METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed due to unplayable field conditions yesterday...The Mets have lost four straight and five of their last six...The recently concluded a stretch of 17 straight games without an offday (7-10)...The Mets conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game home stand against the Marlins (three games) and Phillies (three games)

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Luis Guillorme celebrates his 29th birthday today...We wish him well.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga's 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in $1999 . . . \mathrm{He}$ is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA ( 53 ER/161.1 IP) with 74 walks and 194 strikeouts in 28 starts this season...His 2.96 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.96 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are set to play their fifth doubleheader of the season today...This is their first twinbill against the Marlins since they swept both games on September 28, 2021 at Citi Field...The team split a twinbill on May 1 vs. Atlanta and were swept by the Tigers in Detroit on May 3, took two from the Guardians in New York on May 21 and were swept against the Braves on August 12...The Mets have played 28 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 26 of those 28 twinbills over the last two years...New York has swept eight of their last 15 doubleheaders, including one this year and five DH sweeps last season.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies were shut out by the Erie SeaWolves, 10-0, in the second game of the Eastern League Championship Series on Tuesday night at UPMC Park...Erie swept the series 2-0 and won its first-ever Eastern League title...Binghamton reached the Eastern League Championship Series for the first time since 2014...Rhylan Thomas ended the season on a 16-game hitting streak, across his final 12 regular season games and four Postseason games...Rowdey Jordan ended the season on a 12-game hitting streak, across his final eight regular season games and four postseason games.

EL JEFF-E: On Sunday, Jeff McNeil's on-base streak was snapped at 16 games...It was the third-longest streak of his career...He has posted a . 382 OBP in that span...In 51 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting . 304 (62-204) with 31 runs, nine doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 20 RBI, nine walks with five steals, a . 344 OBP and a . 471 SLG...McNeil has an . 873 OPS in 22 games this month, recording 10 extra-base hits.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded his 206th career multi-hit games. That is the 18th-most in franchise history...Next up is Lee Mazzilli with 207, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 multi-hit games as a Met.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is on a seven-game hitting streak batting . 387 (12-31) with six runs, three doubles, one triple, one home runs, six RBI, four walks with a . 457 OBP and a . 645 SLG... He has safely hit in 22 of his last 24 games...Since August 28, Nimmo is batting . 333 (34-102) with 16 runs, nine doubles, two triples, six home runs, 15 RBI, nine walks with a . 393 OBP and a . 637 SLG.

HEAR, YEAR: Nimmo has recorded 158 hits, 29 doubles, six triples and played in 149 games... He is one hit, double and triple away from tying his career-best numbers which he accomplished last season...Nimmo played in a career-best 151 games in $2022 \ldots$... He has socked a career-best 24 home runs this season and recorded a career-high 66 RBI in 2023.

30-FOR-30: Francisco Lindor has recorded 30 stolen bases and 27 home runs this season... He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season... He would join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991, 1989, 1987) and Darryl Strawberry (1987).

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The New York Mets have won seven of 10 meetings with the Miami Marlins this season,outscoring them, 46-28...The Mets have won the season series with the Marlins every year since 2018, going 61-35 (.635) against them over that time.

IN THE CITI: The Mets conclude their home schedule with a six-game homestand...New York is 39-36 at home this season...The team is 598-559 since Citi Field opened in 2009.

DINGERS!: The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team featured nine players, while the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...The Mets have socked 205 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The 2023 team became the fifth team in franchise history record 200 or more homers in a year...The team's 204 home runs are the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history...They previous four years with 200 or more homers are: 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so.. He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs... He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... He is tied for second in the majors and is tied for second in the National League with 45 home runs...Alonso's 191 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

STEAL THIS ALBUM: The Mets lead the major leagues with a $89.1 \%$ success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 115 bases out of 129 attempts...lt's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was $82.3 \%$ which was accomplished in 2004.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 29 games, DJ Stewart is batting .30 (31-103) with 18 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, seven walks, 23 RBI and a 1.024 OPS...In 52 games this year, Stewart is batting . 264 (38-144) with 21 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 26 RBI, 14 walks, a . 352 OBP and a . 549 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

100: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI ( 120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltran and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 492 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues... He is second in the majors and in the NL with 115 RBI.

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 5.2 innings against the Marlins at loanDepot park on September 19...Allowed three runs, two earned, on six hits and two walks... Fanned five Miami batters in a 4-3 Mets loss.

FUEGO TAKES ON MIAMI (AGAIN): Lucchesi will face the Marlins for the second time this season and the second time in as many starts... Has pitched to a 1-0 record with a 1.69 ERA ( $4 \mathrm{ER} / 16.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in three starts against Miami in his career...Holds a 1-0 record with a 1.42 ERA (1 ER/6.1 IP) at home compared to a $0-0$ record with a 1.86 ERA ( $2 \mathrm{ER} / 9.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ) on the road against the Marlins...In his one win against Miami on May 31, 2019 at Petco Park while with the Padres, Lucchesi tossed 6.1 innings, allowing on earned run on two hits and one walk while striking out five Marlins batters in a 5-2 San Diego win.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made 15 appearances, 14 of which were starts, this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In those appearances, he has pitched to a 4.74 ERA (43 ER/81.2 IP) and has tallied 75 strikeouts...Lucchesi earned International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18 after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings against the Buffalo Bisons on June 13, during which he allowed two hits while striking out six batters... In his most recent start, Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on September 6 with Syracuse against the Rochester Red Wings, allowing three earned runs on six hits and three walks while striking out three batters in a 7-6 Syracuse walk-off victory in 10 innings.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made two appearances with Brooklyn (A+) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 7-day IL, both against the Aberdeen IronBirds...Threw 52 pitches in his first rehab start on August 8, allowing one earned run on four hits and a walk while striking out five...On August 13 , threw 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and one walk while fanning three batters in a 63-pitch outing.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In five away starts in the majors this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 2.59 ERA (7ER/24.1 IP), tallying 20 strikeouts, and earned his first two wins of the season on the road (April 21 @ SF, August 18 @ STL)...In three home starts this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP).

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA ( 19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings... Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his churve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

## SENGA NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win after throwing 6.0 innings against Miami at loanDepot park on September 20...Allowed two earned runs on seven hits and two walks...Fanned three Marlins batters in an 8-3 Mets victory...With a win today, Senga could record his longest win streak of the season with four games, going back to September 1.
METS ROOKIE MILESTONE WATCH: On September 8, Senga passed Jerry Koosman for second all-time most strikeouts by a Mets rookie... With six strikeouts tonight, Senga will become just the second Mets rookie to reach 200 strikeouts (Dwight Gooden, 276 in 1984)...The right-hander also earned his 10th win of the season on September 1, becoming the 11th rookie in franchise history to reach double-digit wins in a season... With a win today, Senga can tie for fifth most wins by a Mets rookie with 13.

HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season and tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season... Only Nolan Ryan $(4,1970)$ and Jacob deGrom $(5,2015)$ have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

SENGA GENESIS: Senga has recorded 194 strikeouts through his first 28 career major league games, the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (235), Matt Harvey (211) and Noah Syndergaard (204) have recorded more during that span...His 194 strikeouts are the third-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 28 career games... He trails only Hideo Nomo (238) and Yu Darvish (214)...Senga's 2.96 ERA is the sixth-lowest mark by a Mets pitcher through their first 28 career major league games (Min. 100.0 IP).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's 12 wins are tied for the most among all qualified major league rookies this season and his 194 strikeouts also lead all major league rookies...Among qualified National League pitchers, Senga is fourth in opponent's average (.209), fourth in SO/9 (10.82) and second in ERA (2.96)...Senga ranks third in the majors in opponent's average against left-handed batters with a .188 (53-282) clip (Min. 200 LHB faced).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 107 of his 194 strikeouts through 28 starts...The pitch has a 59.7 percent whiff rate and a 28.3 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 17 hits in 158 at-bats ending with the forkball, a 108 batting average.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA ( $313 \mathrm{ER} / 1,089.0$ IP) and 1,252 strikeouts ( $10.3 \mathrm{~K} / 9.0$ )... He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).
