TONIGHT’S STARTERS: LHP NOAH CAMERON (8-8, 4.02) vs. RHP SPENCER ARRIGHETTI (7-6, 4.73)

BLANK SPACE: The Royals were blanked by a 3-0 score last night in Toronto, which snapped a season-high, 9-game win streak with their 1st loss since Aug. 15 in Anaheim.

- + The Royals suffered their 8th shutout loss of the season.
- + They stranded 1 in the 1st, 3 in the 3rd and 2 in the 8th and 9th, going 1-for-5 with runners in scoring position.
- + The game was decided on 1 swing, a 3-run HR by **Nathan Lukes** in the 4th inning and was the only blemish on the line of **Randy Dobnak**, who allowed 3 runs in 6.0 innings.
- + The Blue Jays used seven different pitchers to complete the shutout, four of whom also pitched Tuesday night.

ROSTER MOVES: The Royals today announced that infielder **Michael Massey** has been placed on the 7-day Concussion Injured List, retroactive to yesterday...additionally, right hander **Mason Black** was optioned to Triple-A Omaha.

- + Infielder **Josh Rojas** was recalled from Triple-A Omaha for his third stint with the Royals this season.
- + LHP **Anthony Gose** (No. 34) was selected from Omaha.

WHERE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD: After splitting the 1st 2 games of this series, the Royals will play their 13th rubber game of the season tonight vs. the Blue Jays.

- + The Royals 12 series-deciding games entering tonight are the fewest in the Majors, 2 fewer than the Rays, Yankees and Marlins (14 each), though tonight marks their 4th rubber game in their last 9 series...they are 4-8 in rubber games, but they won their most recent on Aug. 16 in Anaheim.
- + The Royals are 29-18 in rubber games vs. Toronto and have won each of the last 7 since their last loss in 2009.

SERIES SPEAKING: The Royals have won each of their last 3 series starting with the final leg of their last trip in Anaheim from Aug. 14-16, which continued on the last homestand vs. the Athletics and Tigers...a win tonight would extend the run to 4 straight series wins and mark the Royals longest such streak since July 21-Aug. 3 of last season, when they won 4 straight series, which included winning 2 of 3 here in Toronto.

- + A victory tonight would mark their 2nd straight road series win, after they went 3-15-2 in their 1st 20 road sets.

FINAL THOUGHTS: The Royals are 16-26 (.381) this season in series finales, which is the 3rd-worst record in the Majors, ahead of the Giants (16-27) and Rockies (13-29).

- + They’ve won their last 3 finales after losing 5 straight.

WANNA GET AWAY?: After tonight’s game, the Royals will fly to Cleveland to begin a 3-game series with the Guardians tomorrow night...they are 14-16 on getaway days this season but have won the last 2 and are 10-8 since the start of June.

TOP 10: The Royals have won 9 of their last 10 games since Aug. 16, during which they have the best record in MLB and rank 1st in on-base pct. (.376) and OPS (.837), 2nd in batting average (.292) and slugging pct. (.461), 3rd in runs per game (5.5) and run differential (+22) and 5th in starter’s ERA (2.77).

ROAD WORK: The Royals continue their penultimate road trip of the season tonight, a 6-game stretch against the Blue Jays (1-1) and Guardians...the Royals are 23-45 (.338) on the road this season, tied with the Giants for the worst road mark in the Majors, which is a stark difference from their 36-30 (.545) record at home, which ranks 12th in the Majors.

- + The Royals have won 3 of their last 5 road games since Aug. 14 on the heels of a 7-game road losing streak.

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 21-16 (.568) since the All-Star break, which is the 4th-best record in the American League and trails only a trio of AL East teams in the Red Sox (27-12), Rays (23-16) and Yankees (21-15).

- + Their 2nd-half play marks a significant improvement for the Royals, who were 21 games under (38-59) before the break, which tied for the worst record in the Majors.
- + The Royals are 6-4-1 in 11 completed series since the All-Star break after going 9-19-3 in 31 sets before the break.
- + Royals starting pitchers own a 3.63 ERA (80 ER in 198.1 IP) since the All-Star break, which ranks 5th in the AL.

MONTHLY MATTERS: The Royals lost 8 of their 1st 11 games in August but have won 10 of the last 12 to improve to 13-10 this month, matching June (13-14) for their most wins in any calendar month this season, with 4 games remaining.

- + A victory tonight would mark the Royals most wins in any month since last August, when they went 16-12.

WHAT CHANGED?: The Royals have won 9 of their last 10 games and 10 of 12 while looking more like the team they expected to be this year, coming off back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15.

- + The Royals underperformed in the early months this year before they were decimated by injuries...but now, many of their leaders on offense are healthy and are playing like they did the last two seasons.
- + **Vinnie Pasquantino** missed 40 games over two separate stints on the Injured List, but in 9 games since his return, he’s slashing .333/.421/.636 (11-for-33) with 6 extra-base hits, 5 RBI, 5 walks and no strikeouts, for a 1.057 OPS.
- + **Bobby Witt Jr.** missed 11 games on the Injured List but in 21 games since he returned, the AL MVP candidate is slashing .329/.436/.494 (26-for-79) with a Majors-most (tied) 21 runs, 7 XBH (.930 OPS), 9 RBI and 5 stolen bases.
- + **Salvador Perez** has hit safely in 33 of 44 games since July 1, during which he’s slashing .259/.313/.457 (42-for-162) with 17 extra-base hits (.770 OPS) and 29 RBI.

CONTACT HIGH: **Vinnie Pasquantino** has not struck out in his last 38 plate appearances, which is the longest streak of his career and the longest active run in the Majors, according to *Elias*...it’s the longest streak by a Royal since **Salvador Perez** went 40 plate appearances without a strikeout more than two years ago, from April 22-May 3, 2024...prior to that, the last longer streak by a Royal was 42 plate appearances by **Carlos Santana** from June 7-21, 2022.

THE RUNNIN’ ROYALS: The Royals have recorded at least 1 stolen base in 5 of their last 6 games and each of their last 4, and they’ve had multiple steals in each of the last 3 games.

- + They’re 4th in the American League with 108 stolen bases, trailing the Guardians (129), Rays (128) and Yankees (128).
- + The Royals have been successful on 78.8% of their stolen base attempts, the 3rd-best rate in the American League, trailing only the Guardians (82.7%) and these Blue Jays (82.3%)...this marks a significant improvement from last year, when the Royals ranked 29th in the Majors at 72.5%.
- + **Bobby Witt Jr.** ranks T-3rd in Major League Baseball with 35 steals, trailing **Nasim Nuñez** (42) and **Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (36)...he leads the Majors with 183 steals since his 2022 debut season, but he’s never led the AL in a single season.
- + According to *Baseball Reference*, Royals baserunners have gone first to third 91 times this season, 3rd most in the Majors to the Tigers (111) and Dodgers (94), and they’ve already surpassed their total from all of last year (85).

TROUBLE WITH THE LONG BALL: The Royals lost 3-0 last night and all 3 runs scored on a home run by **Nathan Lukes**...the Royals have allowed 43.8% of their runs via HR, which is the 6th-highest rate in the Majors and well above the league average of 40.6%.

- + On the flip side, the Royals offense has scored only 34.7% of its runs via homers, the 2nd-lowest rate in the Majors, ahead of only the Brewers (31.2%).

NOAH’S ARC: Tonight’s starter **Noah Cameron** has been among the best pitchers in Major League Baseball since July 24, a game in Detroit when he started calling his own pitches.

- + In 6 outings since July 24, he leads all qualified pitchers in ERA (1.05) and opponents’ average (.109), and leads the American League in innings (42.2).
- + During this stretch, he’s allowed 5 runs on 15 hits in 42.2 innings and no home runs...in fact, he has not allowed a HR in his last 43.2 innings, which is the longest active streak among American League starting pitchers.
- + He has not allowed a run in his last 2 starts (14.0 IP).
- + Cameron has completed at least 7.0 innings in 4 of his last 6 outings and has tossed at least 8.0 innings in 3 of the last 5...he has 3 starts this season of at least 7.0 innings and 1 hit allowed...no other pitcher in Royals history has more than 1 such start in a single season.

O CANADA!: This series began a stretch in which the Royals will play 6 of 12 games vs. the Blue Jays, including a 3-game series next weekend at Kauffman Stadium.

- + They have won 4 straight series vs. the Blue Jays, during which they’re 9-4 and have outscored them 71-39 (+32).
- + A win tonight would match a franchise record with their 5th consecutive series win over the Blue Jays, previously done from 1977-78 and 1985-86.
- + Prior to this streak of 4 series wins vs. the Blue Jays, the Royals had lost 8 of the previous 10 dating back to 2018.

NOAH CAMERON is making his career-high 25th start of the season (26th appearance) and the 49th start of his career in the finale of this 3-game set tonight at the Rogers Centre vs. the Blue Jays, who he is facing for the third time in his career...he's in his second season in the Majors, after finishing 4th in AL Rookie of the Year voting in 2025.

- + With his start on July 30 in Minnesota, Cameron became the first Royal to make at least 20 starts in each of his first two career seasons since **Brad Keller** from 2018-19 and the first left hander to do so since **Glendon Rusch** from 1997-98.
- + After making his Majors debut in April 2025, Noah this season was named to his first career Opening Day roster...he was one of four Royals to make their first Opening Day roster in 2026, along with **Tyler Tolbert**, **Jac Caglianone** and **Carter Jensen**.

LAST TIME OUT: In his start last Friday night vs. the Tigers, Cameron earned his 18th win of the season—and 3rd in his last 4 starts—after spinning 5.0 scoreless innings on 2 hits and 3 walks with 2 strikeouts...worked with traffic on the basepaths in each of his 1st 4 innings, stranding a 2-out single in the 1st, a 1-out walk in the 2nd and another 2-out single in the 3rd before erasing back-to-back 2-out walks in the 4th...went 1-2-3 in the 5th—his only clean inning—after which he exited with a 2-0 lead in favor of **Jose Cuas** prior to the start of the 6th.

- + Cameron has not allowed a run in each of his last 14.0 innings since being charged with a run on **Max Muncy's** RBI double off **John Schreiber** in the 6th inning on Aug. 10 at Dodger Stadium...marks the 2nd-longest scoreless innings streak of his career, according to *Elias*, behind only July 19-Aug. 5 (19.0 IP).
- + Noah has won 3 consecutive decisions—dating back to his Aug. 5 start—for the third time in his career and for the first time since Sept 14, 2025–April 1, 2026.
- + The start marked Cameron's 6th outing this season—4th in his last 6 games—in which he completed at least 5.0 scoreless innings...it was his 11th such appearance since making his Major League debut on April 30, 2025, the 4th most in the American League in that stretch, trailing leader **Drew Rasmussen** (16).

TURNING IT AROUND: Over Noah's last 6 appearances since July 24, he has yielded 5 runs over 42.2 innings (1.05 ERA) on 15 hits with 36 strikeouts...these last 6 outings come on the heels of a 7-start stretch in which he posted a 7.97 ERA (31 ER in 35.0 innings) and a 1.97 WHIP...[according to an article](#) by MLB.com's **Anne Rogers**, Noah revealed that he began calling his own pitches using the PitchCom device in his July 24 game at Detroit, where he tossed 7.0 shutout frames in relief of an opener...he followed that up with back-to-back starts in which he threw 8.0 innings, including on July 30 when he took a no-hit bid into the 7th and then on Aug. 5 vs. Minnesota when he matched a career high with 9 strikeouts...Noah then tossed a 1-hit shutout on Aug. 16 in Anaheim before tossing 5.0 scoreless innings last Friday.

- Across this 6-outing stretch, Cameron has leaned heavily on his slider, a pitch that he threw just 9.8% of the time across his 1st 19 starts this season, but is now using at an 18.6% rate...opponents are just 1-for-their-last-27 (.037) with 14 strikeouts vs. his slider, which marks a sharp turn from the beginning of the season when opponents slashed .327/.327/.653 (16-for-49) against the pitch.
- + Noah generated 8 whiffs in his start last Friday night, snapping a run in which he generated at least 13 swings and misses in 5 consecutive appearances, becoming the first Royal to do so since **Cole Ragans** from Sept. 17, 2025-April 2, 2026 (5).
- + He's allowed 3 hits or fewer in 5 of his last 6 outings, during which opponents are batting .109 (15-for-138) off him, the best mark by any qualified pitcher in that span...prior to this 6-game stretch, opponents hit .279 (113-for-405) against him.
- + Since July 24, Noah leads qualified pitchers in ERA (1.05), WHIP (0.63) and H/9 (.32), while his 42.2 innings pitched lead the American League and rank 4th in the Majors, trailing leader **Jesús Luzardo**, whose 47.2 innings are the best mark in MLB...additionally, he is one of just two qualified pitchers in the Majors to have not allowed a home run in this stretch, joining Miami's **Eury Pérez**.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: The St. Joseph, Mo. native is set to make his 13th road appearance (12th start) of the year tonight in Toronto vs. the Blue Jays...the Royals are 6-18 in his 24 career road outings despite him pitching to a 3.20 ERA (52 ER in 146.1 IP) with a 1.02 WHIP, while allowing 2 runs or fewer in 14 of his 24 outings...he's received just 1 run or fewer of support in 11 of his 24 games away from The K...this season, his 3.33 road ERA (28 ER in 75.2 IP) is more than a full run lower than his 4.79 mark (36 ER in 67.2 IP) in 13 starts at Kauffman Stadium.

- + Since the start of last year, Noah's 1.02 road WHIP is the 5th-best mark in MLB (min. 20 starts), behind **Cam Schlitler** (0.85), reigning two-time **Cy Young** award winner **Tarik Skubal** (0.87), **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** (0.88) and **Drew Rasmussen** (0.94).

VS. BLUE JAYS: Noah has faced the Blue Jays twice in his career, both of which came in his debut campaign a season ago...he last faced the club on Sept. 20 at The K, where he earned the win after spinning 6.2 innings of 1-run ball, with 5 strikeouts...he was through 6.0 scoreless frames and had faced just 3 batters over the minimum before **Daulton Varsho** tagged him for a solo HR, after which he was lifted for **John Schreiber** and the Royals bullpen, who slammed the door on the win to secure the series victory.

- + Across 5 outings vs. the American League in the 2nd half of the season, Cameron owns a 0.24 ERA (1 ER in 37.0 IP) with a 0.51 WHIP, which is in stark contrast to his 9.28 ERA (11 ER in 10.2 IP) over 2 starts in Interleague play.
- + Noah has struggled in 5 starts against the AL East this season, posting an 0-5 record with an 8.39 ERA (23 ER in 24.2 IP), and he has yielded at least 5 runs in 4 of the 5 outings...this comes after he yielded 1 run or fewer in 2 of his 4 starts against the division as a rookie last season, while posting a pair of quality starts.

UNCLE CHARLIE: Since making his MLB debut a year ago, Noah has enjoyed a great deal of success with his curveball, holding opposing hitters to a .146/.188/.203 (.31-for-212) slashline...the .146 average in that stretch is the best in the American League and 2nd best in the Majors (min. 175 PA), trailing leader **Braxton Ashcraft** (.129).

- In 17 appearances since May 22, opponents are a combined 10-for-78 with 32 strikeouts off Cameron's curveball, the 8th-most such strikeouts in the Majors in that stretch...his 43 strikeouts on his curveball this season overall rank 6th in the American League and 12th in the Majors, trailing leader **Aaron Nola** (89).

GAME OF ADJUSTMENTS: This season, Cameron has been sharp the first time through the batting order, holding opponents to a .165 average (32-for-194)... among 96 pitchers who have made at least 20 starts this year, Cameron's .165 batting average the first time through the batting order ranks 7th in the Majors.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS: Over Noah's last 9 games (8 starts) since July 6, he has induced 132 swings and misses, which ranks 5th in the AL and 8th in the Majors in that stretch, behind leader and reigning two-time **Cy Young Award** winner **Tarik Skubal** (164).
