GOLDEN BACKSTOPS: D-back backstops' 6 stolen bases allowed and 12 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

- ◆ Gabriel Moreno's 55.6 caught-stealing pct. (5-for-9) leads the Majors and Tucker Barnhart's 33.3 pct. (1for-3) is tied for ninth.
- Gabriel Moreno leads active catchers with a 41.0 caught-stealing pct. (34-for-83) and **Tucker Barnhart** is 11th with a 30.8 caught-stealing pct. (171-for-556).

bWAR RANKINGS: Ketel Marte's 2.1 bWAR makes him 1 of 4 players (pitcher or position) with a 2.0+ bWAR along with Mookie Betts/LAD (2.8), LHP Ranger Suárez/PHI (2.1) and Bobby Witt/KC (2.0).

◆ Ketel Marte's 0.8 defensive bWAR is tied for second in the Majors with Bobby Witt/KC (0.8) behind Marcus Semien/TEX (0.9) while his 1.4 offensive bWAR is ninth in the Maiors.

DRS [courtesy fieldingbible.com]: Ketel Marte and Christian Walker's 7 defensive runs saved (DRS) are tied for the third in the Majors with Riley Greene/DET behind Marcus Semien/TEX (8) and Cal Raleigh/SEA (8).

♦ The D-backs' 15 DRS are tied for fifth in the Majors behind the Dodgers (15) behind the Royals (25), Rangers (19), Yankees (17) and Blue Jays (16).

MARTE AMONG NL LEADERS: Ketel Marte, among NL leaders, is tied for fourth with 22 RBI and tied for sixth with 13 extra-base hits and 57 total bases.

RACKING UP FREQUENT FLIER MILES: The D-backs' roadtrip will have covered approx. 5,027 air miles with the team trekking from Phoenix to San Francisco (651 miles) to St. Louis (1,735) to Seattle (1,710) to Phoenix (1,111).

ON DECK - LOS ANGELES DODGERS: The D-backs face the Dodgers for the first time since sweeping them in the NLDS, with 4-2 wins in Games 1 & 2 at Dodger Stadium capped by an 11-2 win in Game 3 at Chase Field.

- ♦ The D-backs were 5-8 vs. Dodgers last season, going 5-3 in the first 8 games before dropping the last 5 straight (August 8-30).
- ♦ The D-backs split 3-3 at home last season, their fourth season since 2017 with a winning or .500+ home record vs. Dodgers (also: 2017, '18, '19).

NEXT STARTER: LHP TOMMY HENRY (1-1, 5.55)

- ♦ In his last start, a 14-1 win @ Cardinals on April 23, had a quality start (6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R-1 ER, 1 BB, 6 K).

LIMITING RIGHTIES ON THE ROAD: Limiting right-handed hitters to a .200 opponent average (5-for-25) with 7 strikeouts in 2 road games.

INNING INFO: In 2 road games from innings 1-4, has a 2.25 ERA (2 ER in 8.0 IP), a 0.63 WHIP, .138 opponent average (4-for-29) and 7 strikeouts.

BATTER BREAKDOWN: Is holding hitters batting second to a .071 average (1-for-14) with 7 strikeouts.

FIRST PITCH SUCCESS: His first-pitch swing (34.0 to 44.3) and first-pitch strike (63.9 to 77.0) percentages are up from 2023.
