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THE TWINS: After completing their six-game, seven-day homestand with a record of 4-2 (2-1 vs. the Athletics and 2-1 vs. the Royals), the Twins began their nine-game, 10-day roadtrip with a win in Seattle last night...today, they will continue the trip with the second of three at T-Mobile Park through tomorrow afternoon...they will enjoy an off-day on Monday, then play three at Kansas City (Tuesday-Thursday), followed by three at Milwaukee (next weekend).
⚡ Last night's win moved the Twins over .500 for the first time since late night of April 21 at New York-NL, when they beat the Mets and improved to 12-11...their high-water mark for 2026 is four games over (11-7 after their game on April 14 vs. Boston).
⚡ Last night's win paired with Cleveland's 4-1 loss to Arizona moved the Twins into a tie of second place in the AL Central...first time in second place since April 21.

TWINS GET IT DONE FOR JIMOTHY: The Twins beat the Mariners last night by a score of 5-3 at T-Mobile Park...Zebby Matthews was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing three runs on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with two walks and a career-high 10 strikeouts...Kody Funderburk (1.1 IP), Tommy Nance (0.2 IP), Andrew Morris (1.0 IP) and Yoendrys Gómez (1.0 IP) combined to pitch 4.0 hitless innings of relief, with two walks and four strikeouts...the offense recorded seven hits, three being home runs from Brooks Lee (career-high 16), Royce Lewis (11) and Ryan Jeffers (10).

SEATTLE'S BEST: The Twins and Mariners are playing for the fifth of six times this season.
⚡ Trevor Larnach is hitting .385 (20-for-52) with three doubles, one triple, four home runs, 13 RBI, a .439 on-base percentage, a .712 slugging percentage and a 1.150 OPS in his last 13 games vs. Seattle pitching.
⚡ Brooks Lee has reached base safely in all nine career games vs. Seattle, hitting .297 (11-for-37) with two home runs and seven RBI in those games.
⚡ Over his last 10 games vs. the Mariners, Victor Caratini is hitting .379 (11-for-29) with seven RBI, a .441 on-base percentage and an .889 OPS.
⚡ This season vs. the Ms, Luke Keaschall is 6-for-14 (.429) with two doubles and three walks in four games.
⚡ Twins have gone 13-6 against the AL West this season, going 2-2 vs. Seattle, 4-2 vs. Houston, 3-0 vs. Texas, 2-1 vs. Los Angeles-AL and 2-1 vs. the Athletics...they have won 11 of their last 14 against the AL West, and seven of their last eight on the road.
⚡ Twins have a 2.96 ERA against the AL West, their best of any division.

MINTER, UP AND MOVIN' AROUND...OFFICIALLY: The Twins announced today that they have optioned right-handed pitcher Zebby Matthews to Triple-A St. Paul...to replace Matthews on the 26-man roster, the Twins have activated left-handed pitcher A.J. Minter, who was acquired via trade from the New York Mets yesterday...the 32-year-old has gone 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (23.0 IP, 6 ER), one hold, two walks, 20 strikeouts and a .236 opponent batting average in 23 games for the Mets this season...additionally, the Twins have returned right-handed pitcher Garrett Acton from his rehab assignment, reinstated him from the 60-day Injured List and optioned him to Triple-A St. Paul...to make room for Acton on the 40-man roster, the Twins have designated right-handed pitcher Cody Laweryson for release or assignment.

I'M OUT THERE, JERRY, AND I'M LOVIN' EVERY MINUTE OF IT!: Last night, the Twins acquired right-handed pitcher Dean Kremer in a trade with the Orioles, in exchange for minor league outfielder Jhonnardo Reyes...Kremer, 30, has gone 1-4, 6.50 ERA (36.0 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks, 38 strikeouts and a 1.36 WHIP in seven starts for the Orioles this season...the right-hander began the season with Triple-A Norfolk and made two starts for Baltimore in April, before missing time on the Injured List with a right quad strain; he was reinstated on July 1...the Stockton, California native was originally selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 14th round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of the University of Nevada and has made 133 appearances (130 starts).
⚡ To make room for Kremer on the 26-man roster, the Twins transferred right-handed pitcher Mike Paredes to the 60-day Injured List (left oblique strain).

SERIES CONVERSATIONS: With a win today or tomorrow the Twins will earn their 19th series victory of the season...they have gone 18-15-2 in series play, 11-5-1 at home and 7-10-1 on the road.

⚡ Twins began the season going 8-13-1 in their first 22 series through June 11, but have gone 10-2-1 their last 13 series overall, dating back to June 12-14 vs. St. Louis.
⚡ Twins have gone 4-1-1 in series play on the road over their last six chances, but 0-1-1 in their last two...their last road series win was July 3-5 at Yankee Stadium.
⚡ Twins are seeking their first series win over the Mariners since taking two of three at T-Mobile Park, from June 28-30, 2024...they have gone 0-2-1 head-to-head since.

WEARING OUT THEIR WELCOME: The Twins have gone 13-7 in their last 20 road games (since June 15) after starting the season going 13-21 in their first 34 away from Minnesota...in those 20, they have averaged 5.9 runs-per-game and have outscored opponents 118-95...below are the AL OPS rankings on the road since June 15, among qualifiers:

TWO STARTS AGO (REHAB): In his lone rehab start with Triple-A St. Paul on July 19 vs. Louisville, Priellip threw 3.0 scoreless innings without allowing a hit, while walking one and striking out three... needed only 32 pitches to work through the 10 batters he faced; of those 32 pitches, he threw 20 of them for strikes (62.5%).

➤ Marked the fourth hitless outing of his professional career and first since April 26, 2025 vs. Springfield while pitching for Double-A Wichita (also 3.0 IP, 0 H).

HOME/ROAD SPLITS: In his career, Prielipp has started nine games at home and five games on the road...at Target Field he is 3-2 with a 3.86 ERA (49.0 IP, 21 ER), 15 walks, 54 strikeouts and a 1.04 WHIP, compared to 0-3 with a 6.56 ERA (23.1 IP, 17 ER), 11 walks, 22 strikeouts and a 1.84 WHIP in his five starts on the road.

⚔ Priello is holding opposing hitters to a .193 (17-for-88) BAA his slider, which ranks sixth among American League starting pitchers (min. 75 PA), behind only Toronto's Dylan Cease (.117), Texas' Kumar Rocker (.169), Texas' Jacob deGrom (.175), Houston's Tatsuya Imai (.175) and Los Angeles-AL's Reid Detmers (.179).

Right-hander Taj Bradley is scheduled to toe the rubber for the 22nd time this season in tomorrow's three-game series finale against the Seattle Mariners...in his last start on July 28 vs. Kansas City, Taj did not factor into the decision despite making a quality start, allowing two runs on three hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with three walks and 10 strikeouts as the Twins walked off the Royals by a score of 3-2 at Target Field...in four starts in July, Taj went 3-1 with a 2.92 ERA (37.0 IP, 12 ER), 14 walks, 48 strikeouts, a 1.05 WHIP and a .189 (25-for-132) BAA...this will be Taj's fifth career start against Seattle; he has no record with a 4.91 ERA (22.0 IP, 12 ER), nine walks, 23 strikeouts, a 1.36 WHIP and a .241 (21-for-87) BAA in his career against the Mariners.
