RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (three to play), and Athletics (three to play) tonight at T-Mobile Park...have won 12 of their last 16 games on the heels of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...they went 12-8 on a 20-game-in-20-days stretch to begin the second half (July 17–Aug. 5) before yesterday's off day...lead the AL with a 68-46 record, fourth in the majors...have spent 82 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 41 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres)...the 82 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (129), Braves (127), Brewers (97), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 80 of those days, already third most in team history behind 2023 (106) and 2021 (81), per Stats Perform...have held a 5-game lead over the second-place Yankees each of the last two days, their largest lead since July 8 (5-0)...entered August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).
* The Rays completed their MLB-best 11th sweep of the season with a 4-0 win over the Rockies on Wednesday...marks the fourth-most sweeps in a single season in Rays history (see table on the right) and their second most before the calendar flips to September (2021, 13x).
* The shutout victory was the 11th by the Rays this season, tied for fourth most in the majors...they have shut out opponents in five of their last 11 games (July 25–pres.), their most across any 11-game span in franchise history.

* **Junior Caminero** launched his 33rd home run of the season, going a projected 449 ft. ...it marked his sixth long ball of 440 feet or farther this season, the most by a Ray in the pitch tracking era (since 2008) – see more in "La Máxima" note below.
* **Nick Martinez** got the start on his birthday and earned the win...marked his third career win on his birthday, tied for the fourth most in the modern era (since 1900).
* They improved to a season-high 22 games above .500, their first time reaching the mark since the conclusion of the 2023 season (99-63).
* With a win tonight, the Rays would return to a .500 record (28-28) away from Tropicana Field for the first time since July 3 (21-21)...they have not been above .500 on the road since June 6 (16-15).
* Puyallap, Wash. native **Drew Rasmussen** owns a 1.40 ERA (252IP, 4ER) across six career appearances (five starts) against the Mariners, second lowest among active pitchers (min. 25.0IP) behind LAA **Yusei Kikuchi** (1.32).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed INF **Ben Williamson** (right hamstring strain) on the 10-day IL and recalled INF **Carson Williams** from Triple-A Durham...yesterday, RHP **Steven Wilson** (lumbar disc inflammation) was reinstated from the 60-day IL and designated for assignment... additionally, RHP **Chase Solesky** was claimed off waivers by the Reds and RHP **Craig Kimbrel** cleared waivers and elected free agency.
* This marks Williams' third stint on the active roster this season (also: Opening Day–April 6 & May 17-29)...in 82 games with the Bulls, he is 71-for-314 (.226) with 11 2B, 4 3B, 11 HR, 51 RBI, 17 SB, and a .710 OPS...he is one of seven International League players with 10 HR, 50 RBI, and 15 SB or more this year.

LA MÁXIMA—**Junior Caminero** launched his 33rd home run of the season Wed. at COL...the blast tied him with **Randy Arozarena** (85) for the 10th-most long balls in franchise history...he is 14 homers behind **Fred McGriff** (99) for ninth on the list...he reached 85 career home runs in 318 career games, tied for the eighth-most home runs in the modern era (since 1900) within a player's first 318 games...he is the first player to reach the mark since within as few games since SD **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (March 28, 2019–June 11, 2023; 93HR).

* His homer marked the 78th home run between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN **Eddie Mathews** (87).
* He is pacing for 47 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join Mathews (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign...he would also break **Carlos Peña's** single-season franchise record (2007, 46HR).

HIT & RUN—**Chandler Simpson** swiped his 30th base of the season on Wed. at COL, tied for the third most in the majors with NYY **Jazz Chisholm Jr.** behind WSH **Nasim Núñez** (40) and KC **Bobby Witt Jr.** (31)...he is one of 18 players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 30 stolen bases in each of his first two big-league seasons...he also became one of 13 players in the modern era with 100 hits and 30 stolen bases in each of his first two major league seasons (last: Witt Jr., 2022-23).
* The speedster is on pace for 43 stolen bases in 2026, which would mark his second consecutive 40-stolen-base season to begin his career (2025, 44)...in the modern era, only CAL **Chad Curtis** (1992-93), MON **Delino DeShields** (1990-91), STL **Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and NYY **Bert Daniels** (1910-11) have recorded 40 stolen bases or more in each of their first two campaigns.

A CHANGE OF THINKING—The Rays pitching staff this season has raised its usage of changeups from 8.2 pct in 2024 and 11.7 pct. in 2025 to 20.8 pct...it is the highest usage rate of the pitch in any single season across the pitch tracking era (since 2008)...only two teams have a higher usage rate on a non-fastball pitch in 2026; the Braves (23.2%) and the Blue Jays (21.9%), both on sliders...the Rays staff is throwing four-seamers (26.3%), sinkers (21.0%), and changeups at a combined 67.0 pct. rate.
* The Rays have posted the second-lowest opp. average against the pitch (.177) in the majors behind the Blue Jays (.174)...they have also recorded the second-lowest opp. OBP (.206) against changeups (NYY, .199) and are tied for the fifth-highest whiff rate (34.3%) in the majors.

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 33-1 when out-homering their opponent, 19-10 when home runs are even, and 16-35 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays 271 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (34-27/47)...the Rays have won 20 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.)...they have dropped 22 of 28 contests they have been out-homered in since May 25...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (31-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated 17 of their 33 runs over the last eight games via 10 HR.
* They are 27-5 in multi-homer games, including six straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
* Over their last 36 games since June 25, the Rays are tied for the most multi-homer efforts (17) in the AL and are second behind the Tigers (57) for the most home runs (53) in the AL over that span.

BAKER THE SAVE MAKER—**Bryan Baker** converted his 21st straight save opportunity Tues. at COL to earn his MLB-best 32nd save, as many or more than 22 major league clubs have as a team this season...the 21-save streak is tied for the second longest in franchise history (see table on the right) and is MLB's longest active streak...Baker has earned a save in six of the Rays last eight wins and seven of their last 10 (July 22–pres.)...min. 25.0 IP he leads the majors with a 0.35 ERA (26.0IP, 1ER) and .115 (10-for-87) opp. average since the 21-save streak began on May 17, and only MIL **Jacob Misiorowski** (0.62) has a better WHIP than Baker (0.65) in that time...he has worked a season-high-tying 13 straight scoreless outings (June 27–pres.), matching May 17–June 21...it marks the second-longest streak of his career behind a 15-appearance stretch from April 2–May 4, 2023 and the second longest by a Ray this season behind **Kevin Kelly's** 14-appearance span from April 22–May 22.

* Baker is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47) as the only Rays pitchers to lead the majors in saves over a full season...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining Colomé, **Fernando Rodney** (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernandez** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.
* The Rays have won each of the last 19 games Baker has pitched in, the fourth-longest streak in a pitcher's outings in team history, trailing **Emilio Pagan** (25G, 2019), Soriano, (24G, 2010), and Percival (24G, 2008)...across the season, the Rays are 41-5 when he pitches.
* Collectively, the Rays have recorded an MLB-leading 45 saves, their second most through 114 games in club history (2015, 47SV)...that's good for a pace of 64 saves over a 162-game season, which would establish a team record and tie the third-highest total by any club since saves became an official statistic in 1969 (also: 1988 OAK & 1990 OAK), trailing the 1990 White Sox (68) and 2008 Angels (66).
* The Rays own the majors' best winning pct. in games decided by three runs or fewer (.652/43-23).

SLEEPLESS IN SEATTLE—The Rays return to the PNW for a three-game set this weekend against the Mariners...the Rays have won each of their last two sets opposite the Mariners, winning five of their last six contests since being swept in Seattle between Aug. 8-10, 2025...they have lost seven of their last nine sets (2-7-0) at T-Mobile Park (since 2016; clubs did not meet in 2020)...with their last series win coming between May 5-8, 2022 (3-1)...their 97-119 (.449) record against the Mariners in franchise history is their seventh worst against any opponent and their fourth worst against any AL club.
* In 12 career games against the Mariners, **Junior Caminero** has slashed .400/.449/.822 (18-for-45) with 5 2B, 1 3B, 4 HR, 14 RBI, and an OPS of 1.271...his .400 average is his second best against any opponent across his career, trailing only his .417 (10-for-24) average the Rockies...he has reached base safely in 11 straight against the Mariners (Aug. 27, 2024–pres.), a streak that included both a 10-game hitting streak (Aug. 27, 2024–July 11, 2025) and a five-game extra-base-hit streak (Sept. 1, 2025–July 11, 2025)...the hitting streak tied for the third longest by any Ray against the Mariners.

MR. 3000—On this day in 1999, National Baseball Hall of Famer and Rays Hall of Famer, **Wade Boggs**, recorded his 3,000th career hit on a two-run home run to right field at Tropicana Field...he became the first player in MLB history to reach the milestone with a home run.

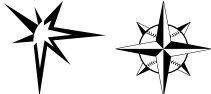

TONIGHT'S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber tonight for his 22nd start of the campaign and 152nd career appearance (103rd start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (102GS), trailing seventh-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS)...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in opp. on-base pct. (1st, .249), strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 6.10), WHIP (1st, 0.93), opp. OPS (2nd, .572), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.53), opp. AVG (3rd, .205), and opp. SLG (4th, .323).

- ★ He has limited right-handed batters to a .170 (28-for-165) clip this season, the lowest mark in MLB (min. 150BF), ahead of **ATH JT. Ginn** (.171).
- ★ Since 2021, his 2.82 ERA (562.2IP, 176ER) ranks fourth among all major league pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), **ATL Chris Sale** (2.77), and **MIL Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).
- ★ Dating back to July 26 vs. CLE, Rasmussen's last 13.0 innings have been scoreless...during that span, he's posted a 0.54 WHIP and .116 (5-for-43) opp. average.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his team-leading 10th win of the year after striking out 10 batters over 6.0 shutout innings on his way to his third straight win on Aug. 1 vs. CWS (W, 6.0IP 4H, OR, BB, 10SO)...after allowing a leadoff walk to the first batter of the game, he struck out five straight, retiring seven of his first eight batters faced before allowing a single to **Edgar Quero** in the 3rd inning...set down 10 of his final 13 batters faced, retiring his final three via the strikeout.

- ★ Marked his second consecutive shutout start of 6.0 innings or more (also: July 26 vs. CLE - 7.0IP) and his seventh of the season, one shy of MLB leader **PHI Cristopher Sánchez** (8)...marked Rasmussen's third career outing with 10 strikeouts or more, joining June 10, 2026 vs. BOS (13SO) and Sept. 9, 2022 at NYY (10SO).
- ★ Was his 15th outing allowing one or zero extra-base hits this season, third most among AL starters behind **LAA/TOR José Soriano** (16) and **TOR Dylan Cease** (16).
- ★ With his 3rd-inning strikeout of **Sam Antonacci**, Rasmussen became the 10th pitcher to record 500 strikeouts in a Rays uniform.
- ★ Fifteen of his 20 starts have been 5.0 innings or more with 2 ER or fewer, tied for the fourth-most such starts among AL pitchers this year.
- ★ He has collected 18 whiffs in back-to-back starts (July 26-pres.)...tied a career high with 10 whiffs on his fastball (also: Sept. 1, 2021 vs. BOS).

ONE SHORT DAY IN THE EMERALD CITY—Across six career appearances (five starts) against Seattle, Rasmussen is 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA (25.2IP, 4ER), a .189 (17-for-90) opp. average, and 26 strikeouts...in those five starts, he is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (24.0IP, 4ER), a .200 (17-for-85) opp. average, and 22 strikeouts...his teams are 3-3 lifetime against the Mariners...made his most recent start against Seattle on Sept. 2, 2025 at Tropicana Field, allowing three earned runs on four hits in a Rays 6-5 victory (5.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2SO, 3HR).

- ★ His 1.40 ERA against the Mariners is his lowest ERA against any opponent in his career (min. 25.0IP).
- ★ He is 9-4 with a 3.40 ERA (100.2IP, 38ER) over 23 career appearances (19 starts) vs. AL West foes, including 9-4 with a 3.60 ERA (95.0IP, 38ER) in the 19 starts.

ROAD WORK AHEAD—The right-hander is making his 11th start on the road this season...is 3-2 with a 3.07 ERA (55.2IP 19ER) and 54 strikeouts to eight walks...Rasmussen has logged a career 20-9 record with a 3.07 ERA (278.2IP, 95ER) across 75 road contests (52 starts).

- ★ Since 2021, Rasmussen's 20 career road wins pace Rays arms...boasts a lifetime .689 (20-9) winning pct. on the road with Tampa Bay, the second-highest clip in franchise history (min. 25GS) behind **David Price** (.701)...with a win tonight, Rasmussen would be .002 shy of eclipsing Price for the highest mark in club history under the same parameters.
- ★ Rasmussen's 2.98 ERA (253.2IP, 84ER) at venues with a dome or retractable roof since the start of 2022 is the fourth-lowest clip in the majors (min. 225.0IP), trailing **TB Shane McClanahan** (2.71), **DET Framer Valdez** (2.95), and **SEA Bryan Woo** (2.98).

A CUT ABOVE—Rasmussen's cutter is his most used pitched this season (30.5%), generating a team-high 26.1 pct. whiff rate on the pitch...his 551 cutters thrown this year are the second most among AL pitchers behind **NY Yankees Cam Schlichtler** (572).

- ★ Min. 300 pitches on the cutter, he owns the fifth-best whiff rate among AL pitchers this year behind **MIN Taj Bradley** (36.1%), **CLE Tanner Bibee** (32.4%), and **TEX Nathan Eovaldi** (27.0%).

ALL THE STARS—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 3-0 with a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) across three starts.

- ★ With a win tonight, Rasmussen would improve to 4-0 following the All-Star break, joining **PHI Cristopher Sánchez** (4-0) as the only MLB starters this year with four wins or more without a loss following the Midsummer Classic...would be the first time in his career Rasmussen has earned a win in his first four starts after the break.
- ★ His 727 (16-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and tied for the sixth-highest mark in the modern era with **Jose Fernandez** and **Clayton Kershaw**, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844), **Johnny Beazley** (.826), **Kris Medlen** (.758), **Don Gullett** (.742), and **Dakota Hudson** (.733)...with a win tonight, Rasmussen would surpass Hudson under the same parameters with a .739 winning pct.
