IN THE STANDINGS [187 days]: The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings this season: FIRST: 173, SECOND: 13. THIRD: 1, FOURTH: 0, FIFTH: 0.....the team finished in first place, ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs by 10.0 games. Reds by 16.0 games and Pirates by 17.0 games.....the team was in first place every day from April 30 through the end of the season and clinched a postseason berth and the NL Central championship on Sept. 18.

AT HOME: The Brewers went 47-34 at home this season (5th in MLB), going 15-9-2 in series play.....the team had two season-high 6-game home winning streaks, coming from 5/29-6/10 and 6/15-6/28.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 46-35 on the road this season (T4th in MLB), going 15-9-2 in series play.....went 21-10 in their last 31 road games.....the team had two season-high 4-game road winning streaks, coming from 4/9-4/13 and 8/6-8/20.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing **Bud Black** in June (42-54).....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach), Matt Erickson (infield coach) and Charlie Greene (bullben coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

GAME 1 STARTER: #51 - RHP FREDDY PERALTA (32gs, 11-9, 3.68)

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: Freddy Peralta, 28, went 11-9 with a 3.68 ERA in 32 starts this season.....the team went 19-13 in his starts.....he made 11 quality starts.....opponents batted .224 (143-for-639, 26hr).....he set career highs in starts (32) and innings pitched (173.2).....he produced 200+ strikeouts (200) for the second time in his career and for the second straight season (210 in 2023).....he joined Teddy Higuera (2x), Corbin Burnes (3x) and Yovani Gallardo (4x) as the only pitchers in franchise history with multiple 200+ strikeout seasons.....he ranked sixth in the National League in strikeouts.....Peralta was acquired from Seattle, along with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki, in exchange for 1B Adam Lind on 12/9/15.....on 2/28/20, he signed a 5-year contract through the 2024 season with club options for 2025 and 2026.

POSTSEASON CAREER: Is 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA in 4 games/2 starts (13ip, 7h, 5r, 5er, 6bb, 17k, 2hr).....pitched in the postseason in 2018, 2020-21 and 2023.....started Game 3 of the 2021 NLDS at Atlanta and received no decision in the Brewers' 3-0 loss (4ip, 3h, 0r, 1bb, 5k).....his other start came in Game 2 of the 2023 NL Wild Card Series vs. Arizona as he took a 5-2 loss (5ip, 3h, 4r, 4er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr).

CAREER: Is 53-36 with a 3.79 ERA and 1 save in 178 games/129 starts (754.1ip, 318er)....is in his seventh MLB season, all with the Brewers (2018-24)....was a 2021 All-Star.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 31-19 with a 3.52 ERA in 95 games/67 starts (407ip, 159er).....went 6-5 with a 4.01 ERA in 17 starts this season (94.1ip, 42er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 22-17 with a 4.12 ERA in 83 games/62 starts (347.1ip, 159er).....went 5-4 with a 3.29 ERA in 15 starts this season (79.1ip, 29er).

CAREER vs. METS: Is 3-0 with a 2.60 ERA in 3 starts against the Mets (17.1ip, 8h, 5r, 5er, 5bb, 20k, 2hr), including a 3-1 victory in his only start this season on Opening Day at Citi Field (6ip, 1h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 8k, 1hr).
