## SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs lost 5-4 in 11 innings @ Orioles last night.

◆ **Ketel Marte** hit safely in his 12th straight game with his fourth homer in 6 games.

◆ **Kevin Newman** collected a multi-hit performance with 1 double and 1 triple.

**VS. ORIOLES:** This marks Arizona's first series @ Baltimore since Sept. 23-25, 2016.

◆ The D-backs are 15-11 all-time vs. Orioles and 5-6 all-time on the road...their last win @ Oriole Park at Camden Yards came on June 17, 2007 (W, 6-4).

◆ Last season, the D-backs hosted the Orioles @ Chase Field for 3 games, the first time since 2019.

**PIKE POWER:** Yesterday, **Ketel Marte** collected his ninth homer of the season (2-run HR in Top 3)...it was his fourth home run in his last 6 games.

◆ Since May 5, Marte's 4 homers are tied for the most in the Majors (also: 5 others).

◆ Among leadoff batters in the Majors this season, Marte's .590 SLG ranks third while his 7 homers are tied for third (also: 3 others).

**BACK-TO-BACK GAMES (AGAIN):** **Ketel Marte** has homered in back-to-back games on 4 occasions this season (April 3-6, April 16-17, May 5-7 and May 10-11) and is the only D-back to have multiple occurrences...no other player in the Majors has met the feat more than 3 times (3 occurrences by Shohei Ohtani/LAD and Cal Raleigh/SEA).

**BWAR(e) OF KETEL:** **Ketel Marte's** 2.7 bWAR is third among all players [pitcher or position], behind Mookie Betts/LAD (3.2) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3.0), and ahead of Shohei Ohtani/LAD (.26) and Gunnar Henderson/BAL (2.6).

**MARTE EXTENDS TO 12:** **Ketel Marte** is riding a season-long 12-game hit streak...his streak is currently the second-longest active hit streak in the Majors, behind Max Kepler/MIN (13).

◆ In the span (since April 28), he has 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

◆ Marte's longest career hit-streak is 16 games (May 16-June 4, 2022)...hit .390 (23-for-59) with 7 doubles, 1 homer, 9 RBI and 5 walks.

**MARTE'S 10+-GAME HIT STREAKS:** **Ketel Marte's** 10 total 10+-game hit streaks in his career with Arizona marks the third most in franchise history, behind Luis Gonzalez (12) and Paul Goldschmidt (11).

**CLEAN FIELDING TEAMS:** Since April 22, the D-backs have made 3 errors (1 being Catcher's Interference), which are second fewest in the Majors, behind the Orioles (2).

**BATS AGAINST BALTIMORE:** Over his last 9 games vs. Orioles, **Gabriel Moreno** is batting .387 (12-for-31)/1.069 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

◆ In his last 16 games, **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** is hitting .339 (20-for-59) with 6 doubles, 2 homers, 8 RBI and 3 walks.

◆ **Ketel Marte**, over 8 games vs. Orioles, is hitting .313 (10-for-32) with 1 double, 3 homers and 7 RBI.

**ABOVE AVERAGE DEFENDERS:** The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the top 10 of MLB Outs Above Average leaders: **Christian Walker** (T-4th, 6), **Ketel Marte** (T-4th, 6) and **Kevin Newman** (T-6th, 5).

**SUÁREZ ON A MISSION FOR 30:** **Eugenio Suárez** has homered against 29 of the 30 teams...the only remaining team is against Baltimore.

**WELCOME TO CAMDEN YARDS:** Entering this series, only 8 players on the D-backs' active roster had played a game @ Camden Yards: **Tucker Barnhart** (4 G), **Randal Grichuk** (28 G), **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (29 G), **Ketel Marte** (3 G), **Gabriel Moreno** (2 G), **Kevin Newman** (5 G), **Joc Pederson** (6 G) and **Eugenio Suárez** (6 G).

**GRICHUK VS. CHARM CITY:** **Randal Grichuk's** 22 home runs vs. Orioles since 2018 are tied for third most among all players (also: Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Gleyber Torres), behind Aaron Judge (28) and J.D. Martinez (27).

**WALKER, THE FORMER ORIOLE:** **Christian Walker** was originally signed by Orioles as a fourth-round selection in 2012 out of the University of South Carolina and spent 5 seasons in the organization (2012-16).

◆ Was named Baltimore's 2014 Brooks Robinson Minor League Player of the Year after hitting .288 (153-for-532) with 73 runs, 25 doubles, 2 triples, 26 homers, 96 RBI and 56 walks.

**MEMORABLE VISITS FOR WALKER & MORENO:** **Christian Walker** hit his first career homer in his third career MLB game with the Orioles on Sept. 20, 2014 vs. Red Sox @ Camden Yards (solo off Rubby De La Rosa, 4th inn.).

◆ On the final day of the 2022 season, Oct. 5, 2022 (Game 1 of doubleheader) @ Orioles, **Gabriel Moreno** slugged his first career home run (3-run off Mike Baumann, 6th inn.).

## D-BACKS MILESTONES TO WATCH:

◆ **Eugenio Suárez** has 249 career homers.

◆ **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has 97 career homers.

◆ **Joc Pederson** has 493 career RBI.

## NEXT STARTER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (2-2, 4.70)

◆ Earned the win in his last start on May 8 @ Reds (2 ER in 7.0 IP).

◆ In 5 career starts vs. Reds, is 3-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 ER in 29.0 IP) with 9 walks allowed and 27 strikeouts.

SNAKEBITES

**AT A GLANCE:** Sixth season with the D-backs.

- 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** Eighth start of the season, fifth on the road.

- Limiting opponents to a .100 average (4-for-40) with 22 strikeouts off his curveball.
- The D-backs have scored a combined 43 runs in his 6 starts this year.
- He has exited 5 of his 7 starts this season with the lead.

**NO APRIL SHOWERS:** Went 2-2 with a 3.67 ERA (11 ER in 27.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts in 5 starts in April.

- In 16 career April starts, is 7-2 with a 1.96 ERA (21 R-20 ER in 91.2 IP), 0.87 WHIP, .180 opponent average (59-for-328) and 110 strikeouts.
- His 1.96 ERA among D-backs starters (min. 10 starts) in April, is a franchise best, ahead of Brandon Webb (2.66) and Patrick Corbin (2.84).

**NL RANKINGS:** Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-6th, 4) and strikeouts per 9.0 innings (9th, 9.71).

**FRANCHISE RANKINGS:** Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (4th, 3.22), WHIP (4th, 1.10), strikeouts (6th, 727), wins (9th, 42) and quality starts (10th, 62).

**AMONG OTHER STARTERS:** Since 2022, his 13 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are the most in the Majors ahead of Corbin Burnes/BAL (12), Blake Snell/SF (11) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

**LAST START:** Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings (1 H, 3 BB, 6 K) on May 7 @ Reds.

- Was his third start of 2024 pitching 6.0+ innings and allowing 0 runs (also: April 2 vs. Yankees and April 14 vs. Cardinals).

**VS. ORIOLES:** Second career start vs. Orioles, first on the road.

- Faced Baltimore on Sept 3, 2023 @ Chase Field (L; 5 ER in 5.1 IP).

**VS. AL EAST:** In 2 career road starts vs. the AL East, is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER in 11.0 IP)...the D-backs are 1-1 in those contests.

**INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT:** In his last 3 road starts vs. the AL, is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 ER in 18.0 IP), .164 opponent average (10-for-61), 0.83 WHIP, 5 walks and 19 strikeouts.

**THIRD TIME THROUGH:** In his third time thru the lineup, is limiting batters to a .185 average (5-for-27) with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts.

**2023 RECAP:** Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

**2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
- In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

**ALL-MLB FIRST TEAM:** Named to the 2023 All-MLB First Team, his first honor, along with Gerrit Cole/Yankees, Shohei Ohtani/Angels, Blake Snell/Padres and Spencer Strider/Braves.

**CY YOUNG HOPEFUL:** Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

**ALL-STAR STARTER:** Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 at T-Mobile Park and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001).
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

**MILKMAN DELIVERED:** Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 – Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; Ian Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

**HOW HE STARTED:** Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
