**TODAY'S GAME:** Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Mark Iacofano's Tigers** and **Game 6** (2-3) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series loss** to the Cardinals and Thu's scheduled off day...following today's game the Redlegs embark on their longest road trip of the season, an 11-day, 9-game jaunt through the **NL Central Division to Chi's Wrigley Field** (3g), StL's **Busch Stadium** (3g) and Pit's **PNC Park** (3g) highlighted by off days in **St. Louis** and **Pittsburgh**...will be the their longest road trip since **7/24-8/11, 2017**, when they went 3-7 over **11 days** at **Cle** (0-1), **NYC** (0-2), **Mia** (1-3) and **Pit** (off day, 2-1)...on **9/17** will return to **Great American Ball Park** for their final homestand of the regular season (3g vs LAD, 3g vs Pit, 4g vs Wsh)...will finish the 2021 championship season on the road at Chi's **Guaranteed Rate Field** (3g) and Pit's **PNC Park** (off day, 3g).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds are **17-17** all-time vs the Tigers (9-9 at Cin, 8-8 at Det)...opened the 2020 shortened season with a 2-1 series loss to the Tigers at **Great American Ball Park**, followed by a 2-1 series win the next week at **Comerica Park**...according to **@EliasSports**, the Redlegs' doubleheader on **8/2/20 at Det** was the first in the Major Leagues since 1900 in which both games were scheduled for fewer than 9 innings...the Reds beat the Tigers, 4 games to 3, in the **1940 World Series**.

**INTERLEAGUE NOTES:** Beginning in **1997**, the Redlegs are **176-236 all-time vs the AL**, at **.427** the **lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team and including **9-8 this season** (2-1 vs Cle, 1-1 vs WSox, 1-1 at Cle, 1-1 at Min, 2-1 at KC, 1-1 vs Min, 0-1 at Cle, 1-1 vs Det)...haven't produced a **winning record vs the American League since 2013** (11-9)...in **8 seasons** since then are **61-96 vs AL** (.389), including a **10-game losing streak** snapped in 2019.

**CUBS UP NEXT:** The Reds are **10-6 vs Cubs** this season, including a **Fourth of July weekend sweep** at **Great American Ball Park**...are **4-3 at Wrigley Field** this season...since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **29 of the last 35 night games** vs the Reds at **The Friendly Confines**...in the Reds' 3-1 series win there in July, **Joey Votto** produced **6 HR** and **10 RBI**...the **6 HR** tie the record for most homers in a series by a visiting player at **Wrigley**, joining by **Jose Abreu** (3-game series in 2020) and **Matt Carpenter** (5-game series in 2018)...**Votto's 128 career hits** at Wrigley are the most by any active opposing player (128-400, .320, 39 2b, 2 3b, 22hr, 68rbi, .424obp, .593slg, 1.017ops)...**Nick Castellanos'** 1.151 career OPS at **Wrigley Field** (est. 1914) is the highest in the ballpark's history (minimum 100pa, 37g, .375, 20 2b, 1 3b, 11hr, 35rbi, .415obp, .737slg).

**ROOKIE OF THE YEAR:** **2B Jonathan India** is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cle's **Joe Jackson**, .468 in 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426 in 1926)...**India** ranks sixth in the National League in **on-base percentage** (.381; Juan Soto 1st, .447)...in the **first inning**, he ranks second in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.470, Juan Soto .471) while ranking fourth in the National League in **batting average** (.358)...beginning **5/21** ranks third in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.402)...leads all Major League rookies in **on-base percentage**, **walks** and **runs scored**...also leads all National League rookies in **RBI**, **hits** (tied), **extra-base hits** and **total bases**...**India** is trying to become the eighth Reds player and second Reds second baseman to win the BBWAA's **Rookie of the Year Award** (**LF Frank Robinson** 1956, **2B Pete Rose** 1963, **3B Tommy Helms** 1966, **C Johnny Bench** 1968, **RHP Pat Zachry** 1976, **3B Chris Sabo** 1988, **RHP Scott Williamson** 1999).

**CATCH YOU LATER:** Reds catchers **Tucker Barnhart** and **Tyler Stephenson** combined have committed just **2 errors**, both on **catcher's interference** on **Barnhart** (8/20 vs Mia, 8/28 at Mia), in **1,365 total chances** and **1,215.2 innings caught**...**Barnhart** has committed just 2 errors since 7/26/19, both catcher's interference calls and both with Mia's Jesús Aguilar batting...the catcher's interference on 8/20 at Cin snapped **Barnhart's** 161-game errorless streak, the club record for consecutive errorless apps by a catcher...in his 2-year career, **Stephenson** does not have an error as a catcher...offensively, they combine to lead the Major Leagues at that position in **hitting** (.288), **hits** (143) and **doubles** (35) while ranking third in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.355) and eighth in **slugging percentage** (.438)...only twice since **1886** have the Reds finished a season using only **2 catchers**, in **1959** (**Ed Bailey**, **Dutch Dotterer**) and **1979** (**Johnny Bench**, **Vic Correll**).

**TOP OF THE ORDER:** Reds batters in the **top 3 spots** in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in **hitting** (.291), **hits** (487), **doubles** (114), **extra-base hits** (203) and **total bases** (864) while leading the National League and ranking second in the majors in **slugging percentage** (.517), **runs** (266) and **RBI** (256)...are **24-12** (.667) when **Jonathan India**, **Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** hit first, second and third, respectively, in the starting lineup.

**DOT, DOT, DOT...:** The Reds rank third in the National League in winning percentage in **1-run games** (.566, 20-16)...haven't had a winning record in 1-run games since 2013 (.551, 27-22)...lead the National League lead and rank T3rd in the Major Leagues with **36 come-from-behind wins** (TB 42, Bos 39, NYC 36)...are 10-8 (.556) **after an off day**...the Reds went **20-18-7** in their previous **45 series**, including **10-9-4 at GABP** and **10-9-3 on the road**...the Reds are eighth in **Baseball America's Mid-Season Organization Talent Rankings**, a leap up from **19th** at the season's start.

At **71-59** through 8/27, the Redlegs were a season-high **12 games above .500** for the second time (69-57), their best since they finished the **2013 season 18 games over at 90-72**...**David Bell's career record** as Reds manager is **180-179** (.501)...**twice** he was a career-high **2 games over .500** (175-173, 177-175) and has improved his single-season **winning percentages** from **.463** in 2019 (75-87) to **.517** last year (31-29) to **.533** this season.

# Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

## RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his third career start vs the Tigers.
- Went 1-8, 7.22 in 11 starts through May (.321oba) and 6-6, 2.84 with 14 quality starts in 17 apps since then (.216baa).
- In June posted a 1.71 ERA, the fifth-best ERA in the National League (Jacob deGrom 0.67, Max Scherzer 1.42, Zach Wheeler 1.44, Anthony DeSclafani 1.69).
- In July posted a 2.15 ERA, the third-best in the National League (Walker Buehler 1.67, Freddy Peralta 2.14).
- Has been the victim of a blown save 5 times...1 other start, a 4.0-inning stint on 4/20 vs Ari, also included a blown save...his 6 starts total in which Reds relievers suffered a blown save are tied for third-most in the Major Leagues behind leaders Tyler Mahle (9gs) and Anthony DeSclafani (7gs).
- Was the Reds' 2019 and 2021 Opening Day starting pitcher.
- Since his Major League debut in 2017 leads the Reds' pitching staff in wins (39), starts (118), IP (676.2) and strikeouts (737).

### REDS BATTERS

- Lead the National League in slugging percentage while ranking second in both batting average (Wsh) and on-base percentage (Wsh).
- Are tied with the Dodgers for the Major League lead with 92 hit by pitches, a single-season franchise record (89hbp, 2019).
- Scored at least 10 runs in a game 19 times, tied with the 1976 World Series championship team for second-most in a Reds season since 1901...the 1903 team and 1975 World Series champion Reds scored at least 10 runs in a single-season record 20 games.
- Are on pace for 223 HR...the team record for HR in a season is 227 in 2019...homered in 99 of their 137 games, including 58 multi-homer games and a season-high 6-homer game in a 14-11 loss in 10 innings on 4/22 vs Ari.
- Already have established single-season franchise records with 11 leadoff HR (10, 1987) and 33 HR overall from the leadoff spot (28, 1987)...only the Braves (36) and Blue Jays (35) have more homers from the first spot in the batting order.
- The Reds have 7 players with at least 10 HR (club record is 10 players), 6 players with at least 15 HR (club record 7) and 4 players with at least 20 HR (club record 6).
- In an 11-5 win on 6/11 vs Col homered in each of the first 5 innings of a game for the only time since joining the National League in 1890 (Nick Castellanos, Scott Heineman, Joey Votto, Kyle Farmer, Tyler Stephenson).
- In Nick Castellanos (21g) and Tyler Naquin (17g), the Reds have more than 1 player with hitting streaks of at least 17 games for the first time since 2000 (Sean Casey 21g, Dmitri Young 18g, Dante Bichette 17g).
- Reds pitchers have pinch hit 3 times, including Wade Miley twice (5/12 at Pit, P5 & 7/17 vs Mil, 4-3) and Tony Santillan once (6/28 vs Phi, K).
- In 8 interleague road games, Jesse Winker (5gs), Joey Votto (2gs), Nick Castellanos (1gs), and Mike Freeman (1g) combined to hit .206 as the team's designated hitters (7-34, 4 2b, 3rbi, 3bb, 11k, 1hbp, 3r).

### 4 SHOGO AKIYAMA, of

**Homestand: 1g in LF, 1g as PH/RF, 0-2**

- Is hitless in his last 16 at bats, tying the longest hitless streak of his career (0-16, 8/25-8/29, 2020).
- Last played in Fri's 15-5 loss vs Det, pinch hit and played LF...last started on 8/24 at Mil, played CF (0-3).
- Has made 31 starts, including 27 starts in CF and 4 starts in LF (last, 5/31 vs Phi)...made his last 25 starts in CF...3 times started in 3 straight games, his longest streaks of the season (6/28-6/30, 7/17-7/19, 7/29-7/31).
- Has not homered in the regular season in his 2-year career...his streak of 311 at bats without a home run is the second-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (Magneuris Sierra, 481)...did homer in his first ever appearance at Great American Ball Park, in an exhibition vs the Tigers on 7/21/20 (3-run off David McKay).
- Following an injury suffered in spring training, made his season debut on 5/7 in Wade Miley's no-hitter at Cle...started in LF.
- Began the season on the 10-day injured list with a strained left hamstring suffered on 3/13, his last spring training appearance...following 2 rehab games at Louisville (1-9, 3k) was reinstated from the 10-day injured list on 5/7, when Joey Votto went on the 10-day injured list with a broken left thumb.
- Made 4 apps in spring training (0-7, 1r, 3bb, 3k, 1sb)...early in spring training, from 2/25-3/3, missed 7 days of camp after his wife was injured in an accident in a Cincinnati park.

- In his last 20 apps beginning 8/11 is 5-for-50 (.100, 1 2b, 2hr, 6rbi), including an 0-for-16 skid (8/10-8/16) and a career-high 0-for-24 stretch snapped with a pinch-hit, infield single in Wed's day game vs StL.
- Has made 34 starts, including 19 starts in LF (last, 9/4 vs Det), 5 starts in CF (last, 8/9 at Cle) and 10 starts in RF (last, 8/12 at Atl)...made each of his last 13 starts in LF.

- Has a 3-game hitting streak (4-9, .444, 1 2b, 1rbi, 1.000ops)...hit safely in 4 of his last 6 apps (5-14, .357, 1 2b, 3rbi).
- Is 1 of only 5 Reds catchers with at least 553 hits, 115 doubles and 51 HR (Johnny Bench, Ernie Lombardi, Joe Oliver, Eddie Taubensee).

- Last name is pronounced Cah-ste-yah-nos...first name preference is Nick.
- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career.
- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including three 2-hit games (7-15, .467, 2hr, 6rbi, 5r, .500obp, .933slg, 1.433ops).
- Beginning 8/16 hit safely in 15 of his last 18 apps, including nine 2-hit games (24-69, .348, 3 2b, 6hr, 15rbi, .384obp, .652slg, 1.036ops).
- In Wed night's 12-2 win vs StL produced his ninth career multi-homer game, his seventh career grand slam and 6 RBI...hit a 2-run HR in the first inning and the slam in the second, both off J.A. - Has been hit by a pitch 19 times, a team high and most recently on 8/25 at Mil (by Brandon Woodruff)...Shin-Soo Choo holds the Reds' single-season record for number of times hit by a pitch (26, 2013).
- Was the National League's Rookie of the Month for July (.319, 7 2b, 4hr, 12rbi, .470obp, .527slg, .997ops), the eighth Reds player to win a monthly award (Adam Dunn, Austin Kearns, Josh Hamilton, Joey Votto, Todd Frazier, Billy Hamilton, Aristides Aquino in August 2019).
- Became the first Reds player to make his Major League debut on Opening Day in a start at second base since Pete Rose in 1963.

### 28 ALEJO LOPEZ, inf Homestand: 1g PH/LF, 1g PH/2B, 1g 3B/LF, 0-4

- First name is pronounced uh-LAY-hoe.
- Was promoted from Louisville on Wed, when rosters expanded, and played in 3 of the Reds' 4 games since then.
- Made 11 apps and 3 starts during 2 previous stints with the Reds this season (9g, 3gs from 6/28-7/17 & 2g as PH from 7/23-7/25 vs StL).
- Made his first 2 starts for the Reds at 3B (6/30 & 7/1 vs SD) and his third and most recent start at 2B (7/5 at KC).
- Began the season at Chattanooga and hit .362 in 25 apps before he was promoted to Louisville on 6/2.

- Beginning 8/11 has started 20 of the Reds' last 23 games (15gs in CF, 4gs in LF, 1gs in RF)...last started in the day game of Wed's doubleheader vs StL.
- Leads the Reds with 74 starts in CF...also has made 13 starts in LF (last, 8/24 at Mil) and 15 starts in RF (last, 8/15 at Phi).
- With 2 outs in the seventh inning of Sat's 7-4 win vs Det, pinch hit and produced a 2-run triple that increased the Reds' lead from 5-4...snapped an 0-for-12 skid.
- His 0-for-12 skid snapped Sat vs Det followed a career-high 17-game hitting streak that included eight 2-hit games and a pair of 3-hit games (29-64, .453, 7 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 10rbi, 16r)...was the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues when snapped.
- During the first 16 games of his 17-game hitting streak batted .467 with 6 HR...the last Reds batter to hit at least .467 with at least 6 HR over any 16-game span was Tony Pérez from 4/12-4/20, 1970 (.482ba, 10hr)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Was the starting CF in Wade Miley's no-hitter.
- Hit 3 of the Reds' 4 longest home runs of the season, on 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser (459 feet), on 4/6 vs Pit off Trevor Cahill (454 feet) and on 4/9 at Ari off Taylor Widener (454 feet)...Jesse Winker hit the Reds' second-longest HR, on 5/23 vs Mil off Freddy Peralta (456 feet).
- From 8/16-8/22 was the National League's Player of the Week, his first such award and the third Reds player this season to be so honored (LHP Wade Miley 5/10, 1B Joey Votto 8/2)...that week hit .500 with a 1.706 OPS (3 2b, 1 3b, 4hr, 5rbi)...for the first time since 2012, 3 Reds players won Player of the Week in the same season (RHP Homer Bailey, Jay Bruce twice, Mat Latos, Drew Stubbs).

### 32 MAX SCHROCK, inf/of Homestand: 4g, 1gs in LF, 3-5

- Was promoted from Louisville on 8/25, when RHP Tejay Antone went on the 10-day injured list with a season-ending right elbow injury.
- Since that 8/25 promotion is hitting .500 (5-10, .545obp) in 8 apps and 3 starts.
- Is his fourth stint with the Reds (5g/1gs from 4/16-4/22, 7g/5gs from 5/20-5/31, 10g/2gs from 7/24-8/4).
- In his last 9 starts is 13-for-26 (.500) with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 HR and 5 RBI.

- Once this season threw more than 1.0 inning (1.2ip, 6/29 vs SD).
- 5 times pitched on consecutive days (last, 7/7 at KC & 7/8 at Mil).
- Retired the first batter in 11 of his 18 apps...stranded all 5 inherited runners.

- Leads all Major League catchers in fielding percentage (1.000)...among National League catchers, ranks 12th with 591 total chances (0 errors) and 14th with 511.1 innings caught.
- Threw out 6 of his last 16 runners attempting to steal, including 4 of his last 9 and 3 of his last 4.
- Hit .359 in April, .305 in June, .322 in July and .291 in August.
- In his last 52 apps beginning 6/25 is hitting .308 (44-143, 7 2b, 5hr, 22rbi, .360obp).
- Has made 56 starts at catcher, most recently in Sat's 7-4 win vs Det.
- Made his other 14 starts at 1B (last, 8/9 at Cle)...his 19 apps and 14 starts at 1B are his only Major League apps at a position other than catcher.
- Has 4 HR in 38 career pinch-hit apps, including 3 HR and 12 RBI in 34 pinch-hit apps this season...leads all Major League pinch hitters in RBI and ranks T2nd in HR (Pablo Sandoval, 4hr).
- Near the top of the batting order has hit second (9gs, last on 9/4 vs Det), third (11gs, last on 7/28 at Cubs) and fourth (23gs, last on 8/17 vs Cubs)...made his last 7 starts batting second...his 23 starts batting cleanup rank second on the team behind Joey Votto...the Reds are 14-9 (.6309) when he hits in the fourth spot in the lineup.
- Has 3 career walkoff hits...as a pinch hitter in 2020, produced an RBI-single off Oliver Pérez on 4/17 vs Cle and a 2-run HR off Sam Howard in the 3-1 win in the opener of a doubleheader on 9/14 vs Pit...this season, with 2 outs in the bottom of the ninth of the 5-4 win on 7/1 vs SD produced an RBI-single off Mark Melancon.
- Made his first Opening Day roster.

### 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**Homestand: 4-11 (.364), 2 2b, 2hr, 3rbi, 1.558ops**

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark in Suárez.
- Hit safely in 3 of his last 4 apps (4-8, .500, 2 2b, 2hr, 3rbi, .583obp, 1.500slg).
- In 5 of the Reds' last 6 games started at 3B.
- Has 25 HR, his fifth career 20-homer season and fourth career 25-homer season.
- In his last 24 apps beginning 7/31 has 6 HR and 15 RBI...10 of his last 12 hits were for extra bases (4 2b, 6hr).
- Leads the team in starts at 3B (86) and ranks second to Kyle Farmer (96) in starts at SS (31)...last played SS in the 6-1 win on 8/13 at Phi, snapping a 60-start streak at 3B (5/30-8/12)...since then, made all 9 of his starts at 3B.
- Made his first 27 starts of the season at SS...beginning 5/7, with 1B Joey Votto and 3B Mike Moutakas each missing time while on the injured list, has made 86 starts at 3B and just 4 starts at SS.
- Led the Reds in starts at SS in 2015, his first season in Cincinnati, but in each of the 5 seasons from 2016-2020 led the team in starts at third base.
- In Wade Miley's no-hitter on 5/7 at Cle made his first start of the season at 3B.
- In 2019 established records for home runs in a season by a player from Venezuela and by a National League third baseman (49).
- Became only the sixth shortstop in Reds history to homer on Opening Day (solo off Jack Flaherty)...was the first Reds shortstop to do it since Barry Larkin in 1995.
- Is approaching 1,000 games (980), 200 HR (187) and 500 runs scored (495)...on 5/23 vs Mil made his 900th Major League appearance...on 6/13 vs Col reached his 500th career RBI on a 2-run HR off Antonio Senzatela.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**Homestand: 4-14 (.286), 2 2b, 1rbi, 5bb, 5r**

- Despite missing 28 games with a broken left thumb (5/7-6/7) is on pace to produce 33 HR and 100 RBI, which would approach his numbers produced during his 2010 National League MVP season (37hr, 113rbi).
- Beginning 7/20, in his last 42 apps has 17 HR and 44 RBI, including a franchise record 7-game home run streak from 7/24-7/30...his 14 HR from 7/24-8/13 are the most by any Reds batter over any 19-game span.
- Hasn't homered since 8/20 vs Mia...this 13-game homerless streak is his longest of the season.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League and ranks second in the Major Leagues in HR (17) and RBI (45) behind KC's Salvador Perez (19hr, 46rbi)...ranks third in the majors in slugging percentage in the second half (.665) and sixth in on-base percentage (.404).
- For the season, ranks among the National League leaders in HR (T6th), RBI (T6th), slugging percentage (5th) and OPS (7th, .921)...previously in his career led the NL in doubles (2011), walks (5 times), on-base percentage (7 times), slugging percentage (2010) and OPS (2010, 2017).
- Beginning 7/2 has reached base safely in 53 of his last 56 apps (57-193, .295, 11 2b, 1 3b, 18hr, 51rbi, .414obp, .642slg, 1.056ops), including a 20-game on-base streak snapped in the 4-1 loss on 8/25 at Mil (22-70, .314, 4 2b, 7hr, 22rbi, .424obp, .671slg, 1.095ops)...his 25-game on-base streak that ended on 8/3 vs Min was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues when snapped and his longest on-base streak since 7/26-8/25, 2017 (29g).
- In 136 apps beginning 8/29/20, after 3 straight games off by manager's decision (8/27/dh at Mil, 8/28 vs Cubs), has produced 36 HR and 99 RBI.
- In the 6-0 win on 8/27 at Mia made his 100th appearance of the season...missed 28 games with a broken left thumb but still had 28 HR and 202 total bases through 100 apps...for the first time in his career recorded at least 28 HR within his first 100 apps...for the third time in his career produced at least 200 total bases within his first 100 games, joining his 2010 MVP season (222tb) and his 2017 campaign (203tb) after which he finished second in the MVP voting in the fourth-closest vote ever.
- Was the National League's Player of the Month for July (1st career) and Player of the Week for 7/26-8/1 (6th career, first since 4/23-4/29, 2018).
- In 7 games from 7/24-7/30 established the franchise record for home runs in consecutive apps, 1 shy of the Major League record shared by Dale Long (1956), Don Mattingly (1987) and Ken Griffey Jr. (1993)...according to StatCast, his single off the top of the RCF wall in the eighth inning on 7/31 at NYM would have been a home run in 10 other Major League ballparks.
- Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- Received NL Most Valuable Player Award votes 7 times in the previous 11 seasons, 6 times finished among the Top 10 and 3 times finished among the Top 3...finished first in 2010, sixth in 2011, 14th in 2012, sixth in 2013, third in 2015, seventh in 2016 and in 2017 second by 2 points to Mia's Giancarlo Stanton in the fourth-closest vote ever.
- Holds franchise records for career games played at first base (1,828) and intentional walks (145)...shares with Joe Morgan the club career record for number of seasons with at least 100 walks (6).

### 33 JESSE WINKER, lf

**10-Day Injured List**

- Since 8/16 has been on the 10-day injured list with an intercostal strain.
- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career
- When he went on the injured list led the National League in doubles and total bases while ranking among the NL leaders in hitting (5th), HR (T10th), RBI (T7th), on-base percentage (5th), slugging percentage (4th), OPS (2nd, .954), hits (T3rd) and extra-base hits (T2nd).
