THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY	
On this date in 1970, the Orioles defeated the Kansas City Royals for the 23 <sup>rd</sup> straight time, establishing a Major League record for most consecutive wins against one club...The O's beat the Royals, 10-8, at Memorial Stadium following a five-run Orioles first inning...The Orioles finished the season 12-0 against Kansas City.	



**SCHEDULE CHANGE:** Major League Baseball announced that all four Orioles games against the Miami Marlins last week were postponed (Monday-Thursday)...The Marlins and Orioles will play a four-game series this week in Baltimore from August 4-6 with one day including a double-header (all game times TBD) and the Marlins serving as the home team for two games.

**SEEKING THE SWEEP:** A win today would give the Orioles their first series sweep of the season and first since August 27-29, 2018 when the O's swept the Blue Jays in a three-game series at Oriole Park...The Orioles last swept a series of the Rays was on June 24-26, 2016 at Oriole Park (four games)...The last three-game sweep of the Rays came on September 11-13, 2012 at Camden Yards.

**MAKE MINE A DOUBLE:** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Orioles turned the first double play to lead off an inning in Major League history when **OF Yoshi Tsutsugo** lined out to left field...**LF Cedric Mullins** threw out **INF Ji-Man Choi** trying to advance to third base on the play...In 2020, each extra inning begins with a runner on second base.

**IT'S A WALK OFF:** The Orioles defeated the Rays for the second-straight night on Saturday, by a score of 5-4...**INF Pat Valaika** drove in the winning run for the Orioles, a walk-off single to right field in the 11<sup>th</sup> inning, his first career walk-off hit...The contest marked the O's first walk-off win and extra-inning game of the season.

✂ **INF Rio Ruiz** notched an RBI-single in the fourth inning, and has now hit safely in five of his six games this season...He finished the night with two RBI (single, sacrifice fly) for his third multi-RBI game on the year.

✂ **LHP Wade LeBlanc** allowed just one run on four hits with one walk and three strikeouts over 5.1 innings of work...He leads the team in innings pitched (11.0) after going 5.2 innings in his first game of the season in the 7-4 win on July 26 at Boston.

✂ **RHP Travis Lakins, Sr.** recorded his first career win after tossing a scoreless 11<sup>th</sup> inning with one strikeout.

**RACKING UP THE K'S:** Orioles pitchers struck out 10 Rays batters in last night's win...It was the O's fourth-straight game with 10-or-more strikeouts, tying a club record, done three other times (8/19-23/2014, 9/7-10/2013, and 6/7-9/1966)...The Orioles have recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in five of their seven games this season...They are one of four teams (CIN, seven-straight, TB, four-straight, and ARI, four-straight) in the majors this season to have a streak of at least four-straight such games.

✂ Orioles relievers rank sixth in the American League (tied for ninth in the majors) with 40 strikeouts...Three of the top six bullpen strikeout totals are from teams in the AL East.

**THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW:** Since the start of the 2019 season, **INF Hanser Alberto** leads the majors with 93 hits off of left-handed pitching (23 more than then the next on the list)...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .406 (93-for-229) average against lefties.

✂ Alberto's 88 hits in 2019 off of lefties were the most in the majors and the most in Orioles history, surpassing the 73 hits by **Rafael Palmeiro** in 1998.

✂ His 88 hits were the most in the majors since **Tony Gwynn** had 90 such hits in 1987.

**ROUGH ROAD AHEAD:** Based on 2019 winning percentages, the Orioles own the second-toughest strength of schedule in the American League (tied for third-toughest in the majors)...The Orioles will play four of last year's 10 postseason teams in 2020...The toughest 2020 schedules based on 2019 winning percentages:

**POSTSEASON PLUS:** Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association jointly announced that the 2020 Postseason will expand to 16 teams, beginning with eight best-of-three Wild Card Series preceding the Division Series.

✂ The higher seeds in the Wild Card Series will host all three games, which will be scheduled for Tuesday, September 29 through Friday, October 2.

**#F16HT AGAINST COLON CANCER:** **INF/OF Trey Mancini** has teamed up with the Colorectal Cancer Alliance to raise awareness for colon cancer...Mancini participates in the organization's "Never Too Young" advisory board, which advocates for all young-onset patients and survivors...In support of Mancini's fight and his partnership with the CCA, the O's are selling **#F16HT** t-shirts to benefit the Alliance...All net proceeds from the shirts will benefit the Colorectal Cancer Alliance Patient and Family Support Services...The shirts are available for \$25, sold exclusively at [Orioles.com/Auctions](https://www.orioles.com/auctions).

**INJURED LIST:** Four players are on the Injured List...**RHP Hunter Harvey** (right forearm strain) and **RHP Dillon Tate** (right elbow contusion) are on the 10-day Injured List...**INF/OF Trey Mancini** (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment) and **INF Richie Martin** (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O's named **Fredi González** as Major League Coach, **Darren Holmes** as Bullpen Coach, and **Anthony Sanders** as First Base Coach...**José Hernández** shifted from Major League Coach to Assistant Hitting Coach...All other coaches remained in their same positions from the 2019 season: **Doug Brocail** as Pitching Coach, **Tim Cossins** as Major League Field Coordinator/Catching Instructor, **José Flores** as Third Base Coach, and **Don Long** as Hitting Coach.

**THE SKIPPER:** **Brandon Hyde** was named the 20<sup>th</sup> manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

**LAST START:** Made his Orioles debut and first career Opening Day start on 7/24 at Boston...Was dealt the loss after surrendering four runs on four hits and three walks with five strikeouts through 3.0 innings...Milone now owns a career 0-4 record and 9.57 ERA (28 ER/26.1 IP) in six starts against Boston.

**GETTING THE NOD:** As a starter, Milone owns a 47-40 record and 4.34 ERA (369 ER/764.2 IP) in 137 career starts, compared to his 3-8 record and 5.50 ERA (69 ER/113.0 IP) in 38 outings as a reliever...Made six starts in 2019 and went 1-3 with a 4.65 ERA (16 ER/31.0 IP) while holding opponents to a .252 (30-for-119) clip...Made 17 appearances out of the bullpen in 2019 and pitched to a 3-7 record and 4.80 ERA (43 ER/80.2 IP) with a .237 (72-for-304) opponent average...Tossed four-or-more in- nings in 16 of his 17 relief appearances in 2019.

**CAREER VS. TAMPA BAY:** Will be making his ninth appearance (sixth start) against the Rays...He has gone 3-4 with a 6.75 ERA (29 ER/38.2 IP) with nine walks and 22 strikeouts through his first eight appearances...His last start against Tampa Bay came on 8/27/15 in which he tossed 5.1 innings and was dealt the loss after allowing five runs (four earned) on eight hits, one home run, and one walk...His last appearance against the Rays was on 8/20/19 in which he served as a “bulk” pitcher, throwing 5.0 innings in relief and allowing four runs on six hits and four strikeouts en route to his third win of the season.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** This will be Milone’s 25<sup>th</sup> career start (30<sup>th</sup> appearance) against an AL East opponent...He is 5-15 with a 5.47 ERA (91 ER/149.2 IP), 37 walks, and 107 strikeouts in his first 29 games...In 13 career road starts (16 appearances), he has gone 3-8 with a 6.66 ERA (54 ER/73.0 IP), 20 walks and 54 strikeouts...In 11 career starts (13 games) at home against the division, he has gone 2-7 with a 4.34 ERA (37 ER/76.2 IP), 17 walks and 53 strikeouts.

**HOME WOES:** Made 12 appearances (four starts) at home last season, and posted a 1-6 record with a 5.46 ERA (37 ER/61.0 IP), compared to 3-4 with a 3.91 ERA (22 ER/50.2 IP) in 11 appearances (two starts) on the road...Has pitched in three games (two starts) at Oriole Park in his career, and has a 0-0 record and 4.38 ERA (6 ER/12.1 IP) with three home runs allowed and nine strikeouts in these outings.

**HURT BY THE LONG BALL:** Milone surrendered 24 home runs in 2019, tying the second-highest total in his career (also allowed 24 in 2012 with Oakland)...It was his highest home run total in a season since he allowed 25 home runs with Oakland in 2013.

**2019 RECAP:** Started last season with Triple-A Tacoma, going 4-2 with a 3.83 ERA (21 ER/49.1 IP); had his contract selected by the Mariners on 5/21...Served primarily as a “bulk” pitcher for Seattle, following the team’s “opener”...Ranked among Mariners relief pitchers in innings pitched (2<sup>nd</sup>, 80.2) and strikeouts (T-4<sup>th</sup>, 60)...Held opponents to a .237 batting average as a reliever...**Posted career-bests in WHIP (1.12) and opponent batting average (.241)**...His 94 strikeouts were his highest total in six seasons since he recorded 126 strikeouts in 2013...Posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER/32.0 IP) with seven walks, 27 strikeouts and a .205 opponent batting average in six games (two starts) during the month of June...Had a 3.56 ERA (19 ER/48.0 IP) with 10 walks and 44 strikeouts in nine games (four starts) in the first half of the season...Went 3-4 with a 3.91 ERA (22 ER/ 50.2 IP), nine walks and 44 strikeouts in 11 games (two starts) on the road...Elected free agency on 10/31/19 and signed with the Orioles as a minor league free agent on 2/14/20.
