#### **VS. HOUSTON**

The Mariners and Astros this series meet in the postseason for the first time ever... it also marks the first time Seattle will play a divisional opponent in the playoffs...the Mariners went 7-12 against the Astros during the regular season (3-7 at Minute Maid Park).

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play Game 1 of the American League Division Series today against the Houston Astros...the game will be televised live on TBS with Brian Anderson, Jeff Francoeur and Matt Winer on the call and broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs, Aaron Goldsmith, Dave Sims, Mike Blowers and Gary Hill Jr.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...the Mariners defeated the Toronto Blue Jays by a 10-9 score on Saturday to capture the American League Wild Card Series and advance to the American League Division Series...it marked the 2nd postseason sweep in Mariners history (other: 2000 ALDS, 3-0 over Chicago White Sox)...during the 2022 regular season, the Mariners went 46-35 at home and 44-37 on the road...they went 51-42 in the first half and 39-30 in the second half...Seattle was 72-17 (.809) when scoring at least 4 runs and 18-55 (.247) when scoring 3 or fewer runs during the season.

- Logan a.k.a. Walter Logan Gilbert went 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 ER, 25.0 IP) in 4 starts against Houston in 2022.
- Kirb The Bird Hunter On Saturday, George Kirby became the <u>first rookie in MLB history</u> to record a postseason save in his first career relief appearance at the Major League level.
- Oh, Canada On Saturday, Matt Brash became the 2nd Canadian-born visiting player to appear in a postseason game in Canada, joining White Sox pitcher Kirk McCaskill (Oct. 9, 1993 at Toronto).
- JULIOOOO On Friday, Julio Rodríguez singled and became the youngest player (21 years, 282 days old) in Mariners history to record a hit in the postseason...he surpassed Alex Rodriguez (22 years, 66 days old), who homered for Seattle on Oct. 1, 1997.

MARINERS, ASTROS SQUARE OFF IN ALDS...the Mariners take on the Astros after sweeping Toronto to capture their 4th postseason series win in franchise history, evening their all-time record in postseason series to 4-4...Seattle won the American League Division Series in 1995 against the Yankees, 2000 against the White Sox and 2001 against Cleveland...2022 marks the Mariners 5th postseason berth in franchise history (1995, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2022)...it marks the 2nd Wild Card berth in franchise history (2000, 2022).

<u>COMEBACK OF CHAOTIC PROPORTIONS</u>...the Mariners overcame an 8-1 deficit to defeat the Blue Jays by a 10-9 final on Saturday...it was the <u>largest postseason comeback by a road team in MLB history</u> (7 runs) and tied for the 2nd-largest postseason comeback overall...Seattle had the 4th-lowest win expectancy (0.94%) in an eventual win in postseason history (*Baseball-Reference*)...it marked the Mariners largest comeback since overcoming a 7-0 deficit in an eventual 11-8 on July 26, 2021 vs. Houston...it surpassed the Mariners largest comeback in the postseason (5 runs), when Seattle overcame a 5-0 deficit in an eventual 11-8 win in Game 4 of the ALDS on Oct. 7, 1995 vs. the Yankees.

<u>CLUTCH CAL</u>...Cal Raleigh went 3-for-4 with 3 runs, 1 double, 1 RBI and 1 walk in Saturday's series-clinching win...in Seattle's 2 Wild Card games, Raleigh hit .500 (4x8) with 4 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 3 RBI and 1 walk... he joins Ken Griffey Jr. (Oct 3-4, 1995) as the only Mariners to reach base 5+ times with 1+ homer over their first 2 career postseason games...Raleigh is just the 2nd catcher in MLB history to meet those criteria in his first 2 career postseason games, joining Victor Marinez-CLE (Oct. 4-5, 2007)...on Saturday, Raleigh became the 2nd catcher 25-or-younger to score 3 runs in a postseason game, joining Javy López-ATL (age 25) on Oct. 14, 1996.

OYE COMO VA...Carlos Santana got the comeback started on Saturday, hitting a 3-run homer in the 6th inning to cut the Mariners deficit to 8-5...it was Seattle's first 3+ RBI home run in the postseason since Jay Buhner hit a 3-run homer on Oct. 13, 1995, snapping a string of 25 postseason homers by the Mariners that were either solo or 2-run shots...it was Santana's 5th career postseason homer (other 4 with Cleveland), with him now homering in each round of the postseason (1 Wild Card HR, 1 ALDS HR, 2 ALCS HR and 1 World Series HR).

<u>J.P. THE BASE CLEARER</u>...**J.P. Crawford**'s game-tying, 3-run double in the top of the 8th on Saturday was just the second 3+ RBI game-tying hit with the bases loaded in the 8th inning or later in postseason history... Crawford joined David Ortiz, whose grand slam for the Red Sox on Oct. 13, 2013 tied the game in the bottom of the 8th in Boston's eventual 6-5 win over the Tigers.

JULIO RODRÍGUEZ: AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR FRONTRUNNER...Julio Rodríguez has gotten on base at a .400 clip through his first 2 postseason games, batting .143 (1x7) with 2 runs, 1 walk and 2 hit-by-pitches...he batted .284 (145x511) with 84 runs scored, 25 doubles, 3 triples, 28 home runs, 75 RBI, 40 walks and 25 stolen bases, getting on base at a .345 clip, slugging .509 with an .853 OPS in 132 games during his rookie season... the 21-year-old led Major League rookies in home runs (28), total bases (260), slugging percentage (.509), OPS (.853), bWAR (6.0) and fWAR (5.3)...Julio ranked 3rd in hits (145), 2nd in runs (84), 2nd in RBI (75), 2nd in extrabase hits (57), 2nd in stolen bases (25) and 2nd in times on base (193)...Julio became the 3rd rookie in Major League history, and the 1st player in his debut season to reach 25+ home runs and 25+ stolen bases...Rodríguez also became the fastest player in Major League history (125 career games) to reach those feats, surpassing Mike Trout-LAA (128 career games)...Rodríguez is 1 of 3 Mariners rookies to produce 6.0+ bWAR in a season, joining AL Rookie of the Year winners Alvin Davis (6.0 in 1984) and Ichiro Suzuki (7.7 in 2001)...Rodríguez was selected to the 2022 American League All-Star team and was the only rookie All-Star in the Majors.

SCOTT SERVAIS: AL MANAGER OF THE YEAR?...manager Scott Servais has a 528-504 (.512) regular season record across 7 seasons (2016-c) as Mariners skipper...he is the 2nd-winningest manager in franchise history, trailing only Lou Piniella (840 wins)...Servais tallied his 500th managerial win this season on Aug. 12 at Texas...since Servais took over as manager (2016-c), Seattle leads the Majors in 1-run wins (189), 1-run games (330) and winning percentage in 1-run games (.573)...Seattle also leads MLB in extra inning wins (66) and winning percentage in extra innings (.667) since Servais took over prior to the 2016 season.

WINNING MONTHS...the Mariners put together a winning month in 5 of 6 months in 2022 (11-10 in April, 16-13 in June, 18-7 in July, 17-10 in August and 18-14 in Sept/Oct.)...dating back to the start of 2021, Seattle has put together a winning month in 10 of its last 12 months.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Adam Frazier and Cal Raleigh each tallied 3 hits in Saturday's 10-9, come-frombehind win...Frazier went 3-for-5 with the go-ahead RBI double in the top of the 9th, while Raleigh went 3-for-4 with a double in the 9th and scored the go-ahead run on Frazier's double, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Frazier and Raleigh were the first pair of Mariners to tally 3+ hits in a postseason game since Edgar Martinez and Jay Buhner did it 27 years ago to the day -- on Oct. 8, 1995?...in that game, Martinez went 3-for-6 and Buhner went 3-for-5...Martinez hit a walk-off double in the bottom of the 11th inning, delivering the Mariners a 5-4 win over the Yankees and advancing them to the ALCS in their first-ever postseason series in franchise history...AND FINALLY...Frazier's go-ahead double was the Mariners first in the 9th inning or later of a postseason game since Edgar's, known as "The Double", 27 years ago to the day.

   The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher will make his first career Postseason start...he has made 7 career regular season starts against Houston, 4 in 2022.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau. Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Con-
- Reached 200 career strikeouts on 6/14/22 vs. MIN with a strikeout of Carlos Correa.
- LAST TIME OUT ... ND in last start on 9/30 vs. OAK, setting a career-high in innings pitched, tossing 8.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 3 hits (1 HR) and 2 walks with 4 strikeouts...threw 101 pitches, 64 strikes.
- POSTSEASON...will make Postseason debut in today's game.
  ..Gilbert aged 25-years, 157-days will become the 3rd-youngest Mariners pitcher to start a Postseason game, trailing Bob Wolcott (22-years, 32-days) and Freddy García (6x, first: 23-years, 363-days).
- ASTROPHYSICIST...was 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (7 ER, 25.0 IP) with 22 strikeouts and 6 walks in 4 starts against the Astros in 2022...tossed a quality start in each of the 4 starts, including 7.0 scoreless innings on 5/28 in Seattle.

WINNER...the Mariners are 37-19 (.661) in 56 games started by

Gilbert in his career, and 21-11 (.656) in 32 starts this season...
when Gilbert tosses 6.0+ innings, the Mariners are 17-7 (.708) while going 20-12 (.625) when he goes less than 6.0 innings.

THIS IS SPARTA...reached 300 career strikeouts and 300.0 career innings pitched in last start of the regular season on 9/30 vs. OAK...became the 3rd-fastest starting pitcher in franchise history (56 GS) to 300 strikeouts, trailing only Félix Hernández (51) and Erik Hanson (53).

FROM WEAKNESS TO STRENGTH...tossed 6.0+ innings in 18 starts this season, passing his 2021 total of 6 starts of 6.0+ innings...the Mariners are 12-6 this season when Gilbert tosses at least 6.0 innings.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...recorded quality starts in 7-consecutive starts from 5/17-6/19...7-consecutive quality starts is tied for the 2022 team lead with Robbie Ray...marks the Mariners longest quality start streak since James Paxton had 9-consecutive quality starts from 6/27-8/10/17...his 16 total quality starts are tied for the 3rd-most on the team, trailing Ray (18) and Marco Gonzales (18).

**TRIPLE SEVENS**...tossed 7.0 innings in 3-consecutive starts dating from 5/17-5/28...3 consecutive starts of 7.0+ innings marks the longest streak in his career, having never done it in consecutive starts prior to the streak...first Mariner with 3-consecutive starts of 7.0+ innings since **Marco Gonzales** had 4 consecutive from 9/11-9/29/19.

TURN IT UP TO ELEVEN...struck out a career-high 11 batters on 9/19 against Los Angeles-AL...bested his previous career-high of 9, which he had done 6 times, most recently on 9/6/22 vs. CWS

PITCHER OF THE MONTH...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for April, the first time he has won the award...marks the first Mariners winner since James Paxton in July, 2017 and the 14th different player to win the award (19th instance).

PITCH PERFECT...three of his pitches have a negative run value this season ac cording to Baseball Savant, with his four-seam fastball (-12), changeup (-3) and curveball (-1) grading out in the negatives.

MONTH OF MARVEL...his 0.40 ERA (1 ER, 22.1 IP) in April was the lowest ERA in a month in Mariners history, surpassing Mark Langston's 0.50 ERA (3 ER, 53.2 IP) in September 1988 (min. 20.0 IP).

HE'S LIKE THE ROCKET, MAN...became just the 2nd pitcher in AL history to strike out 15-or-more batters while allowing no more than 1 walk and no more than 1 earned run over his first 3 starts of the season, joining Roger Clemens (1991) via Stats Perform.

BY YOU...recorded 211 swings-and-misses on his 4-seam fastball, which was the 5th-most in the Majors and 3rd-most in the American League...trailed only Gerrit Cole-NYY (231) and Cristian Javier-HOU (230) in the AL... his 211 whiffs on his four-seamer are the 2nd-most in a single season by a Mariners pitcher since 2008, trailing only James Paxton's 226 in 2018.

THE ARSENAL...offers a 5 pitch mix...53.9% of the time he throws his four-seam fastball, which averages 96.1 MPH, a slider, which he throws 24.2% of the time and averages 86.9 MPH, a curveball, which he uses 12.5% of the time, and averages 80.8 MPH, a changeup, which he throws 8.0% of the time and averages 86.2 MPH and a sinker, which he throws at just 1.4% and averages 94.7 MPH.


