BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their last and longest homestand of the season with tonight's opener of a three-game series with the visiting San Francisco Giants ... The Cardinals began their nine-game/10-day homestand by taking two-of-three from the Chicago White Sox over Hall of Fame Weekend ... The Nationals visit St. Louis this weekend for three games ... With 12 games remaining, St. Louis enters today's game in 4th place in the National League Central and 7.5 games out of the final NL Wild Card spot ... St. Louis has been mathematically eliminated from the NL Central division race.

CITY BY THE BAY: Since the Giants relocated to San Francisco in 1958, the Cardinals hold a slim 368-367 advantage in the all-time series ... The Cardinals and Giants have played eight straight one-run games dating back to Sept. 6, 2025 at Busch Stadium ... The Giants won the last non one-run game with an 8-2 victory at Busch on Sept. 5, 2025.

CHURCH CHAT: **Nathan Church** is batting .340/.389/.400 (17-50) over his career-high 12-hitting streak (Sept. 1-present), longest active in MLB and tied for the 4th-longest by any rookie this season behind Kansas City's **Carter Jensen** (20g), Colorado's **TJ Rumfield** (13g) and Detroit's **Kevin McGonigle** (13g). *Well isn't that special?*

LET THE KIDS PLAY: The three youngest active Major League rosters include the Nationals (25.6 yrs), Giants (26.3), and Cardinals (26.5).

NO FLY ZONE: The Cardinals and their opponents have combined to hit 122 homers at **Busch Stadium III** this season, tying **Angel Stadium** for the fewest hit in any Major League Ballpark ... 137 home runs have been hit at San Francisco's **Oracle Park**, 3rd-fewest in MLB ... The four lowest slugging percentages this season include **Angel Stadium** (.343), **Petco Park** (.366), **Busch Stadium** (.373), and **Oracle Park** (.376).

BAEZ BASH BROS: OF **Joshua Báez** has hit 41 home runs between Memphis (AAA) and St. Louis this season, becoming the 5th Cardinals player in the last 20 seasons (2005-present) with 40+ combined homers at Double-A or above in a single season with **Albert Pujols** (6x), **Mark McGwire** (2x), **Jim Edmonds** (2x) & **Rick Ankiel** (2007).

- Cardinals 21-year-old minor league SS **Jesús Báez** (AA) ended his season with 39 combined home runs between Peoria (A+) and Springfield (AA), 2nd-most in Minor League baseball to Brewers minor league 1B/3B **Andrew Fischer** (48) and matching OF **Moises Gomez** (2022) for the most by a Cardinals minor leaguer since 1949 when OF **Russ Derry** belted 42 for the Rochester Red Wings (AAA).

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (Sept. 14, 2022): In a 4-1 win over the Brewers at Busch Stadium, a sellout crowd of 46,459 fans witness **Adam Wainwright** and **Yadier Molina** make their 325th career regular season start as batterymates, establishing a new all-time Major League record and passing the 324 starts mark set by the Detroit Tigers duo of **Mickey Lolich** and **Bill Freehan** (1963-75) nearly 50 seasons prior.

SAN FRANCISCO CONNECTIONS

Nathan Church and **Matt Chapman** are graduates of El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

Bryan Torres was selected by the Giants from the Brewers in the AAA-phase of the 2019 Rule 5 Draft... played in 43 games for Richmond (AA) in 2021.

Quinn Mathews pitched at nearby Stanford University from 2020-23, going 25-10 in 68 games (45 starts) and was the 2023 Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year.

Daniel Descalso was born in Redwood City and resides in Danville, Calif...graduated from Saint Francis High School in Mountain View in 2004... played college baseball at UC-Davis (2005-07).

Alec Burleson and **Carson Whisenhunt** were teammates at East Carolina University in 2020 ... **Andre Pallante** and **Christian Koss** were teammates at UC-Irvine from 2017-19.

Hayden Birdsong was born in Mattoon, Ill...pitched at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Ill., where Sr. Dir., Player Dev. **Kyle Haines** graduated with a kinesiology and sports mgmt. degree.

Giants Manager **Tony Vitello** is a St. Louis native... attended De Smet High School and the University of Missouri, where he played baseball from 2000-02...was an asst. coach at Mizzou from 2003-10.

Giants Hitting Coach **Hunter Mense** played baseball at the Univ. of Missouri (2004-06) and was an assistant coach (2011-16)...Bench Coach **Jayce Tingle** played at Mizzou from 2000-03.

Justin Bruhl was born in nearby Petaluma, Calif., and earned his first save on Sept. 18, 2022 at San Francisco while with the Dodgers.

Andrew Knizner played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2019-23)...selected in the 7th round of the 2016 MLB Draft by the Cardinals.

Giants 1B Coach **Shane Robinson** was selected by St. Louis in 5th round of the 2006 MLB Draft and played in 268 games for STL from 2009, 11-14.

Cardinals Assistant Hitting Coach **Casey Chenoweth** was a hitting coach for the DSL Giants (2017-18) and the AZL Giants Orange (2019).

Cardinals Bullpen Coach **Julio Rangel** was the Giants Minor League Pitching Coordinator in 2018.

JT Brubaker (July 26, 2020 at STL w/ PIT), **Adrian Houser** (Sept. 26, 2015 at STL w/MIL), **Trevor McDonald** (Sept. 29, 2024 at Oracle Park w/SF), **Blade Tidwell** (May 4, 2025[1] at STL w/NYM) & **Keaton Winn** (June 13, 2023 at STL w/SF) all made their MLB debuts against the Cardinals.

Cardenales broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played parts of four seasons with the Giants (2007-10), and Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** made his MLB debut at San Francisco (April 7, 1984).

2025 Cardinals Hall of Famer **Édgar Rentería** played two seasons in San Francisco (2009-10)... member of the 2010 World Series Champion Giants and was named World Series MVP.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER:

- Southern California native and former Stanford Cardinal makes his 7th career Major League start tonight and back-to-back against the Giants.
- Currently ranked as the No. 11 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.
- Made his only career start at Busch Stadium Friday, Aug. 28 vs. Pittsburgh and earned his first career win with a career high 5.2 innings.
- Has received 3 runs of support or fewer in all six of his Major League starts.
- The Cardinals 4th round draft pick out of Stanford University in 2023. Originally selected by the Rays in the 19th round in the 2022 MLB Draft.
- 2024 Cardinals and Baseball America Minor League Pitcher of the Year.
- Led the 2026 International League in strikeouts (111) and opponent BA (.170); and ranked in the Top 10 in ERA (3.13, 2nd), games started (19, 2nd), innings pitched (92.0, 5th) and WHIP (1.14, 4th) when he was first called up (Aug. 1).
- Since the beginning of 2024, ranks 2nd in all of Minor League Baseball with 437 strikeouts, trailing only the Mets **Jonah Tong** (472). Ranks 4th in qualifying ERA (3.19).
- Led all of Minor League Baseball in 2024 with 202 strikeouts, T-7th most in a single-season by any Cardinals minor league pitcher (since 1962).

LAST TIME OUT (September 8 at Oracle Park): L 2-1; 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 99 pitches

- Pitched a career-high 6.0 innings at SF in his last start allowing just two runs, solo home runs to Bryce Eldridge and Christian Koss.
- Allowed just two singles after the Koss 2nd inning home run.
- Did not allow a hit with runners in scoring position (0-2) and for the 2nd straight start (0-9 over that span).

2026 SEASON:

RE-DEFINING SCORING POSITION: Has not allowed a hit over his last 2 starts covering 12 batters (0-9, 3 walks).

MEET ME IN ST. LOUIS: Made his first career start at Busch Stadium on Aug. 28 and earned his 1st career with career-high 5.2 innings, most innings by a Cardinals rookie left hander since **Matthew Liberatore** (8.0 IP on Aug. 10, 2023 at Tampa Bay) ... Quinn's 102 pitches were a professional high (2024-26) and most is most thrown since his 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023 (16 SO) ... Became the first Cardinal w/ 7+ strikeouts in his first career start at Busch Stadium since **Luke Weaver** (7K vs. OAK on 8/26/16).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Became the first Cardinals pitcher (6th all-time) to make his first three starts of the road. Previous was **Howie Pollet** in 1941 (Aug. 20-28). - *Elias Sports Bureau*

OH, CANADA!: Was the first Cards starting pitcher to make his Major League debut in Canada since **Rick Ankiel** on August 23, 1999 at Montreal's Olympic Stadium vs. the Expos.

HATCHED: Is one 13 Cardinals (8 pitchers) to make their Major League debuts this season.

WALKING IN MEMPHIS: Began the season in the Memphis (AAA) rotation and held his opposition to three hits or fewer in 15-of-21 Triple-A starts.

BULL-YING DURHAM: Struck out a season-high 10 over 7.0 IP in a 7-3 Redbirds win vs. Durham (7/24) on the start before his MLB debut.

SUMMER LOVING: Over his final 12 starts with Memphis (AAA) from May 28-August 12, went 4-1 with a 1.99 ERA and 76 strikeouts over 63.1 innings pitched (10.8 K/9 IP) including a 1.01 WHIP.

SIX FOR THE FIX: Made four scoreless starts with three of them 6.0 innings or more with a season-high 7.0 IP, two-hitter at Gwinnett (Braves).

PERSONAL (More info on Cardinals Media Guide Pages 145-148):

- Threw a 156-pitch complete game in the Stanford Super Regional win against Texas on June 11, 2023, striking out 16 batters.
- Has a strong interest in cryptocurrency and before baseball wanted to pursue a career as an investment banker.
- Boasts that he's the best player at any board game and is often seen playing pub trivia at Cardinals Spring Training.
- His older sister, Remy, played soccer at Rice University (2017-18).

MATHEWS vs. SAN FRANCISCO

- Aliso Viejo, Calif., native makes his 2nd straight start against the Giants and 3rd straight against teams from California (at LAD, 9/3).
- Is 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA over a career-high 6.0 innings in his lone start at Oracle Park (9/8). Took a 2-1 loss departing down 2-0 into the 7th inning.
- Pitched at Stanford University.

LAST START vs. GIANTS: (Sept. 8, 2026 at San Francisco): L, 2-1; 6.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR - 99 pitches

- Hurled 6.0 innings taking the 2-1 loss allowing two runs on solo home runs by Bryce Eldridge and Christian Koss. Did not allow a run over his last four innings with two singles.
