jays in back-to-back series for the first time, regardless of location.
 - ★ Tie a franchise record with six straight wins over Toronto (also: May 15-Aug. 5, 2003).
 - ★ Win each of their first six meetings with a single opponent to begin a season for the ninth time, first since a 6-0 sweep of the White Sox in 2023.
 - ★ Become the second AL East team to win 11 of their first 12 games vs. divisional opponents since the division was formed in 1969, joining Cleveland in 1988 (11-1)...become the first team in any division to turn the trick since the 2009 Marlins started 11-1 against the NL East (Elias).
 - ★ Become the fourth team in the modern era (since 1900) to start 21-3 or better in intraleague games, joining the 1955 Dodgers (22-2), 1946 Red Sox (21-3), and 1911 Tigers (21-3).
 - ★ Tie the best 19-game stretch in franchise history (17-2) for the fourth time, joining three separate spans by the 2013 Rays (last: July 4-27, 2013).

- ★ **ALL-AMERICAN**—The Rays (20-3) are the sixth team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 20 of their first 23 intraleague games, joining the 1987 Brewers (20-3), 1981 Athletics (20-3), 1955 Dodgers (21-2), 1946 Red Sox (20-3), and 1911 Tigers (21-2)...they have tallied eight consecutive series wins over AL opponents, tying the third-longest streak in franchise history (also: Aug. 20-Sept. 19, 2018), trailing only streaks of 14 series (June 24-Aug. 25, 2013) and 10 series (July 28-Aug. 31, 2008)...they joined the 2018 Diamondbacks (9) and 2001 Mariners (9) as the only clubs since 2000 to win their first eight intraleague series to open a season (Stats Perform)...the Rays are in the midst of nine consecutive games vs. AL East teams, winning seven of eight thus far, and 18 in 21 games from May 4-27...at 10-1, they are the third AL East club to win 10 of their first 11 divisional games, joining Cleveland in 1988 and Milwaukee in 1987...it marks the best intradivision record in MLB, ahead of the Braves (10-3).
- ★ **Chandler Simpson** is 15-for-36 (.417) vs. AL East opponents and 34-for-120 (.283) against all other clubs...min. 30 AB, the only players with better averages against their own division are **ATH Carlos Cortes** (.474) and **ATL Michael Harris II** (.429).
- ★ **Ryan Vilade** is batting .364 (12-for-33) with a 1.023 OPS against AL opponents while **Nick Fortes** is hitting .327 (18-for-55) and **Ben Williamson** is batting .313 (21-for-67) with a .403 on-base pct.
- ★ Rays pitchers have turned in an MLB-best 2.52 ERA (207.0IP, 58ER) in 23 games vs. AL competition compared to a 4.71 ERA (162.1IP, 85) over 18 Interleague matchups.

- ★ **ARANDA'S WORLD**—**Jonathan Aranda** is 6-for-12 (.500) with 1 HR and 4 RBI during a four-game hitting streak and has batted .358 (24-for-67) with 1 2B, 5 HR, 17 RBI, and a 1.041 OPS across his last 20 games dating back to April 20, the AL's third-best average in that timeframe to **DET Riley Greene** (.389) and **ATH Shea Langeliers** (.377)...he paces the AL with 33 RBI, marking the fourth-latest into a season a Rays hitter has led the Junior Circuit in RBI, earlier than only **Evan Longoria** in 2010 (May 22) and 2009 (June 9) and **Austin Meadows** in 2021 (June 10)...it ties **Carlos Peña** (2009) for the sixth-most RBI by a Ray through the club's first 41 games and marks the most since **Randy Arozarena** (34) in 2023.
- ★ Aranda leads the AL in hits (17) and average (.472) this month while pacing the majors in on-base pct. (.523)...he is 12-for-21 (.571) vs. right-handed pitchers since the start of May.

- ★ **THE RAY WAY**—The Rays staff leads the majors in opp. on-base pct. (.286) while ranking third in opp. OPS (.645) and fourth in WHIP (1.15)...they have posted a top-six WHIP in the majors in each of the last nine seasons (2017-25), MLB's longest active streak...the Rays have permitted three runs or fewer 21 times (16th most in MLB), going 19-2 in those games, compared to a 9-11 mark when allowing four runs or more...they have held opponents to two runs or fewer 16 times (T4th) and one or zero runs 11 times (T1st).
- ★ The rotation paces the majors in WHIP (1.06) and opp. on-base pct. (.268) while ranking third in ERA (3.07) behind the Braves (3.06) and Yankees (3.07 - by decimal points)...this includes an MLB-best 3.00 ERA (171.0IP, 57ER) in their last 34 starts dating back to April 4.
- ★ Despite yielding six runs last night, the Rays bullpen's 1.66 ERA (65.0IP, 12ER) over the last 18 games still leads the majors (April 22-pres)...the Rays are the only team in MLB that has not lost when leading after five innings (21-0)...their six blown lead losses are tied for the fewest in baseball (also: CIN, SD, STL, TEX)...they had five blown lead losses in their first seven games compared to one in their last 34 games (April 19 at PIT - led 2-1, lost 6-3).
- ★ **O. CANADA**—The Rays and Blue Jays wrap up a stretch of six meetings in a 10-day span (May 4-13) tonight...the Rays swept the Jays in three games from May 4-6 at Tropicana Field to complete a 6-0 homestand...they need to go 2-6 or better over the next eight matchups to clinch a season series win...the Rays have won their first five meetings with the Blue Jays for the first time...their last longer streak vs. a single opponent was a 6-0 sweep of the White Sox in 2023, and their last longer streak against an AL East foe was 2021 vs. BAL (6G)...last night's win secured their fifth series victory in their last five sets at Rogers Centre (Sept. 29, 2023-pres)...they have won eight straight season sets over Toronto since 2018, 10 in 11 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015), and 16 in 18 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...the eight-season streak is tied for the longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the Angels (2016-24), and is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing ATL over MIA (11), CHC over PIT (11), and NYY over KC (10), according to Stats Perform.
- ★ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in each of his 11 career games at Rogers Centre, going 16-for-48 (.333) with 3 HR and 10 RBI...it ties **Rocco Baldelli** (2003-04) and **Damian Rolls** (2001-03) for the second-longest career-opening streak at the ballpark by a Ray behind **Tommy Pham** (14G, 2018-19)...Caminero recorded his first career home run (Oct. 1, 2023) and grand slam (May 13, 2025) in Toronto.
- ★ **Jonathan Aranda** has 24 RBI in his last 20 games vs. the Blue Jays (Oct. 1, 2023-pres.), batting .342 (25-for-73) with a 1.104 OPS in those games...min. 50 PA, the only player with a better OPS against the Jays in that span is **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (1.326)...10 of his 32 career homers have come vs. Toronto.

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his fourth start and 15th appearance of the year, including his second start and 10th outing on the road...marks his fourth straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 20th start of his major league career and his 11th on the road...acquired from the Twins for RHP Taj Bradley on July 31, 2025.

LAST TIME OUT—Worked a season-high 4.0 innings while allowing three runs (two earned) on four hits and one walk with three strikeouts in an 8-4 victory over the Red Sox on May 7 at Fenway Park...pitched a clean 1st inning before allowing all three runs in the 2nd...a single-walk-single sequence plated Boston's first run of the inning...two batters later, a run scored on a throwing error, which was followed by another RBI-single that gave the Red Sox their third run...he allowed just a single in the 3rd frame, retiring seven of his final eight batters to conclude the outing.

- ✦ His 59 pitches were his most in a game since he threw 74 in a 4-0 win for the Twins on Oct. 2, 2021 at KC.
- ✦ Min. 15.0 IP, his 56.0 pct. ground ball rate is tied for ninth among AL righties.

RUNNING THROUGH THE SIX—Jax is 1-2 with a 4.82 ERA (18.2IP, 10ER) and 15 strikeouts over 16 career appearances (one start) against Toronto...his last outing came on Sept. 27, 2025, when he tossed a perfect inning of relief on nine pitches in a 5-1 loss at Rogers Centre...in six career outings in Toronto, he holds a 1.50 ERA (6.0IP, 1ER) with four strikeouts, a .136 (3-for-22) opp. average, and a 0.67 WHIP.

- ✦ Jax is 3-6 with a 4.79 ERA (77.0IP, 41ER) in 62 career appearances (four starts) against AL East opponents...however, he has turned in a 2.38 ERA (11.1IP, 3ER), 0.88 WHIP, and .175 (7-for-40) opp. average across nine outings (one start) vs. the division since joining the Rays.

COUNTRY ROADS—Jax is 1-2 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1IP, 8ER) over nine appearances on the road this season, with five of his eight earned runs coming in his first four appearances...opponents are batting .317 (13-for-41) against him on the road compared to .120 (3-for-25) at Tropicana Field...he is 2-2 with a 5.83 ERA (41.2IP, 27ER) across 10 career starts away from home.

ROLE CALL—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for Ian Seymour on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 3-5 with a 5.49 ERA (80.1IP, 49ER) in 19 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

MLB CAREER RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for RHP Taj Bradley...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind HOU Bryan Abreu (105), CLE Cade Smith (104), and teammate Edwin Uceta (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind CIN Graham Ashcraft (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to SF/NYM Tyler Rogers (226G) and Abreu (220G).

- ✦ In 2024, received the Joseph W. Haynes Award as Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...became the first Minnesota pitcher to record 10 saves and 20 holds in a season.
- ✦ In 2023, made the Twins Opening Day roster for the first time and spent the year in the club's bullpen...tied for ninth in the AL with a team-leading 23 holds...led the majors with a 3.3 pct. barrel rate (min. 250BF).
- ✦ In 2022, transitioned to a relief role for the first time after spending his first six professional seasons (2016-21) as a starter...led the Twins bullpen in innings (72.1), tied for the team lead in holds (18), and ranked second in appearances (65)...began the season with Triple-A St. Paul after spending spring training with the Twins...made one appearance before being recalled April 12 when Jorge Alcala was placed on the injured list, remaining with the big-league club through season's end.
- ✦ Made his major league debut in 2021 across four stints with the Twins: June 5-16, June 24-July 7, July 19-20, and July 30-end of season...maintained a regular spot in the rotation during his season-ending stint with the club...named the recipient of the Bob Feller Act of Valor Award, given annually to the major leaguer who best embodies the spirit of the late Hall of Famer, both in terms of commitment to country and love for baseball.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- ✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER VS. MIAMI MARLINS: RHP JESSE SCHOLTENS (3-2, 3.29)
