THE PIRATES: have lost 11 of their last 12 games (since September 5 vs. Milwaukee), including an 8-4 loss to cap off a three-game sweep at the hands of Chicago (NL) on Wednesday afternoon...Are 42-36 at PNC Park (most home wins in a season since going 44-36 in 2018)...Are 53-62 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs.

Atlanta...Have at least one extra-base hit in 52 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 70 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game run from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 57 one-run games (are 24-33 in those games), their most in a season since 2014 (60).

LEFTY LOVER: Joey Bart connected for his third home run of the season in Wednesday afternoon's game vs. Chicago (NL), a three-run blast off Cubs starter Matthew Boyd...All three of his home runs so far this year have come against left-handed pitchers in the National League Central (also April 7 vs. St. Louis, off Matthew Liberatore and August 11 at Milwaukee, off José Quintana)...It was Bart's sixth career game with at least three RBI and his first since August 9, 2024 at Los Angeles (NL), when he also recorded three RBI...He is 21-for-68 (.309) with six extra-base hits, 10 RBI, 14 walks and a .912 OPS against left-handed pitchers so far this season.

56 BUCS: When Rafael Flores made his Major League debut on Wednesday afternoon vs. Chicago (NL), he became the 56th different player to appear in at least one game for the Pirates this season...He also became the eighth Pirate to make his Major League debut this year, along with Thomas Harrington (April 1 at Tampa Bay), Tsung-Che Cheng (April 9 vs. St. Louis), Matt Gorski (April 24 at Los Angeles-AL), Braxton Ashcraft (May 26 at Arizona), Cam Sanders (August 5 vs. San Francisco), Bubba Chandler (August 22 vs. Colorado) and Cam Devanney (August 31 at Boston)...Pittsburgh had 56 different players appear in a game during the 2024 season.

SEE YOU NEXT YEAR: Pittsburgh will conclude the home portion of its 2025 schedule with this weekend's three-game series vs. the Athletics here at PNC Park...The only other time the Pirates played their last home series of a season vs. an American League team (interleague play began in 1997) came from September 26-27, 2017, when they swept a two-game series vs. Baltimore... Pittsburgh will take on the Athletics in a three-game series at Sutter Health Park next season from June 15-17 (will also travel to Colorado during that trip).

TAKE A WALK: The Pirates have drawn at least one walk in 62 straight games (since July 7 at Kansas City)...That is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and their longest streak since a 72-gamer from May 6-July 30, 2024.

CURVE COUNTRY: Double-A Altoona has split the first two games of its best-

of-three division series vs. Erie (Detroit) in the Eastern League's playoffs...With a win tonight, the Curve would advance to a best-of-three championship series vs. Binghamton (New York-NL), which swept Somerset (New York-AL), 2-0, in the other division series.

IT'S ALL RELATIVE: The Athletics' Jacob Wilson, who started at shortstop for the American League in the 2025 All-Star Game, is making his first trip to PNC Park this weekend...His father, Jack, was a shortstop for the Pirates from 2001-09 and ranks second in PNC Park history with 612 hits (Andrew McCutchen, 927, ranks first)...Jack was a National League All-Star and Silver Slugger Award winner in 2004...When Jacob appears in a game this weekend, they will become the 20th father-son duo to both play at PNC Park.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

<u>September 19, 2014</u>: Pittsburgh used a four-run eighth inning to defeat Milwaukee, 4-2, at PNC Park. With the Pirates trailing, 2-0, and two runners on with one out in the bottom of the eighth inning, Russell Martin hit a go-ahead, three-run home run off Jonathan Broxton. John Holdzkom earned his first and only Major League victory, tossing a scoreless eighth inning of relief.

2025 RECORD: 6-14, 4.13 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-3/212 BATS/THROWS: R/R

BORN: April 4, 1996

AGE: 29 SIGNED: Thru 2028 HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

AS OF LATE: Keller allowed two runs on four hits and one walk (he had four strikeouts) over 5.1 innings on September 12 at Washington, having a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 6-5 loss...His 62 pitches thrown that night were his fewest in a start since August 3, 2024 vs. Arizona, when he threw 60 pitches in 4.0 innings...Keller's 51 pitches through 5.0 innings that evening were his fewest through 5.0 innings in any start of his career...In his last four starts (since August 26 at St. Louis), he has posted a 2.78 ERA (22.2ip/7er), 24 strikeouts (three walks) & a .195 batting average against (16-for-82).

AGAINST THE ATHLETICS: Keller is 0-2 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1ip/8er) in two career starts against the A's...He allowed five runs over his 5.1 innings of work on June 6, 2023 at PNC Park, losing an 11-2 decision...Keller also surrendered three runs across his 5.0 innings of work on April 30, 2024 at the Oakland Coliseum, losing a 5-2 decision.

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller enters tonight's start with 827 strikeouts, tied with Bob Moose for the 14th-most in Pirates history (Elroy Face ranks 13th with 842 strikeouts).

DON'T WALK HERE: Keller has issued three or fewer walks in 28 consecutive starts (since April 9 vs. St. Louis)...The last Pirates to do that in a single season were Jameson Taillon (32 starts) and Iván Nova (29 starts), who both did that in every start in 2018... Keller has issued 45 walks in 167.2 innings pitched this season, making him one of eight National League pitchers with at least 165.0 innings pitched and 45 or fewer walks issued (teammate Paul Skenes has issued 42 walks in his 181.2 innings of work).

CONSISTENT KELLER: Keller has 17 quality starts, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Before him, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it with Pittsburgh from 2012-15, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...In his last start on September 12 at Washington, Keller made his 30th start of the season (it is his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts)...The only other Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to achieve that were Maholm from 2008-10 and lan Snell from 2006-08.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Keller has made two starts of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one/zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts so far this season (those came on April 9 and July 2, both vs. St. Louis at PNC Park)...During the Modern Era (since 1901), the only Pirates pitchers with three or more such starts in a season were Deacon Phillippe (three) in 1902, Vernon Law (three) in 1965, Larry McWilliams (three) in 1983, Doug Drabek (three) in 1989, Denny Neagle (three) in 1995 and Keller himself (four) in 2023.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: With his third-inning strikeout of Masyn Winn in the 5-0 victory on July 2 against St. Louis, Keller became PNC Park's all-time leader in strikeouts (currently has 405 strikeouts here), surpassing Paul Maholm, who had 383 strikeouts.

CLOSE CALLS: Keller has pitched in 14 one-run games (last on September 12 at Washington)...He is 1-4 with a 2.90 ERA (80.2ip/26er) in those starts...The 14 starts are tied with Seattle's Bryan Woo for the most in all of Major League Baseball, and they are the most by any Pirates pitcher since Jameson Taillon made 14 such starts in 2018.

- Has hit safely in four of his last five starts, dating back to 9/9 at Baltimore, going 5-for-17 (.294) with a double, a triple and an RBI during that span. **®** His 19 home runs as a center fielder are the second-most among all National League players this year, trailing Chicago's Pete Crow-Armstrong (29).
- **®** Has a career-high 38 stolen bases...Would be the first Pirates player to lead the National League in steals since Tony Womack had 58 steals in 1998.

- **®** His 2.94 catcher's ERA (634.2ip/207er) so far this year is the lowest by any Pittsburgh catcher with at least 600.0 innings caught in a single season.

- Collected the first hit of his career with his second-inning single off Los Angeles (NL)'s Emmet Sheehan in Pittsburgh's 3-0 win on 9/3 at PNC Park.
- Š Was acquired from Kansas City on 7/16 for infielder/outfielder Adam Frazier...Hit .266 (101-for-379) in his 103 total games at Triple-A this season.

- His three-walk game on 9/13 at Washington was his first since 6/25/24 with Chicago (AL)...Has 16 RBI across his 21 games since 8/20 vs. Toronto.
- His game-tying home run in the ninth inning on 9/9 at Baltimore marked his first homer in the ninth inning or later since 6/30/22 with Cincinnati.
