Rubber Games
Atlanta and New York have split the first two games of this series and will play the rubber game this afternoon.
After dropping their first such game of the season, the Braves have won four straight series-deciding matchups. Atlanta lost to New York-NL on April 11, and have subsequently beaten Miami, Cleveland, Chicago-NL and Oakland.
The Braves have outscored their opponents 19-11 ( +8 ), in these games.
New York is 6-2 in rubber games this season, but has dropped each of its last two such games, including to Boston and Baltimore in the last week.


TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Yankees today conclude a three-game weekend series in what are the only scheduled meetings between the teams this season...The two are playing for the second consecutive season after meeting at Truist Park last year.

A New York beat Atlanta, 8-3, last night and the clubs have split the opening two games of this series... The loss snapped a four-game winning streak for the Braves over the Yankees dating to last season, their longest winning run over New York in history...They had won back-to-back games five times previously.
A Atlanta is just 20-27 (.426) all-time against New York since the advent of interleague play in 1997, its worst record against any AL team in that span... The Braves and Yankees have met four times in the World Series, with Atlanta going 1-3 in these sets...The Milwaukee Braves won the title in 1957, before the Yankees won in 1958, 1996 and 1999.

A Despite the losing record overall, Atlanta is an even 13-13 all-time here in New York...The Braves last played here in 2021 and split a pair of games, and Atlanta last won a series here in 2012 (2-1)...The club is 4-3-2 in nine total series here all-time.
A LH Max Fried has never lost to the Yankees, going a perfect $2-0$ with a 2.25 ERA ( $3 \mathrm{ER} / 12.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) in a pair of starts...The 6 -foot-4,190-pound native of Santa Monica, CA, last faced them on August 14 of last season, and allowed eight hits and two runs over 6.0 innings in Atlanta's win, 11-3...Today's start will be Fried's first here at Yankee Stadium, and he is $4-2$ with a 3.06 ERA (18 ER/53.0 IP) and a .162 opponents average in nine starts on the road this season.

A LH Nestor Cortes is set for the first start of his career against Atlanta...The 5-foot-11, 210-pound native Cuban has made 16 starts for New York this season, going 4-5 with a 3.36 ERA (35 ER/93.2 IP), including 6.0 scoreless innings in his last turn on June 18 vs. Baltimore...In eight starts this season at Yankee Stadium, Cortes is 4-2 with a 1.57 ERA (9 ER/51.2 IP).
LOSS: Atlanta fell to New York, 8-3, last night to stop the club's four-game winning streak...DH Marcell Ozuna and C Travis d'Arnaud homered for the Braves, and the club lost for just the seventh time this season when it homers at least twice.
A Atlanta and New York enter play this afternoon with the two best interleague records in baseball. The Braves' $21-11$ (.656) mark is best in the sport, while the Yankees' 13-7 (.650) record ranks second.

A Atlanta's 21 wins are tied with Milwaukee for most in the majors against the opposing league
A The Braves opened the scoring with a solo homer in the first inning last night, before allowing seven unanswered runs...Atlanta fell to $28-12$ when scoring first this season.

HOMERS: Atlanta hit two more home runs last night, and has clubbed 18 homers over its last eight games...No team in baseball has more homers in that span, which dates to June 14.

A The Braves' 18 homers over their last eight games match their total from the previous 21 contests, May 22 to June 14...Atlanta ranks tied for 12th in the majors with 84 homers on the season, one year after leading baseball and tying the single-season major league record with 307 homers in 2023.

A All three of Atlanta's runs last night scored via home run, and $70.5 \%$ of the Braves' runs dating to June 14 have come from the longball... That percentage is highest in the majors...Through Atlanta's first 66 games of the season, just $38.0 \%$ of its runs came via homer, 11th most in baseball...The Braves were the only team in baseball to score over half of its runs $(51.7 \%)$ from the home run last season.

A Atlanta and New York combined to hit four home runs last night, and none of them would have been out in all 30 major league parks...Aaron Judge's firstinning homer would have also been out in just eight other parks around the league...Per Baseball Savant, Yankee Stadium is ranked as the sixth most homerfriendly park in the majors with a home run mark of 114 , meaning that of batters and pitchers who played at both Yankee Stadium and elsewhere, $14 \%$ more home runs occured in New York...Atlanta's Truist Park ranked 23rd with a home run mark of 90

KELENIC AT LEADOFF: OF Jarred Kelenic reached base two more times last night, going 1-for-3 with a walk and a double...Since moving into the leadoff spot in the batting order on June 15, he has hit .323/.364/. 581 with two doubles, two homers and four runs scored.

A He has at least one hit in all seven games, and the Braves are 5-2.

A Kelenic has 10 hits and two walks in the seven games since moving into the leadoff spot, and his 18 total bases in that span are tied for seventh most by No. 1 hitter in baseball.

A He has hit in nine straight games overall dating to June 13, his longest run of the season...He has just one longer streak in his career, hitting in 10 straight games last April.

CATCHERS: Travis d'Arnaud drove in two of Atlanta's three runs last night with his seventh home run of the season, and Braves catchers have four total homers in their last six games...Sean Murphy hit two on Wednesday, while d'Arnaud also homered on June 16.

A Dating to June 14, Murphy and d'Arnaud have combined to bat $.379 / .400 / .828$ with nine runs and seven RBI...Their 1.228 OPS in that span is second best by a catching corps in baseball.
A Since the start of last season, Atlanta's catchers lead the NL in homers (42), RBI (140) and extra-base hits (95).

A Scheduled to make his 15th start of the season and third of his career against New York (AL).
A Is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two career starts against the Yankees.
A Sporting a 2.00 ERA over his last 10 starts.
A Dating to his 2017 debut season, Fried's .701 winning percentage is the third highest in the majors, trailing only Clayton Kershaw and Justin Verlander (min. 700 IP).

A Opponents are being held to an average exit velocity of 84.6 MPH against Fried; the lowest among qualified pitchers...Teammate Chris Sale ranks third.
A Also leads the league with the lowest percentage of balls barreled against him at $10.9 \%$ (among qualifiers).

A Pitching to a 7.90 ERA in the first frame and a 2.18 ERA in all other innings this season.

A Allowed a combined nine runs in the first innings between his first two games in 2024.

A Sporting a 2.16 ERA in 12 starts after allowing a combined 10 earned runs through 5.0 frames tossed between his first two starts of the season.

A Ranks as the third lowest ERA in the Majors among qualifiers during that span dating to April 7.

Producing a $60.3 \%$ groundball rate this season; the second highest rate in the majors among qualified starters.
A His 138 groundballs induced are second most in MLB among lefties.
A His 66 wins over the past five seasons are most in the National League, and most by any left-hander in baseball.

A Only one pitcher, the Yankees' Gerrit Cole, has more wins than Fried since the start of 2019...Cole has 71 wins.

A Additionally, the Braves have 91 wins in games started by Fried since the beginning of 2019 , the most such wins by a pitcher in the National League... Only Cole and José, Berríos, whose teams have won 94 and 92 of their starts resepctively, have more in the majors.
Fried's 26 successful pickoffs since debuting in 2017 are the most in baseball and two more than the next closest pitcher, Washington's Patrick Corbin.
A Corbin has attempted 488 pickoffs in that time, compared to Fried's 192.
A Fried has successfully nabbed a runner on 13.5 percent of his career pickoff attempts, drastically higher than the MLB average since his debut (1.7 percent)...Since 2017, 1.6 percent of MLB's successful pick attempts have been executed by Fried.

A Recorded a career most 13 strikeouts on June 4 against Boston.
A His previous career high was 11 punchouts, done twice.
\& Earned his second win of the season while throwing a three-hit shutout against the Marlins on April 23; the fourth of his career and the third of the nine-inning variety
A Each of his four shutouts have qualified as a "Maddux" (fewer than 100 pitches).
A Since pitch tracking began in 1988, Hall-of-Famers Greg Maddux (11) and Tom Glavine (5) are the only Braves pitchers to log more "Maddux" outings.
A It's the first 9.0-inning shutout by a Braves pitcher since RHP Bryce Elder on September 26, 2022 at Washington.
\& Tossed a two-run complete game against Chicago (NL) in his last start, fanning nine hitters while scattering three hits, one earned run and issuing zero walks.
A Became the first Braves pitcher to record two complete games in which he did not allow more than one earned run and three hits in the team's first 50 games of the season since Shelby Miller in 2015...Only Boston-era pitchers Irv Young, Lou Fette and Jim Tobin have more such games in that same span

A He is one of two pitchers in baseball with two no-hit bids through the sixth inning this season...Also the first pitcher in the National League to have taken multiple no-hitters through the sixth in a season since Clayton Kershaw in 2022.
A Struckout Christian Walker looking in the top of the second inning to reach 700 punchouts on his career.
A Fried became the sixth left-handed pitcher in franchise history to reach the milestone.
A Joins Hall-of-Famers Warren Spahn and Tom Glavine along with with Denny Lemaster, Lefty Tyler and Steve Avery as the only lefty Braves pitchers to do so. A Had the shortest start of his career against Philadelphia on March 30, 2024.
$\mathcal{A}$ Lasted 0.2 innings while allowing three earned runs and two hits, issuing three walks on 43 pitches.
