STREAKING

Since a **4-game series sweep** of the Marlins at Great American Ball Park from **8/19-8/22**, after which they moved into the **second Wild Card spot**, the Reds have **lost 5 consecutive series** and **10 of 16 games** but just **1.0 game** in the **Wild Card** standings...is their longest **series losing streak** since they lost the **last 5 series** of the **2018** season.

BATTING RACE

Nick Castellanos is trying to become the Reds' first National League **batting champion** since **Pete Rose** hit **.338** in **1973**...**Castellanos** and **Jesse Winker** are trying to become the first Reds duo to finish in the **Top 3** in hitting since **1938**, when **Ernie Lombardi** led the NL at **.342** with **Frank McCormick** third at **.327**...courtesy @EliasSports...current NL leaders are below...

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Melody Yount's Cardinals** and **Game 5** (2-2) of the Reds' longest road trip of the season, an 11-day, 9-game jaunt through the **NL Central** to Chi's **Wrigley Field** (1-2), **Busch Stadium** (1-0) and Pit's **PNC Park** (3g) highlighted by off days in **St. Louis** yesterday and in **Pittsburgh** on Monday...is their longest road trip since **7/24-8/11, 2017**, when they went **3-7** over **11 days** at **Cle** (0-1), **NY** (0-2), **Mia** (1-3) and **Pit** (off day, 2-1)...**Friday** will return to **Great American Ball Park** for their final homestand of the regular season (3g vs LAD, 3g vs Pit, 4g vs Wsh)...will finish the 2021 championship season on the road at Chi's **Guaranteed Rate Field** (3g) and Pit's **PNC Park** (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES: With 2 games remaining, at **10-7** the Reds have produced their first winning season series vs the Cardinals since **2011** (9-6)...the Reds' **6-game winning streak** from 6/3-7/24 was their longest winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 6-game winning streak from **5/5-5/14, 2003**...went **7-7-3** in their previous **17 series vs StL**, including **3-2 in series this season**... from **6/3-6/7**, the Reds earned their first **4-game sweep in St. Louis** since **5/4-5/7, 1990**...**Joey Votto** has **208 apps** and **222 career hits** vs StL, both the most among active players (222-725, .306)...in the live ball era, his **career .426 OBP vs StL** ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** .477, **Ralph Kiner** .424).

PIRATES UP NEXT: Spanning last season and including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps already this year, the Reds won **13** of the **last 14 games** vs the Pirates, including each of the **last 12 games vs Pit** at **Great American Ball Park**...are **16-4 vs Pit** over the last 2 seasons, including **9-1 this season**...the Reds are **8-19 at PNC Park** the **last 4 seasons**, including an **11-game losing streak** spanning **2018-2019**.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: **2B Jonathan India** is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cle's **Joe Jackson**, .468 in 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426 in 1926)...**India** ranks seventh in the National League in **on-base percentage** (.379; **Juan Soto** 1st, .450)...**in the first inning** leads the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.466) while ranking second in the National League in **batting average** (.361; **C.J. Cron** .368)...**beginning 5/21** ranks fourth in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.399) behind **Juan Soto** (.467), **Bryce Harper** (.420) and **Freddie Freeman** (.404)...leads all Major League rookies in **on-base percentage**, **OPS**, **doubles** (tied) and **walks**... also leads all National League rookies in **RBI**, **hits**, **extra-base hits**, **total bases** and **runs scored**...**India** is trying to become the eighth Reds player and second Reds second baseman to win the BBWAA's **Rookie of the Year Award** (**LF Frank Robinson** 1956, **2B Pete Rose** 1963, **3B Tommy Helms** 1966, **C Johnny Bench** 1968, **RHP Pat Zachry** 1976, **3B Chris Sabo** 1988, **RHP Scott Williamson** 1999).

CATCH YOU LATER: Reds catchers **Tucker Barnhart** and **Tyler Stephenson** combined have committed just **2 errors**, both on **catcher's interference** on **Barnhart** (8/20 vs Mia, 8/28 at Mia), in **1,417 total chances** and **1,259.2 innings caught**...**Barnhart** has committed just 2 errors since 7/26/19, both catcher's interference calls and both with Mia's Jesus Aguilar batting...the catcher's interference on 8/20 at Cin snapped **Barnhart's** 161-game errorless streak, the club record for consecutive errorless apps by a catcher...in his 2-year career, **Stephenson** does not have an error as a catcher...offensively, they combine to lead the Major Leagues at that position in **hitting** (.285), **hits** (146) and **doubles** (35) while ranking fourth in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.354) and ninth in **slugging percentage** (.430)...only twice since **1882** have the Reds finished a season using only **2 catchers**, in **1959** (**Ed Bailey, Dutch Dotterer**) and **1979** (**Johnny Bench, Vic Correll**).

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the **top 3 spots** in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in **hitting** (.290), **hits** (502), **doubles** (118) and **extra-base hits** (209) while leading the National League and ranking second in the majors in **slugging percentage** (.514) and **total bases** (889)... are **24-12** (.667) when **Jonathan India, Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** hit first, second and third, respectively, in the starting lineup...that trio last started together in that order on **8/15 at Phi**.

INTERNATIONAL TREASURE: **Joey Votto** has **2,014 career hits**, **325 HR** and **1,053 career RBI**...he is only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his **2,000th hit**, **300th home run** and **1,000th RBI**...**Billy Williams** did it in **1971**...**Votto** recorded his **3,000th HR** on **4/30 vs Cubs** (2-run off **Jake Arrieta**), his **1,000th RBI** on **6/30 vs SD** (solo HR off **Joe Musgrove**) and his **2,000th hit** on **8/16 vs Cubs** (single off **Michael Rucker**)...courtesy @EliasSports.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: The **Brewers' Magic Number** to clinch the **NL Central** is **9**...the Reds are **11-8 (.579) after off days**...are **21-17 (.553) in 1-run games**...haven't had a winning record in 1-run games since **2013** (.551, 27-22)...rank T4th in the Major Leagues with **36 come-from-behind wins** (TB 43, Bos 40, SF 37)...the Reds went **20-20-7** in their previous **47 series**, including **10-10-4 at GABP** and **10-10-3 on the road**...have **7 series sweep wins** (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col, 3g at Mil, 3g vs Cubs, 4g vs Pit, 4g vs Mia).

RED HOTS

- In *Baseball America's* most recent Best Tools survey, his changeup was rated by field managers the best in the National League.
- Threw quality starts in each of his last 5 apps (1-4, 2.81), in 9 of his last 10 starts (4-5, 3.43) and beginning 6/4 in 15 of his last 18 starts (6-7, 2.77).
- Went 1-8, 7.22 in 11 starts through May (.321oba) and 6-7, 2.77 with 15 quality starts in 18 apps since then (.215baa).
- His 2.77 ERA beginning June 1 is the seventh-best in the Major Leagues (Buehler 2.12, Ray 2.21, Wainwright 2.38, Burnes 2.45, Urias 2.53, Miley 2.72).
- In June posted a 1.71 ERA, the fifth-best ERA in the National League (Jacob deGrom 0.67, Max Scherzer 1.42, Zach Wheeler 1.44, Anthony DeSclafani 1.69).
- In July posted a 2.15 ERA, the third-best in the National League (Walker Buehler 1.67, Freddy Peralta 2.14).
- Has been the victim of a blown save 5 times...1 other start, a 4.0-inning stint on 4/20 vs Ari, also included a blown save...his 6 starts total in which Reds relievers suffered a blown save are tied for second-most in the Major Leagues behind leaders Tyler Mahle (9gs) and Anthony DeSclafani (7gs).

Road Trip: 2gs at C, 2g as PH, 2-9, 1bb, 1r

- Leads National League rookies in hitting.
- Has 4 HR and 14 RBI in 41 career pinch-hit apps, including 3 HR and 12 RBI in 38 pinch-hit apps this season...in 2021 leads all Major League pinch hitters in RBI and ranks T2nd in HR (Pablo Sandoval, 4hr).
- Leads all Major League catchers in fielding percentage (1.000)...among National League catchers, ranks 12th with 616 total chances (0 errors) and 14th with 529.1 innings caught.
- Threw out 6 of his last 16 runners attempting to steal, including 4 of his last 9 and 3 of his last 4.
- Hit .359 in April, .305 in June, .322 in July and .291 in August.
- In his last 57 apps beginning 6/25 is hitting .301 (46-153, 7 2b, 5hr, 22rbi, .355obp).
- Has made 58 starts at catcher, most recently in Fri's 4-2 win at StL.
- Made his other 14 starts at 1B (last, 8/9 at Cle)...his 19 apps and 14 starts at 1B are his only Major League apps at a position other than catcher.
- Near the top of the batting order has hit second (11gs, last on 9/10 at StL), third (11gs, last on 7/28 at Cubs) and fourth (23gs, last on 8/17 vs Cubs)...made his last 9 starts batting second...his 23 starts batting cleanup rank second on the team behind Joey Votto...the Reds are 14-9 (.6309) when he hits in the fourth spot in the lineup.
- Has 3 career walkoff hits...as a pinch hitter in 2020, produced an RBI-single off Oliver Pérez on 4/17 vs Cle and a 2-run HR off Sam Howard in the 3-1 win in the opener of a doubleheader on 9/14 vs Pit...this season, with 2 outs in the bottom of the ninth of the 5-4 win on 7/1 vs SD produced an RBI-single off Mark Melancon.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Road Trip: 2gs at 3B, 2-6, solo HR, 2r

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark in Suárez.
- Last night's 452-foot HR off Jon Lester was the longest by a visiting player at Busch Stadium this season.
- In September is hitting .400 (7g, 6-15, 2 2b, 3hr, 4rbi, .524obp, 1.133slg, 1.657ops).
- Has 26 HR, his fifth career 20-homer season and fourth career 25-homer season.
- In his last 27 apps beginning 7/31 has 7 HR and 16 RBI...11 of his last 14 hits were for extra bases (4 2b, 7hr).
- Leads the team in starts at 3B (88) and ranks second to Kyle Farmer (100) in starts at SS (31)...last played SS in the 6-1 win on 8/13 at Phi, snapping a 60-start streak at 3B (5/30-8/12)...since then, made all 11 of his starts at 3B.
- Made his first 27 starts of the season at SS...beginning 5/7, with 1B Joey Votto and 3B Mike Moutakas each missing time while on the injured list, has made 88 starts at 3B and just 4 starts at SS.
- Led the Reds in starts at SS in 2015, his first season in Cincinnati, but in each of the 5 seasons from 2016-2020 led the team in starts at third base.
- In Wade Miley's no-hitter on 5/7 at Cle made his first start of the season at 3B.
- In 2019 established records for home runs in a season by a player from Venezuela and by a National League third baseman (49).
- Became only the sixth shortstop in Reds history to homer on Opening Day (solo off Jack Flaherty)...was the first Reds shortstop to do it since Barry Larkin in 1995.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Road Trip: 3-11, 1 2b, 2 solo HR, 2bb, 3r

- Has homered in consecutive apps following a season-high 16-game homerless streak.
- Last night celebrated his 38th birthday with his 30th HR of the season...was the 325th homer of his career, moving him past Frank Robinson and into second place alone on the club's all-time list (Johnny Bench, 389)...homered on his birthday for the third time (2011, 2016).
- At age 38, moved ahead of Ken Griffey Jr. as oldest Reds player ever to produce at least 30 HR in a season...Griffey hit 30 HR in 2007 at age 37...Votto became the first player at age 38 or older to hit at least 30 HR in a season since 2004 (Barry Bonds, 45hr at age 39 & Steve Finley, 36hr at age 39).
- Despite missing 28 games with a broken left thumb (5/7-6/7) has produced 30 HR, 87 RBI and an OPS of .923...in his career has 3 seasons of at least 30 HR, 4 seasons of at least 90 RBI, 3 seasons of at least 100 RBI and, not including 2021, 9 seasons of an OPS of at least .900.
- In his last 47 apps beginning 7/20 has 19 HR and 46 RBI (1.095ops), including a franchise record 7-game home run streak from 7/24-7/30...his 14 HR from 7/24-8/13 are the most by any Reds batter over any 19-game span.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League leaders in HR (1st, 19), RBI (T1st, 47), on-base percentage (7th, .395), slugging percentage (2nd, .665) and extra-base hits (T2nd, 29).
- For the season, ranks among the National League leaders in HR (T5th), RBI (7th), on-base percentage (13th), slugging percentage (5th) and OPS (6th, .923)...previously in his career led the NL in doubles (2011), walks (5 times), on-base percentage (7 times), slugging percentage (2010) and OPS (2010, 2017).
- Beginning 7/2 has reached base safely in 56 of his last 61 apps (60-208, .288, 12 2b, 1 3b, 20hr, 53rbi, .406obp, .644slg, 1.050ops), including a season-high 25-game on-base streak that ended on 8/3 vs Min...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and his longest on-base streak since 7/26-8/25, 2017 (29g).
- In 141 apps beginning 8/29/20, after 3 straight games off by manager's decision (8/27/dh at Mil, 8/28 vs Cubs), has produced 38 HR and 101 RBI.
- In the 6-0 win on 8/27 at Mia made his 100th appearance of the season...missed 28 games with a broken left thumb but still had 28 HR and 202 total bases through 100 apps...for the first time in his career recorded at least 28 HR within his first 100 apps of a season...for the third time in his career produced at least 200 total bases within his first 100 games, joining his 2010 MVP season (222tb) and his 2017 campaign (203tb) after which he finished second in the MVP voting in the fourth-closest vote ever.
- Was the National League's Player of the Month for July (1st career) and Player of the Week for 7/26-8/1 (6th career, first since 4/23-4/29, 2018).
- In 7 games from 7/24-7/30 established the franchise record for home runs in consecutive apps, 1 shy of the Major League record shared by Dale Long (1956), Don Mattingly (1987) and Ken Griffey Jr. (1993)...according to StatCast, his single off the top of the RCF wall in the eighth inning on 7/31 at NYM would have been a home run in 10 other Major League ballparks.
- Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- Received NL Most Valuable Player Award votes 7 times in the previous 11 seasons, 6 times finished among the Top 10 and 3 times finished among the Top 3...finished first in 2010, sixth in 2011, 14th in 2012, sixth in 2013, third in 2015, seventh in 2016 and in 2017 second by 2 points to Mia's Giancarlo Stanton in the fourth-closest vote ever.

- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career
