ROAD TRIPPIN'

The Reds' 12-game road losing streak is their longest in a single season since a 12-game road skid from 8/1-8/15, 1945 (0-1 at StL Cardinals, 0-5 at Brooklyn Dodgers, 0-4 at NY Giants, 0-2 at Bos Braves)...haven't lost 13 straight road games since an 0-19 stretch from 7/5-8/24, 1933...this active road losing streak includes the Reds' first 4-game series sweep loss to the Dodgers since April 1975, their second consecutive series sweep loss at Petco Park and their first series sweep loss at Coors Field since 9/6-9/10, 2010 (4g)...Cin's winless trip at LAD (4g) and SD (3g) was its first winless road trip of at least 7 games since 6/7-6/14, 2004 (0-3 at Oak, 0-3 at Cle, 0-1 at Phi).

DOUBLE, DOUBLE, DOUBLE, DOUBLE

SS Kyle Farmer on 4/27 vs SD tied the Major League record for doubles in a game with 4, accomplished many times and most recently by Pit's Kevin Newman on 8/14/21 vs Mil... Farmer is the first player with 4 doubles in a game at Great American Ball Park...was Farmer's first career 4-hit game...below are Reds batters who share the record:

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3-game series vs Mike Vassallo's first-place Brewers and Game 6 (0-5) of a 7-day, 6-game road trip that included a 3-0 series sweep loss at Col's Coors Field and Monday's off day here...beginning tomorrow night the Redlegs return to Great American Ballpark for a 7-game homestand vs the Pirates (4g), including Cin's first scheduled doubleheader since 9/17/1987 at Dodger Stadium, and these Brewers (3g).

TRANSACTIONS: Yesterday the Reds claimed off waivers from the Rays RHP Robert Dugger, placed on the injured list OF Tyler Naquin & Nick Senzel and selected from Louisville as substitute players the contracts of OF Albert Almora Jr. (#3) & OF Ronnie Dawson (#82).

SERIES NOTES: The 18 runs scored by the Brewers in last night's 18-4 win was their highest total ever in a game vs the Reds...this afternoon the Brewers are looking for their first series sweep here since 4/24-4/26, 2017...the Brewers won last season's series, 10-9...in the first 3 games after the 2021 All-Star break, the Brewers recorded their first sweep in the Queen City since 9/24-9/26, 2019...the Reds and first-place Brewers played 7 consecutive games spanning each side of the 2021 All-Star break (3-1 at Mil, 0-3 at Cin)...the Reds faced the same opponent in 7 consecutive games for the first time since 6/30-7/4, 1953, when, coincidentally, they went 4-3 vs the Milwaukee Braves (1-2 at Mil, 3-1 at Mil)...from 6/14-6/16, 2021 at American Family Field, the Reds completed their first sweep of the Brewers since 9/4-9/6, 2017 (3g at Great American Ball Park) and their first sweep in Milwaukee since 8/25-8/27, 2009 (3g)...the Redlegs have won 7 of the last 12 games and 9 of the last 15 games at American Family Field.

PIRATES UP NEXT: The Reds are 20-9 vs Pit over the last 2 seasons, including 13-6 overall and 9-1 at Great American Ball Park last season...spanning last season and including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps last year, the Reds won 17 of the last 23 games vs the Pirates, including 14 of the last 15 games vs Pit at GABP...the Pirates' 6-2 win at Great American Ball Park on 9/21 snapped the Reds' 13-game home winning streak vs Pit, their longest vs the Pirates in the Queen City since an 18-game winning streak at Crosley Field from 4/22/39 - 9/5/1940...4 times in 2021 the Reds beat the Pirates by 10 runs, a club record vs any opponent in a season...the 1945 Pirates club was the National League's last team to beat an opponent 4 times in a season by at least 10 runs (Brooklyn)...the Reds went 10-23 at PNC Park the last 4 seasons, including an 11-game losing streak spanning 2018-2019 and an 8-game losing streak to begin the 2019 season.

REHABBING: RHP Luis Castillo (right shoulder strain) yesterday afternoon made his third rehabilitation start, for Class AAA Louisville at Indianapolis, and started the 1-0 Bats win (4.1ip, 3h, 0r, 2bb, 7k, 76pch)...on 4/24 started for Class A Dayton and received no decision in the 9-2 Dragons win vs West Michigan (2.1ip, 2h, 1er, 3bb, 4k, 48 pitches)...on Fri started for Louisville and received no decision in the 8-4 Bats loss at Columbus (3.2ip, 2h, 0er, 3bb, 5k, 66 pitches).

RED HOTS:

- The Reds' current injured list includes 15 players...began the season with 8 players on the injured list, their highest total to begin a season since they began the 2014 campaign with 8 players on the disabled list...since 2022 Opening Day have made 13 more additions to the injured list - including Jonathan India, Tyler Naquin & Nick Senzel twice each - for a season total of 21.
- The Reds' 11.5-game deficit on May 1 was their largest ever on that date.
- Including this one, the Reds went 0-7-1 in this season's 8 series, their only split against the Braves to begin the year (2-2).
- The Reds began the season 0-4 at Great American Ball Park, their first 0-4 home start since the 1955 club began 0-4 at Crosley Field.
- Over 11 games and 99 innings from 4/12-4/23 the Reds failed to hold a lead through the end of a full inning, including a 6-game, 54-inning stretch from 4/12-4/17 in which they never led at any point.

YOUNG GUNS: The Reds' Opening Day roster included 3 pitchers with 0.000 days of service time (relievers RHP Alexis Diaz & RHP Daniel Duarte, starter RHP Hunter Greene) and 9 pitchers with less than 1.000 year of service time...a fourth pitcher with no service time, LHP Nick Lodolo, replaced Duarte when Lodolo was promoted to start on 4/12 vs Cle...in LHP Reiver Sanmartin (Game 2, 3rd Major League start), Greene (Game 4, ML debut) and Lodolo (Game 6, ML debut), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the first 6 games of a season for only the second time in their history...the 1902 Reds staff used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookie pitchers...courtesy @EliasSports.

THE SKIPPER...: David Bell is in his fourth season as a Major League manager...on 9/22 of last season, the club announced Bell's 2-year contract extension through the 2023 season...was named to the position on 10/22/18 as the 63rd manager in franchise history, the 53rd since 1900...David and his father, Buddy, are the fourth father-son duo to serve as Major League managers, joining George & Dick Sisler, Bob & Joel Skinner and Bob & Aaron Boone.

Today's Pitcher - #21 Hunter Greene, RHP

RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his fifth Major League appearance and start.
- In the 5-2 loss on 4/16 at LAD threw 39 pitches at more than 100 miles per hour, the most recorded in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...his 13 pitches at 101mph were the most ever recorded by a starter in a game...struck out 2 batters on fastballs clocked at 101mph, tied for the most in a game by a starter on a strikeout pitch of that velocity (Jacob deGrom, Justin Verlander)...courtesy @SlangsOnSports.
- Made his Major League debut in the 6-3 win on 4/10 at Atl in the Reds' fourth game of the season...became the ninth Reds pitcher and first since Jackson Stephens in 2016 to record the win and at least 7 strikeouts in his first career appearance...first career strikeout was Matt Olson (2nd batter)...recorded 2 strikeouts in each of his first 3 innings...didn't allow a hit until Matt Olson singled to lead off the fourth inning...in the fifth allowed a leadoff HR to Travis d'Arnaud and a 2-out HR to Olson, both solo homers...RHP Art Warren threw a scoreless ninth inning for his first career save.
- At age 22 years, 247 days became the youngest starting pitcher to make his Major League debut for the Reds since Mike Leake received no decision a 3-1 Reds win on 4/11/10 vs the Cubs at 22 years, 150 days old.
- Became the youngest pitcher to start for the Reds since LHP Brandon Finnegan made his team debut on 9/18/15 at Mil at age 22 years, 5 months, 4 days and the youngest righthander since Leake.
- Was 1 of 3 pitchers on the Reds' Opening Day roster with 0.000 days of service time (Alexis Diaz, Daniel Duarte) and 1 of 9 Reds pitchers with less than 1.000 year of service time.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft...was rated by MLB.com the best overall prospect and by *Baseball America* the best high school player in that draft...the Twins selected high school SS Royce Lewis with the No. 1 overall pick.
- Entered the 2022 season rated #35 on *Baseball America's* Top 100 Prospects List...Reds farmhands IF/OF Jose Barrero was at #33, LHP Nick Lodolo at #36 and IF Elly de la Cruz at #77.
- Entered the 2022 season rated the best prospect in the organization by MLB Pipeline and No. 2 in the system by *Baseball America* (IF/OF Jose Barrero, #1).
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.

Tomorrow vs Pirates - #71 Connor Overton, RHP

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow at Great American Ball Park will make his second appearance and start of the season...will be his 11th Major League appearance and fifth career start, his first career appearance and start vs his former team.
- In Sat's 4-3 loss at Coors Field made his Reds and season debuts...left leading, 2-0, but was the victim of a blown save when the Rockies scored 4 runs in the bottom of the sixth inning off Art Warren.
- Joined the Reds on Fri, when he was named to the Taxi Squad...on Sat was promoted from Class AAA Louisville to the 28-man active roster to start that night's game at Coors Field.
- Was a non-roster invitee to 2022 early minor league spring training camp and post-lockout Major League camp...in 3 exhibition "A" game relief apps for the Reds posted a 5.40 ERA (5ip, 5h, 3er, 2bb, 3k).
- On 3/28 was reassigned to minor league camp...began the season at Louisville, where in 2 starts and 2 relief apps he went 2-1, 2.84 (19ip, 16h, 2bb, 22k, 2hr, .222baa).
- On 11/26/21 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2022 Major League spring training camp.
- In 2021, in his Major League debut made 3 starts and 6 relief apps for the Blue Jays and Pirates.
- During the 2021 season, didn't allow a run in 6 relief apps (8.2ip, 4h, 2bb, 6k, .143baa)...posted an ERA of 10.80 in his 3 starts (6.2ip, 10h, 8er, 3bb, 9k, 2hr, .357baa).
- Didn't allow a run in his first 7 Major League apps (11.2ip, 6h, 3bb, 9k, .154baa).
- While pitching for the Pirates in 2021 made 2 apps vs the Reds, both at Great American Ball Park...pitched in relief in a 9-5 loss on 9/20 (1ip, 1k) and started the 13-1 loss on 9/27 (1ip, 6h, 4er, 0bb, 2k, Joey Votto 2-run HR).
- Pitched in 2 seasons in the independent leagues, for the American Association's Sioux City Explorers in 2016 and in the Atlantic League for the Lancaster Barnstormers in 2019.
- Spent most of the 2016 season pitching for Sioux City but did make 1 appearance, on 8/13, for the Giants' Class A San Jose affiliate...didn't pitch again the rest of that season because of a right elbow injury.
- Missed the entire 2017 season following "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.
- Played shortstop and pitched at Atlee High School in Mechanicsville, VA...played 3 seasons at Old Dominion University...missed out on a fourth collegiate season because of a right shoulder injury...his father, Dee, was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 1982 secondary draft.

- Made 4 spring training apps before he was sidelined, including 2 starts at 3B and 1 start at SS (4-10, .400, 2 2b, 1rbi, 1hbp, 1.055ops).
- While with the Giants in 2020 won the National League's Silver Slugger Award for 2B.
- In 2021, for the Giants established career highs in doubles (17), HR (7) and walks (25).
