## RED HOTS

• **TJ Friedl** (35g, 38h) and **Jonathan India** (35g, 39h) each has appeared in **all 35 Reds games**, and each has amassed at least **38 hits**...**Joey Votto** (35g, 41h) was the last Reds player to produce those numbers, in **2013**...**Friedl** and **India** comprise the first **pair of teammates** to produce at least **36 hits** while appearing in each of the Reds' **first 34 games** since **1995**, when **Reggie Sanders** (35g, 42h) and **Bret Boone** (35g, 39h) did it.

## TONIGHT'S GAME

• Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Jay Horwitz' Mets** and **Game 5** (2-2) of a 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series loss** to the **White Sox**.  
• Following this series the Reds hit the road for a pair of **3-game series** at Mia's **loanDepot Park** and at Col's **Coors Field**, then return to **Great American Ball Park** for 7 games vs the **Yankees** (3g) and **Cardinals** (4g).

## SERIES NOTES

- The Mets won last season's 6-game season series, **5-1**, including their first sweep in **New York** since **4/25-4/27, 2016**.
- Beginning **9/24/13**, the Reds are **16-38 vs NYM**, including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14 - 9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01 - 8/13/03**.
- Dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**.

## MARLINS UP NEXT...

- Friday the Reds and Marlins begin a 3-game series at **loanDepot Park**.
- The Reds went **15-6 vs Mia** over the previous 3 seasons (6-1 in 2019, 5-2 in 2021, 4-3 in 2022) following 4 straight losing season series to the **Marlins**.
- Between the **2014** and **2019** winning season series, the Reds went **10-18 vs Mia** (3-4, 3-4, 2-5, 2-5).
- The Reds are **16-19 at Marlins Park / loanDepot park**, including **3-0** with the roof open and **13-19** closed.

## ...FOLLOWED BY THE ROCKIES

- Next week the Reds make their annual visit to **Coors Field**.
- Last season the Rockies earned the **4-2 series win**, including their **first series sweep** of the Reds since **September 2010**.
- Beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games, the Reds' **.338 winning percentage at Coors Field** (22-43) is tied for their second-lowest at any current road ballpark in that span (Phi's **Citizens Bank Park**, 21-43, .328; LA's **Dodger Stadium**, 22-43, .338).
- The Reds' **3-1 series win** from **5/30-6/2, 2016** is their only series win at **Coors Field** since **8/27-8/29, 2012**.

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• **IF/OF Nick Senzel** was **National League Player of the Week** for **4/24-4/30**, the first award of his career (6g, .476, 1 2b, 2hr, 9rbi, 1sb, 8r, 17tb, .560obp, .810slg, 1.370ops)...he led NL hitters in hitting, RBI and runs scored while ranking second in OBP, T3rd in hits & total bases and fourth in slugging.

## @REDSONTHERISE

- Louisville **IF Matt McLain** and Chattanooga **IF Noelvi Marte** are last week's International League and Southern League **Players of the Week**, respectively...**McLain** led the IL in extra-base hits (7), total bases (23) and RBI (11) while ranking among the league leaders in hits (2nd, 11), doubles (2nd, 4), slugging (3rd, .920), hitting (4th, .440) and OPS (4th, 1.403)...**Marte** led the SL in HR (4), RBI (11), slugging (.958) and total bases (23) while ranking among the leaders in extra-base hits (T1st, 5), hits (2nd, 10), OPS (2nd, 1.439), hitting (3rd, .417) and on-base percentage (7th, .481).
- Dayton **OF Blake Dunn** was **Midwest League Player of the Week** for **4/24-4/30** (6g, .550, 1 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, 4sb, 9r) and both the league and organization's **Player of the Month for April**...in April, he led the **Midwest League** in hitting (.386), runs (17), on-base percentage (.538), slugging (.702) and OPS (1.240) while ranking second in total bases (40), HR (5), RBI (18) and stolen bases (11).
- **LHP Andrew Abbott** was the organization's **Pitcher of the Month** for **April** (4gs, 1-0, 1.74, 20.2ip, 9h, 6bb, 43k for Chattanooga & Louisville).

## 2022 YOUNG GUNS

- In **62 combined starts**, Reds rookie starting pitchers **RHP Hunter Greene**, **LHP Nick Lodolo** and **RHP Graham Ashcraft** went **14-26, 4.34** (334ip, 161er)...all 3 made their Major League debuts in **2022**.
- In **LHP Reiver Sanmartin** (Game 2), **Greene** (Game 4) and **Lodolo** (Game 6), in 2022 the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the **first 6 games of a season** for only the **second time in their history** (1902).

## THE SKIPPER & HIS CREW

- **David Bell** is in his fifth season as a Major League manager (**266-315, .458**, 2020 Wild Card)...was hired on **10/22/18**...on **9/22/21**, the club announced a **2-year contract extension** through **2023**.
- Returning to **David Bell's staff** are bench coach **Freddie Benavides** (10th season on the Major League staff), 3B coach **J.R. House** (5th), pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (5th), game planning/IF coach **Jeff Pickler** (5th), bullpen catcher **José Duarte** (5th), coach/coordinator of advance scouting **Kyle Arnsberg** (2nd) and hitting coach **Joel McKeithan** (2nd).
- New to the staff in 2023 are assistant hitting coach **Terry Bradshaw**, 1B Coach **Collin Cowgill**, assistant hitting/integrated performance coach **Tim LaMonte**, assistant pitching coach **Alon Leichman** (alone LISHE-man), bullpen coach **Matt Tracy** and bullpen catcher **Joe Singley**.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #21 Hunter Greene, RHP

## RED HOT

- In just his second season, tonight is making his 32nd Major League appearance and start...will be his second career appearance and start vs the Mets.
- In Fri's 5-4 loss vs WSox allowed all 5 runs on a pair of homers, including a 3-run HR by Elvis Andrus in the fifth inning and a 2-run HR by Luis Robert Jr. in the sixth...were Greene's first home runs allowed since Opening Day, snapping his career-high homerless streak at 29.0 innings.
- Through the first 7 starts of his 2022 rookie season had allowed 11 home runs.
- Has been charged with 3 pitch timer violations.
- Was the Reds' 2023 Opening Day starting pitcher.
- At age 23 years, 236 days became the first pitcher age 25 or under to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 1980, when at age 22 years, 232 days RHP Frank Pastore beat Phil Niekro and the Braves, 9-0... courtesy @EliasSports.
- Became the first second-year pitcher to start for the Reds on Opening Day since 26-year-old RHP Raisel Iglesias started the 6-2 win vs the Phillies in the 2016 season opener...courtesy @EliasSports.
- On 4/18 signed a \$53 million contract through the 2028 season that includes for 2029 a \$21 million club option and \$2 million buyout.
- In his age 22 season, in 2022 led the Reds' staff in starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
- Last season ranked among qualified National League rookie pitchers in starts (1st, 24), innings pitched (2nd, 125.2), strikeout rate (2nd, 30.9%), whiff rate (2nd, 32.0%), opponents' BA (2nd, .222), fWAR (3rd, 1.6), rWAR (3rd, 2.2), opponents' OPS (T3rd, .725), FIP (6th, 4.37) and ERA (6th, 4.44).
- In 2022 posted a strikeout rate of 30.9 percent...since 2000 and with a minimum of 100 innings pitched, no pitcher age 22 or younger has posted a higher strikeout rate in a Major League season.
- Last season's average fastball velocity of 98.9 miles per hour ranked highest among all Major League pitchers with at least 100 innings pitched.
- Last season was 1 of only 7 pitchers in the National League and 16 pitchers in the Major Leagues to throw a shutout.
- Was the National League Player of the Week for 6/6-6/12, the only Reds player so honored in 2022 (2gs, 1-0, 0.75, 12ip, 3h, 1er, 2bb, 15k, .079baa).
- In 2022 became the only Major League rookie since 1900 to produce in a season at least 3 apps in which he threw at least 6.0 innings with at least 8 strikeouts and no more than 1 hit (5/15 at Pit, 6/6 vs Ari, 8/1 at Mia)...no pitcher in modern history, regardless of rookie status, has produced more than 3 such games... in his final start of the season, in Game 160 vs Cubs, recorded 6.0 innings and 8 strikeouts but allowed 2 hits.
- From 8/5-9/16 missed 43 days and 40 games while on the 15-day injured list with a right shoulder strain...went 4-12, 5.26 in 20 starts prior to the injury and 1-1, 0.78 in 4 starts after he came off the 15-day IL.
- Following his 2022 rookie season was the Reds' nominee for MLB's prestigious Lou Gehrig Memorial Award for exemplary contributions to his community.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft...was rated by MLB.com the best overall prospect and by *Baseball America* the best high school player in that draft...the Twins selected high school SS Royce Lewis with the No. 1 overall pick.
- Heading into the 2017 draft, became the 13th high school athlete ever to appear on the cover of *Sports Illustrated*.
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery.

- Through 35 games this season, Reds starters 10 times threw at least 6.0 innings and twice threw 7.0 innings (Graham Ashcraft, Nick Lodolo).
