LOS ANGELES DODGERS (43-24) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (34-33)

June 10, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #68/Home #35

RHP Shohei Ohtani (6-2, 0.74 ERA) vs. RHP Jared Jones (1-0, 4.82 ERA)

THE PIRATES: lost to the Dodgers, 12-3, on Tuesday night and have lost four straight games (since June 5 at Atlanta) after winning eight of their previous 11 contests (May 24-June 4)...Will host Los Angeles (NL) for two more games (Wednesday-Thursday) before welcoming Miami to town for a three-game series this weekend (Friday-Sunday)...Have the fifth-most runs scored (336) in Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (362), Los Angeles-NL (357), Atlanta (349) and Milwaukee (349)...Have 65 steals, tied with Cleveland & Washington for the third-most in all of Major League Baseball.

DODGER DOMINANCE: Pittsburgh is looking to pick up its fifth straight home series win vs. Los Angeles-NL (won two of three games from May 9-11, 2022, two of three games from April 25-27, 2023, two of three games from June 4-6, 2024 and swept a three-game series last year from Sept. 2-4...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the Pirates have won five straight home series vs. the Dodgers four times in series history...Those came from Sept. 26, 1901-Sept. 10, 1903 (eight straight series), July 21, 1910-July 27, 1911 (five straight series), June 17, 1925-July 24, 1926 (five straight series) & July 24, 1943-August 22, 1944 (five straight series).

BACK-TO-BACK: Bryan Reynolds and Ryan O'Hearn hit back-to-back home runs in the first inning on Tuesday vs. Los Angeles (NL)...It was the second time the pair went back-to-back this season (also March 31 at Cincinnati)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, they became the fifth pair of Pirates in the last 10 years to go back-to-back (in either order) twice in a single season, joining Starling Marte and Gregory Polanco in 2018 (July 14 [G1] vs. Milwaukee and July 14 [G2] vs. Milwaukee), Connor Joe and Rodolfo Castro in 2023 (April 13 at St. Louis and April 27 vs. Los Angeles-NL), Carlos Santana and Jack Suwinski in 2023 (June 9 vs. New York-NL and June 27 vs. San Diego) and Joshua Palacios and Reynolds in 2023 (August 4 at Milwaukee and August 8 vs. Atlanta)...Pittsburgh's 41 home runs here at PNC Park this year are only eight shy of its 2025 total (49).

EXTRA! EXTRA! The Pirates have collected at least one extra-base hit in 40 straight games (since April 26 at Milwaukee)...That is the longest active streak in Major League Baseball and is also tied with San Francisco (April 24-June 6) for the third-longest such streak by a Major League team this year, trailing only Baltimore (44, April 5-May 24) & Detroit (44, March 28-May 16).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Pittsburgh has outscored its opponents, 47-28, in the first inning of games...The Pirates' 47 first-inning runs are tied with New York (AL) for the third-most in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (53) and Milwaukee (49)...Their 17 first-inning homers are tied with Atlanta and Los Angeles (AL) for the second-most in MLB, behind New York-AL (18).

WELL-ATTENDED: Tuesday night's game between the Dodgers and the Pirates had an attendance of 30,646...It marked Pittsburgh's sixth crowd of at least 30,000 fans for a Monday-Thursday, non-Home Opener game in the last 10 years (since 2017) and the first since July 23, 2024 vs. St. Louis (32,422)...It was also the Pirates' fifth-largest crowd for a game at PNC Park this season.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Pittsburgh pitchers have struck out at least seven batters in 15 straight games (since May 24 at Toronto)...The Pirates have had at least 10 strikeouts in eight of the 15 games...It marks Pittsburgh's second such streak this season (also April 18-May 3)...The Pirates' last such streak of 16 straight games came from August 16-September 1, 2024...Pittsburgh's 148 strikeouts since May 24 are second in Major League Baseball, behind Milwaukee (158)...The Pirates' 612 strikeouts this year are fourth in all of MLB, behind only Milwaukee (634), Cleveland (631) and Philadelphia (630).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 10, 1983: Bill Madlock went 3-for-5 with a double, two RBI and a walk in Pittsburgh's 4-3, 12-inning win over Philadelphia at Veterans Stadium, including his two-out, go-ahead double that brought home Johnny Ray in the 12th inning. Lee Mazzilli went 2-for-2 with two walks and a run scored in the victory. Kent Tekulve earned the win after tossing 2.0 scoreless innings of relief to end the game.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2020 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones won a 5-1 decision after allowing four hits and two walks (he had four strikeouts) over 5.0 scoreless innings of work on June 4 at Houston...It was Jones' first Major League win since Sept. 8, 2024 vs. Washington (a total of 634 days).

AGAINST THE DODGERS: Jones won a 1-0 decision against Tyler Glasnow after striking out six batters over 6.0 scoreless innings in his only career start against Los Angeles (NL), which came on June 4, 2024 at PNC Park (the game's only run came via a third-inning blast from former Pirate/current Dodgers minor leaguer Jack Suwinski).

WE WENT TO JARED: The Pirates have won six of Jones' last seven starts, dating back to September 2, 2024 at Chicago (NL)...The team's only loss in that stretch came on September 21, 2024 at Cincinnati, when he allowed six runs over 5.0 innings (lost, 7-1).

2026 DEBUT: Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

MAKING A COMEBACK: Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

ON THE MEND: Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakeland), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

2024 IN REVIEW: Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Jones' 98 strikeouts prior to the 2024 All-Star break were the most by any Pirates rookie prior to the break, surpassing Cy Blanton (79) in 1935...He led the South Atlantic League in strikeouts (142) while he was w/High-A Greensboro (2022).

HISTORIC OUTING: Jones allowed just one baserunner (it was a fifth-inning double to Elias Díaz) while striking out 10 batters over 7.0 scoreless innings on May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado...He became the first and only Pittsburgh pitcher to have an outing of at least 7.0 scoreless innings, one/zero hits allowed, zero walks surrendered and 10 strikeouts.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Jones struck out at least seven batters in each of his first five Major League starts (March 30-April 22, 2024)...He joined Pittsburgh's Jose DeLeon (July 23-August 10, 1983), Washington's Stephen Strasburg (June 8-28, 2010) and New York (AL)'s Masahiro Tanaka (April 4-27, 2014) as the only pitchers to accomplish that.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Jones struck out 10 batters over 5.2 innings of work in his Major League debut on March 30, 2024 at Miami...He became the first Pirate with at least 10 strikeouts in his Major League debut since Tim Wakefield on July 31, 1992 vs. St. Louis (he was the first National League pitcher to do that since Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta on May 13, 2018 at Colorado)...Jones' 10 strikeouts in his debut were one shy of the franchise record in a debut, set by Nick Maddox (1907) & matched by Dick Hall (1955).

- Posted his first career extra-base hit with an RBI double (scored Jhostynxon Garcia) in the sixth inning of his Pirates debut on 5/28 vs. Chicago (NL).
- Was recalled from Triple-A Indy before the game on 5/28 vs. the Cubs...Was acquired from Cincinnati (for right-handed pitcher Kyle Nicolas) on 3/4.

- His 21 stolen bases rank fourth in all of Major League Baseball...Is 24-for-77 (.312) against left-handed pitchers this year (was 11-for-108 last year).

- Had his eight-game hitting streak (.424, 14-for-33) snapped on Sunday at Atlanta...Is 9-for-29 (.310) with three extra-base hits and five RBI in June.
- His .304 average (69-for-227) ranks eighth in the National League...Has gone 54-for-165 (.327) across his last 43 contests (since 4/19 vs. Tampa Bay).

- Has hit safely in 21 of his last 26 starts (since 5/6 at Arizona), going 31-for-97 (.320) with five doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, 15 walks and 15 runs.

- Was the only Pirate (since RBI became an official stat in 1920) with at least 15 home runs and 40 RBI across his first 55 contests with the franchise.
