## Detroit Tigers (44-25) at Baltimore Orioles (27-39)

**WHERE THE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD:** The Detroit Tigers and Baltimore Orioles tonight play the rubber match of their three game series at Oriole Park at Camden Yards, Detroit's lone road games within a stretch of playing nine out of 12 games at Comerica Park, a span that then extends to 15 of 21 home games to conclude the month of June ... tomorrow, the Tigers continue their home heavy schedule when they begin a six-game N.L. Central homestand vs. Cincinnati and Pittsburgh.

- At 44-25, the Tigers have the best record in the American League and are half a game behind the Mets for the best mark in the majors ... the Tigers are off to their best start through 69 games in 19 years when they began 45-24 in 2006.
- The Tigers are now 26-13 in their last 39 games starting April 30 ... into today's rubber match, the Tigers are 15-5-1 in their first 21 series to start the season.
- The Tigers have posted a 44-22 record, a .667 winning percentage, in their last 66 games starting March 31 since enduring a three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 44-22 record, which is a 108-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 4.5-games up on the Yankees, the next closest A.L. team.

**IT'S GOOD TO BE KING:** Tarik Skubal has 95 strikeouts and only three walks in his last 11 starts dating to April 8, the first pitcher in major league history (dating to 1893) with 95 or more strikeouts and three walks or fewer in an 11-start span within the same season ... thanks to Elias.

- Overall this season, Skubal has a 15.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio, which is more than double the next-closest competitor in Texas' Nathan Eovaldi (7.30) and 2.5 times the next-next-closest pitchers, Seattle's Bryan Woo and Atlanta's Spencer Schwellenbach, and their 6.00 K/BB ratio.
- The only big league pitcher ever to throw more than 100.0 innings in a season with a 12.0 strikeout-to-walk-ratio or better?: Clayton Kershaw with a 15.64 mark in 2016.
- Skubal enters tonight's start having reached 7.0 innings pitched in three starts in a row for only the second time in his career (also May 26-June 7, 2022).

**THE TORK DELIVERS:** Spencer Torkelson has 16 homers, 31 extra-base hits and 47 RBI this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals ... in total, there are eight players overall in the majors to have reached those numbers.

- Torkelson ranks fourth in the A.L. in homers and RBI and is tied for sixth in extra-base hits ... Torkelson's .339 on-base percentage is currently 44 points higher than last year's .295 mark and his .504 slugging is 130 points higher than last year's .374 mark.
- Torkelson has now hit 10 home runs with two strikes this year, the most in the majors ... Torkelson also leads the A.L. and is tied for second in the majors with 19 RBI with runners in scoring position and two outs ... his seven extra-base hits with RISP/two outs lead the A.L. and tie for most in the majors.

**THE STREAK CAN VOTE, SO SHOULD YOU AT TIGERS.COM/VOTE:** Gleyber Torres went 1-for-4 last night and has now reached base safely in 18-consecutive games, the sixth-longest active streak in the majors ... Torres now boasts the longest streak to reach base safely by a Tiger this season and longest overall since Kerry Carpenter reached safely in 24-straight games from August 2-28, 2023.

- Torres has a .423 on-base percentage during this 18-game run and has accepted 17 walks compared to striking out only 14 times in this span.
- Torres has turned in a .770 OPS this season, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. and second to only St. Louis' Brendan Donovan (.819) in the majors ... Torres leads all major league second basemen with a .379 on-base percentage, leads A.L. second basemen with a .270 batting average, is second in the A.L. with 30 RBI and third in the A.L. with a .391 slugging.

**VESTED INTERESTS:** Will Vest (11 saves, 1.89 ERA) and Tommy Kahnle (eight saves, 1.24 ERA) are two of the 10 pitchers in baseball with at least eight saves and a sub-2.00 ERA this season and the only set of teammates to each do so ... regardless of ERA, Vest and Kahnle are one of only three sets of teammates to each have eight saves this year, joining San Francisco's Camilo Doval and Ryan Walker as well as New York's Luke Weaver and Devin Williams.

- Vest is the only pitcher in all of baseball with at least five wins, 11 saves and a sub-2.00 ERA.

**PRODUCE SECTION:** Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 47 RBI) and Riley Greene (13 homers, 44 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the American League, as they remain the only set of teammates in the A.L. to have each reached 13 homers and 44 RBI.

**THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE:** The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +85 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+106) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +56 edge on the second-place Twins (+29), are +99 on the third-place Guardians (-14) and are +105 on the fourth-place Royals (-20).

**AND FINALLY:** Tarik Skubal has a 3.4 WAR (Fangraphs), blowing away all A.L. foes ... next closest are Garrett Crochet (2.5), Kris Bubic (2.5), Hunter Brown (2.3), Nathan Eovaldi (2.2) and Max Fried (2.2).

- Threw the first complete-game shutout of his professional career on May 25 against Cleveland, tossing a "Maddux". He needed just 94 pitches (72 strikes/22 balls) to record 27 outs, with 13 of those coming by way of strikeout, tying his career high. His 13 strikeouts were the most strikeouts by any pitcher in major league history in a "Maddux".
- In that outing, he became the first pitcher in Tigers history to throw a complete game issuing zero walks and allowing no more than two hits with at least 13 strikeouts ... he is the first pitcher in the majors to record such a start since Jacob deGrom did so on April 23, 2021.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters on May 9 against Texas, marking the third 12-strikeout game of his career and his most in a game since his career-high 13 on July 7, 2024, at Cincinnati. With the outing, he became the first pitcher in MLB history to have 40+ strikeouts (50), no more than one walk (1) and an ERA under 1.00 (0.97: 4ER/37.0IP) over a six-start span since ERA became in official stat in both leagues in 1913.
- Went 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (5 ER/29.2 IP) with 38 strikeouts and only four walks in five starts in April, a tick better than his April of 2024 when he went 3-0 with a 2.05 ERA (7 ER/30.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts and six walks in five starts en route to winning the A.L. Cy Young Award in unanimous fashion.
- Was the unanimous AL Cy Young winner in 2024, becoming the fifth Tiger to win the award, the first since Max Scherzer in 2013, and the second LHP in franchise history to ever do so (other, Willie Hernandez in 1984).
- Started 31 games last year, posting an 18-4 record with a 2.39 ERA (51ER/192.0IP) and 228 strikeouts...his 18 victories were the most by a Tigers pitcher since Max Scherzer also won 18 in 2014.
- Won the American League Pitching Triple Crown, finishing first in wins (18), ERA (2.39) and strikeouts (228)...became the third pitcher in franchise history and the 22<sup>nd</sup> pitcher in Major League history to win the Triple Crown, joining Justin Verlander (2011) and Hal Newhouser (1945).
- From Sept. 3, 2023-May 17, 2024, Skubal had a 10-0 record with a 1.48 ERA (14ER/85.0IP), 12 walks, 109 strikeouts and four home runs allowed...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Skubal is the third starting pitcher since 1913 to have a 14-start span with an ERA below 1.50, 100-or-more strikeouts, 12-or-fewer walks and four-or-fewer home runs, joining Clayton Kershaw (twice, 9/29/15-6/4/16 and 5/1/16-9/19/16) and Jacob deGrom (4/5/21-7/1/21) while being the only starter with such a stretch while also earning 10 wins.
- Started three games during the postseason, compiling a 1-1 record with a 2.37 ERA (5ER/19.0IP) and 20 strikeouts...started his playoff career by not allowing a run in 17.0 consecutive innings, tied for the fifth-longest streak in MLB history and longest since Ian Anderson started his postseason career with 17.2 straight scoreless innings in 2020.

- Placed on the 15-day injured list with a right triceps strain on April 19...activated by Detroit on May 9 after a brief rehab stint.
- Joins the Tigers on a one-year contract with a club option for the 2026 season.
- Posted a 3.24 ERA (3ER/8.1IP) over eight appearances in spring camp, striking out eight and walking four.
- Spent most of 2024 with the White Sox before joining the Braves for their playoff push on August 31...made five relief appearances for Atlanta in September, posting a 2.70 ERA (2ER/6.2IP) with nine strikeouts and just two walks.
