THE PIRATES: have lost two of the first three games on this six-game homestand (their final homestand prior to the All-Star break) vs. Atlanta (1-2, Tuesday-Thursday) and Milwaukee (Friday-Sunday), including a 10-5 loss on Thursday...Will begin the second half of the season with a six-game road trip against Cleveland (July 17-19) and New York-AL (July 20-22)...Have the most hits (857) in all of Major League Baseball...Have hit 120 home runs this season (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)...Have scored the third-most runs (492) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (511) and Los Angeles-NL (501)...Have struck out the fourth-most batters (858) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Philadelphia (928), Milwaukee (903) and New York-NL (870)...Are looking to enter the All-Star break with a record above .500 for the first time since 2016, when they went 46-43 (.517) during the first half (the Bucs entered the 2024 All-Star break at 48-48)...Are finishing the first half of the year at home for the first time since doing so in back-to-back years from 2018-19 vs. Milwaukee.

TWO WITH THE CREW: Today's doubleheader between the Pirates and Brewers marks the ninth all-time doubleheader between the two teams and the seventh at PNC Park (also September 3, 2001, July 2, 2004, September 13, 2006, August 22, 2011, July 14, 2018 and August 14, 2021)...It is the 34th all-time doubleheader at PNC Park and first since September 7, 2024 vs. Washington.

WHAT'S BREWING: Pittsburgh is facing Milwaukee for the second time this season...The Pirates won two of three games from April 24-26 at American Family Field...They are seeking their first home series victory against the Brewers since winning two of three games from September 4-6, 2023...Pittsburgh is also looking to win back-to-back series against Milwaukee for the first time since winning two of three games from July 8-10, 2022 at American Family Field and sweeping a three-game series from August 2-4, 2022 at PNC Park...The Pirates are also 14-12 (.538) against the National League Central this season...They have finished with a winning record against the division twice in a year since it formed in 1994, coming in 2013 (45-31, .592) and 2018 (43-33, .566).

BEER BATTER: Bryan Reynolds posted the 399th extra-base hit of his career with his solo shot (14th home run of the year) in the third inning on Thursday vs. Atlanta...He would become one of 17 players and the second switch hitter (also Max Carey, 590 extra-base hits) in franchise history (since 1887) with at least 400 extra-base hits...Reynolds, who has batted .318 (35-for-110) with eight doubles, eight home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.014 OPS while hitting safely in 25 of his last 28 games (since June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL), is 115-for-362 (.318) with 25 doubles, 16 home runs, 51 RBI and a .941 OPS in his 103 career games vs. Milwaukee.

JAKE 'N' RAKE: Jake Mangum finished a triple shy of the cycle after going 4-for-5 with a double, a home run, three RBI and a steal on Thursday vs. Atlanta...It was his third career game with multiple extra-base hits (also June 22, 2025 with Tampa Bay vs. Detroit and last year on August 22 with Tampa Bay vs. St. Louis)...It was his fourth career four-hit game (also March 31, 2025 with Tampa Bay vs. Pittsburgh, June 9, 2025 with Tampa Bay at Boston and last year on August 22 with Tampa Bay vs. St. Louis)...He was the 10th Pirate (since RBI official in 1920) to have four hits (including a double and a home run), three RBI and a steal in a game, joining Reb Russell (August 8 [G1], 1922 at Philadelphia), Kiki Cuyler (June 4, 1925 vs. Philadelphia), George Grantham (June 22, 1925 at St. Louis), Willie Stargell (May 22, 1968 at Chicago), Barry Bonds (May 25, 1992 at San Diego), Jason Kendall (July 24, 1997 at San Diego), Kevin Young (August 13, 2000 vs. Arizona), Freddy Sanchez (May 25, 2009 at Chicago-NL) and Bryan Reynolds (September 5, 2021 at Chicago-NL)...He has also hit safely in 26 of his last 32 games with a plate appearance (since May 30 vs. Minnesota), going 45-for-125 (.360) with an .868 OPS in that stretch.

HOME-R HAPPY: Bryan Reynolds and Esmerlyn Valdez hit back-to-back solo home runs (third inning), while Jake Mangum connected for a two-run home run (fourth inning) on Thursday vs. Atlanta...Reynolds' and Valdez' home runs marked the fourth pair of back-to-back home runs by Pittsburgh this season (also Ryan O'Hearn and Reynolds on March 31 at Cincinnati, Reynolds and O'Hearn on June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL and O'Hearn and Valdez on June 28 vs. Cincinnati)...The Pirates' 66 home runs at home this year are the sixth-most in Major League Baseball...They are behind Washington (73), the Athletics (72), New York-AL (70), Philadelphia (68) and Cincinnati (67).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 11, 2006: The Pirates and the city of Pittsburgh hosted the MLB All-Star Game at PNC Park, marking the city's fifth time hosting the Midsummer Classic. The American League won, 3-2, extending its unbeaten streak to 10 straight games (since 1997). Texas' Michael Young was named the game's Most Valuable Player after hitting a game-winning, two-out, two-run triple in the top of the ninth inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft won a 7-1 decision after allowing one run (leadoff home run to James Wood) and striking out seven batters over 5.2 innings on July 4 at Washington... He has gone 4-0 with a 3.04 ERA (23.2ip/8er) and 32 strikeouts over his last four starts (since June 17 at the Athletics)...It is the second time in his career that he has won four straight decisions (also May 9-31)...The last Pirates pitcher to win five straight decisions was Bailey Falter (May 9-June 22, 2025)...The last Pittsburgh right-handed pitcher to do it was Paul Skenes, when he won six straight from May 17-July 11, 2024.

HEY NOW: Ashcraft was named to his first career All-Star team on Tuesday, joining Paul Skenes as Pittsburgh’s representatives (he replaced Skenes on the roster)...Skenes (123) and Ashcraft (122) are the second pair of Pirates teammates to both have at least 115 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break in a single season (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933), joining Francisco Liriano (125) and Gerrit Cole (116) in 2015...They are also the third pair of Pittsburgh starters to be named to the All-Star team in the same season, along with Bob Friend/Vernon Law (1960), as well as A.J. Burnett/Cole (2015).

AGAINST THE BREWERS: Ashcraft had a no-decision after allowing one hit and striking out two batters (Brice Turang and Caleb Durbin) over 3.0 scoreless innings in his only career appearance/start against Milwaukee, which came in Pittsburgh’s 5-4 win on June 23, 2025 at American Family Field (it was also his first Major League start).

CENTRAL PERK: Ashcraft has a 2.72 ERA (36.1ip/11er) in six starts vs. the National League Central this season (six of the 11 runs allowed came in an 11-7 loss on April 28 vs. St. Louis)...His 2.69 career ERA (63.2ip/19er) in 13 outings (12 starts) vs. the division since June 14, 2025 at Chicago (first appearance vs. the division) ranks second in Major League Baseball (minimum 60.0 innings), behind only Chicago (NL)’s Colin Rea (2.34).

TWICE AS NICE: Ashcraft has made multiple starts where he recorded at least 10 strikeouts and did not issue a walk...He struck out 11 batters on May 31 vs. Minnesota and 10 batters on June 24 vs. Seattle...Ashcraft became the only Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to post multiple such starts during a single season.

RISPY BUSINESS: Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .135 batting average against (10-for-74) with runners in scoring position this season...He has also allowed just three hits in 34 at-bats (.088 average) with runners in scoring position & two outs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

PITCH EFFICIENCY: Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay’s Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.

ELITE ARM: Ashcraft had a 2.77 ERA (74.2ip/23er) and 81 strikeouts (he issued just 17 walks) over his first 12 starts...He was one of only three Pirates (since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912) to have a sub-3.00 ERA, at least 80 strikeouts and 20 or fewer walks issued through their first 12 starts of a season... Ashcraft joined Gerrit Cole (2015, 1.73 ERA/86 K) & Paul Skenes (2024, 1.93 ERA/97 K).

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing four runs over 4.0 innings (plus three batters) in Pittsburgh’s 11-5 win on July 5 at Washington...He has allowed nine runs over 10.1 innings during his last two starts (also June 30 at Philadelphia) after posting a 2.82 ERA (22.1ip/7er) over his four appearances (three starts) from June 7-25.

RIGHT ON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .209 batting average against (33-for-158) and a .617 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)’s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco’s Heliot Ramos (May 10).

AGAINST THE BREWERS: Chandler lost a 10-2 decision after allowing nine runs over 2.2 innings during his only career appearance/start against Milwaukee, which came last year on September 7 at PNC Park (it was his first Major League start)...He became the first Pirate to surrender nine runs since Martín Pérez on May 15, 2024 at Milwaukee.

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee’s Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona’s Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit’s Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh’s 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodríguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.
