METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Giants, 12-4, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets have lost two of their last three and five of their last six games...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (1-2) against the Giants (1-2) and Guardians...Following this stand, the team travels to Milwaukee for a three-game trip.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Congrats to Edwin Díaz who was named the National League Reliever of the Month for July...This is second time Díaz has won the award after earning the honors for May...Marks the 10th Reliever of the Month Award of his career (fifth as a Met), which is the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...In 10 appearances last month, Díaz went 2-0 with seven saves and did surrender a run, allowing four hits, while striking out 18...He held opposing hitters to a .114 average (4-35)...In 43 games in 2025, Díaz is 5-1 with 23 saves, a 1.44 ERA (7 ER/43.2 IP), 17 walks and 65 strikeouts.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to Randy Guzman who was named the Minor League Player of the Week of the Florida State League...In six games, Guzman hit .440 (11-25) with five runs, five doubles, one home run, eight RBI and a 1.200 OPS...The 20 year old is batting .292/.373/.505 (56-192) with 24 runs, 14 doubles, nine homers and 43 RBI in 58 games between St. Lucie and the Florida Complex League Mets in 2025.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 38-18 record at home...Their .679 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors...Their home record is tied for the best start at home in franchise history through 56 games, with the 1985, '86, '89, '90, 2000, '15 and '22 teams...Their 38 wins are tied for the most in The Show with Toronto...New York has posted a 3.38 ERA at home this year, which is the fifth-best in MLB...New York pitchers have held opposing batters to a .224 average at home which is the fourth-best in the majors and second-best in the NL.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Mark Vientos is on a career-high 11-game hitting streak...He is batting .333 (13-39) with two runs, three doubles, one homer, seven RBI, one walk, a .350 OBP and a .487 SLG...Over the last 18 games, Vientos is batting .323/.333/.484 (20-62) and has posted a .817 OPS.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 30 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with an 89.9% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 16 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Pete Alonso's 250 home runs since he joined the league in 2019 is tied with Kyle Schwarber for the second-most in the majors, trailing only Aaron Judge (269)...Alonso's 672 RBI are the most in the majors since 2019.

FULL HOUSE: FULL HOUSE: Last series against the Giants (August 1-3) drew a total of 129,108 fans to Citi Field...It is the highest attendance for a non-Subway Series three-game set in the ballpark's history...Since Game 2 of the July 2 doubleheader, attendance has topped 41,000 fans for 14 straight games.

20/20 VISION: The Mets are one of five teams to feature three players with 20 or more home runs (Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor and Juan Soto)...The Cubs, Diamondbacks, Mariners and Yankees also feature three players with 20+ homers...Brandon Nimmo has 19 homers...The Mets have had six seasons in which at least four players recorded 20+ homers (2024, 2023, 2019, 2016, 2000, 1987)...The team's record is five players with 20+ homers in 2019 (Pete Alonso, Michael Conforto, J.D. Davis, Todd Frazier and Jeff McNeil).

TWO AWAY: Edwin Díaz has 248 saves in 501 career games in the major leagues...According to *Elias*, his 248 saves are the ninth most saves for any pitcher through his first 500 career games and the most for any active pitcher...The most saves in first 500 career MLB games among active pitchers: Díaz (248), Kenly Jansen (244), Aroldis Chapman (240), Josh Hader (227 in 465 games), Raisel Iglesias (212).

HELLS BELLS: On August 1, Ryan Helsley became the sixth Mets pitcher (third reliever) to record three strikeouts in their debut inning with the team...Courtesy of *Elias*...He threw nine fastballs in the appearance, each registering at 99.6 MPH or faster...His 101.4 MPH pitch was the hardest thrown ball by a Met this season.

SINCE YOU'VE BEEN BACK: In nine games since Francisco Alvarez has returned from Triple-A Syracuse, he is batting .321/.441/.607 (9-28) with seven runs, five extra-base hits, four RBI and six walks.

LAST TIME OUT: Lowered his ERA to 2.08 (4 ER/17.1 IP) after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing one earned run on July 29 in San Diego...He threw a season-high 86 pitches and each of his last two starts have been at least 5.0 innings...Has only allowed one run in all four of his appearances this season...Has recorded five or more strikeouts in three of his four appearances this season and he has struck out 22 batters over his first 17.1 innings this season...He has a 11.42 K/9 over those three appearances.

IN THE CITI: In 20 career appearances (18 starts) at Citi Field he has posted a 3.31 ERA (40 ER/108.2 IP) and has a 8-2 record...Has made two starts at Citi Field this season and he has a 2.00 ERA (2 ER/9.0 IP) and 11 strikeouts through those first two starts...Last season he went 6-2 with a 3.30 ERA (33 ER/90.0 IP) at home...Over his last nine home starts last season he went 6-0 and recorded a 2.73 ERA (19 ER/62.2 IP)...The Mets were 11-4 in games he started at Citi Field last season.

VS CLEVELAND: Has made six starts against Cleveland in his career and he has a 2.94 ERA (11 ER/33.2 IP) with 39 strikeouts and a 3-1 record...He hasn't allowed more than three earned runs in any of his starts against them...Has struck out five or more in five of his starts against the Guardians...His last start against Cleveland came on September 12, 2023, while he was with the Giants, and he suffered his only loss against them after tossing 5.2 innings and only allowing one earned run.

RIDE THE HOT HAND: In his last 22 games (21 starts) since June 26, 2024, is 9-4 with a 2.89 ERA (41 ER/127.2 IP), a .180 (82-455) opponents' batting average and a 0.94 WHIP...Ranks second in the NL in opponents' batting average, fourth in WHIP and 11th in ERA during that span (min. 400 batters faced)...The Mets are 16-6 in those games.

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .160 (8-50) compared to left-handers who are batting .250 (3-12)...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 66.2% of the time, and he has picked up 13 of his 22 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 24.3% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the six-highest clip (66.2%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 200 times this season.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-63 record, a 3.98 ERA (531 ER/1201.2 IP), and 1131 strikeouts in 232 games and 201 starts...His 1131 career strikeouts are the 14th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Earlier today, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after tossing going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...He held opposing batters to just a .114 average (4-35) and posted four walks compared to 18 strikeouts (14.73 K/9.0 IP)...Marks the 10th Reliever of the Month Award of his career (fifth as a Met), which is the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Snapped his season-high 17.1 scoreless inning streak after allowing the free runner to score in the 10th inning on August 1 against San Francisco...It was the longest active scoreless streak in the majors and marked his first loss since September 15, 2024...Recorded his 23rd save of the season on July 27 at San Francisco (1.0 IP, 2 K, 2 BB)...On July 26 at San Francisco, earned the save after tossing a scoreless ninth inning (H, K).
- Has allowed just one earned run over his last 33 games, posting a 0.26 ERA (ER/34.0 IP) with 11 walks and 50 strikeouts since April 23...His 0.26 ERA is the second-lowest by a Mets reliever in any 33-game span in franchise history (lowest: Mark Guthrie's 0.00 ERA

- over 33 G in 2002) and is the best 33-game span of his career...During that same span, his 0.26 ERA is the best in the majors and his .140 opponents' BA is the third best (min. 30.0 IP)...The next-best ERA is Nathan Eovaldi's 1.00 ERA in that span...Has not allowed a home run in each of his last 33 outings (since April 23), which is the fourth-longest such streak of his career (most: 52 games from 5/14/22-4/7/24)...Has not allowed a home run to each of his last 157 right-handed batters faced dating back to May 6, 2024...It is the fifth-longest active streak in the majors among RHP vs. RHB, trails Cade Smith (203 BF), Josiah Gray (183 BF), Jhoan Duran (172 BF) and Joe Jimenez (164 BF)...Courtesy of *Elias*.
- Among qualified relievers this season, is fourth in ERA (1.44, second in NL) and opponents' BA (.156, first in NL), fifth in opponents' SLG (.218, first in NL), sixth in opponents' OPS (.489, second in NL) and K/9.0 IP (13.40, first in NL), tied for eighth in saves (23, tied for third in NL) and tied for 10th in strikeouts (65, third in NL)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 25.0 innings this season, his 41.3 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and sixth-best in the majors.
 - His 40 Interleague saves are tied for the 10th-most in the majors (since 1997) and his 28 such saves as a Met are the most in franchise history...Has made eight career appearances vs. Cleveland, recording four saves and a 1.08 ERA (ER/8.1 IP)...Has held Guardian batters to a 0.74 average (2-27) with three walks and 16 strikeouts.
