METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets game against the Nationals was suspended yesterday in the top of the third inning with runners on second and third and one out...The Mets have won two of their last three games...New York continues a seven-game road trip (2-2) to Cincinnati (1-2) and Washington D.C. (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets head home for a six-game homestand against Tampa Bay (three games) and Cleveland (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Joey Cora celebrates his birthday today...Cora was drafted in the first round (23rd overall) in the 1985 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University...The infielder spent 11 years in the majors leagues, batting .277 with 30 home runs and 294 RBI.

TALKING 'BOUT MAMA: For the second straight year, the Mets will play a twinbill on Mother's Day...New York split a doubleheader with the Phillies in the City of Brotherly Love on May 8 last year...The Mets fell 3-2 in game one before defeating the Phillies 6-1 in game two...The Mets are 31-32 all-time on Mother's Day.

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY: The Mets will wear special Mother's Day caps and their jerseys will be adorned by a pink ribbon...In addition, players will be able to use pink bats...Players will also wear pink compression sleeves, pink batting gloves, pink footwear, pink wrist/elbow/leg guards and catcher's equipment...Mets Game Used items from today's game will be auctioned exclusively on MLB.com/auction to benefit the Susan G. Komen Foundation and Stand Up To Cancer to the fight against breast cancer.

LET'S SPLIT UP: The Mets are once again playing a doubleheader that includes a resumed game...The team last did this on August 31, 2021... On April 11 vs. Miami, the contest was suspended with one out and a runner on first...The game was resumed as part of a split doubleheader on August 31...The Mets won 6-5 in walkoff fashion...The team earned a 3-1 win over the Fish in a 7-inning night cap.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are set to play their third doubleheader of the season today...New York is 1-3 in twinbills this season...New York has swept seven of their last 13 doubleheaders, including five DH sweeps last season.

MAXIONAL PARK: Max Scherzer is set to make his 99th career start at Nationals Park...He is 39-26 with a 3.00 ERA (213 ER/629.1 IP) with 148 walks and 841 strikeouts in the ballpark...Only Stephen Strasburg (774.0 IP) has thrown more innings at the ballpark...His 39 wins at the yard are tied for third-most, while his 841 strikeouts rank second, only behind Strasburg's 914.

PATRIOTIC PETE: Pete Alonso is a lifetime .336 (46-137) hitter with 24 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 12 home runs, 29 RBI, 17 walks with a .414 OBP a .679 SLG in 37 career games in Washington D.C...Alonso has 22 career home runs vs. Washington, fifth-most among active players...His 1.064 OPS against the Nats is the second-best among active players.

30 FOR 30: Francisco Lindor has recorded 30 RBI, while Pete Alonso has collected 31 RBI this year...They are one of two pairs of teammates to record 30 or more RBI this year...They join Adolis Garcia (37) and Marcus Semien (33) of the Rangers as the only other teammates with 30+ RBI this year.

WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME: Mark Canha has hit .406 (13-32) with seven runs, one double, one home run, five RBI and three walks in eight games at the ballpark...Jeff McNeil has slashed .328/.387/.500 with 16 runs, six doubles, two triples, four home runs, 20 RBI and 12 walks in 35 contests in the district...Brandon Nimmo has slashed .306/.428/.408 with 24 runs, seven doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBI and 30 walks in 45 games at the home of the Nationals.

STILL 39: Pete Alonso has hit 13 home runs this season through 39 games... According to Sportradar, only one Met has hit 14 or more home runs through the first 40 games of a season...The other was Dave Kingman's 15 home runs in 1976.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Including last night, the Mets have been outscored 36-9 in the first inning this year...The Mets are 6-18 when their opponent scores first...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-2 when scoring first this season...Their .867 winning percentage when scoring first ranks second in the majors.

BRIGHAM OUT, BRIGHAM OUT: Jeff Brigham has not allowed a run in nine of his 11 appearances this season, posting a 3.00 ERA (4 ER/12.0 IP)... He has struck out 14 and allowed five hits and four walks in 12.0 innings this year.

A THOUSAND MILES: On Friday, David Robertson recorded his 1,000th career strikeout...He has 1,001 career strikeouts, recording 1,000 in relief and one as a starter as an opener in 2021 as a member of the Rays...He became the 14th pitcher in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts solely in relief.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in 15 games and has allowed one run in 15.1 innings of work, good for a 0.53 ERA...He has allowed eight hits, five walks while striking out 24 in that span...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .133 (4-30) batting average this season... He has converted all eight save opportunities he's had this season... Overall, he has recorded 164 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

STARTING PITCHING: Including yesterday, Mets starting pitchers have tossed 192.2 innings this year, the fourth-fewest innings in the majors... They have surrendered 37 homers, the fifth-most in the majors...New York starters have issued 97 walks, tied for the most in the majors...They are 13-16 with a 5.28 ERA (113 earned runs/192.2 innings).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 8-6 against the division this year... The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York will play their 25th and 26th road games today...New York is 12-12 on the road this season...They are 3-3-1 in road series in 2023.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.1 innings in Detroit against his former team on May 3 in the second game of a doubleheader, allowing six earned runs on eight hits and one walk while fanning three Tigers batters...Was his first start since serving a 10-game suspension for violating MLB's foreign substance policy...Had his next start pushed back due to neck spasms.

I USED TO WORK HERE: Tonight, Scherzer will make his 99th career start at Nationals Park...Only two pitchers have started here more often: Stephen Strasburg (128) and Gio Gonzalez (100)...He has pitched here as a visitor twice, both last year, and won both starts... During his seven seasons with the Nats, he went 37-26 in D.C. with a 2.99 ERA (208 earned runs/626.2 innings), 830 strikeouts and 145 walks...He ranks second on the ballpark's all-time list in strikeouts (841) and innings pitched (639.1), trailing only Stephen Strasburg (914 K, 774.0 IP)...Scherzer has the best K/9 (11.84), WHIP (0.97), K/BB (5.68) and H/9 (6.64) in the ballpark's history (min. 100.0 IP).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just three punchouts separating the two...With 162 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

QUITE THE DEBUT: After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA (37 ER/145.1 IP) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field...Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)...Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DAVID PETERSON (1-5, 7.68)

LAST TIME OUT: Lost his third straight start, May 9 at Cincinnati...Threw 3.1 innings and allowed four runs on seven hits with two walks and four strikeouts.

HITS ARE FALLING: Peterson has allowed five hits or more in all seven of his starts this season...From 2021-2022, he allowed more than four hits in just 12 of his 34 starts...Prior to this stretch of seven starts, Peterson had not allowed more than four hits in three straight starts in his career.
