FINAL DESTINATION: The Detroit Tigers tonight begin their final road series of the regular season, a four-game set at the Chicago White Sox that represents the backend of a two-city, seven-game trek that began with a series victory in Toronto (2-1) ... yesterday's 5-1 setback at Rogers Centre snapped Detroit's six-game winning streak, which matched its longest of the season (three times).

- The Tigers arrive in Chicago with three-straight series wins after going winless in their previous seven series ... so to sum things up, the Tigers went 6-1-1 in their first eight series after the All-Star Break, went winless in their next seven series and have now won their last three.
- Yesterday's setback marked Detroit's 44th loss after leading at one point in the game, tied for the most in the A.L. with the Angels and trailing only Washington (46) for most in the majors.
- September 11 began a stretch of 13 games in 13 days for the Tigers ... overall, the Tigers are scheduled to play 20 games in 20 days from September 4-23 with just one day off.
- The Tigers have 10 games remaining in the regular season with this week at the American League and next week vs. the National League ... after this road trip concludes in Chicago, the Tigers host Washington and Pittsburgh next week at Comerica Park.

BETTER WIN TONIGHT: The Tigers and White Sox have seen each of their first three series end in sweeps this year ... this marks the first time the clubs have begun a season with three sweeps since 1984 (Tigers won the first two, White Sox the third) ... the clubs last saw four series result in sweeps within the same season in 1961 (non-consecutive) ... going back to 1901, these two clubs have never seen four series in a row result in sweeps in the same season (series of more than one game).

THE BEST IN THE A.L.: Kevin McGonigle boasts a 6.7 bWAR this season, by far the best mark by any position player in the A.L., the best mark by any major league rookie and third best by any position player in baseball alongside Pete Crow-Armstrong (9.3) and Bryce Turang (6.9) ... the next best position players in the A.L. are well behind Kevin: Bobby Witt Jr (6.3) and Yordan Alvarez (6.1).

LONG DIVISION: The Tigers are 17-31 in their first 48 games against their division this year and are 9-22 in games decided by two runs or less vs. A.L. Central foes this year, a .290 winning percentage and worst in the division, well behind the next-best Royals (14-16, .467) ... the Tigers are 0-12 in games decided by two runs or less vs. A.L. Central foes on the road ... last year the Tigers led all A.L. Central clubs by going 11-3 in games decided by two runs or less on the road.

GREENE WITH ENVY: Riley Greene 20 homers, 30 doubles, 73 RBI and 75 runs scored, the third season in a row he has reached 20 homers, 27 doubles, 73 RBI and 75 runs ... he is the first Tiger to reach those totals three years in a row since Miguel Cabrera (5, 2008-12) ... only three players in all of baseball have reached those totals in at least each of the last three seasons: Riley Greene (3), Atlanta's Matt Olson (6) and San Francisco's Rafael Devers (6).

- Overall, Greene is only the fourth player in Tigers franchise history to reach 27 doubles, 20 homers, 70 RBI and 75 runs in three seasons in a row, joining Miguel Cabrera (5, 2008-12), Bobby Higginson (3, 1996-98) and Rocky Colavito (3, 1961-63) ... Al Kaline, Hank Greenberg or any other Tigers great not listed here did what Riley and only those three others have done.

WALK THIS WAY: Kevin McGonigle has 91 walks to go along with 94 runs scored ... he is only the eighth player in major league history to reach or exceed both 90 walks and 90 runs in his rookie season, joining Aaron Judge (2017), Joe Foy (1966), Joe Morgan (1966), Dick Howser (1961), Al Rosen (1950), Ted Williams (1939) and Detroit's Lu Blue (1921).

- McGonigle's 91 walks are the most in a season by any major league rookie since Aaron Judge in 2017 (127 walks) ... McGonigle is the fourth rookie since 2000 to reach 91 walks in a season ... Kevin's 91 walks are second most by a rookie in club history (Lu Blue, 103 walks in 1921).

HOW'D WE GET HERE?: The Tigers woke up on June 1 with a 22-38 in their first 60 games and in last place in the American League, 11.0 games behind first-place Cleveland in the A.L. Central, and 7.0 games behind for the third Wild Card spot with nine teams to leap frog ... after going 38-23 in their next 61 games, the Tigers woke up on August 14 with a 60-61 mark and in sole possession of the third Wild Card spot in the A.L. ... but the Tigers have since dropped 19 of their last 31 games and woke up today back in third place in the A.L. Central, 5.5-games behind the first-place Guardians, and 5.0-games back for the third Wild Card spot in the A.L. with four teams to leap frog.

AHH SO THIS EXPLAINS IT (MAYBE?): The Tigers have won 10 games this season via a shutout of six or more runs, most in baseball ... the Tigers have won five games by 10 or more runs, tied for the most such wins in the A.L. ... meanwhile, the Tigers are one of 10 teams in all of baseball to only lose two (or fewer) games by double digits (both happened recently in Minnesota from August 31-September 1) ... all while going 21-47 in 68 games decided by two runs or less... hence, Detroit's +76 run-differential, third best in the A.L., despite its 72-80 record this season.

AND FINALLY: Framer Valdez collected his team-leading 10th win last time out, his sixth-straight season of reaching double digit victories ... he joins Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler as the lone two pitchers in all of baseball with 10 or more wins in each of the last six seasons starting in 2021.

- Collected his team-leading 10th win last time out, his sixth-straight season of reaching double digit wins...he joins Philadelphia’s Zack Wheeler as the lone pitchers in baseball with 10+ wins in each of the last six seasons.
- Has four straight quality starts entering tonight's game, coming off his second straight game not allowing an earned run.
- Had his 11-start streak of 5.0+ innings snapped on July 21 against the Cubs...recorded just two outs, allowing six earned runs on five hits, two walks and a hit batter...did not record an out until the eighth batter of the game.
- Tossed 7.0 strong innings on July 9, allowing just one earned run on three hits while striking out nine.
- Went on the Bereavement List on Sunday, July 12 and was added back to Detroit's active roster on July 18.
- Earned his first win since April 19 on June 5 against Seattle, allowing just one earned run on five hits and two walks while striking out five over 5.0 innings.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with Detroit as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers in 2025, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GIDP (22), 2nd in GIDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Delivered 2.0 scoreless innings with two strikeouts on Sept. 14 in Toronto...was called upon with the bases loaded in the third inning and got out of the jam.
- Optioned to Toledo on July 18, allowed 11 earned runs on 15 hits (six home runs) while walking eight and striking out 20 in 18.0 innings (13 games) from July 21-Aug. 29 with the Mud Hens...recalled and joined Detroit on Sept. 1.
- Closed out a Tigers win with 2.0 scoreless innings July 10 against PHI...allowed one hit while striking out one.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on June 12 and recalled on July 1, replacing an injured Will Vest...allowed just one earned run over five games (6.1 innings) with the Mud Hens over that span...did not allow a hit in his last 3.2 frames.
