### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Oct. 1, 1961:** Roger Maris hits his 61st home run in the season's final game off Boston's Tracy Stallard at Yankee Stadium, establishing a then-Major League record. It was the only run in a 1-0 Yankees victory.

**Oct. 1, 1932:** In Game 3 of the World Series at Wrigley Field, Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig each hit two home runs in the Yankees' 7-5 win over the Cubs. Ruth's second homer, which came in the fifth inning, is his fabled "called shot."

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Oct. 2, 1978:** After falling as many as 14 games behind Boston in the AL East standings, the Yankees defeat the Red Sox, 5-4 in Fenway Park, in only the second one-game playoff game in AL history. Trailing 2-0 in the seventh, the Yankees' offense is sparked when Bucky Dent hits a two-out homer to give New York a 3-2 lead.

**Oct. 2, 1932:** The Yankees complete a four-game sweep of the Cubs and capture their fourth World Series title, defeating Chicago at Wrigley Field, 13-6. Tony Lazzeri hits two home runs and six Yankees record multiple hits in the clinching win.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees conclude the 2023 season today with the final game of a three-game set at Kansas City (1-1 thus far)...are 3-2 on their last road trip after winning two-of-three games at Toronto and splitting the first two games at Kansas City.

- Have won four of their last six games and six of their last nine games (since 9/21)...are 12-7 in their last 19 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a 20-11 (.645) record since 8/28, tied with Baltimore for the second-best record in the Majors over that span, trailing only San Diego (20-10, .667)**...are 22-14 in their last 36 games (since 8/23).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees defeated the Royals, 5-2, on Saturday at Kauffman Stadium...**RHP Clarke Schmidt** (4.0IP, 8H, 2ER, 0BB, 3K, 1HR, 1WP) started and allowed 2ER in 4.0IP without recording a decision...**RF Oswaldo Cabrera** (1-for-4, 1RBI) drove in the first Yankees' run with an RBI single in the fourth inning...**LF Everson Pereira** (1-for-5, 1RBI) tied the game in the fourth inning with an RBI single...**CF Estevan Florial** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI) hit a go-ahead RBI single in the sixth inning...**2B Gleyber Torres** (2-for-4, 1R, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit a two-run single in the sixth inning...**3B/1B DJ LeMahieu** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 triple, 1BB, 1SB) reached base three times and hit a triple in the third inning...**DH Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1BB), **1B Jake Bauers** (0-for-1, 1R, 2BB) and **C Kyle Higashioka** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double) each reached base twice...**RHP Frankie Montas** (1.1IP, 2H, 0R, 1BB, 1K) earned the win in his season debut...**RHP Ian Hamilton** (2.0IP, 2H, 1K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief...**RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 2K) earned his career-high 24th save of the season.

**WINNING WAYS:** With their 82nd win of the season on Saturday, **the Yankees clinched their 31st consecutive winning season** (since 1993)...their current 31-season streak is the second-longest such stretch in Major League history behind only the franchise's streak of 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.  
► Their current 31-season streak is the third-longest streak of consecutive winning seasons all-time in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their own 39-season stretch and 32 straight winning seasons by the Montreal Canadiens (1952-83).

**GLEYBER DAY:** INF **Gleyber Torres** reached base three times on Saturday, including a two-run single in the sixth...has reached base multiple times in 11 of his last 17 games (since 9/12-G2).  
► Is batting .310/.400/.515 (62-for-200) with 33R, 14 doubles, 9HR, 24RBI, 28BB, 2HP and 5SB in 53 games since 8/1...has hit safely in 38 of those games and has reached base safely in 44 of those contests...**his .915 OPS since 8/1 is the ninth-highest in the AL (min. 150PA)**.  
► Since 7/6, is hitting .306/.376/.496 (85-for-278) with 43R, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 12HR, 32RBI, 31BB, 2HP, 3SF and 6SB in 72 games in that span.  
► Has 4BB of his last six games (since 9/25), 10BB in his last 14 games (since 9/15) and 15BB in his last 23 games (since 9/6)...has recorded a career-high 67BB this season.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees enter their final road game of the season with a record of 40-40...*if the Yankees win today*, it would mark their fifth winning season on the road in the last six seasons since 2018 (also 42-39 in 2022, 46-35 in 2021, 46-35 in 2019 and 47-34 in 2018)...they would also become one of just four teams in that span to post a winning record on the road in at least five of the last six seasons, joining Atlanta (six), Los Angeles-NL (six) and Houston (five).

**LEMACHINE:** INF **DJ LeMahieu** reached base three times on Saturday, including a triple in the third inning...has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games (since 9/12-G1), batting .286 (16-for-56) with 8R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5RBI, 8BB and 2SB in that span.  
► Since the All-Star break (since 7/14), is hitting .272/.375/.433 (59-for-217) in 59 games in that span...prior to the break, had batted .220/.285/.357 (61-for-277) in 76 games.  
► Has reached base in 21 of his last 25 games (since 8/30), 39 of his last 45 games (since 8/1), 56 of his last 64 games (since 7/4) and 63 of his last 73 games (since 6/23).  
► Has reached base multiple times in 23 of his last 43 games (since 8/4) and 29 of his last 53 games (since 7/21).

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 11-2 in their last 13 games vs. Kansas City (since 8/11/21), 14-3 in their last 17 games vs. the Royals (since 6/23/21) and 19-5 in their last 24 games against Kansas City (since 4/19/19).  
► **Have won each of their last 15 completed series vs. the Royals since 5/25/15, going 37-12 in that span...according to STATS, their 15-series winning streak vs. the Royals is tied for their second-longest such streak vs. an opponent in franchise history**, trailing only a 21-series streak vs. the Boston Red Sox from 1930-33...also recorded a 15-series winning streak vs. the Kansas City Athletics from 1955-57.

**GO WITH THE FLO:** OF **Estevan Florial** hit a go-ahead RBI single in the sixth inning on Saturday...has reached base in 14 of his last 16 games (since 9/12-G2), hitting safely in 12 of those games.

**KING OF THE HILL:** RHP **Michael King** will make his ninth start of the season today...**as a starter this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K in eight starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his last seven starts (since 8/24), posting a 1.05 ERA (34.1IP, 4ER) in that span**...over that same stretch, **leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in ERA**, trailing only San Diego's Blake Snell (0.47).  
► **Has recorded 35K over his last four starts (22.2IP)**.  
► Since 7/21, has gone 2-3 with a 1.64 ERA (49.1IP, 9ER) and 69K in 17 games (eight starts).

**ALL RISE:** OF **Aaron Judge** is batting **.370/.532/.848 (17-for-46) with 12R, 4 doubles, 6HR, 17RBI and 16BB over his last 14 games (since 9/14-G2)**.

- **Has hit 37HR in 106 games this season...is just the second player in Major League history to hit at least 37HR in a season while playing in 107 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees play their last game of the season today), joining Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland).
- Has reached base multiple times in 56 of his 106 games this year, including 44 of his last 77 games (since 5/12).
- Has reached base in 48-of-102 plate appearances over his last 23 games (since 9/5), posting a .471 OBP in that span (22H, 26BB).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 37HR are the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the 10th-most in the Majors...is also tied for fourth in the AL in game-winning RBI (13) and ranks sixth in walks (88)**.
- Since being reinstated from the injured list on 7/28, his 18HR are tied for first in the AL and tied for fourth in the Majors...leads the AL with 53BB and ranks second in the Majors in that span, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (59)...also ranks fourth in the AL and 10th in the Majors in OBP (.408) over that span...additionally, ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.965) and sixth in SLG (.557) over that stretch.
- **Has walked in a season-high six straight games (since 9/24), recording 8BB in that span**...marks his longest stretch since his career-high-tying eight-game streak from 9/24-10/2/22.
- Has hit .382/.475/.853 (26-for-68) with 19R, 5 doubles, 9HR, 20RBI, 11BB, 1HP and 1SB in his last 18 games vs. the Royals (since 7/26/18).
- Has 7HR in his last eight games vs. Kansas City (since 4/29/22)...has 3HR in his last four games at Kauffman Stadium (since 4/29/22).

**CENTRAL PERK:** Since 2022, the Yankees are 43-21 (.672) vs. the AL Central...are 54-25 in their last 79 games vs. the division (since 6/23/21) and 67-31 in their last 98 games (since 9/12/19-G1).  
► Have won or split 25 of their last 31 completed series vs. the AL Central (going 24-6-1 since 9/10/19), 28 of their last 34 completed series (going 25-6-3 since 6/13/19) and 31 of their last 38 completed series (going 28-7-3 since 4/18/19).

**CLOSING TIME:** RHP **Clay Holmes** recorded his career-high 24th save of the season on Saturday after tossing a perfect ninth inning...**has not allowed a run in 12 of his last 13 outings (since 8/31), posting a 0.69 ERA (13.0IP, 1ER) with eight saves in that span**...has retired 39-of-48 batters faced over that stretch (5H/4BB).

**RIGHT HAND MAN:** RHP **Ian Hamilton** tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of relief on Saturday...has tossed 2.0-or-more innings in 13 of his 36 relief appearances this season, with nine of those outings being scoreless.  
► **His 2.33 ERA as a reliever (54.0IP, 14ER) ranks ninth in the AL among qualified relievers**.

**BATTERS' EYE:** **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 4.03 pitches per plate appearance ratio and rank third with a 9.52 PA/BB ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

**AUSTIN POWERS:** C **Austin Wells** has recorded at least 1H in nine of his last 12 games (since 9/12-G2)...has reached base safely in 10 of those games.  
► Is hitting .296/.321/.778 (8-for-27) with 5R, 1 double, 4HR, 9RBI and 1BB in his last seven games (since 9/20).  
► **Has 8RBI over his last four games (since 9/25)**.  
► **Has 4HR in his last seven games (since 9/20)**...eight of his 13H this season have gone for extra bases (4 doubles, 4HR).

**RARE OCCURRENCE:** The Yankees were eliminated from postseason play on 9/24 for the first time since 2016...the Yankees were just one of three teams to make the postseason in each of the past six seasons (2017-22, also Houston and Los Angeles-NL)...over that span, 26 teams missed the playoffs at least twice, 22 teams missed the postseason at least three times, 18 teams missed the playoffs at least four times and 13 teams missed the postseason at least five times during that six-season stretch.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP MICHAEL KING (4-7, 2.50 ERA)

**RHP Michael King** will make his 49th appearance (ninth start) of the season in today's series finale at Kansas City...the 28-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...made his last start on Tuesday at Toronto, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in a no decision (1H, 5BB, 5K)...in his last seven starts (since 8/24), is 1-2 with a 1.05 ERA (34.1IP, 4ER) and 47K in that span...**his 1.05 ERA in that span leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in that span**...is 4-7 with six saves and a 2.50 ERA (100.2IP, 80H, 31R/28ER, 32BB, 126K, 7HR) in 48 appearances (eight starts) this season...in eight starts this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K...as a reliever this season, is 3-4 with six saves, a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 22ER) and 76K in 40 appearances...has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 23 of his 48 appearances this season (15 in relief, eight starts), with 14 of those 23 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are tied for the most in the AL and tied for second-the most in the Majors...has recorded at least five outs in 28 of his 48 outings this season (20 in relief, eight starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and seventh-most in the Majors...over five seasons with the Yankees (2019-23), has gone 13-16 with seven saves and a 3.29 ERA (243.2IP, 204H, 99R/89ER, 83BB, 281K, 21HR) in 114 appearances (18 starts)...was acquired by the Yankees from Miami along with 2017-18 signing bonus pool money in exchange for INF Garrett Cooper and LHP Caleb Smith on 11/20/17.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Last started on Tuesday at Toronto, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in a no decision (1H, 5BB, 5K)...marked his second career outing of at least 6.0 scoreless innings with 1H-or-fewer allowed (also 6.0IP, 0R, 1H on 4/4/21 vs. Toronto).

- ✦ Allowed his only hit to Alejandro Kirk with a single in the third inning.
- ✦ His 5BB matched his career high (also 5BB on 8/8/20 at Tampa Bay).

**FOR STARTERS:** Has made eight starts for the Yankees this season, going 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K.

- ✦ In his last seven starts (since 8/24), is 1-2 with a 1.05 ERA (34.1IP, 4ER) and 47K in that span...**his 1.05 ERA in that span leads the AL and ranks second in the Majors in that span.**
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his eight starts this season.
- ✦ Has surrendered 1BB-or-fewer in six of his eight starts and 0BB in four starts.
- ✦ Earned his first career win as a starter on 9/3 at Houston after allowing just 1ER over 5.0IP (5H, 0BB, 4K).
- ✦ In 18 career starts, has gone 1-8 with a 4.08 ERA (75.0IP, 34ER) and 86K.

**VS. KANSAS CITY:** Has made four career appearances (one start) vs. the Royals, posting a 2.25 ERA (8.0IP, 2ER) and 10K.

- ✦ Has made two relief appearances vs. Kansas City this season, tossing 1.2 scoreless innings (3H, 0BB, 3K).
- ✦ Tossed 1.2 scoreless innings of relief on 5/1/22 in his only outing at Kauffman Stadium.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** In 23 appearances (five starts) on the road this season, has gone 2-3 with three saves and a 1.82 ERA (54.1IP, 36H, 11ER, 17BB, 63K, 3HR).

- ✦ In five road starts this season, is 1-2 with a 1.66 ERA (21.2IP, 4ER) and 25K.
- ✦ Has tossed 1.1IP-or-more in 18 of those outings (13 in relief, five starts).
- ✦ 17 of his appearances on the road this season have been scoreless.
- ✦ In 54 career appearances (11 starts) on the road, is 4-8 with three saves and a 3.15 ERA (123.0IP, 91H, 47R/43ER, 43BB, 7HP, 132K, 7HR).

**KING OF THE HILL:** Is 4-7 with six saves and a 2.50 ERA (100.2IP, 80H, 31R/28ER, 32BB, 126K, 7HR) in 48 appearances (eight starts) this season.

- ✦ In eight starts for the Yankees this season, has gone 1-3 with a 1.49 ERA (36.1IP, 6ER) and 50K.
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his eight starts this season.
- ✦ Struck out 13 batters without issuing a walk on 9/20 vs. Toronto, becoming the first Yankees starter to record at 13K with no walks allowed in a start since Gerrit Cole on 9/1/21 at Los Angeles-AL (15K, 0BB)...became the 11th Yankees starter to do so in franchise history (15th time).
- ✦ Did not allow a run in eight straight relief outings from 7/21-8/16...recorded 17K over 11.2 scoreless innings during that span.
- ✦ Has thrown 2.0 innings-or-more in 23 of his 48 appearances this season (15 in relief, eight in starts), with 14 of those 23 outings being scoreless...his 12 relief appearances of at least 2.0 scoreless innings are tied for the most in the AL and tied for second- the most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least five outs in 28 of his 48 outings this season (20 in relief, eight starts)...his 20 such relief appearances are tied for the third-most in the AL and tied for the seventh-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded at least 1K in 36 of his 42 relief outings this season...has collected multiple strikeouts in 28 of those appearances...has 3K-or-more in 12 relief outings this season, the fifth-most such games among AL relievers and the seventh-most in the Majors.
- ✦ Has recorded multiple strikeouts in a career-high 14 straight games (since 7/28)...has recorded multiple strikeouts in 21 of his last 24 outings (since 6/23).
- ✦ As a reliever, has gone 3-4 with six saves and a 3.08 ERA (64.1IP, 51H, 23R/22ER, 23BB, 76K, 6HR).
- ✦ Has six saves this season after entering 2023 with just one career save...has tossed more than 1.0 inning in four of his six saves this season.
