RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their eight-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (0-4) and Blue Jays (four to play) tonight in Toronto...marks their first time playing back-to-back four-game series since Aug. 18-25, 2022 at Tropicana Field (vs. KC: 3-1; vs. LAA: 4-0) and first time doing so on the road since July 12-18, 2019 (at BAL: 3-1; at NYY: 1-3)...have lost a season-high five straight games, their longest skid since another five-game streak from April 2-8, 2025 (excl. multi-season streaks)...have not dropped six consecutive games since May 19-25, 2024...entering the streak, went 13-4 in their previous 17 games (June 24–July 11), second best in the majors over that span to the Red Sox (13-3)...have also lost their last six road games, their longest skid since July 10-27, 2025 (7G)...have gone 22-27 in their last 49 games (May 24–pres.), 11th in the AL/21st in the majors, on the heels of an MLB-best 34-15 start...overall, lead the AL with a 56-42 record, fourth best in the majors...are currently 0-4 on stretches of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have spent 64 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 22 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...hold a 1.5-game lead in the division, their smallest since June 28 (1.0)...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021.

- ✦ The Rays went 0-for-15 with RISP and 2-for-21 with runners on base in yesterday's 6-1 loss at Fenway Park, completing a four-game sweep...it was their most hitless RISP at-bats in a game they failed to tally a hit with a man in scoring position in franchise history, surpassing the previous mark of 0-for-14 (2x: Sept. 28, 2006 at CLE & July 10, 1998 vs. NYY)...they became the first club to go 0-for-15 (or worse) with RISP since the Tigers on March 27, 2025 (Opening Day) at LAD (0-for-15).
- ✦ The club was swept for the fourth time this season, three of which have come on the road, and for the first time in a four-game set since July 10-13, 2025 at BOS...among AL squads, only the Guardians (1), Blue Jays, Orioles, and Rangers (all 3) have been swept fewer times than the Rays.
- ✦ The Rays have led at some point in each of their last three losses, their second-longest streak of blown-lead defeats this year after they led in each of their first five setbacks (March 26–April 3)...their 19 blown-lead losses on the season are tied with the Astros for third fewest in the AL, with only the Rangers (15) and Red Sox (16) tallying fewer.
- ✦ The pitching staff has allowed a homer in five straight games, and 11 of their 18 runs allowed over the last three games have come via 7 HR...overall, they have allowed the third-highest percentage of runs via long balls in the majors (see table on the right).
- ✦ The Rays rotation has gone eight consecutive outings without completing 6.0 IP, accomplishing the feat only once in their last 14 starts (July 8 vs. NYY: 6.1 IP by **Shane McClellanahan**)...the eight-start stretch is tied with April 14-21 for their longest this season, with their last longer streak of 5.2 IP or fewer starts coming from Sept. 4-13, 2025 (9).
- ✦ The Rays are 0-6-9 in their last 15 four-game series (June 7, 2024–pres.), including 0-1-2 this season...it marks their second-longest streak of winless four-game series in club history (15) behind an 0-15-7 span (2-2) from 2002-04.
- ✦ The Rays AL-best 21-11 record in series openers is tied with the Dodgers (21-11) for second in the majors behind the Brewers (25-7)...they have won four of their last six openers, but are 8-7 in their last 15 since winning nine straight from April 6–May 22.

TRICKY NICK—Coming off his first career All-Star selection and a scoreless 5th inning in the AL's 4-0, shutout win over the NL last Tuesday, **Nick Martinez** is slated for his first start of the second half this evening...the Rays have won his last four starts (June 21–pres.), with the right-hander going 2-0 with a 2.82 ERA (22.1IP, 7ER), 0.99 WHIP, and .210 (17-for-81) opp. average in those outings...if the Rays were to win tonight, it would match a five-start run in **Shane McClellanahan's** outings (April 25–May 18) for their most consecutive wins in a pitcher's starts this season...excluding June 3 vs. DET, when he was tagged for 6 ER in 4.0 IP, Martinez has turned in a 2.22 ERA (101.1IP, 25ER) across his other 17 starts, nine of which were quality...his 17 starts allowing three runs or fewer are tied with seven other pitchers for second most in the majors to NYY **Cam Schlichter** (18).

- ✦ Excluding openers, Martinez's 2.65 ERA is fourth lowest by a Rays pitcher through his first 18 starts with the club...only **Drew Rasmussen** (2.12, 2021-22), **Charlie Morton** (2.36, 2019), and **Drew Smyly** (2.58, 2014-15) have turned in better marks.

(VICTORY SCREECH)—Yesterday in the 2nd inning at BOS, **Victor Mesa Jr.** recorded the 25th inside-the-park home run in Rays history, first since **Jake Mangum** on July 2, 2025 vs. ATH and the first on the road since **Lukealey** on Aug. 16, 2023 at SF...Mesa Jr. (8th HR) joined Mangum (2nd), **Kevin Kiermaier** (2nd, 2014), and **Randy Winn** (3rd, 1999) as the only Rays to record an inside-the-parker as one of their first 10 career home runs...it marked the fourth inside-the-park homer by a Ray at Fenway Park, all coming since 2014 (also: **Austin Meadows**, Sept. 6, 2021; **Denard Span**, April 28, 2018; **Kiermaier**, May 31, 2014)...there have been only nine inside-the-park homers at the ballpark since 2014, and the Red Sox have recorded three of them (TEX: 1).

- ✦ Mesa Jr. has homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career and has gone deep four times in his last eight contests, batting .381 (8-for-21) with 1 2B, 4 HR, and 5 RBI...in all of MLB, only **PIT Esmerlyn Valdez** (6) and **BOS Willyer Abreu** (5) have more home runs in that span (July 7–pres.)
- ✦ The Rays have homered in 19 of their last 25 games (June 21–pres.), leading the AL with 38 HR and 12 multi-homer games in that span (see table on the right)...this comes after they produced the fewest homers (60) and multi-homer efforts (14, tied with BOS) over their first 73 games through June 20.

HES THE CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 19 of his last 23 games, batting .349/.378/.465 (30-for-86) with 6 2B, 2 3B, 3 RBI, 4 BB, 4 SO, 9 R, and 9 SB in that span (June 19–pres.)...he paces the AL in average and stolen bases (1st with **CLE Khalil Watson**) over that timeframe while ranking fifth in hits...the stretch has raised his batting average from a season-low .259 to .282.

- ✦ Simpson has tallied an extra-base hit in consecutive games for the first time since May 25-26 at BAL...he has collected 8 XBH (6 2B, 2 3B) in his last 20 games, matching his total from his first 72 games combined (4 2B, 4 3B).

MILESTONE WATCH—**Yandy Díaz** enters this series with 998 career games played, two shy of becoming the 24th Cuban-born player to appear in 1,000 games and the sixth Cuban-born, primary corner infielder/DH, joining **José Abreu** (2014-24), **Kendrys Morales** (2006-19), **Yonder Alonso** (2010-19), **Rafael Palmeiro** (1986-2005), and **Tony Pérez** (1964-86)...910 of those contests have come in a Rays uniform, four shy of matching **Kevin Kiermaier** (914G) for fifth most in franchise history...he is also two home runs shy of tying **Ben Zobrist** (114HR) for sixth on the club's all-time list and four extra-base hits away from tying **Aubrey Huff** (309XBH) for fifth.

- ✦ With 994 hits in his Rays career, he is approaching Zobrist (1,016 hits) for third on the Rays all-time list...**Carl Crawford** (1,480) and **Evan Longoria** (1,471) rank first and second, respectively.

O. CANADA—The Rays and Blue Jays meet for the third of four sets in 2026 this week after the Rays won each of the first two series, claiming five of six matchups...they won their first five games vs. Toronto for the first time and need to go 2-5 or better over the final seven meetings to clinch their ninth consecutive season series win (2017–pres.), 11th in 12 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015), and 17th in 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...their current eight-season streak is tied for their longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the **Angels** (2016-24), and is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing ATL over MIA (11), CHC over PIT (11), and NYY over KC (11, including 2026).

- ✦ The Rays have won five of their last six series at Rogers Centre (Sept. 29, 2023–pres.) after taking two of three games here from May 11-13.
- ✦ They have lost five consecutive games vs. AL East opponents, their longest skid since dropping seven in a row from July 29–Sept. 16, 2025, and have lost 10 of their last 15 games against the division overall since starting 14-2...this includes defeats in each of their last eight road games in AL East ballparks, which is their longest skid since June 24–Aug. 8, 2026 (also 8G)—their last longer streak was 11 straight from July 30–Sept. 26, 2006.
- ✦ Since the start of 2025, the Rays are 26-16 vs. the AL East at home (14-2 in 2026) compared to 13-28 on the road (5-10 in 2026).
- ✦ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in each of his 12 career games at Rogers Centre, going 17-for-52 (.327) with 3 HR and 10 RBI...it marks the third-longest career-opening streak in this ballpark's history, trailing 14-game streaks by **TB Tommy Pham** (2018-19) and **CAL/KC Wally Joyner** (1989-92)...
- ✦ Caminero recorded his first career home run (Oct. 1, 2023) and grand slam (May 13, 2025) in Toronto.
- ✦ **Jonathan Aranda** has 24 RBI in his last 21 games vs. the Blue Jays (Oct. 1, 2023–pres.), batting .342 (26-for-76) with a 1.100 OPS in those games...min. 60 PA, the only player with a better OPS against the Jays in that span is **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (1.285)...10 of his 38 career homers have come vs. Toronto.

SCORING CHANGE—Today, MLB announced an official scoring change from yesterday's 6-1 loss at BOS...in the bottom of the 3rd inning, the Red Sox scored three runs, originally ruled to be 1 ER and 2 UER...they have been adjusted to 2 ER and 1 UER, as there was no assumed out when **Caleb Durbin** reached via fielder's choice.

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 19th start with the Rays and 10th on the road this season...marks his 299th career appearance (148th start) and eighth (sixth start) opposite the Blue Jays...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ Ranks third among AL qualifiers with a 2.65 ERA (105.1IP, 31ER) behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (2.20) and BOS **Sonny Gray** (2.48); is eighth among MLB qualifiers...his .800 winning pct. this year is sixth among MLB qualifiers and second in the AL behind Gray (.923).
- ★ Nine of his 18 starts this season have been quality...with a quality start tonight, he would tie **Drew Rasmussen** for the club lead with 10 QS.
- ★ Will be making his first start since July 10 vs. SEA, marking his fifth start with six days of rest or more in 2026...in those five outings, he is 2-0 with a 2.66 ERA (23.2IP, 7ER) and 12 strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT—Improved to 8-2 after allowing two runs on four hits across 5.1 innings on July 10 vs. SEA (W, 5.1IP, 4H, 2ER, BB, SO, HR)...did not allow a hit until his 10th batter faced, permitting a leadoff double to **J.P. Crawford** in the 4th inning...allowed a solo homer to **Cole Young** in the 5th frame, only the third long ball Martinez has yielded on a changeup in 2026...gave up a pair of singles to Crawford and **Randy Arozarena** with one out in the 6th inning before handing the ball over to **Cole Sulser**, who allowed one of the two baserunners to score.

- ★ Has allowed three runs or fewer in 17 of his 18 starts, tied for the second most among MLB hurlers behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (18).

AGAINST TORONTO, EH—The veteran right-hander is 2-2 with a 5.83 ERA (29.1IP, 19ER) and 16 strikeouts in seven career appearances (five starts) opposite the Blue Jays...in the five starts, he has pitched to a 5.74 ERA (26.2IP, 17ER) with 14 strikeouts...his last start against them came earlier this season on May 4 at Tropicana Field, when he earned the win after pitching 5.0 innings of one-run ball (W, 5.0IP, 5H, ER, BB, 4SO).

- ★ Martinez is 9-10 with a 5.17 ERA (169.0IP, 97ER) and 93 strikeouts in 43 career appearances (26 starts) vs. AL East foes...is 8-8 with a 5.19 ERA (144.0IP, 83ER) and 73 strikeouts as a starter.
- ★ Against the AL East this year, Martinez has posted a 3-0 record with a 2.22 ERA (28.1IP, 7ER) and 14 strikeouts...it is his lowest ERA against any division this year...the Rays are 5-0 in his starts against AL East foes.
- ★ Martinez has fashioned a 2.71 ERA (63.0IP, 19ER) in games against AL opponents, the 10th-lowest mark among major league pitchers (min. 50.0IP) in 2026...is 6-1 in 11 starts against the AL, with the Rays winning all but one of those games.

ROAD TRIPPIN'—In eight road starts this season, Martinez is 2-1 with a 2.12 ERA (46.2IP, 11ER) and 27 strikeouts compared to a 3.07 (58.2IP, 20ER) mark with 35 strikeouts in 10 home starts.

- ★ Among pitchers with 40.0 innings or more on the road this year, his ERA is the seventh lowest in the majors and third lowest in the AL behind NYY **Cam Schlichtler** (1.18) and DET **Tarik Skubal** (2.05).
- ★ It marks the seventh-lowest ERA by an age-35-or-older pitcher through his first eight road starts with a new franchise in the expansion era (since 1961), including the lowest mark since CWS **Johnny Cueto** (2.12) in 2022 (excl. multi-season spans and openers)...only four traditional starters under the same criteria have a 2.00 ERA or lower through their first nine road starts: Cueto (1.81, 2022), TB **Charlie Morton** (1.57, 2019), and NYY **Tommy John** (1.87, 1979).

START ME UP—When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has logged a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts and a .185 opp. average (12-for-65)...his ERA in the opening frame is the sixth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 15.0IP).

- ★ In his career, he has turned in a 3.18 ERA (147.1IP, 52ER) with 109 strikeouts and a .233 opp. average (130-for-559) in the 1st inning...marks his lowest ERA and opp. batting average of any of the first six frames.

A CHANGE OF HEART—Martinez has the lowest opp. average (.138/16-for-116) on changeups among MLB pitchers (min. 100AB), ahead of **Shane McClellan**'s .149 clip (17-for-114)...Martinez's .180 opp. OBP also paces the majors ahead of McClellan (.192)...under the same parameters, Martinez is second among major league pitchers in hard-hit rate (19.8%) behind LAA **Walbert Ureña** (19.7)...min. 1,000 total pitches, his 28.0 pct. usage rate on the pitch is fourth in the AL and seventh among major league pitchers.

- ★ Has allowed extra-base hits on the changeup in four of his last five starts (1 2B, 1 3B, 3HR; June 15–pres.) after allowing just one in his first 13 starts prior to that span (2B - April 11 vs. NYY).

SAVANT STUFF—Martinez ranks highly in multiple MLB pitching rankings, according to Baseball Savant...his Offspeed Run Value (7) is in the 97th percentile and his Pitching Run Value (10) is in the 84th percentile, an improvement from his -2 Pitching Run Value and -2 Offspeed Run Value in 2025.

- ★ Since the start of 2023, Martinez's 32.3 pct. hard-hit rate is fifth lowest in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind NYY **Ryan Yarbrough** (29.6), TOR **Tyler Rogers** (29.8), LAA **Brent Suter** (29.8), and LAD **Blake Snell** (32.5).
