**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Braves, 7-5, last night...The Mets are looking to avoid their fourth sweep of the season...The Mets continue their six-game road trip (0-2) to Atlanta (0-2) and Pittsburgh (three games).

**LET'S NOT GO STREAKING:** New York has lost a season-high five straight games, which is the longest stretch of the season...The last time the Mets lost five in a row was from September 21-26, 2021...The last time the Mets lost six or more in a row was when they dropped six straight from August 23-29, 2019.

**PHAM-TASTIC:** Over his last 12 games, Tommy Pham is batting .357 (10-28) with five runs, two doubles, one triple, three home runs, 10 RBI, four walks with a .424 OBP, a .821 SLG and a 1.246 OPS.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso's 22 home runs this year, leads the majors leagues...His 49 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 429 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 58 of the Mets games this year.

**JUST DO IT:** Justin Verlander will make his fourth career start against the Braves tonight...Verlander is 2-1 with a 2.57 ERA (6 ER/21.0 IP) with five walks and 25 strikeouts lifetime against Atlanta...This will mark his first career start at Truist Park...In six starts this year, Verlander is 2-3 with a 4.25 ERA (17 ER/36.0 IP) with nine walks and 30 strikeouts...This includes a 1-1 mark with a 4.76 ERA (9 ER/17.0 IP) with four walks and 14 strikeouts in three starts on the road.

**COME AT THE KING, BEST NOT MISS:** Omar Narváez has reached base safely in all six games this season, batting .313 (5-16) with two runs, two RBI and two walks.

**TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST:** New York is 22-32 all-time at Truist Park...Mark Canha has hit .270 (10-37) with three runs, four doubles, two home runs, four RBI, three walks with a .341 OBP and a .541 SLG...Tommy Pham has batted .279 (12-43) with 10 runs, one double, five home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks with a .411 OBP and a .651 SLG...Starling Marte has hit seven home runs in 27 career games at the yard.

**HOTLANTA:** Jeff McNeil has hit .376 (35-93) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .420 OBP and a .538 SLG...In seven games at the ballpark in 2022, McNeil recorded a hit in six of those games, batting .517 (15-29) with five runs, three doubles, one home run, two RBI with a 1.241 OPS.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Over his last 27 games, Starling Marte is batting .283 (26-92) with 12 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a .327 OBP...He has safely reached base in eight of his last 10 games.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 12-10 against the division this year...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022...Their .658 winning percentage against the East was the best mark in club history.

**BRAVES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have lost six straight and eight of their last nine at Truist Park...New York is 22-32 all-time at the ballpark.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Francisco Alvarez has hit nine home runs this season...That puts him tied for the third-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for second in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's 10 career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed 22 errors in 62 games this year, tied with the Diamondbacks for the fewest errors in the majors...New York owns a .990 fielding percentage...Their .990 fielding percentage, second in the major leagues.

**FIRST IS THE WORST:** The Mets have been outscored 46-14 in the first inning this year.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York has played 35 games on the road this year, tied for the most in the majors...New York is 15-20 with a 4.99 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 294 strikeouts on the road are the third-most in the majors.

**ROAD WARRIOR:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .338 (46-136) with 18 runs, eight doubles, three triples, two home runs, 17 RBI, 17 walks with a .419 OBP and .485 SLG in 36 games on the road this season...His .338 road average ranks fourth in the majors...Nimmo owns a career .399 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** New York is 16-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 6-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

**EIGHT IS GREAT:** The Mets are 27-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 122 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** The Mets lead the major leagues with an 87.5% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 17 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 331 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals...Pete Alonso has stolen 12 bases in 13 tries in his career.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** The Mets are hitting .238 (110-462) with runners in scoring position, ranking 12th in the NL and 23rd in the majors this year...Last season, New York batted .269 (371-1,378), good for third in the NL and fourth in the majors.

### VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

**TILL I COLLAPSE:** In his last start, June 2 vs. Toronto, Verlander threw 117 pitches, the most by a starting pitcher this season...It was the highest pitch count Verlander reached since throwing 120 pitches in his third career no-hitter on September 1, 2019 at Toronto...His 117 pitches were the most by a Mets hurler since Jason Vargas reached 117 pitches in a complete game shutout on June 5, 2019 at San Francisco...Was the highest pitch count in a game by a pitcher age 40 or older since R.A. Dickey threw 121 pitches on August 30, 2017 with Atlanta...Were the most pitches by a Mets pitcher age 40 or older since Bartolo Colon threw 121 pitches on July 14, 2014...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

**ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST:** Tonight, Verlander will make his first career start at Truist Park, marking the 34th venue Verlander has started in...Verlander joins Zack Greinke, Johnny Cueto, Rich Hill, Gerrit Cole, Charlie Morton, Jordan Lyles and Robbie Ray as the only other active pitchers to have made at least one start in 34 or more ballparks...Verlander's first three career starts against the Braves all came at Turner Field...Courtesy of Elias.

**30 FOR 30:** With a win on May 10th against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

**3K AND COUNTING:** Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 23 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer...During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**A TRUE COMEBACK STORY:** In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

**LIKE A FINE WINE:** Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

**THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF:** Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher...Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed one run over 5.1 innings on five hits, five walks and five strikeouts on June 3 vs. Toronto at Citi Field...Lowered his career Interleague ERA to 2.25 (7 ER/28.0 IP).

**NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK:** This season, Megill is 3-1 with a 3.03 ERA (11 ER/32.2 IP) in six home starts this season...In six road starts this season, Megill is 2-2 with a 6.08 ERA (18 ER/26.2 IP)...In 22 career home games (20 starts), Megill is 7-4 with a 4.09 ERA (47 ER/103.1 IP) and in 23 career road games (19 starts), Megill is 6-7 with a 5.23 ERA (54 ER/93.0 IP).
