THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

VS. GIANTS: Since 2022, the D-backs are 17-15 vs. Giants... in their 32 matchups in the span, 12 of the contests have ended in 1-run decisions.

- ♦ The D-backs have won 4 of their last 7 games.
- ♦ Over 13 games last season, Christian Walker is batting .333 (13-for-39)/.905 OPS with 4 doubles, 5 RBI and 10 walks.
- ◆Ketel Marte, over his last 13 games, is hitting .327 (16-for-49) with 1 double, 4 homers and 10 RBI.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 11 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

- ♦ The D-backs have scored 2+ runs in the first inning in 8 of their 19 games this season...no other team has more than 6 instances so far this season (Phillies).
- ♦ In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 1 run 3 times, 2 runs 4 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 26 runs with a .402 average (37-for-92)/1.217 OPS and 9 doubles, 8 home runs and 9 walks.

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs have scored first in all 9 games they have won this season...they have scored first in a game 14 times, tied for the second most in the Majors (also: Royals), behind the Red Sox.

SERIES-LY: The D-backs have secured 3 series wins in their first 6 series of the season. (vs. COL, @ COL, vs. STL).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +19 run differential is the best in the NL West and third in the NL, behind the Braves (+29) and Brewers (+25).

♦ The D-backs' 106 runs in their first 19 games of a season are fifth most in franchise history, behind 2008 (120), 1999 (109), 2001 (108) and 2004 (108).

INNINGS 1-3: In Innings 1-3, the D-backs' .332 AVG, 26 extra-base hits and 50 runs lead the Majors:

AVG: D-backs (.332), Brewers (.316), Royals (.293), Cubs (.278) **XBH: D-backs (26)**, Royals (25), Orioles (24), Red Sox (23), Dodgers (23) R: D-backs (50), Royals (43), Padres (42), Brewers (41), Rangers (41)

OFFENSE OFF STARTING ARMS: D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .305 (116-for-380)/.857 OPS with 65 runs, 21 doubles, 17 homers and 33 walks.

♦ Among all teams' offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first with a .305 average, .857 OPS, 116 hits, 65 runs and 188 total bases while their 67 strikeouts are the fewest.

LIMITING THE STRIKEOUT: Corbin Carroll's 7.1 strikeout pct. (84 PA) ranks atop all hitters this season (min. 50 PA) while Gabriel Moreno's 7.4% is second...Joc Pederson is atop the list with largest drop in strikeout rate from 2023 to 2024 while Carroll's and Moreno's are tied for fourth:

STOPPING THE OPPONENT RUNNING GAME: Through 19 games this season, D-back backstops have held opponents to an MLB-low 3 stolen bases in 6 attempts... Gabriel Moreno's 39.7 caught-stealing pct. (31-for-78) since 2022 is highest among all active MLB catchers.

♦There has been only 6 stolen base attempts against Arizona over 263 stolen base opportunities, which are the fewest among all MLB teams...the second fewest is 7 stolen base attempts (against Rangers).

HITTING & RUNNING: Since 2023, Corbin Carroll's 12 games with 1+ hits and 2+ stolen bases are tied for the second most in the Majors (also: Ronald Acuña Jr./ATL), behind Esteury Ruiz/OAK (14).

HARD HIT SERIES: The D-backs' 201 hard hits (No. of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) rank tied for sixth in MLB with the Giants, behind the Astros (235), Dodgers (227), Braves (219), Padres (218), Orioles (216).

- ◆ Ketel Marte's 37 hard hits rank tied for third in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (42) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (38) while **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.**'s 33 are tied for sixth (also: Vladimir Guerrero Jr./TOR).
- ♦ Marte also boasts a 55.2 pct. hard hit pct.

NEXT STARTER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (FIRST START)

- ♦ Will be making his D-backs debut after he was signed to a 1-year contract on March 29.
- ♦ In 2023, earned All-MLB Second Team honors after he posted career bests in wins (10), quality starts (20), ERA (3.20), innings (188.2) and strikeouts (166).
- ♦ In 32 starts between the Rangers and Cardinals last season, went 10-11 with a 3.20 ERA (67 ER in 188.2 IP).
- ♦ Made his first 2 career starts vs. Giants in 2023 while with the Cardinals (0-1, 2.19 ERA; 3 ER in 12.1 IP, 13 K).
