**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees conclude their nine-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game series at Texas (2-0 thus far)...are 7-1 on the road trip after sweeping Boston in a three-game set, winning two-of-three games at Houston and winning their first two games at Texas...following this road trip, will return home for a seven-game homestand, featuring a four-game set vs. Baltimore (Fri.-Mon.) and a three-game series vs. Texas (5/5-7).

- Their 20-10 (.667) record is the best in the American League and tied for the second-best in the Majors...** their 20 wins are the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors.
- Have won 10 of their last 11G (since 4/17), 11 of their last 13G (since 4/15) and 12 of their last 15G (since 4/13).**
- Including their current series, have won or split eight of their 10 series this season (7-2-1), including each of their last five (4-0-1)...have also won five of their six series on the road this year.
- Are a season-high 10 games over .500.
- The Yankees are 16-3 this season when scoring first.**
- The Yankees' +50 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees won their series against the Rangers with a 3-2 victory on Tuesday at Globe Life Field...**RHP Cam Schittler** (6.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 8K) earned his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings...**LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) drove in the first run for the Yankees with an RBI double in the first inning...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a solo home run in the seventh inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI) homered in his third straight game, hitting his 12th home run of the year with a solo shot in the ninth inning and tying the Major League lead...**LHP Brent Hoadrick** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) and **RHP Fernando Cruz** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 2K) were both scoreless in relief...**RHP David Bednar** (1.0IP, 2H, 2R/1ER, 1HP) earned his AL-leading ninth save of the season.

**SCHLITZ'S CREEK:** RHP Cam Schittler earned his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings on Tuesday at Texas (3H, 2BB, 8K)...marked his third scoreless start this season (also 3/27 at San Francisco and 4/1 at Seattle).

- Has gone 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA (41.2IP, 25H, 9R/7ER, 6BB, 49K, 1HR) in seven starts this season,** holding opponents to a .168/.200/.242 (25-for-149) slash line...**has also allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of his starts, including each of his last three starts.**
- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts this season...** along with his nine-start streak to begin the 2025 season, **is one of just four pitchers in franchise history to allow 3R-or-fewer in at least seven starts to begin a season multiple times...** joins Gerrit Cole (3x: first 8GS in 2021 and '22, and first 7GS in '23), Jim Bouton (2x: first 12GS in 1966 and first 10GS in '63) and Whitey Ford (2x: first 8GS in 1956 and first 7GS in '67)...joins Cole as the only two pitchers to do so in consecutive seasons.
- Is just the fourth Yankee pitcher in the last 27 seasons (since 2000) to record a 1.51-or-lower ERA through their first seven starts of a season,** joining Max Fried (1.01 ERA in first 7GS in 2025), Gerrit Cole (1.35 ERA in first 7GS in 2023) and Nestor Cortes (1.35 ERA in first 7GS in 2022).
- Is only the fourth pitcher in franchise history (fifth time) to post a sub-1.75 ERA and record at least 45K through their first seven starts of a season,** joining Gerrit Cole (2x: 1.35 ERA and 52K in first 7GS in 2023; 1.61 ERA and 66K in first 7GS in 2021), Nestor Cortes (1.35 ERA and 49K in first 7GS in 2022) and Mike Mussina (1.70 ERA and 63K in first 7GS in 2003).
- Over his last 15 Major League starts (since 8/20/25), has gone 7-2 with a 1.91 ERA (85.0IP, 18ER) and 103K...** the Yankees are 13-2 in those starts.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** Yankees batters lead the Majors with 48HR this season...hit 2HR on Tuesday at Texas...have hit at least 2HR in four of their last five games (since 4/24) and eight of their last 12 games (since 4/16)...their 13 games with at least 2HR this season are tied with Chicago-AL for the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Chicago-NL (14).

- Have homered in 13 straight games (since 4/15), hitting 29HR over that span.

**AUSTIN POWERS:** C Austin Wells hit his third home run of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning on Tuesday at Texas...**has 2HR in his last three games...** has reached base safely in 18 of his 42PA over his last 11 games (since 4/13), posting a .429 OBP.

**PITCH PERFECT:** Yankees pitchers allowed only 2R/1ER on Tuesday at Texas...have allowed only 1ER-or-fewer in seven of their last 11G (since 4/17), posting a 2.11 ERA (98.0IP, 23ER) over that span.

**GET THE BROOMS OUT:** The Yankees will look to complete their fourth series sweep of the season today (also 3G at San Francisco from 3/25-28, 3G vs. Kansas City from 4/17-19 and 3G at Boston from 4/21-23).

- With a win today, would mark their first sweep of the Rangers on the road since a three-game set from 5/1-3(G2)/07.

**WELCOME TO THE SHOW:** RHP Elmer Rodríguez will make his Major League debut today at Texas...in four starts with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 12H, 4R/3ER, 7BB, 20K, 1HR)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in all four starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts.

- Will be the third Yankees pitcher in the last 19 seasons (since 2008) to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher at age 22-or-younger,** joining Deivi García (21y, 103d on 8/30/20-G2 vs. the Mets) and Luis Severino (21y, 166d on 8/5/15 vs. Boston).
- Was named by Baseball America as the Yankees' 2025 Minor League "Player of the Year" after going 11-8 with a 2.58 ERA (150.0IP, 104H, 52R/43ER, 57BB, 176K, 3HR) in 27 combined appearances (26 starts) with High-A Hudson Valley, Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre last season...** among qualified minor league pitchers in 2025, ranked second in strikeouts, was tied for fifth in innings pitched and eighth in opponents' BA (.192) and ERA...also ranked first among Yankees farmhands in strikeouts and innings pitched, was tied for first in starts, second in ERA, opponents' BA and WHIP (1.07), and tied for third in wins.

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** homered in his third straight game on Tuesday at Texas, hitting his 12th home run of the season with a solo shot in the ninth inning...**his 12HR are tied with Chicago-AL's Munezaka Murakami for the most in the Majors.**

- Marks the second time in his career he has hit at least 12HR through the club's first 30 games of a season (also 13HR in first 30G in 2017)...is one of seven Yankees (11th time) to accomplish the feat,** joining Babe Ruth (4x: 12HR in 1921, '26, '28 and '30), Mickey Mantle (15HR in 1956), Yogi Berra (12HR in 1956), Tino Martinez (12HR in 1997), Alex Rodriguez (14HR in 2007), his own 13HR in 2017 and Luke Voit (12HR in 2020)...joins Ruth as the only Yankees to do so multiple times.
- Has homered in three straight games for the 17th time in his career and for the first time this season (first since a three-game streak from 6/8-11/25)...has homered in consecutive games for the fourth time this season (also 2G from 3/27-28, 4/12-13 and 4/15-16).**
- Marked his 380th career HR, surpassing Orlando Cepeda and Tony Pérez (379) for sole possession of 75th place on the all-time home runs list.
- Has hit 9HR in his last 16 games (since 4/12).**
- Is tied for the Major League lead in HR (12, tied for first in AL),** ranks second in pitches per PA (4.51, second in AL), third in SLG (.645, third in AL) and OPS (1.037, third in AL), tied for third in total bases (69, second in AL), fourth in XBH (17, third in AL) and tied for seventh in runs scored (25, third in AL).
- Has reached base in 37 of his 41 career games vs. Texas, batting .313/.390/.646 (45-for-144) with 34R, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 13HR, 25RBI, 17BB/1BB, 2HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- 17 of his 28H this season have been XBH (12HR, 5 doubles).
- Has reached base multiple times in seven of his last eight games (since 4/21) and nine of his last 11 games (since 4/17)...has reached base in 23 of his last 24 games (since 4/3).
- Has batted .324/.390/.541 (12-for-37) with 2 doubles, 2HR and 4BB in his career off Texas' RHP Nathan Eovaldi.

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a Major League-best 2.70 ERA (173.1IP, 52ER) and 172K in 30 starts this season...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 10 of their last 11 starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.67 ERA (70.0IP, 13ER) over that span...have not allowed an ER in six of their last 11 starts.

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 26 of their 30 starts this season.
- Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 19 of their 30 starts, tied for their second-most through their first 30 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 24 starts in 2022 (also had 19 starts in 1958).
- Lead the Majors in ERA (2.70), opponents' BA (.203), opponents' OBP (.261), opponents' SLG (.322), opponents' OPS (.584), WHIP (0.99) and K/BB (3.91),** rank second in BB/9.0IP (2.28, second in AL), is tied for second in strikeouts (172, tied for second in AL), third in innings pitched (173.1, second in AL) and strikeout rate (25.1%, second in AL), fourth in HR/9.0IP (0.83, third in AL) and ninth in K/9.0IP (8.93, sixth in AL).

**DYNAMIC DUO: OF Aaron Judge (12HR) and C/INF Ben Rice (10HR) are only the third pair of Yankees teammates in franchise history to each hit at least 10HR in the club's first 30 games of a season,** joining Babe Ruth (12HR) and Lou Gehrig (10HR) in 1930 and Yogi Berra (12HR) and Mickey Mantle (15HR) in 1956...are only the third set of teammates in Major League history to each hit at least 10HR before May 1, joining Los Angeles-NL's Cody Bellinger and Joc Pederson in 2019 and Colorado's Trevor Story and Nolan Arenado in 2016...are the only set to hit at least 10HR and record 20BB before May 1.

- Judge and Rice have combined to hit 22HR this year, more than four Major League teams (San Francisco-19HR, Boston-20HR, Milwaukee-20HR and Miami-21HR).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP ELMER RODRÍGUEZ (MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT)

**RHP Elmer Rodríguez** will make his Major League debut in today's series finale at Texas...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre prior to today's game...the 22-year-old will make the start on extended six days' rest...last pitched on 4/22 vs. Rochester with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, recording the loss despite allowing 1R/ER over 5.2IP (3H, 1BB, 7K, 0HR, 1WP)...in four starts with the RailRiders this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 12H, 4R/3ER, 7BB, 20K, 1HR)...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in all four starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts...**was named by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' 2025 Minor League "Player of the Year" after going 11-8 with a 2.58 ERA (150.0IP, 104H, 52R/43ER, 57BB, 176K, 3HR) in 27 combined appearances (26 starts) with High-A Hudson Valley (15G/14GS), Double-A Somerset (11GS) and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (1GS) last season**...among qualified minor league pitchers in 2025, ranked second in strikeouts, was tied for fifth in innings pitched and eighth in opponents' BA (.192) and ERA...also ranked first among Yankees farmhands in strikeouts and innings pitched, was tied for first in starts, second in ERA, opponents' BA and WHIP (1.07), and tied for third in wins...following the 2025 season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 2 prospect and the No. 59 prospect in baseball...was also tabbed as the Yankees' No. 3 prospect by MLB Pipeline and the No. 82 prospect in baseball...over parts of five minor league seasons in the Boston Red Sox (2022-24) and Yankees (2025-26) organizations, has gone 23-21 with a 2.51 ERA (354.2IP, 255H, 135R/99ER, 149BB, 391K, 13HR) in 79 career games (74 starts)...the San Juan, P.R., native was originally selected by Boston in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by the Yankees along with international signing bonus pool money from the Red Sox in exchange for C Carlos Narváez on 12/11/24.

**WELCOME TO THE SHOW:** Will be making his Major League debut today vs. Texas...will be the first Yankee to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher since Cam Schlichtler on 7/9/25 vs. Seattle and the first to do so on the road since Will Warren on 7/30/24 at Philadelphia.

- ✦ **Will be the third Yankees pitcher in the last 19 seasons (since 2008) to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher at age 22-or-younger**, joining Deivi García (21y, 103d on 8/30/20-G2 vs. the Mets) and Luis Severino (21y, 166d on 8/5/15 vs. Boston).
- ✦ Will be the first Yankee to make his Major League debut this season.

**2026:** In four starts with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre this season, has gone 1-2 with a 1.27 ERA (21.1IP, 12H, 4R/3ER, 7BB, 20K, 1HR)...has limited opposing batters to a .171 (12-for-70) BA.

- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in all four starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three starts.
- ✦ Has surrendered 4H-or-fewer in all four starts.
- ✦ Made his season debut on 4/2 at Rochester, recording the loss despite allowing 1R/ER over 5.0IP (4H, 2BB, 2K, 0HR).
- ✦ Did not record a decision in his second start of the year on 4/10-G1 vs. Durham (5.0IP, 3H, 2R/1ER, 2BB, 5K, 1HR, 1WP).
- ✦ Earned his first win of the season on 4/15 at Syracuse after tossing 5.2 scoreless innings (2H, 2BB, 6K, 1HP).
- ✦ Made his most recent start on 4/22 vs. Rochester, recording the loss despite allowing 1R/ER over 5.2IP (3H, 1BB, 7K, 0HR, 1WP).
- ✦ Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2026 World Baseball Classic...made one start vs. Team Cuba on 3/9, earning the win after tossing 3.0 scoreless innings (1H, 3BB, 3K).

**LA ISLA DEL ENCANTO:** *With his start today*, will become just the fourth Puerto Rican-born pitcher to start a game for the Yankees, joining Javier Vázquez (58 combined starts in 2004 and '10), Ed Figueroa (126 starts from 1976-80) and Ricky Bones (one start in 1996)...additionally, would be just the ninth Puerto Rican-born pitcher in franchise history to appear in game (also Jonathan Albaladejo, Luis Arroyo, Fernando Cruz, Bobby Muñoz and Juan Padilla).

- ✦ Pitched for Team Puerto Rico in the 2026 World Baseball Classic...made one start vs. Team Cuba on 3/9, earning the win after tossing 3.0 scoreless innings (1H, 3BB, 3K).

**2025: Was named by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' 2025 Minor League "Player of the Year" after going 11-8 with a 2.58 ERA (150.0IP, 104H, 52R/43ER, 57BB, 176K, 3HR) in 27 combined appearances (26 starts) with High-A Hudson Valley (15G/14GS), Double-A Somerset (11GS) and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (1GS).**

- ✦ Among qualified minor league pitchers, ranked second in strikeouts, was tied for fifth in innings pitched and eighth in opponents' BA (.192) and ERA...also ranked first among Yankees farmhands in strikeouts and innings pitched, was tied for first in starts, second in ERA, opponents' BA and WHIP (1.07), and tied for third in wins.
- ✦ Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of his 27 games, 2R-or-fewer in 18 games and 1R-or-fewer in 13 games (including 0R in 10 games)...had tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in his lone relief appearance on 6/13 vs. Greenville.
- ✦ Tossed at least 6.0IP in 14 of his starts and at least 7.0IP in four starts.
- ✦ Began the season with High-A Hudson Valley, going 6-4 with a 2.26 ERA (83.2IP, 52H, 27R/21ER, 37BB, 99K, 1HR) in 15 games (14 starts)...was named the South Atlantic League "Pitcher of the Week" for 4/21-27 after allowing only 1H and striking out 12 batters over 6.1 scoreless innings in his start on 4/25 at Asheville (W, 1BB).
- ✦ Was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 7/11 and went 5-3 with a 2.64 ERA (61.1IP, 44H, 21R/18ER, 20BB, 74K, 2HR) in 11 starts...was named the Eastern League "Pitcher of the Week" for 9/1-7 after going 1-0 over two scoreless starts (11.0IP, 3H, 2BB, 16K).
- ✦ Made his final appearance of the year with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (L, 5.0IP, 8H, 4R/ER, 0BB, 3K, 0HR, 1HP, 1BK)...also made a postseason start with the RailRiders on 9/25 at Jacksonville in Game 3 of the International League Championship Series at Jacksonville (L, 0.2IP, 4H, 5R/ER, 2BB, 2K, 0HR).
- ✦ Following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 2 prospect and the No. 59 prospect in baseball...was also tabbed as the Yankees' No. 3 prospect by MLB Pipeline and the No. 82 prospect in baseball...was named by *Baseball America* as a High Class A All-Star and as a First-Team All-Star...was also labeled by *Baseball America* as having the "Best Curveball" and "Best Control" in the Yankees system.
- ✦ Was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/18.
