THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second National League pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth (1999, 2001, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LOVULLO 1 WIN SHY OF 500: Torey Lovullo currently sits at 499 career managerial wins, 1 shy of the 500-win club.

♦ D-backs longest-tenured skipper is in his eighth season.

VS. ROCKIES: The D-backs took 3 of 4 vs. Rockies in the season-opening series.

- ♦ Went 4-2 @ Rockies last season and are 7-4 in their last 11 road games since August 13, 2022.
- ♦ Are 13-4 overall vs. Rockies since 2023, including 10-3 mark last season.
- ◆ Jake McCarthy has hit safely in 8 of his last 9 games vs. Rockies (with a plate appearance) at a .500 clip (16-for-32)/1.243 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run, 9 RBI, 4 walks and 9 stolen bases.
- ◆ **Kevin Newman** has hit safely in 3 of his last 4 games vs. Rockies (with a plate appearance) at a .313 clip (5-for-16) with 1 double, 1 homer, 3 RBI and 1 walk.

WALKER VS. ROCKIES: Christian Walker has a 21-game onbase streak vs. Rockies since August 14, 2022, hitting safely in 19 of those games, and a .393 average (33-for-84)/1.266 OPS with 7 doubles, 9 home runs, 25 RBI and

- ♦ Has a 12-game hitting streak vs. Rockies, since May 31, 2023, batting .404 (19-for-47)/1.396 OPS with 3 doubles, 7 home runs, 16 RBI and 6 walks.
- ♦ Has hit safely in 9 of his last 10 road games @ Rockies, reaching base safely in all 10 games, at a .452 clip (19-for-42)/1.521 OPS with 5 doubles, 6 home runs, 18 RBI and 6 walks.
- ◆ Among all players @ Rockies since 2018 (min. 75 PA), Walker is first with 25 extra-base hits, tied for first with 13 home runs, tied for third with 12 doubles, fifth with a 1.062 SLG and 12th with a .327 AVG.

HAPPY IN THE TOP SPOT: Ketel Marte hit leadoff home runs in back-to-back games on Friday and Saturday, the second D-back to do so along with Jean Segura on September 13-14, 2016 vs. Rockies.

*Didi Gregorius hit a leadoff home run in back-to-back individual games on June 4, 2014 @ Rockies and June 6, 2014 vs. Braves...did not play on June 5, 2014 @ Rockies.

♦ Among leadoff hitters (min. 25 PA), Marte ranks third with a .676 SLG and 1.035 OPS, tied for third with 3 home runs, fifth with 7 RBI and sixth with a .324 AVG.

HITTERS VS. STARTERS: D-backs hitters, against opposing starting pitchers, are batting .340 (67-for-197)/.950 OPS with 40 runs, 12 doubles, 10 home runs, 18 walks and 36 strikeouts.

♦ Among all teams offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first with a .340 AVG, .396 OBP, .553 SLG, .950 OPS, 10 home runs and 109 total bases.

STARTING PITCHERS: In the last 5 starts, D-backs starting pitchers have a 3.77 ERA (12 ER in 28.2 IP) and .243 opponent average with 7 walks and 29 strikeouts.

♦ In 10 starts, D-backs starting pitchers have a 4.15 ERA (25 R-24 ER in 52.0 IP), .246 opponent average, 15 walks and 52 strikeouts.

VS. SOUTHPAWS: The D-backs, in 7 games vs. left-handed starters, are hitting .369 (45-for-122)/.994 OPS with 26 runs scored, 8 doubles, 6 home runs and 9 walks.

♦ Overall vs. lefties, the offense is hitting .319 (51-for-160)/.874 OPS with 28 runs scored, 10 doubles, 6 home runs and 16 walks.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: In the opening frame, the D-backs have scored 2 runs 3 times, 3 runs 3 times and 6 times once, tallying 21 runs on .482 hitting (27-for-56)/1.435 OPS with 6 doubles, 6 home runs and 5 walks.

EARLY ACTION AT THE DISH: In Innings 1-3, the D-backs' 38 runs and 1.030 OPS lead the Majors:

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +16 run differential is tied for sixth in the Majors, with the Cubs (+16), behind the Guardians (+32), Braves (+26), Red Sox (+26), Rangers (+23) and Pirates (+18).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs' .984 OPS with runners in scoring position is second in the Majors behind the Braves (.994) and ahead of the Rangers (.942), Padres (.931) and Rockies (.915).

DEFENSIVE LEADERBOARD: Eugenio Suárez' 2 DRS are tied for third among third basemen with Isiah Kiner-Falefa/ TOR (2) and Trey Lipscomb/WSH (2) behind Ryan Mc-Mahon/COL (3) and Matt Chapman/SF (2).

◆ Christian Walker's 3 DRS lead first basemen ahead of Carlos Santana/MIN (2) and Vinnie Pasquantino/KC (2).
