AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their seven-game road trip tonight with the third game of a four-game set at Baltimore (0-2 thus far)...are 2-3 on the road trip after winning two-of-three at Milwaukee and dropping their first two games at Baltimore...after this road trip, will return to the Bronx for a seven-day, six-game homestand vs. Detroit (Fri-Sun.) and Houston (Fri.-Sun.).

➤ Their 19-12 record (.613) is the third-best in the AL and sixth-best record in the Majors, trailing only Atlanta (19-9, .679), Baltimore (19-10, .655), Cleveland (19-10, .655), Philadelphia (20-11, .645) and Milwaukee (18-11, .621)...

their 19 wins are tied for the second-most in the Majors. Marks the seventh time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees have gone 19-12 or better to start a season (also went 23-8 in 2022, 21-10 in 2010, '17 and '18, and 19-12 in 2006 and '15)...with a win tonight, would mark the sixth time in the last 21 years (since 2004) the Yankees went 20-12 or better to start a season (went 24-8 in 2022, 22-10 in 2018, 21-11 in 2010 and '17, and 20-12 in 2015).

The Yankees are in the midst of a 17-day stretch without an off day (4/19-5/5)...marks their longest stretch of the season without an off-day...are 6-6 so far.

Have won seven of their nine completed series this season and have lost just one series this year (7-1-1).

▶ Are 7-4 following a loss this year.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Orioles, 4-2, on Tuesday at Camden Yards...LHP Nestor Cortes (6.0IP, 8H, 4R/ ER, 2BB, 5K, 0HR) started and recorded his third loss of the year...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit a game-tying solo HR in the third inning...RF Juan Soto (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RB), 1BB) reached base three times and hit his team-leading eighth HR of the year with a solo shot in the sixth inning...SS Anthony Volpe (1-for-4) was the only other Yankee to record a hit...RHP Luke Weaver (2.0IP, 1H, 3K) tossed 2.0 scoreless innings of foliar innings of relief.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 20 of their 31 games decided by 2R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors...13 of their last 16 games, 14 of their last 18 games and 15 of their last 20 games have been decided by 2R-or-fewer.

Are 8-3 in one-run games this year...their 11 one-run games are tied with Atlanta and Chicago-AL for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Detroit (12) and Oakland (12). The Yankees have had 23 of their 31 games decided by

3R-or-fewer, the most such games in the Majors.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge has reached base safely in each of his last eight games (since 4/23), hitting .300/.432/.633 (9-for-30) with 5R, 1 double, 3HR, 7RBI, 6BB/1IBB and 1HP.

▶ Has 3HR in his last seven games (since 4/24).

▶ In 97 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .307/.436/.698 (107-for-348) with 94R, 19 doubles, 39HR, 85RBI, 76BB, 4HP, 1SF and 5SB...his 39HR are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.06 ERA (279.0IP, 95ER) this year, the third-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.59) and Seattle (3.03).

> Have held opponents to 3R-or-fewer in 19 of 31 games this year (are 13-6 in those games)...are 16-7 this season when holding their opponent to 4R-or-fewer.

STANTON ISLAND: Since 2019, DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton

STANTON STAND: Since 2019, DH/OF Glancarlo Stanton has hit .331/.409/.545 (59-for-178) with 24R, 8 doubles, 10HR, 35RBI, 24BB and 15F in 47 games vs. the Orioles.

▶ In 38 career games at Camden Yards, has hit .320/.400/.500 (48-for-150) with 25R, 6 doubles, 7HR, 20RBI and 20BB... since 2020, has hit .361/.431/.567 (35-for-97) with 15R, 5 doubles, 5HR, 14RBI and 12BB in 25 games at Camden Yards Camden Yards.

GLEYBER DAY: INF Gleyber Torres is hitting .313 (10-for-32) with 2R, 2 doubles and 4RBI over his last seven games (since 4/24).

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells hit his first HR of the year with a game-tying solo HR in third inning...over his last five games (since 4/24), is hitting .438/.526/.750 (7-for-16) with 3R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 1RBI and 3BB.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO YOU: RHP Marcus Stroman turns 33 years old today (DOB: 5/1/91).

THE GREAT JUAN: OF Juan Soto reached base three times and hit his team-leading eighth HR of the season with his 447-foot home run landed on Eutaw Street, the 123rd home run in Oriole Park history to land on Eutaw Street, the 65th by a visiting player and the 11th by a Yankee... joins Jason Giambi (three times), Curtis Granderson (twice), Robinson Canó, Johnny Damon, Didi Gregorius, Paul O'Neill and Nick Swisher...was the first by a Yankees batter since Didi Gregorius on 8/8/19.

- Has reached base safely in 28 of his 31 games this season, hitting .325/.438/.581 (38-for-117) with 22R, 6 doubles, 8HR, 25RBI, 25BB, 25B and 25F...has reached base multiple times in five of his last seven games and in 19 of his 31 games this year...his 19 such games are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors. Has hit .455/.517/.909 (10-for-22) with 1 double, 3HR, 19RBI, 5BB and 25F with RISP this season.

 Owns a season-high eight-game hitting streak (since 4/23), batting .333/.432/.667 (10-for-30) with 8R, 1 double, 3HR, 5RBI, 6BB, 1SB and 1SF over that span...matches the longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season and marks his longest hitting streak since 9/11-19/23 (8G)...his last longer streak was a nine-game streak from 7/25-8/5/23.

 Has hit 3HR in his last seven games (since 4/24). Has reached base safely in 28 of his 31 games this

Is the only Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2007) and just the fourth in the last 25 years (since 2000) to reach base at least 63 times in the club's first 31 games of a season, joining Jason Giambi (68TOB in 2006), Derek Jeter (63TOB in 2006) and Alfonso Soriano (65TOB in 2003).
- Is the fourth Yankee in the last 33 years (since 1992) to record at least 25BB in the club's first 31 games of a season, joining Aaron Judge (25BB in 2018), Jason Giambi (36BB in 2006) and Nick Johnson (30BB in 2003).
- Ranks second in the Majors in walks (25, first in AL) and times on base (63, first in AL), tied for second in OBP (.438, first in AL), third in WAR among position players (2.1 - FanGraphs, second in AL), fourth in OPS (1.019, first in AL), tied for fourth in RBI (25, tied for second in AL), tied for fifth in HR (eight, tied for fourth in AL), tied for ninth in hits (38, tied for fourth in AL) and 10th in SLG (.581, fifth in AL)... also ranks fifth in the AL in BA (.325) and tied for fifth in extra-base hits (14).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in plate appearances per walk ratio (8.87), are tied for first in walks (135, first in AL), rank second in pitches per plate appearance (4.05, second in AL), third in home runs (39, second in AL) and fourth in on-base percentage (.337, first in AL).

Have scored at least 4R in 20 of their 31 games, at least 5R in 17 games and at least 6R in 12 games.

In 17 games and at least 6R in 12 games.

Their 17 games with at least 5R are the most in the AL and tied with Atlanta and Philadelphia for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (18).

The Yankees are 19-3 (.864) this season when scoring at least 3R, the best such record in the Majors.

Have hit 17HR over their last eight games (since 4/23) after hitting 3HR in their previous seven games (4/15-22).

Have hit multiple home runs in four of their last five games and five of their last seven games...their 11 multi-HR games are tied for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Baltimore (14) and Texas (14).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 3.38 ERA (168.0IP, 63ER) in 31 starts this year, the fifth-lowest ERA in the Majors, trailing only Boston (2.00), Philadelphia (2.47), Kansas City (3.08) and Seattle (3.22)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 25 of their 31 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 18 starts and 1ER-or-

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have posted a 2.59 ERA (111.0IP, 32ER) this season, the third-lowest in the Majors, trailing only Cleveland (2.49) and Oakland (2.51).

Have posted a 1.00 ERA (27.0IP, 3ER) in their last eight games (since 4/23).

HIP HIP JOSE: C Jose Trevino is batting .406/.429/.594 (13-for-32) with 6R, 2HR, 10RBI, 2BB and 1SF over his last 10 games (since 4/13-G1)...matches his most RBI over a 10-

game span in his career (also 10RBI in 10G from 5/23-6/7/22).

As a Yankee (since 2022), has hit .333 (48-for-144) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 50RBI, 8BB, 2HP and 2SF with runners in scoring position.

May 1, 1996: Yankees outfielder Gerald Williams goes 6-for-8 with 1HR and 3RBI in a 15-inning, 11-6 win at Baltimore. His hit total matches the Yankees franchise record previously set by Myril Hoag in a nine-inning game on 6/6/34 at Boston.

May 1, 1951: Mickey Mantle hits his first career home run off the White Sox' Randy Gumpert in an 8-3 victory at Comiskey Park.

May 1, 1920: Babe Ruth hits his first HR as a Yankee in a 6-0 win vs. Boston off future teammate Herb Pennock.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 2, 1961: Mickey Mantle goes 2-for-5 with 5RBI in the Yankees' 6-4, 10-inning win at Minnesota's Metropolitan Stadium. With the game tied at 2-2, Mantle hits a two-out grand slam that holds up as the game winner.

May 2, 1939: Lou Gehrig's streak of 2,130 consecutive games played ends when he does not play in the Yankees' 22-2 win vs. the Detroit Tigers at Briggs Stadium. Babe Dahlgren plays first base, contributing a double and a home run.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (1-1, 4.01 ERA)

RHP Luis Gil will make his sixth start of the season in tonight's game at Baltimore...the 25-year-old will start on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Friday at Milwaukee, allowing 5R/ER in 5.0IP without recording a decision (7H, 2BB, 6K, 2HR)...has allowed just 15H to 108 batters faced this season... leads the Majors with a 12.77 K/9.0IP (min. 100BF)...among American League pitchers (min. 100BF), ranks sixth in H/9.0IP (5.47) and opponents' BA (.174)... has struck out at least six batters in 10 of his first 12 career starts, matching Masahiro Tanaka (10) for the most such games in a pitcher's first 12 career games in franchise history...if he records six-or-more strikeouts tonight, would match Tanaka (11) for the most games with at least six strikeouts in a pitcher's first 13 career games in franchise history... is also just the fourth pitcher in the last 26 seasons (since 1999) to record six-ormore strikeouts in at least 10 of their first 12 career games, joining Hunter Greene (11 in 2022), Masahiro Tanaka (10 in 2014) and Stephen Strasburg (10 in 2010)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in nine of his first 12 career starts, including four of his five starts this season...spent the entire 2023 season on the 60-day injured list recovering from right elbow surgery...made his first career Opening Day roster in 2024...was added to the Yankees' 40-man roster on 11/20/19...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15...last name is pronounced "HEEL."

LAST TIME OUT: Did not record a decision after allowing 5R/ER in 5.0IP on Friday at Milwaukee (7H, 2BB, 6K, 2HR)...his 5R/ER matched his career high (also 5R/ER on 9/13/21 vs. Minnesota).

VS. BALTIMORE/AL EAST: Will be making his second career start against Baltimore...made his Major League debut against Baltimore on 8/3/21. earning the win after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K).
