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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (64-69) vs. SAN DIEGO PADRES (71-61)

August 25, 2026 - Petco Park - San Diego, CA - 6:40 PDT - Game #134/Road #68

RHP Paul Skenes (9-11, 3.95 ERA) vs. RHP Michael King (8-9, 3.38 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won one of the first four games on this season-long, nine-game/11-day road trip to Los Angeles-NL (0-3, Friday-Sunday), San Diego (1-0, Monday-Wednesday) and St. Louis (August 28-30), including a 3-2, 12-inning win on Monday at Petco Park...Won four of six games on their recent homestand vs. Boston (2-1, August 14-16) and Detroit (2-1, August 17-19)...Have hit 157 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the most hits (1161) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (656) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (695) and Chicago-NL (691), after scoring a Major League-low 583 runs in 2025 (are looking to become the fourth team in Major League history to finish top three in the league in runs the year after finishing last in the league in runs and the first since Chicago [AL] in 1915)...Have struck out the third-most batters (1236) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1302) & Milwaukee (1269).

FIAR FACTS: Pittsburgh defeated San Diego, 3-2, in 12 innings on Monday and can win its first series vs. the Padres since taking two of three games from July 24-26, 2023 at Petco Park with a win tonight...Monday's game lasted 4 hours and 10 minutes, marking the Pirates' longest road game since a 3-2, 11-inning loss on July 14, 2022 at Miami that lasted 4 hours and 13 minutes...It also marked their first extra-inning win in San Diego since an 8-6, 13-inning win on September 3, 2000 at Qualcomm Stadium.

IRON CITY BRYAN: Bryan Reynolds has played in each of Pittsburgh's 133 games this season and 142 straight team games (he missed his last game last season on September 17 vs. Chicago-NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that is tied with Kevin Young (1998) for the third-longest streak by any Pirates player since 1989, trailing only Jason Bay (307 games, 2004-06) and Bobby Bonilla (189 games, 1989-90)...Reynolds is also on pace to become the seventh Pittsburgh player (10th instance) during the Expansion Era (since 1961) to play in each of the team's games in a season (he would be the first to do that since Bay played in all 162 contests in 2005)...He enters tonight's contest just six hits shy of 1100 hits for his career.

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales delivered the game-winning RBI with his single that scored Jared Triolo in the 12th inning of the Pirates' 3-2 win on Monday at San Diego...It marked his second career game-winning RBI in extra innings (he also had a walkoff single in a 7-6, 10-inning win on May 21, 2024 vs. San Francisco)...He also singled in the ninth inning on Monday, giving him his Major League-best 51st multi-hit game of the season...His .308 batting average (144-for-468) is fourth in all of Major League Baseball.

GO WITH THE FLO: Rafael Flores Jr. was 2-for-4 with an RBI double and a walk in Monday's 3-2, 12-inning win at Petco Park...He has gone 12-for-39 (.308) with two doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, three walks, a 1.101 OPS and eight runs in his last 11 games, dating back to the win on August 13 at Miami.

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez connected for his 15th home run and first since July 26 vs. Chicago (NL) on Monday at San Diego...His 15 home runs are the most by a Pirates rookie since Jack Suwinski (19) and Oneil Cruz (17) in 2022, while also being the most by a Pittsburgh right-handed rookie since Jung Ho Kang (15) in 2015...His 15 home runs since making his MLB debut on May 22 at Toronto are tied with Cincinnati's Sal Stewart for the second-most among Major League rookies, behind Toronto's Kazuma Okamoto (16).

HIGH FIVE: Esmerlyn Valdez joined Brandon Lowe (27), Ryan O'Hearn (17), Oneil Cruz (16) and Bryan Reynolds (15) as Pirates to have hit 15 home runs this season when he did that in Monday's 12-inning win at Petco Park...It is the first time the Pirates have had at least five players hit at least 15 home runs in a season since 2015, when Pedro Álvarez (27), Andrew McCutchen (23), Starling Marte (19), Neil Walker (16) and Jung Ho Kang (15) all did that.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 25, 1972: Steve Blass allowed two runs in a career-high 11.0 innings of work, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 3-2, 12-inning win over Los Angeles in Game One of a doubleheader at Three Rivers Stadium. Richie Hebner sent the game to extra innings with his game-tying, solo home run in the ninth inning, while Manny Sanguillen ended the game with a two-out, RBI single in the 12th inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing three runs over 4.1 innings in Pittsburgh’s 4-3, walkoff win on August 19 vs. Detroit...He is 0-3 with a 6.46 ERA (23.2ip/17er) in his last five starts (since July 25 vs. Chicago-NL)...Skenes earned his last win after allowing one run over 7.0 innings in the 7-1 win on July 19 at Cleveland.

AGAINST THE PADRES: Skenes won a 7-1 decision after allowing one run over 6.1 innings of work in his only career start against San Diego, which came this year on April 7 at PNC Park...Petco Park is one of only three National League stadiums that he has yet to pitch in, along with San Francisco’s Oracle Park & Washington’s Nationals Park.

BEST WESTERN: Skenes has gone 9-2 with a 1.83 ERA (93.2ip/19er), 109 strikeouts and a .183 batting average against (61-for-334) in 15 career starts against the National League West...He is 3-1 with a 1.31 ERA (34.1ip/5er), 38 strikeouts and a .142 batting average against (16-for-113) in five starts against the division this year...His ERA against the NL West since May 23, 2024 vs. San Francisco (his first start against the division) is the lowest mark in Major League Baseball (minimum 90.0 innings pitched).

K COLLECTOR: Skenes enters tonight’s start against San Diego at Petco Park with 557 career strikeouts, the 31st-most in franchise history (since 1887)...Charlie Morton ranks 29th on the list with 563 strikeouts, while Joe Gibbon ranks 30th with 562 strikeouts.

AND THE WHIFF: Skenes struck out a career-high-tying 11 batters (also May 17, 2024 at Chicago-NL and July 11, 2024 at Milwaukee) in 5.1 innings on July 25 vs. Chicago (NL)...His three career outings with at least 10 strikeouts and fewer than 6.0 innings are the most by a Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901)...He also did it on July 6, 2025 at Seattle (5.0 innings, 10 K) and this season on May 28 vs. Chicago-NL (5.1 innings, 10 K).

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes was named to his third straight National League All-Star team on July 4...Per Sarah Langs, he was one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star Game in at least each of his first three career seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) and Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)... He became only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three consecutive All-Star teams, joining Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Elroy Face (1959-61) on that short list.

THE 500 CLUB: Skenes’ fourth-inning strikeout of Elly De La Cruz during his start on June 26 vs. Cincinnati was the 500th of his Major League career (it came in his 72nd start)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)’s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)’s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego’s Mat Latos (2010).
